### **SECTION I. Issues**

- A) **Mental Health:** Even prior to the pandemic mental health issues, and specifically suicide, were increasingly in the spotlight and causing concern in Minnesota. Now we are seeing the stresses of the pandemic causing an elevated rate of mental health issues and suicide across the state.
- B) **Agriculture:** As the spring planting season approaches, an increased focus is put on farm and agricultural safety. A farmer is 800 percent more likely to die while working than people in other jobs, and agriculture plays an enormous role across southern Minnesota.
- C) **Education:** As children across southern Minnesota are back in the classroom following the holidays, many Minnesota families are concerned how Minnesota school districts are handling influenza, COVID-19, teacher & bus driver shortages, and school safety.
- D) **Safety:** Many Minnesotans view the state as being less safe that it was just a few years ago. Behavior changes that occurred during the pandemic may be to blame. Keeping themselves, their children, and families safe is always on the mind of Minnesotans
- E) **Healthcare:** Keeping their families healthy is likely the top priority of southern Minnesota parents and families. From flu shots to COVID boosters, and the best strategies for keeping kids safe & healthy – are all on the minds of Minnesotans searching for more information.

**Issue(s) Discussed:** Healthcare, safety

**Issue(s) Discussed:** Healthcare, safety, abortion

**Program Description:** During the program there was discussion of new evaluations on the best ways to treat diabetes in children, an update on the state-wide holiday DWI campaign from the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, and news from the Minnesota legislature as lawmakers pushed to include abortion rights into Minnesota law.

**Program Description:** During the program the hosts discussed the difficulty Minnesota hospitals are having trouble discharging patients into continuing care, managing holiday debt, and the recent single largest donation ever made to any Minnesota college or university.

**Program Description:** During the program the hosts discuss the large economic impact the Minnesota State University has on the state, the deepening of Minnesota's teacher shortage, and the newly released state budget and infrastructure program.

**Program Description:** This week's program included discussions on legislation focused on rural broadband and agricultural development, a federal push for expanded paid family leave, and the signing into Minnesota law the fundamental right to abortion.

**Program Description:** The program discussed the latest on new grants to help school districts install stop-arm camera systems on school busses, a large majority of Minnesota hospitals are continuing to hide the cost of care from consumers, and a recap of a busy week in Minnesota politics.
