TOP COMMUNITY ISSUES FOR KRXP.

FOR THE QUARTER BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2022 AND ENDING MARCH 31, 2022.

1. **CHARITY:** UCHealth's nonprofit, The Colorado Springs Health Foundation, sent out \$4.5 million to non-profits in El Paso and Teller counties. The grants covered everything from access to mental and physical health, and substance abuse disorder treatment. As well as suicide prevention, access to healthy, affordable food, and access to opportunities for physical activities.
2. **CRIME:** Barry Morpew's defense attorneys have filed a motion of dismissal in the case of the 2020 murder of his missing wife, Suzanne Morpew. According to court documents, during an Internal Affairs interview of one of the investigators, the investigator said arresting Morpew was "the worst decision that could have been made," and that had the prosecution not intentionally withheld evidence that would have cleared Morpew prior to the Preliminary Hearing, probable cause would not have been found.
3. **ECONOMY:** Governor Jared Polis announced that Colorado will become the first state to accept cryptocurrency as payment for state taxes and fees. Polis said the state will take the digital coin payments and deposit the equivalent value in dollars into the state's treasury.
4. **EDUCATION:** District 11 has a stark warning for parents everywhere, after it was revealed that three of their students have died of fentanyl overdoses this year. The D-11 Chief Communications Officer says the district is launching a campaign called "Fake and Fatal" to try to educate students about the dangers of fentanyl, and that middle and high schools will have Narcan on hand. In the most recently-announced case, authorities say a Mitchell High Student took a deadly dose of fentanyl in a school bathroom. The woman who sold the drugs was in court on 3/17/22. The district noted that the transaction likely stemmed from social media and urged parents to monitor their children's accounts.
5. **ENTERTAINMENT:** Will Smith marched on stage and smacked presenter Chris Rock during the 2022 Oscars after Rock made a joke about the appearance of Smith's wife, Jada Pinkett Smith. Smith twice shouted at Rock to "keep my wife's name out of your (expletive) mouth." Rock made a joke about Pinkett Smith's shaved head. Pinkett Smith revealed in 2018 that she was diagnosed with alopecia, and has often discussed the challenges of hair loss. Moments after the slap, Smith was awarded best actor for his role in "King Richard" and apologized to the academy during his speech.

6. **GOVERNMENT:** President Joe Biden addressed the nation and announced a new round of sanctions targeting Russia after its invasion of Ukraine, charging that Russian leader Vladimir Putin “chose this war” and that his country will bear the consequences of his action. The United States and its allies will block assets of four large Russian banks, impose export controls and sanction oligarchs. Biden also said the U.S. will be deploying additional forces to Germany to bolster NATO, though Ukraine is not a member. Also announced, The U.S. Army says 3,800 soldiers from Fort Stewart, Georgia, are among 7,000 additional forces deploying to Europe.
7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** The Biden administration will significantly loosen federal mask-wearing guidelines to protect against COVID-19 transmission effective immediately. This means most Americans will no longer be advised to wear masks in indoor public settings. The new metrics will still consider caseloads, but also take into account hospitalizations and local hospital capacity. Under the new guidelines, the vast majority of Americans will no longer live in areas where indoor masking in public is recommended based on current data that Daily COVID-19 cases have dropped 90% in the US since mid-January.
8. **MILITARY:** The Army says it will immediately begin discharging soldiers who have refused to get the mandatory COVID-19 vaccine, putting more than 3,300 service members at risk of being thrown out soon. The Army now joins The Marine Corps, Air Force and Navy who have already discharged active-duty troops or entry-level personnel at boot camps for refusing the shots. Roughly 97% of all Army soldiers have gotten at least one shot.
9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** Police in Denver are investigating after a box of human heads was stolen from a freight company’s truck this last week. The Denver Police Department said in an email that the human remains were being transported for medical research purposes. Investigators believe someone broke into the parked truck that had the box inside it between Wednesday afternoon (3/2/22) and Thursday morning (3/3/22). Denver Police asked anyone who finds the blue-and-white box marked with a label saying "Exempt Human Specimen” to call them. No arrests had been made as of Saturday afternoon.

- 10. POLICE & FIRE:** Investigators looking for the cause of the Marshall Fire that destroyed nearly 1,000 homes and buildings have narrowed their search to a sparsely populated neighborhood near Boulder. Authorities say it's the same area where a passer-by captured video of a burning shed on the day the fire began. The Boulder County Sheriff says it could be weeks before authorities release details on the investigation. Experts from the FBI, the ATF, and the U.S. Forest Service are helping with the investigation. Meanwhile, teams continued searching for two people who were still missing, and survivors sorted through the charred remnants of their homes to find whatever was left.
- 11. WEATHER & UTILITIES:** (3/24/22) A tornado ripped through parts of New Orleans and its suburbs last night, flipping cars and ripping roofs off homes and killing one person. The fatality happened in St. Bernard Parish, which borders New Orleans to the southeast. A neighbor of the 25-year-old who died said his roof was ripped off, and there was nothing left of his neighbor's house. The same storm system spawned tornadoes in Texas, where one woman died, and dropped torrential rain while shredding buildings in Alabama on Monday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/03/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Police Department is investigating a stabbing that happened early Saturday. Officers were flagged down just before 1 a.m. after responding to a disturbance call on Mazatlán Circle. Police found two victims, one with several stab wounds, and another with superficial wounds to the neck. Police applied a tourniquet to the more injured victim. Police say the man was attacked by someone he knew for an unknown reason. Police have identified a possible suspect, but it's unclear if they've been arrested.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/03/2022 1 MIN. A scary night for those dining out at an Old Chicago in Colorado Springs last night. Patrons reportedly wrestled a gun away from a suspect after shots were fired at the restaurant located at North Academy and Austin Bluffs. Responding officers discovered a single gunshot had been fired through a glass door leading into the restaurant. The suspect was later contacted at their residence and taken into custody with no further incident.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/05/2022 1 MIN. Pikes Peak Crime Stoppers has increased the reward being offered for information leading to an arrest in a shooting that left two people, including a boy, dead and several others injured at the Memorial Park Skate Park on November 20. Pikes Peak Crime Stoppers is now offering \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest of whoever was responsible for the deadly shooting. If you have information, call Crime Stoppers at 634-STOP.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/18/2022 1 MIN. A Pueblo woman shot and killed at a Dollar General over the weekend has been identified. Renee Francisca Dominguez, who was 38, died at the scene Friday after police say she was chased by the gunman from the parking lot into the store. The suspect was shooting as he ran after her. The incident happened at the Dollar General on 4th street at around 8 pm. The suspect was discovered with a self-inflicted gunshot wound and pronounced dead in El Paso County.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/19/2022 1 MIN. Pueblo Police are on the hunt for a suspect who committed a crime caught on camera against a teenager. Video shows a man with a gun approaching the teen who was standing on the side of a black truck. The teen gets on his knees as the man points the gun at his head, and demands the teen's phone. The victim is heard saying, "I have nothing," and even empties his pockets to prove it. That's when the suspect kicked the victim in the groin and took off. Anyone who knows the suspect's identity should call Pueblo Police at 553-2502.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/24/2022 1 MIN. One man is dead after firing shots while driving in Colorado Springs Saturday. Police say a woman called 911 at around 4:20 p.m. to report a man "menacing" her while driving northbound on I-25 near Briargate Parkway. She said the man driving next to her pulled out a handgun and fired it. Deputies with the El Paso County Sheriff's Office along with Colorado State Patrol located the suspect's vehicle and witnessed the suspect shooting into the air while they were following him. The pursuit ended in Monument where the suspect took his life.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/24/2022 1 MIN. Another shooting in Colorado Springs Friday night likely stemmed from a road rage incident, according to Police. Officers responded to an area near North Gate Road and Roller Coaster Road at around 4:30 p.m. Police say two people got into some type of verbal argument over driving that turned physical, and then ended with at least one shot being fired. One person was injured and they are expected to survive. Police say everyone involved is accounted for and they don't believe the public is in danger.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/24/2022 1 MIN. A woman in Colorado Springs says she was held at gunpoint and kidnapped while shopping Saturday afternoon. The alleged kidnapping happened in an area in the 500 block of S. 8th street, when the victim says a 30-40 year-old Hispanic male approached her in a black SUV, and forced her into his car at gunpoint. After several hours, she was able to escape. Colorado Springs Police were unable to locate the suspect or the vehicle.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/28/2022 1 MIN. Letecia Stauch, the El Paso County woman accused of brutally murdering her stepson, appeared in court yesterday, exactly two years to the day since she reported 11-year-old Gannon Stauch missing. Letecia remained quiet during the hearing. The judge on the case said that evidence from her original cell phone, and the 2 phones she purchased out of state could be used as evidence against her, something her attorneys were trying to keep out of the trial.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/02/2022 1 MIN. A judge has granted a change of venue for the ongoing Barry Morphew murder case. The judge agreed with the defense's argument that Morphew would have a hard time getting a fair trial in Chaffee County. The judge stated that since it is a high profile case in a relatively small county with a small jury pool it would be better to hold the trial in Fremont County. However, the court declined to grant the defense's request that the trial be held outside the 11th Judicial District altogether.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/07/2022 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police say the same suspect was behind two shootings two miles apart overnight. The first shooting happened on Galena Drive just before 2:45. Police say the suspect fired at a vehicle following an attempted assault. Luckily no one was injured but the suspect fled the scene. Then 2 miles south, at an apartment complex on Rebecca Lane, police were called to another shooting. A woman had been shot several times in the chest. She was rushed to the hospital and is expected to survive. Police say the suspect information and vehicle description in both incidents matched. Detectives have not identified the suspect at this time.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/08/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Police Department is actively investigating a possible homicide inside a home early this morning after responding to a report of a disturbance near Bugle Drive near N. Union and Dublin. The call came in after 2 a.m. and responding officers found a woman suffering from trauma. First responders attempted to save the woman but she died from her injuries. CSPD's Violent Crime Section Homicide/Assault Unit has taken over the investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/09/2022 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office announced yesterday that possible remains of Kara Nichols, a woman who disappeared in October of 2012, have been located in the Black Forest area. She was reported missing on October 14, 2012, and was last seen on Mission Road in Colorado Springs. According to Sheriff Bill Elder, detectives re-interviewing someone connected to the case who provided new information which led to the search along Burgess Road in Black Forest. They believe the remains to be Kara. A suspect was arrested Monday and is charged with 2nd-degree murder.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/10/2022 1 MIN. The Fremont County Sheriff's Office says the FBI is involved in a death investigation out of Phantom Canyon. Yesterday they found the bodies of two men in a ravine and say their injuries were consistent with foul play. The bodies were located near County Road 67 in the area of mile marker 10.5. The area is between Colorado Springs and Canon City. No further information was released.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/14/2022 1 MIN. A new bill introduced in the House Committee, and sponsored by El Paso County Democratic Representative Marc Snyder, aims to extend service hours for businesses who have a liquor license. If passed, a business would need to apply for an extended service hours permit, and if approved, they would be able to operate between the 10 hours of 5 A.M. and 2 A.M., or between the hours of 7 A.M. and 4 A.M., but not both. The bill is getting pushback from the Mothers Against Drunk Driving group who say that it could put more stress on officers and that it's a safety issue.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/24/2022 1 MIN. Governor Jared Polis announced yesterday that Colorado will become the first state to accept cryptocurrency as payment for state taxes and fees. Polis said the state will take the digital coin payments and deposit the equivalent value in dollars into the state's treasury. The announcement comes as legislators in other states, including Arizona and California, are proposing laws which, if ratified, would deem cryptocurrency an accepted form of payment statewide, not just for tax purposes.

The bill would eliminate barriers such such as mandatory home inspections, parenting classes, finger-printing, and criminal background checks when a child is conceived as a result of assisted reproduction. One State Representative and her wife learned about the burdens firsthand when they were undergoing in vitro fertilization to conceive their daughter. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/04/2022 1 MIN. For years, Colorado residents haven't been allowed to smile in their Driver's License photos. Now thanks to a pilot program in the state, for a limited time you can now smile in your photo. The Communications Director for the Colorado Department of Revenue said for years residents have been asking to smile in their photo. Currently, the rule is that people need to keep a straight face for security/identity purposes pertaining to illegal acts such as fraud. There's no word on when this trial phase will conclude.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/10/2022 1 MIN. Mesa County Clerk Tina Peters turned herself in to police yesterday, and her bond was posted at \$500,000 cash. A grand jury in Colorado indicted the county election clerk who sowed doubt about the 2022 presidential election. The indictment alleges Peters was part of a deceptive scheme to breach voting system technology used throughout the U.S. Peters was elected to the post in 2018, and is charged with 10 counts. They included attempting to influence a public servant, criminal impersonation and first-degree official misconduct. She issued a statement saying the investigation was politically motivated. Also facing charges in the case is Deputy Clerk Belinda Knisley.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/14/2022 1 MIN. Tired this morning? A bill making its way through the Colorado legislature aims to give Coloradans the option to end daylight saving time by voting on a ballot measure in November. Some say more crashes happen on the day after the time change, because people are tired, and some doctors believe a change in sleep schedule could cause heart attacks, or even strokes. If passed, Colorado would remain in MST year-round.

The FDA also said everyone eligible for a Pfizer booster can get one as early as five months after their last dose rather than six months. The decision now goes into the hands of the CDC, who will ultimately decide whether to recommend boosters for the younger teens.

District 11 announced that as students and staff return back to school tomorrow, they get to decide if they want to wear a face covering and get vaccinated from COVID, as both are not required. However, if you ride the bus, a face covering is required, as that is a federal mandate. The school district says the goal is to keep students and teachers in the classroom.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/05/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Department Of Corrections announced that as of yesterday, in-person visitation will be suspended for the time being. La Salle Street, is stepping up by providing the community with COVID-19 tests and medical supplies to those feeling ill. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/07/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment says it is having issues getting an accurate report of coronavirus cases across the state, due to several factors, one being at-home tests which aren't being reported to the state. Another factor is holiday gatherings. The state says that if you take an at home test and it seems inconclusive, but you have symptoms, get a PCR test. In that case, there isn't a need to report your at-home results, as PCR test results are already reported to Public Health.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/07/2022 1 MIN. Colorado College announced that all students, staff, and faculty are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 to include the booster shot. The college will also require everyone to wear a KN95 mask or a similar, aerosol filtering masks such as N95, KF94, or FFP2. According to the CC website, the campus is trying to reduce the risk of infection, and keep in-person classes, field trips and other activities resuming on a regular basis.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/18/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Attorney General has shut down two COVID-19 testing sites. The parent company Macagain, was ordered to close its locations because they failed to report test results and cases as required by law. A spokesperson for the company said the failure to report data wasn't intentional, and that they were running into trouble uploading the data online due to system errors. Most already are vaccinated and will get boosters of the omicron-based vaccine or the original version. Some unvaccinated volunteers will get three omicron-based doses. The original vaccines still offer good protection against severe illness and death. Studies have made clear that adding a booster dose strengthens that protection.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/26/2022 1 MIN. If you weren't aware, there is a new sub-variant of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 called Omicron BA.2, or "stealth" Omicron since it's harder to detect. The Colorado Department of Health and Environment says the sub-variant is already in the state, as it was detected in late December in the Denver metro area. Some scientists worry it could be more transmissible, because "stealth" Omicron is less detectable, but they say there's a lot they still don't know, including whether it evades vaccines better or causes more severe disease. To protect against it, doctors continue to urge vaccination and the usual coronavirus precautions.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/27/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and Colorado School of Public Health have released an updated statewide modeling report suggesting that the current curve of the Omicron variant of COVID has started to decline and should continue to do so in the weeks ahead. They say immunity to omicron is high and rising, and the model estimates that 80% of the state population will be immune to omicron by mid-February. Currently one in 19 are contagious with the variant, and about 45% of the population has had it. By the end of next month they estimate that to rise to 65%.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/28/2022 1 MIN. More than 78,000 free KN95 and surgical-grade masks made it into El Paso County yesterday courtesy of the state with plans for distribution tomorrow. More than two dozen people were killed in the 2017 attack in Sutherland Springs when Devin Patrick Kelley opened fire during a Sunday service. A lawsuit alleged the Air Force might have prevented the deaths by flagging Kelley’s prior assault conviction, preventing him from legally buying the weapon used in the shooting.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/08/2022 1 MIN. A 24-year-old Fort Carson soldier was arrested for weapons charges and driving under the influence early Sunday morning. Colorado Springs Police say the suspect allegedly fired a gun into the air six to eight times while leaving a bar in downtown Colorado Springs. The incident happened near Kiowa Street and Tejon Street just before 2:00 a.m. on Sunday. Witnesses heard the shots from inside Blondies. The soldier was taken into custody and luckily no one was injured.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2022 1 MIN. Fort Carson announced it will be conducting prescribed burns in training areas and Pinon Canyon Maneuver Site beginning next week and will continue intermittently until April 15. The installation says the program is critical to reducing wildland fire potential and will only be conducted if the weather is favorable. Smoke from the burns will most likely be seen along I-25 and Highway 115 from Colorado Springs to Pueblo. Concerned citizens can call the base.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2022 1 MIN. The Local 7 chapter of the United Food and Commercial Workers International Union held votes yesterday. The strike would not begin until at least after their current contract expires, which is 11:59 p.m. on Saturday. The union says King Soopers is evading the union to hire outside workers at a higher rate, prohibiting union activity, trying to bargain directly with workers instead of the union and imposing unfair wage changes

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/07/2022 1 MIN. Colorado authorities say last week's wildfire caused \$513 million in damage and destroyed 1,084 homes and structures. It's the first estimate of economic damage for the Dec. 30 blaze, the most destructive wildfire in state history. Authorities previously estimated that at least 991 homes and other buildings were destroyed. Two people are missing, though officials have found partial human remains at one location.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/19/2022 1 MIN. Three of Tonga's smaller islands have suffered serious damage from tsunami waves, according to officials and the Red Cross. Scientists say the eruption of the undersea volcano was 10 megatons, more powerful than a nuclear bomb. The string of islands is home to about 100,000 people who lost communication after the explosion. It's still unclear the toll the explosion has taken on the local area. The once in a millennium event also caused a Pacific-wide tsunami that smashed boats in New Zealand, and caused an oil spill and two drownings in Peru.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/24/2022 1 MIN. Police in Pennsylvania say a truck carrying about 100 monkeys was involved in a crash and authorities are searching for at least three of the monkeys that appeared to have escaped the vehicle. A Pennsylvania State Police Trooper told reporters that the truck carrying the animals crashed with a dump truck Friday afternoon. She said the truck had been on its way to a lab. Authorities have asked residents who might see the monkeys to call state police. It was unclear if any people or animals were injured in the crash.

Security Council is scheduled to meet today for the first time on Russia's troop buildup and threatening actions against Ukraine at the request of the United States. All key players are expected to square off in public over the possibility of a Russian invasion and its global impact. The U.S. Ambassador said Russia's actions pose "a clear threat to international peace and security and the U.N. Charter." However, Russia's deputy ambassador called the proposed meeting a "PR stunt."

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/01/2022 1 MIN. An uncontrolled fire raging at a North Carolina fertilizer plant forced the evacuations of thousands of people as firefighters warned early this morning that chemicals at the site could cause a large explosion. Authorities drove through neighborhoods and knocked on doors asking residents to leave within a one-mile radius of the plant in Winston-Salem, where the fire started last night. Bright orange flames and thick plumes of smoke could be seen around the fully engulfed building. The Winston-Salem Fire Department said the evacuation area included about 6,500 people in 2,500 homes.

Investigators say a man who allegedly kidnapped an employee at the western Colorado ranch owned by former New York City mayor Michael Bloomberg at first asked her where the billionaire's daughters were and later went on rants about Bloomberg, saying he wanted to "make an international scene" with him or his daughters. The Bloomberg family was not at the ranch when the 48-year-old suspect allegedly kidnapped a female worker at gunpoint Wednesday and forced her to drive him in her vehicle, ending up in Wyoming. He was charged with kidnapping in federal court Thursday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/09/2022 1 MIN. A new bill introduced last week would prohibit Colorado employers from denying employment to or firing workers because of their off-the-clock cannabis use – either medical or recreational. House Bill 1152 would also require employers to let their workers consume medical marijuana on the job with exceptions of workers whose jobs are in dangerous fields or require fine motor skills, such as positions involving the use of heavy machinery.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/14/2022 1 MIN. Super Bowl 56 is in the books. The L.A. Rams came back from behind to defeat the Cincinnati Bengals, 23 to 20. Rams receiver Cooper Kupp was named the Super Bowl MVP. He caught two touchdown passes. Long time Denver Bronco turned Ram credited the Broncos for his victory yesterday. Miller had two tackles and two sacks in the game. He also broke up one of the Bengals' quarterback's passes, which saved a touchdown.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/17/2022 1 MIN. The omicron wave that assaulted the United States this winter also bolstered its defenses. Millions of Americans' immune systems now recognize the virus and are primed to fight it off. One estimate says 73% of Americans are, for now, immune to omicron, and that could rise to 80% by mid-March.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/21/2022 1 MIN. The U.S. and Russian presidents have tentatively agreed to meet in a last-ditch diplomatic effort to stave off Moscow's invasion of Ukraine. A new bill introduced in the House Committee, and sponsored by El Paso County Democratic Representative Marc Snyder, aims to extend service hours for businesses who have a liquor license. If passed, a business would need to apply for an extended service hours permit, and if approved, they would be able to operate between the 10 hours of 5 A.M. and 2 A.M., or between the hours of 7 A.M. and 4 A.M., but not both. The bill is getting pushback from the Mothers Against Drunk Driving group who say that it could put more stress on officers and that it's a safety issue.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/23/2022 1 MIN. A fire aboard a huge car transport ship adrift in the mid-Atlantic is dying out. The blaze has burned for six days in Portugal. A Portuguese Air Force helicopter evacuated 22 crew members last week. The ship was carrying \$401mworth of cars, including Porsche, Audi, Bentley and Lamborghini models. The cause of the fire is not known, though suspicion has fallen on lithium batteries in electric vehicles which were headed to the U.S. from Germany.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/25/2022 1 MIN. Russia is pressing its invasion of Ukraine to the outskirts of the capital. This comes a day after it unleashed airstrikes on cities and military bases and sent in troops and tanks from three sides. Explosions sounded before dawn in Kyiv and gunfire was reported in the city center today. Western leaders scheduled an emergency meeting. This comes as this morning the Kremlin says Russia is ready to send a delegation to Belarus for talks with Ukrainian officials.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/25/2022 1 MIN. President Joe Biden addressed the nation yesterday and announced a new round of sanctions targeting Russia after its invasion of Ukraine, charging that Russian leader Vladimir Putin "chose this war" and that his country will bear the consequences of his action. The United States and its allies will block assets of four large Russian banks, impose export controls and sanction oligarchs. Biden also said the U.S. will be deploying additional forces to Germany to bolster NATO, though Ukraine is not a member. Also announced this morning, The U.S. Army says 3,800 soldiers from Fort Stewart, Georgia, are among 7,000 additional forces deploying to Europe.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/01/2022 1 MIN. Russia's military assault on Ukraine is now in its sixth day. A miles-long convoy of Russian tanks and armored vehicles is inching closer to the Ukrainian capital and fighting has intensified on the ground as there are reports that more than 70 Ukrainian soldiers were killed after Russian artillery hit a military base. Meanwhile, civilians, families and children are huddling in underground subway stations and other shelters.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/03/2022 1 MIN. The U.N.'s top human rights body is holding an urgent debate on the situation in Ukraine and the possibility of creating a panel to investigate any Human Rights violations during Russia's war with its neighbor. There are 47 members, including those from Ukraine and Russia, and a vote is expected tomorrow on whether to set up a three-person expert panel. The panel would seek to collect and analyze evidence that could be used by a court, such as the International Criminal Court, which has already launched its own investigation over Russia's invasion.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/07/2022 1 MIN. Police in Denver are investigating after a box of human heads was stolen from a freight company's truck this last week. The Denver Police Department said in an email Saturday, that the human remains were being transported for medical research purposes. Investigators believe someone broke into the parked truck that had the box inside it between Wednesday afternoon and Thursday morning. Denver Police asked anyone who finds the blue-and-white box marked with a label saying "Exempt Human Specimen" to call them. No arrests had been made as of Saturday afternoon.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/08/2022 1 MIN. A Las Vegas Metro police officer is accused of three casino heists. The 33-year-old former officer was in court yesterday to face charges for a robbery last Sunday. The FBI said in one of the robberies the suspect walked up to a cage with his service weapon and demanded cash. The cashier handed bundles of cash worth a total of nearly \$74,000. In a separate robbery, he pointed his weapon at a cashier before shoving her to the ground and told her, "This isn't your money, it's not worth losing your life over," as ran off with \$11,000 but was tackled by security. After his arrest he identified himself as a police officer. A search of his home found evidence connecting him to the crime, and eviction notices.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/09/2022 1 MIN. President Joe Biden has announced that the U.S. will ban all Russian oil imports, toughening the toll on Russia's economy. But he also acknowledged it will bring costs to Americans, particularly at the gas pump. Biden said the U.S. was acting in close consultation with European allies, who are more dependent on Russian energy supplies.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/10/2022 1 MIN. Russian airstrikes have hit three hospitals in Ukraine, including two west of the capital, one a maternity and children's hospital in Mariupol, where 17 people were wounded. Ukrainian officials labeled it a "war crime." Meanwhile, while some worry about the situation in Chernobyl, several nuclear energy experts told The Associated Press that there is no imminent danger because the fuel rods have been cooling for more than 20 years already, it is not a situation like the 2011 Fukushima nuclear disaster or even like the original Chernobyl meltdown nearly 36 years ago.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/11/2022 1 MIN. Investigators linked multiple "swatting" calls targeting schools in El Paso County and across the U.S, to a juvenile in Arvada, who is also suspected of trying to extort girls for sexually explicit images and videos. The identity of the suspect isn't being released due to his age. Members of the Internet Crimes Against Children Unit, which is headed by the Colorado Springs Police Department and comprised of detectives from the El Paso County Sheriff's Office, and special agents with the Homeland Security Investigations – took over the investigation. Another female juvenile suspect was taken into custody tied to the case. The pair are facing a number of charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/11/2022 1 MIN. In huge sports news, the Major League Baseball lockout is over. Owners and players reached a new collective bargaining agreement yesterday, ending the 99-day lockout. Opening Day is April 7th, and teams will play a full, 162-game season.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/18/2022 1 MIN. A second American man was killed in a Russian attack in northern Ukraine yesterday where he was seeking medical treatment for his partner. The death of Jim Hill, of Diggs, Idaho, was reported yesterday by his sister. In a post on Facebook, she said he was waiting in a bread line with several other people when they were gunned down by Russian military snipers. Ukrainian officials reported that 10 people were killed Wednesday while standing in the bread line. This comes as today, President Joe Biden will speak with China's President to discuss ongoing economic competition between the two countries and Russia's war against Ukraine.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/21/2022 1 MIN. Colorado is now one of three states where body composting is a legal form of burial, and one man became the first in the state to undergo the process. The family donated the man's remains to help restore the Colorado Burial Preserve, and they were turned into a rich soil which was laid out in Florence over the weekend. Human composting became legal in Colorado last year as a green alternative to burial or cremation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/22/2022 1 MIN. Mud-stained wallets and bank cards are among personal effects found on a mountainside where 132 lives were presumed lost when a China Eastern plane inexplicably fell from the sky and burst into a fireball. Video clips show small pieces of the plane and exposed earth where the plane crashed, but no survivors have been found. Investigators are looking into why the Boeing 737-800 made a steep dive shortly before it would have begun its descent to land. The search for the black boxes holding the flight data and cockpit voice recorders will be difficult at the remote site, as it is only accessible by foot or motorcycle.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/24/2022 1 MIN. A tornado ripped through parts of New Orleans and its suburbs last night, flipping cars and ripping roofs off homes and killing one person. The fatality happened in St. Bernard Parish, which borders New Orleans to the southeast. A neighbor of the 25-year-old who died said his roof was ripped off, and there was nothing left of his neighbor's house. The same storm system spawned tornadoes in Texas, where one woman died, and dropped torrential rain while shredding buildings in Alabama on Monday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/24/2022 1 MIN. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky will remotely address NATO members today, and is calling on people worldwide to gather in public to show support for his country. Zelensky said he would ask the alliance to provide "effective and unrestricted" support to Ukraine, including any weapons the country needs to fend off the Russian onslaught. NATO estimates between 7,000 and 15,000 Russian soldiers have been killed in Ukraine.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/24/2022 1 MIN. Madeleine Albright, the first female secretary of state, has died at age 84. Her family says she died of cancer yesterday. Albright was a mentor to many current and former American statesmen and women. During the Clinton administration, she was the highest-ranking woman in the history of the U.S. government. In 2012, President Barack Obama awarded Albright the Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/28/2022 1 MIN. A wildfire south of Boulder that forced nearly 20,000 people to flee was listed at 35% contained by yesterday afternoon and most evacuation orders had been lifted. Authorities say the fire burned to within 1,000 yards of residences, but fire retardant and other prep work helped save the homes. The fire is burning near an area where more than 1,000 homes were destroyed by The Marshall Fire pushed by strong winds in late December. The difference in the two fires was that crews were able to use aircraft to fight the fire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/28/2022 1 MIN. Will Smith marched on stage and smacked presenter Chris Rock during last night's Oscars after Rock made a joke about the appearance of Smith's wife, Jada Pinkett Smith. Smith twice shouted at Rock to "keep my wife's name out of your (expletive) mouth." Rock made a joke about Pinkett Smith's shaved head. Pinkett Smith revealed in 2018 that she was diagnosed with alopecia. She has often discussed the challenges of hair loss on Instagram and other social media platforms. Moments after the slap, Smith was awarded best actor for his role in "King Richard" and apologized to the academy during his speech.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/29/2022 1 MIN. It remains to be seen if Will Smith will be punished for slapping Chris Rock at the Oscars. But yesterday, he took the first necessary step if he's going to redeem himself, by apologizing directly to Chris. He said, quote, "I am embarrassed and my actions were not indicative of the man I want to be." and he added that "'Violence in all of its forms is poisonous and destructive.'"

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/29/2022 1 MIN. The first face-to-face talks in two weeks between Russia and Ukraine have begun in Turkey. An adviser to the Ukrainian president said the meeting was focused on securing a cease-fire and guarantees for Ukraine's security. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said his country is prepared to declare neutrality.

Investigators are still trying to determine what caused the fire which took nearly 1,000 homes and other buildings destroyed in suburbs between Denver and Boulder. The inferno broke out Thursday, unusually late in the year following an extremely dry fall and amid a winter nearly devoid of snow. Experts say those conditions, along with wind gusts, up to 115 mph helped the fire spread. The Boulder County Sheriff says authorities are pursuing a number of tips.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/03/2022 1 MIN. If you're looking to help out the victims of the Marshall Fire, Governor Polis says the best way is monetarily. However, there are a number of other ways you can help. If you have shelter to offer displaced residents, sign up to be a vetted host at Airbnb.com and you will be alerted through the Airbnb Open Homes Program if needed. You can also donate household items to local thrift stores. If you're looking to donate money, visit the Community Foundation, Boulder County website. The local YMCA is also taking donations, as is Disgruntled Vets and 22 until none. Items like baby wipes, hand sanitizer, and more are encouraged.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/04/2022 1 MIN. Investigators looking for the cause of the Marshall Fire that destroyed nearly 1,000 homes and buildings have narrowed their search to a sparsely populated neighborhood near Boulder. Authorities say it's the same area where a passer-by captured video of a burning shed on the day the fire began. The Boulder County Sheriff says it could be weeks before authorities release details on the investigation. Experts from the FBI, the ATF, and the U.S. Forest Service are helping with the investigation. Meanwhile, teams continued searching Monday for two people who were still missing, and survivors sorted through the charred remnants of their homes to find whatever was left.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/06/2022 1 MIN. Investigators looking for one of two people missing from the Marshall Fire have found partial human remains in an area near the suspected origin of the blaze. The Boulder County Sheriff's Office said yesterday investigators located the partial remains of an adult in the Marshall area south of Boulder. Authorities are conducting a separate search for a person reported missing in the hard-hit community of Superior.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/06/2022 1 MIN. Congressman Joe Neguse announced that he and Governor Jared Polis will host President Joe Biden tomorrow as he tours the damage of the Marshall Fire. They will also reportedly discuss the urgent need for federal support. The Congressman has been working with the President's administration and FEMA to advocate for victims impacted by the fire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/07/2022 1 MIN. Colorado authorities say last week's wildfire caused \$513 million in damage and destroyed 1,084 homes and structures. It's the first estimate of economic damage for the Dec. 30 blaze, the most destructive wildfire in state history. Authorities previously estimated that at least 991 homes and other buildings were destroyed. Two people are missing, though officials have found partial human remains at one location.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/03/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Bureau of Investigation issued a statewide alert yesterday for a possible kidnapping of a 46-year-old woman in Rio Blanco County which is on the northwest side of the state. Just before 6 last night, investigators released information that the woman may have been kidnapped by a man driving a maroon Ford F-150 with Colorado license plate AIA-728 and a camper shell. Police say the woman was likely taken by the suspect at 11 a.m., and was last seen yesterday near Golden at around 3:30 p.m. Call 911 if you see the vehicle.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/03/2022 1 MIN. The Garfield County prosecutor says he cannot prove that any individual is responsible for the 2021 death of a 6-year-old Colorado Springs girl who died on an amusement park ride at Glenwood Caverns Adventure Park, and that he has decided not to file charges in the case. In a letter, the prosecutor says he doesn't have enough evidence to determine which of two park workers failed to buckle a safety belt for Wongel Estifanos before she fell from the Haunted Mine Drop ride. The ride plunges passengers 110 feet inside Iron Mountain. Estifanos, who was on vacation with her family, died Sept. 5.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/07/2022 1 MIN. The Pueblo Police Department says four juveniles are in hospitals across the state after a serious car crash on I-25 in Pueblo yesterday morning. Police responded just before 1 a.m. to the crash on I-25 northbound at the 13th Street off ramp and found four kids inside of a truck with serious injuries. The initial investigation found that the vehicle was northbound when it left the roadway, hit a light pole, and then a guardrail. Police said alcohol and speed are believed to be factors in the crash. Three of the four victims were air-lifted to Colorado Springs and Denver area hospitals. Anyone with information about this incident, please contact Pueblo Police at 553-2502.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/10/2022 1 MIN. One person is dead following a single-vehicle accident along Highway 78 in Pueblo County. The Colorado State Patrol says the crash was reported at 7:41 last night. CSP says the vehicle missed a curve and drove off of the road, and off a cliff, falling roughly 300 feet. The accident happened near milepost 22, just past Rock Creek Road.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2022 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office is disputing information posted to the El Paso County Wildland Fire Team's Twitter page stating that 18 of their volunteer firefighters abruptly resigned due to a hostile environment. The statement also referenced a letter detailing grievances that had been delivered to the Sheriff. The Sheriff's Office says it has no idea who made the posts, and that future information relevant to the EPC Wildland Fire Team will be disseminated by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office only. This all comes as the Fountain Fire Chief was terminated pending an appeal as of this past Friday. Details on why were not available.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2022 1 MIN. A deadly crash is under investigation in Pueblo. According to the Colorado State Patrol, an 86-year-old woman was making a left turn onto Highway 50 from 36th lane at around 4 p.m. when a truck driving eastbound struck the woman's vehicle. The 86-year-old and a juvenile in her vehicle died in the crash and another child in the car was rushed to Children's Hospital with life-threatening injuries by helicopter. The 31-year-old man driving the truck had minor injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2022 1 MIN. Colorado Springs firefighters responded to a house fire in which a neighbor described an explosion this morning. Luckily no one was injured. The fire happened at a home near Memorial Park off of Vermijo and Cedar at around 1 this morning. Firefighters arrived within about five minutes and put the fire out. No one was home at the time, and it's unclear if there was an actual explosion or if it was noise from the fire. The cause is under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/18/2022 1 MIN. A horrible head-on collision killed five dogs near the El Paso/Fremont County line late yesterday morning. The crash happened around 10 on Highway 115 just south of Turkey Creek Road. State Patrol said two pickup trucks collided head-on, leaving one person trapped inside of their vehicle. It's unclear if the dogs were riding in the bed of one of the trucks or were inside. Both drivers were transported to the hospital, one was airlifted. The force of the impact nearly ripped one of the trucks in half. The road was slushy and icy in the area of the crash but it's unclear if that played a role. The crash remains under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/21/2022 1 MIN. 80 acres burned in Eastern El Paso County yesterday. According to the El Paso County Sheriff's Office, the fire started in the 36000 block of Judge Orr Road, southeast of Calhan. Officials with Calhan Fire, crews from Simla, Ellicott, Calhan, and the Tri County Fire Departments all responded. What caused the fire remains under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/23/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Police Department and the Colorado Springs City Attorney's Office, has expanded the "no sitting" city ordinance. The ordinance prohibits any sitting, kneeling, reclining, or lying down on the surface of any public right-of-way and prohibits any objects from being placed on the surface of the right-of-way. Public rights-of-way include streets, sidewalks, trails, paths, alleys, parkways, curbs, medians, traffic islands, etc. The ordinance will apply to areas from Cache La Poudre to East Cheyenne Road, with varying east and west boundaries and is effective immediately.

Another crew was also called to assist. The entire 10th floor was evacuated as crews worked the fire in one unit.
