FOR THE QUARTER BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2021 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021.

1. **CHARITY:** X1039's support of The Place Night Out Project on 11/18/2021. The event focuses on youth in the Pikes Peak Region experiencing homelessness, and how staying the night outside will raise awareness and funds for the nonprofit. It is happening on a weeknight so those volunteering can see what it's like to wake up from the street and go to school or work. Sign up at theplacecos.org.
2. **CRIME:** FBI agents and local police are investigating at least five different crime scenes in Denver after a shooter allegedly went on a "killing spree" on Monday 12/24/2021, killing five and wounding two others. Authorities say all of the victims were known to the suspect through personal or business relationships. The suspect died following an exchange of gunfire with police. Prior to the shooting, federal law enforcement was aware that the suspect harbored extremist views and had a history of psychiatric episodes.
3. **ECONOMY:** Mountain Metro Transit is experiencing a driver shortage, and if you take public transportation it could affect you. The company has to cut routes, as they are down 25 drivers making it even difficult for them to cover and produce more routes. As of now, there is no restoration plan in sight. As part of the reductions, Mountain Metro is no longer running routes 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 35, and 38.
4. **EDUCATION:** Falcon School District 49's School Board met last night to officially approve the terminations of many staff members, including three Vista Ridge High School principals who left the school suddenly nearly two weeks ago. The High School secretary said they could not elaborate on why due to it being a personnel matter. Other staff expected to be fired include the former Falcon High School Football Head Coach and Assistant Coach after an investigation revealed coaches and parents didn't report what they knew about an alleged hazing incident.
5. **ENTERTAINMENT:** South Park creators Matt Stone and Trey Parker announced yesterday that they have partnered with an award winning restaurateur who will be the executive chef of Casa Bonita, meaning better food is in the future for the restaurant. The pair made the \$300 Million purchase yesterday after a judge finally approved the sale. The chef, Dana Rodriguez, was born in Chihuahua, Mexico, and she says she looks forward to making Casa Bonita a place where people look forward to the food, drinks, and good times.

6. **GOVERNMENT:** Pueblo's mayor Nick Gradisar is calling on the Pueblo County Board of Health to issue an indoor mask order throughout Pueblo County, after he says hospitals are at capacity. The mayor said hospitals are sending patients away to La Junta because there are no available beds. The mayor is expected to send the letter today, and if the board approves, it will last through January 31, 2022 unless the board chooses to extend or terminate the order sooner.

7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** A person in California has become the first in the U.S. to have an identified case of the omicron variant of COVID-19. Dr. Anthony Fauci said the person was a traveler who returned from South Africa on Nov. 22 and tested positive on Nov. 29. The person was vaccinated against COVID-19 but had not received a booster shot. The person was said to be experiencing mild symptoms but was improving. The news comes as scientists continue to study the risks posed by the new strain of the virus.

8. **MILITARY:** A woman who calls Colorado Springs and Divide her hometowns was one of 10 new NASA astronaut candidates announced earlier this week. Out of 12,000 applicants, Nichole Ayers stood out. She is a major in the US Air Force, and just one of a handful of women who can fly the F-22 Raptor. Ayers graduated Woodland Park High School before earning a degree in mathematics with a minor in Russian from the U.S. Air Force Academy. She will report for duty in January 2022 to complete two years of astronaut training.

9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** The FBI's Denver office said yesterday, that a comparison of dental records confirmed that the remains discovered Wednesday 10/20/21 in a swampy nature preserve near North Port, Florida were Brian Laundrie. Laundrie disappeared Sept. 14, two weeks after the 23-year-old returned alone to his parents' home in Florida after a cross-country trip with Gabby Petito whose remains were found in Wyoming.

10. **POLICE & FIRE:** Colorado officials say nearly 1,000 homes and other structures were destroyed, dozens more were damaged, and three people are missing after a wildfire charred numerous neighborhoods in a suburban area northwest of Denver on December 30, 2021. Investigators are still trying to find the cause of the blaze. Authorities are pursuing a number of tips. Officials had previously estimated that at least 500 homes — and possibly 1,000 — were destroyed. The wind-whipped wildfire blackened entire neighborhoods in the area between Denver and Boulder with gusts up to 115 miles per hour.

11. WEATHER & UTILITIES: A powerful windstorm on 12/15/2021 wreaked havoc in the state. With gusts as high as 100 mph, downed trees, snapped power line poles, and fallen fences littering places everywhere. The winds caused semi trucks to flip over on I-25, many small fires were reported, and a gas line break happened at the Chapel Hills Mall due to the weather. Some people are still without power today, and Colorado Springs Utilities is hoping to have power restored for everyone "within the next day or two." Over 34,000 customers reported outages. Many Black Hills Energy customers in Pueblo were also impacted by an outage with no estimated restoration time.

KRXP IN STUDIO: 10/01/2021 1 MIN. Starting today, SNAP recipients will start receiving a significant increase every month on their benefits. The increase will be just over \$36 per person per month, or about \$1.19 per day. One expert says this is big, because usually the increase is about \$1-\$2 per person or it doesn't increase at all at times. If you are experiencing hunger or are struggling to afford nutritious food and are not currently participating in SNAP, you can apply at any time at any local human services office, call 2-1-1, or apply online at the Colorado PEAK website.

KRXP IN STUDIO: 10/05/2021 1 MIN. If your plans take you to Denver next week, Meow Wolf announced a special supply drive in support of local Indigenous people on Indigenous People's Day, October 11 from 10a-6p. The Denver Indian Center needs donated goods and supplies to give to the local Indigenous community which is a population disproportionately impacted by the ongoing pandemic. Specifically requested items include: Baby food and formula, Diapers, Educational toys and books, Cleaning supplies, including disinfectant wipes and spray, Liquid hand soap and dish soap, Hand sanitizer, Toilet paper, and Disposable masks.

KRXP IN STUDIO: 10/07/2021 1 MIN. A group of men rebuilt the bathroom of a Colorado Springs woman whose video of a former contractor demolishing it went viral. The woman, who had a dispute with the original contractor, allegedly had paid half the balance of the bathroom job because she was unhappy with the work. She called them to install a shower door, and that's when the contractor took a sledgehammer, and started demolishing the bathroom, in what he called a "repossession."

KRXP IN STUDIO: 10/05/2021 1 MIN. One indigenous-owned restaurant in Colorado Springs is serving the community with delicious Native-American food and charity services. Carefree Bar & Grill's owner, part of the Ho-Chunk nation of Wisconsin, serves up fry bread, Indian tacos, bison burgers and more. The restaurant is closed Monday's but that's when she opens the door for the Native American community with beading and also serves as an advocate for indigenous survivors of domestic violence. Currently, there is a donation box placed in front of Carefree Bar & Grill so the community can donate winter clothing to local native American families and other families in need. The box will be there until the end of November.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/12/2021 1 MIN. A Colorado Springs homeless man has been given a new start after a viral TikTok. The former chef and his wife have been living in their van for 18 months after losing his job due to the pandemic. By chance in a Wal-Mart parking lot, a man who runs a foundation called the “Dream Machine” heard his story and got to work making the former chef’s dreams come true posting a video online and gaining attention. On Sunday, the homeless man was gifted a \$40,000 food truck at America The Beautiful Park and served up his famous nacho tacos that went viral on TikTok. The goal was for him to make \$50,000 in a day.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/04/2021 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office is investigating a deadly officer-involved shooting that happened yesterday afternoon. According to CSPD, an officer attempted to stop a shoplifting suspect at the WalMart off of Platte Avenue and Chelton Road. The suspect was tased by the officer, and still was able to get away. He hid behind a car, where he fired a shot at the officer. The officer then returned fire, hitting the suspect, who died on scene from his injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/04/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police responded to a domestic violence incident in which a man was struck in the head by a machete early yesterday morning. According to police, the reporting male said he was struck in the head by someone he knew, who had fled the area, off of N. Academy Blvd. around 4 a.m. The man had a severe laceration to his head and a fractured skull. He is being treated at a hospital. Police are looking for Timothy Lott, and say that this is an isolated incident.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/08/2021 1 MIN. A deadly stabbing is under investigation, after one person was killed off of S. Nevada near I-25. It's not clear what led up to the stabbing but police say there was a disturbance between two people at a bus stop at around 8:30. When they arrived they found one man dead from his injuries. The suspect is still at large, and there is no description at this time.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/11/2021 1 MIN. Mark Redwine, the man who was convicted of murdering his 13-year-old son in 2012, was sentenced to 48 years in prison by a La Plata County judge. The presiding Judge said that Redwine still took absolutely no responsibility for what he did to his son, and added that he had trouble remembering a convicted criminal defendant that has shown such an utter lack of remorse for his criminal behavior.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/18/2021 1 MIN. A domestic violence incident ended in a suspect being shot in the face on Saturday morning in Colorado Springs. Police received several calls about the shooting which was the result of a 34-year-old man hurting a victim, who fled to a neighbor's home for help. The suspect shot at the home with a rifle, then grabbed an AR-15 and entered the home. The homeowner was armed and fired one round at the man, hitting him in the face. Responding officers took the suspect to a hospital where he's being treated for non-life-threatening injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/19/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police say a would-be armed robbery suspect got pepper sprayed when he demanded some items from a man exiting a business off of S. Academy. After getting sprayed in the face, the suspect attempted to carjack a vehicle nearby. The pepper spray proved too powerful so the suspect ran into a business to wash it off, and police found him inside and arrested him without incident.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/29/2021 1 MIN. An officer-involved shooting investigation is underway in Colorado Springs. It happened yesterday afternoon near the Vanguard School. Police were called to an area off of S. Nevada after witnesses reported seeing a man shooting into an occupied vehicle. Officers located the suspect in an area nearby and he pointed his weapon at them, prompting police to fire at least one shot; he then fled to the Vanguard School grounds. When confronted by staff the suspect left. Police then located the suspect on S. Wahsatch, where he again pointed his weapon. One more shot was fired at the suspect. He was then taken into custody and sent to a hospital for his injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/29/2021 1 MIN. A Pueblo woman is facing DUI charges after driving her car through her neighbor's home yesterday morning. The crash happened just after 8 a.m., and unfortunately a woman inside of the home was pinned by the car, and a gas meter was destroyed and leaking. Crews had to rescue the 46 year-old driver from the vehicle, and then had to remove a wall inside the home to rescue the homeowner who was pinned between the car and her wall. Both women suffered minor injuries. The driver was arrested on the DUI charges, and a warrant for failing to appear in court for a different DUI.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/01/2021 1 MIN. An investigation into a murder-suicide that left two adults and two children dead in the Sun Hills neighborhood in Gleaneagle is underway. Police responded to a 911 call from a young boy saying someone was seriously injured. When they arrived they found all four people deceased. No ages, relationship, or identifying information on those found have been released. If you have any information that can help this investigation call 520-6666.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/02/2021 1 MIN. We now know the identity of the suspect and victims in a murder-suicide in Monument on Saturday. Police say a 55-year-old man shot and killed a 50-year-old woman, and both 9 and 13 year-old-girls. Police responded to a 911 call after a young boy said one of his siblings wasn't moving. District 20 says it will be offering counseling services at Discovery Canyon Campus. One of the family members is a part of the US Air Force Academy Rifle team and is receiving support from their squadron. Neighbors say the Army veterans had a large household with 8 children, some were adopted, and the father owned a gun store in Colorado Springs.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/04/2021 1 MIN. Leticia Stauch is expected in court this afternoon to enter a plea of either "guilty" or "not guilty" in her case. She is accused of killing her 11-year-old stepson Gannon Stauch. She faces over a dozen charges, including first-degree murder. It is believed she killed Gannon in their Lorson Ranch home and drove his body to the Florida Panhandle where it was later found. On September 23, a judge ruled there was enough evidence to charge Stauch and move forward with a trial.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/08/2021 1 MIN. An early morning shooting happened yesterday at the Waffle House off of Powers Blvd in Colorado Springs. CSPD received calls about shots being fired into the restaurant as a disturbance escalated. Police said, according to witnesses, a group of six people in the restaurant confronted a Hispanic male. The victim was physically assaulted by the group before they left. A Hispanic man from the group was seen on surveillance coming back to the restaurant and firing 5 to 6 rounds from a pistol into the restaurant from the parking lot at the victim, who was still seated inside. The suspect fled the area immediately in an unknown vehicle. CSPD says surprisingly no injuries were reported. The suspect and members of the group have not yet been identified.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/08/2021 1 MIN. One person was killed and another injured after a fire at the Enfield Apartments off of Hancock Ave. last night. The Colorado Springs Fire Department reports it took over 30 firefighters to extinguish the fire that started on the third story floor. Colorado Springs Police report one person was killed trying to escape the fire. Officials say a suspect in custody who allegedly started the fire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/12/2021 1 MIN. Classes were canceled at Sierra High School yesterday after a student lit a flare inside of a classroom. Police say an officer discovered a student had lit the flare and let it burn on the floor inside of a classroom. A staff member was able to put the fire out with a fire extinguisher. The school was evacuated due to "heavy smoke," which led to the cancellation of classes. The student was identified and taken into custody, and it isn't clear if he or she will be facing charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/16/2021 1 MIN. The 20-year-old suspect arrested after setting a fire at the Enfield Apartments in Colorado Springs, killing one person and injuring several others last week told authorities that he can "communicate directly with God." He also stated that he believed he was an alien and "possessed by victims of the Holocaust." The suspect told police he started the fire on the burners of his stove, and according to a neighbor, he had made comments about letting the apartment burn because he hated the place. A 66-year-old man was killed trying to escape the fire by jumping from his third story window. The suspect is due in court later this week.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/30/2021 1 MIN. Yesterday, the El Paso County Sheriff's Office announced a juvenile is facing two charges of attempted murder following two shootings in Security/Widefield earlier this month. The first shooting happened on Nov. 19 at about 6 in the morning off of Highway 85/87. Deputies say the victim was shot in the face, was taken to the hospital in critical condition, and was later released. The next day, a second person was shot in the arm and survived near Highway 85 and S. Academy. The juvenile suspect has not been identified.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/01/2021 1 MIN. Crews were dispatched to an area near S. Academy Boulevard and Chelton Road just after 5:20 yesterday afternoon. Crews were able to tackle the flames in a short amount of time, and just a small area was burned. No injuries were reported, and firefighters believe the cause was debris that was left at the campfire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/07/2021 1 MIN. A construction worker was hit by a car in Pueblo yesterday morning. The crash happened just before 11:30 as the worker was repairing part of S. Santa Fe Avenue. The driver pulled over and cooperated with Police. They were cited for the crash and the worker is expected to survive.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/08/2021 1 MIN. A community is reeling after a deadly fire in the University Park Neighborhood in Pueblo. The Pueblo Fire Department said a 4-year-old child was killed Tuesday night in the fire. The task force was investigating the Sutra Healing Center in Security/Widefield for pimping and prostitution. The undercover officer then set up a party where the woman would bring other workers to perform sex acts. That's where the police made the bust. CSPD said that despite an internal investigation, the detective who received the service has not been placed on leave.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 10/21/2021 1 MIN. Five vehicles were damaged following a crash involving a dump truck yesterday afternoon at Stetson Hills and North Powers in Colorado Springs. The crash was reported just after 6:30 last night and was discovered just before 10. The FAA and NTSB have taken over the crash investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/30/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police and Fire Departments responded to a crash at N. Nevada Ave. and E. Columbia St. yesterday afternoon, after they say a woman driving down northbound Nevada crashed while changing the radio station. The crash happened just before 6 p.m. and police say the driver hit a parked car on the shoulder, flipping her vehicle on its side. Authorities say the driver sustained minor injuries. Alcohol was not a factor in the crash.

Firefighters in Colorado Springs had to rescue a utility worker after they fell into a trench and it collapsed on them yesterday morning off of Garden of the Gods Road. According to CSFD it took 40 firefighters about an hour to successfully free the person from the trench. They were taken to a hospital with lower extremity injuries. Fort Carson's Heavy Rescue Team was also called to assist with the rescue.

Yesterday the Utilities Board discussed the proposed increase to natural gas and electric rates. The rates still need to be approved by the Colorado Springs City Council. CSU said it understands it is a difficult time for its customers, but due to rising natural gas prices, and their inability to compete with larger bidders, the rates are a necessity, adding that they have many programs for those who may be struggling to pay their utility bills.

Those with 719 and 970 area codes, will now have to dial the full 10 digits when making a call, even for calls within the same city. CSU cites gas prices being up 100% from last year due to supply and demand. The increase would last through January of 2022, before dropping in February and increasing again in May. There are many resources available for those struggling to pay their utility bills.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 11/10/2021 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs City council voted unanimously yesterday to raise Colorado Springs Utilities natural gas and electric rates. Based on a sample residential bill, customers will see an almost \$29 increase per month increase to their bills starting Nov. 15. The council also rejected the Humane pet store ordinance, which would have banned puppies from puppy mills from being sold in pet stores. They cite one store being singled out, and not addressing the root of the problem.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 12/01/2021 1 MIN. The Colorado Department of Transportation started emergency paving yesterday morning on a stretch of I-25 just south of the Springs, and it's expected to last through Thursday. CDOT will fill potholes with asphalt and make repairs ahead of the looming winter weather. The paving will occur between South Academy Boulevard (exit 135) and Santa Fe Avenue (exit 128). Drivers can expect to see single-lane closures on both sides of the interstate between 9 a.m.-3 p.m. daily. The speed limit will be reduced to 55 mph while workers are out.
