# **TOP COMMUNITY ISSUES FOR KRXP.**

**FOR THE QUARTER BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2019 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2019.**

1. **CHARITY:** KRXP's support of The Place, formerly known as Urban Peak, and their winter clothing drive. KRXP collected tents, backpacks, boots, blankets, sleeping bags, and other cold weather items for homeless youth in the community.
2. **CRIME:** A Pueblo man has been arrested and charged with murdering his own mother, dismembering the body, stuffing it in a suitcase, and dumping it in a dumpster. The head, hands and feet are still missing.
3. **ECONOMY:** Zeezo's is officially closed. The magical store which has provided costumes and much more to Colorado Springs for 45 years, shut its doors on 11/2/19.
4. **EDUCATION:** The Westboro Baptist Church protest at Manitou Springs High School was met with at least 50 counter protestors.
5. **ENTERTAINMENT:** The Colorado Springs City Council approved the Colorado Springs Soccer stadium; groundbreaking took place on December 7 with a targeted opening date of March 2021.
6. **GOVERNMENT:** After a long wait, Proposition DD, which will allow casinos to have sports betting has passed at the state level.
7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** State health officials say that almost 300 people have contracted hepatitis A in Colorado since 2018. Health officials in Denver are working to curb the disease through a vaccination campaign.
8. **MILITARY:** The Colorado Springs area looks to see \$322 million in new construction on most of the bases and that includes money to establish the U.S. Space Force within the Department of the Air Force.
9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** The impeachment inquiry into President Donald Trump.

10. **POLICE & FIRE:** A Pueblo man has been arrested and charged with murdering his own mother, dismembering the body, stuffing it in a suitcase, and dumping it in a dumpster. The head, hands and feet are still missing.
11. **WEATHER & UTILITIES:** The Centers for Disease Control has chosen El Paso County as one of eight communities nationwide to participate in a study to evaluate the exposure to PFAS. Four state lawmakers met yesterday for a press conference and are calling for better and longer-lasting federal clean up solutions.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/31/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN The Pueblo man who killed and dismembered his mother, placed her body in a suitcase, and dumped it in a carwash dumpster has been charged with First Degree Murder.



KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/1/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN The Patrick Frazee murder trial started today and is expected to last at least three weeks. Frazee's girlfriend is expected to testify against him. If convicted, he faces life in prison without the possibility of parole.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/4/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Colorado Springs police are looking for two suspects they say robbed seven places in 27 minutes on the southeast side of town. Police say two male suspects entered the stores, brandished a weapon at the clerks and demanded money. Police have not found the suspects.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/5/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN A white supremacist was arrested in Pueblo Friday when he met up with undercover FBI agents in an attempt to bomb the Temple Emanuel Synagogue.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/7/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Testimony continued yesterday in the Patrick Frazee trial in Cripple Creek, his alleged accomplice and former lover took the stand revealing she was pregnant with his baby at one point. Frazee is accused of killing his fiancée and mother of his child as well as asking his ex-girlfriend to help him in the crime.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/11/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN A woman drove more than 2 miles in a stolen police cruiser before crashing it right in front of Penrose Hospital. Police say the suspect jumped in the vehicle while officers were investigating a disturbance on North Nevada near Garden of the Gods Road. When officers caught up with her a short time later, the vehicle was smashed, with pieces of the car strewn across the roadway. The woman tried to run, but officers apprehended her. No one was injured.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/19/19 6:10/7:10/8:10 1MIN Patrick Frazee has been found guilty of first-degree murder in the death of his fiancée, Kelsey Berreth. Jurors deliberated for a little over two hours yesterday after two weeks of testimony. He was sentenced to life in prison without parole plus 156 years for the other charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/21/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Colorado Springs police say a man was shot yesterday afternoon after trying to run from two robbers near Venetucci Boulevard, south of the Broadmoor World Arena. He remains in a hospital with a non-life-threatening injury. Police did not announce any suspects or arrests.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/22/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Colorado Springs police say a man robbed the First Bank at West Garden of the Gods Road yesterday. He escaped with an undisclosed amount of cash. Police did not say if the man was armed, nor did they announce any suspects or arrests.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/26/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Police say that an armed suspect is still at large. The suspect is a fugitive wanted on multiple arrest warrants. Police were initially following the suspect's car when he crashed on North Circle Drive. Officers then apprehended him and took him to UC Memorial Health Hospital to treat injuries from the car accident. At the hospital, the suspect was able to escape custody while undergoing medical treatment and fled while being pursued by a CSPD detective. The suspect got into a scuffle with the detective and managed to grab the officer's firearm, firing at least one shot before stealing an SUV from the hospital parking lot and fleeing the scene. No medical staff or patients were injured, but the detective did require medical attention.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/27/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Police in Fountain are crediting two customers with holding down an armed robbery suspect in a liquor store there. The attempted robbery happened last night in Fountain at High Spirits along S. Santa Fe Avenue. The suspect entered the store armed with a gun and demanded cash from the clerk, but two alert customers were able to hold him down until the police arrived.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/02/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Convicted murderer Patrick Frazee's alleged mistress, Krystal Lee will learn her fate today in court. Lee is the reason investigators knew Kelsey Berreth was killed on Thanksgiving Day, last year. She admitted she knew about Frazee's plan to kill Berreth, then cleaned up the crime scene and even disposed of Berreth's cell phone. She faces anywhere from 3 years to probation for tampering with evidence.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/03/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Krystal Lee Kenney, the key witness in the murder trial of Patrick Frazee, will be sentenced next month. When she is sentenced, she faces up to 3 years behind bars.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/04/19 6:10/7:10 1MIN Two people are in custody this morning after a vehicle pursuit in Colorado Springs. It ended at Academy near Flintridge drive. The chase started after 9:30 last night at Austin Bluffs and Academy. Colorado State Patrol hasn't said what initiated the chase but is reporting a trooper executed a maneuver to end the chase in a crash. No one was seriously injured and a man and woman were detained at the scene.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/04/19 6:10/8:10 1MIN Manitou Springs Police believe they have the person responsible for shooting another man in custody. The shooting happened on Nov. 23 in front of the Dillon Motel. Witnesses told officers the suspect left the area in a minivan. That suspect facing attempted murder charges. The victim is expected to survive.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/05/19 6:10/6:10/7:10/8:10 1MIN A violent rampage in a Pueblo neighborhood left one person dead, and three others injured in a bizarre string of attacks by an axe wielding man. The incidents are all under investigation. Witnesses say a man approached and attacked another man with an axe, and after a scuffle, ran away. That victim took himself to a hospital for treatment. Then, hours later, the suspect attempted to enter a home nearby and stabbed a man with a knife before running away. Police then got a call about another assault where the first one took place; it was a 75-year-old man in a wheelchair. Neighbors held down the suspect until police arrived, and the suspect stopped breathing. While investigating the third attack, police were approached by a neighbor who said there was a deceased male in her front yard. The suspect is a 34-year-old who is facing three charges of attempted murder

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/06/19 6:10/6:10/7:10/8:10 1MIN The suspect in a violent rampage which left one dead and three injured in Pueblo this week has been identified. The homicide victim has also been identified as 63-year-old Donald Ritchie of Pueblo. The 34-year-old suspect faces three charges of attempted murder and is still the main suspect in the homicide. He remains in serious condition in the hospital.

He then tried breaking into one home, and while police responded to that, a 14-year-old boy texted 911 saying a man had broken into his home and was in his bedroom. The boy's mother was able to lure the man away while her children hid and were eventually rescued out of a window by police. The 20-year-old man was taken into custody and is facing multiple charges.

That chain will add a second Colorado Springs location next month and has started hiring 95 employees to staff it. That new location will open Nov. 7 in the Powers Pointe shopping center, southwest of Powers and Barnes on the city's northeast side.
