7/18/16 LOCAL ENVIRONMENT; ENERGY “Calif. Regulators Reject Natural Gas Pipeline Plan Through San Bernardino Neighborhoods” A proposal to construct a new natural gas pipeline from the San Bernardino County high desert into Riverside County has been rejected by state regulators, after opponents argued construction of the project would negatively affect residential neighborhoods in San Bernardino.

7/18/16 LOCAL POLITICS; NATIONAL POLITICAL CONVENTIONS “IE Woman Will Speak At GOP National Convention Tonight” A Moreno Valley woman was in the national spotlight as she told the story of her military son's death when she delivered a prime-time speech from the dais at the Republican National Convention.

7/18/16 LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY; CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO “Deadly City: San Bernardino's Murder Rate Higher Than L.A., Equal To Chicago” With 2016 half over, San Bernardino recorded its 40th homicide of the year. That's just a couple of deaths short of the total number of homicides in the city over all of last year -- including the 14 people massacred in the terrorist mass shooting on Dec. 2. The statistics show that San Bernardino can now be considered one of the most deadly cities in the nation.

7/19/16 STUDENT HEALTH; LOCAL EDUCATION; ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE “Report: Drug And Alcohol Use Down Among Calif. School Students” Drug and alcohol use dropped among students in California and school safety increased.

7/19/16 LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY; LAW ENFORCEMENT/COMMUNITY RELATIONS “Journalist Creates Database Of Officer-Involved Deaths In California” A Nevada journalist has published a list of deaths related to law enforcement interaction during the last 16 years.

7/19/16 LOCAL WILDFIRES; WILDFIRE SAFETY “Temecula-Area "Spot Fires" Shut Down Fwy Lanes, Damage Golf Resort” Multiple spot fires broke out yesterday (Monday) along Interstate 15 just south of Temecula, damaging property at a golf course and prompting the California Highway Patrol to temporarily shut down half of the freeway as a precaution.

7/19/16 LOCAL REAL ESTATE; HOME SALES AND PRICES "Riverside County Home Sales And Prices Surge" Sales of existing homes in Riverside County increased 4-and-a-half percent last month compared to the same time a year ago, even as home prices climbed, according to a report released this week by the California Association of Realtors.

7/20/16 DRONES; WILDFIRE SAFETY "California Looks To Utah For Answer To Problem Drones Over Wildfires" Proposed legislation making its way to the governor's desk in Utah could provide a framework for regulating aerial drones here in California.

7/20/16 CALIFORNIA ENERGY, ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY, SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION, NUCLEAR POWER "Study: For More Profit, Edison Intentionally Pushed San Onofre Nuclear Plant Beyond Its Limits" The cause of a leak in 2012 that led to the permanent shutdown of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station was steam generators being deliberately run too hot, too hard, and too fast, according to a report released by an independent watchdog organization.

7/21/16 LOCAL PUBLIC SAFETY "Hemet Shocked By 3 Homicides In 9 Hours" The Riverside County community of Hemet is reeling after three people were killed in a nine-hour span.

7/21/16 LOCAL ECONOMY; CITY OF SAN BERNARDINO; INLAND EMPIRE 66ers BASEBALL "IE 66ers Baseball Could Leave San Bernardino" After 20 years of the Inland Empire 66ers playing ball in San Bernardino, the bankrupt city could lose its minor-league baseball team by the end of the year. A lease arrangement with San Manuel Stadium is behind the team's possible exit.

7/21/16 LOCAL AIR QUALITY; ENVIRONMENTAL SAFETY; LOCAL ECONOMY "IE Environmentalists Skeptical Of SoCal Air Quality Board's Proposed Policy Changes" The Inland Empire is notorious for having some of the worst air quality in Southern California. 7/28/16 LOCAL POLITICS AND ELECTIONS "Expect 2 - Maybe 3 - Marijuana Measures On San Bernardino City Ballot This Fall" All signs indicate there will be two marijuana initiatives on the ballot in San Bernardino this fall. More than 7,000 signatures - practically double what was required - were turned in to city officials for a second measure also dealing with pot dispensaries. A possible third - initiative remains hazy.

If plans pan out, the show would be performed around the first anniversary of the massacre.

Valley College Cancels Plans For Stage Play About Dec 2 Terror Attack" San Bernardino Valley College has canceled its planned stage production recounting the December 2 terror attack, following outcry from families of the victims who died in the massacre.

8/1/16 REGIONAL WILDFIRES "Sand Fire Update" A report updating the fight against the Sand Fire burning out of control in Sand Canyon in Los Angeles County.

8/1/16 LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT "The City of San Bernardino Seeks Law Enforcement Trainees" The San Bernardino Police Department is recruiting local individuals interested in careers in law enforcement.

8/1/16 WILDFIRE SAFETY; DRONE SAFETY AND REGULATION "Feds and Industry Move to Keep Drones Out of Fire Areas" Private industry is working with the Department of the Interior to create "geo-fences" to keep hobbyist drones out of fire zones.

8/2/16 FOSTER CARE POLICY, SEX TRAFFICKING "Foster Care Reform Bill on the Way to Governor Brown" A bill protecting foster children from placement with parents who sexually trafficked them passed without opposition in the California Assembly. The

state Senate has also approved the bill, which is now headed to the Governor's desk.

8/3/16 DROUGHT AND WATER ISSUES "June Water Savings Lag In June" Californians saved less water in June than they have in previous years. It's the first month under new rules giving suppliers more autonomy to set their own conservation standards.

8/4/16 WILDFIRE SCIENCE, CALFIRE, WILDFIRE BUDGETS "California Wildfires: The New Normal" The overall number of acres burned by wildfires in the U.S. is closer to normal so far this year. In California, however, the "new normal" includes larger and more frequent wildfires.
