- 1. **CHARITY**: Colorado College received the largest gift from an individual donor in the college's 147-year history. Yesterday, an anonymous donor made a \$33.5 million commitment to the college, with instructions for a large portion of the funds to go towards the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center at the College. The money will also help the college in its day-to-day activities, and will also help make the school more accessible for current and potential students, according to the acting co-president.
- 2. CRIME: A gunman opened fire at a birthday party in Colorado Springs, killing six adults before killing himself yesterday. Police say the shooting happened around 12:40 a.m. at a home on Preakness Way inside the Canterbury Manufactured Home Community on the east side of the city. The Colorado Springs Gazette reports officers arrived at a trailer to find six dead adults and a man with serious injuries who died later at a hospital. The suspected shooter was the boyfriend of a female victim at the party attended by friends, family and children. Children at the shooting were placed with relatives. Police have not released the identities of the shooter or victims. Authorities say a motive wasn't immediately known.
- 3. ECONOMY: JBS SA, the world's largest meat processing company who also has a plant in Greeley, says it paid the equivalent of \$11 million to hackers who broke into its computer system. The Brazil-based company said on May 31 that it was the victim of a ransomware attack, but yesterday was the first time the company's U.S. division confirmed that it paid the ransom. JBS said the vast majority of its facilities were operational at the time it made the payment. It said it decided to pay in order to avoid any unforeseen issues and ensure no data was exfiltrated. The FBI has attributed the attack to a Russian gang that has made some of the largest ransomware demands on record in recent months.
- 4. EDUCATION: Governor Polis announced the winners of the \$50,000 scholarships in the Colorado Comeback Cash drawing. The vaccinated teens were from Centennial, Boulder, Littleton, Longmont, and Grand Junction. One of the original winners was from Steamboat Springs, but he said during the news conference that he had a full-ride scholarship available to him, so he made his winning scholarship available to another vaccinated teen.

- 5. ENTERTAINMENT: Governor Jared Polis announced yesterday that Coloradans who are vaccinated against COVID-19 now have a chance of winning a million dollars. The Governor cited similar programs that are working in other states like Ohio, which saw a "surge of interest" in COVID-19 vaccines after the state announced its lottery. Governor Polis said the money is coming from unused funds which were set aside for vaccination advertising, and believed it would be more effective in the lottery than advertisements. The first drawing is June 4, with weekly drawings after that. Winners will be contacted by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, and you do have to be a Colorado resident, and at least 18 years old.
- 6. GOVERNMENT: Governor Jared Polis announced yesterday that Coloradans who are vaccinated against COVID-19 now have a chance of winning a million dollars. - 7. HEALTH & SAFETY: The State of Colorado has redefined what establishes a COVID-19 outbreak. As of yesterday, the state says, "five or more confirmed or probable cases of COVID-19, of which at least one case has had a positive test with onset in a 14-day period" would establish an official COVID-19 outbreak. Since the pandemic started, an outbreak was considered when two or more positive COVID-19 cases within 14 days.
- 8. MILITARY: After Vice President Kamala Harris was appointed as the Chair of the National Space Council, several Colorado Lawmakers are inviting her to come and see the state's space industry first hand. Senators Michael Bennet, John Hickenlooper, and other Colorado representatives extended the invite yesterday, citing Colorado's extensive involvement in space exploration and research, the U.S. Air Force Academy's top undergraduate aerospace engineering program, how the University of Colorado Boulder receives more NASA funding than any other public university and much more. Lawmakers also reaffirmed how Colorado should be Space Command's permanent home.

- 9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** (6/28/21) Rescue workers are still holding out hope they will find survivors as they head into a fifth day of digging through the rubble of a partially collapsed condo building outside Miami. The death toll stands at 9 as of this morning, but more than 150 people remain missing. Families of the missing rode buses yesterday to a site nearby from which they watched rescuers work. The Israeli Die-as-pra Affairs Minister led a humanitarian delegation that included several Israeli experts in search-and-rescue operations. He said the experts have told him of cases where survivors were found after 100 hours or more..
- 10. **POLICE & FIRE:** A 15-year-old and 9-year-old were killed April 17 while crossing Fountain Mesa Road and Mesa Ridge Parkway in Fountain. According to police, the boys were struck by a westbound vehicle as they crossed the road against a red light. The older boy died on the scene, and the younger was rushed to the hospital where he later died. A third boy, 15, was also struck and suffered minor injuries. The driver remained on scene and was cooperating with the investigation. Police are still investigating what led up to the crash but say it currently does not appear the driver committed any traffic violations.
- 11. **WEATHER & UTILITIES:** A massive four-year- project has broken ground in Colorado Springs with hopes to improve military access, mobility and safety along sections of I-25, as well as highway 94, S. Academy Blvd., and Charter Oak Ranch Road. The first project goes along highway 94 between Peterson and Schriever Air Force Bases. The second project is aimed to help people traveling between Peterson Air Force Base and Fort Carson. Though the new project will bring traffic congestion for the next couple of years, it's something CDOT leaders and Colorado Springs Mayor John Suthers say is necessary. The Mayor cited traffic congestion, long wait times, and a crash in those areas nearly every day.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/06/2021 1 MIN. A 24-year-old man has been sentenced to 30 years in prison for his role in the deaths of two Coronado High School students in 2017. The man was accused of killing 15-year-old Derek Greer and 16-year-old Natalie Partida in March 2017. The victims' bodies were found near Pikes Peak International Raceway. The man agreed to a plea deal last week, and a judge accepted it yesterday. The families were floored to hear the sentence and felt it was unfair. A spokesperson for the 4th District Attorney's office said, "You want to do what's best for the families, but you also are weighted on what's best for the community or the State of Colorado."

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/20/2021 1 MIN. A chase that started in Pueblo and ended in Colorado Springs had Northbound I-25 closed between Woodmen and North Academy yesterday. The incident happened around 5:30 p.m. According to the Colorado State Patrol, the vehicle was believed to be used in a robbery in Pueblo. Officers from the Fountain Police Department also assisted in the chase, where the suspect hit stop sticks near Woodmen Road. The vehicle came to a stop just south of the N. Academy exit after officers used a tactical maneuver. It all ended with an officer-involved shooting with the suspect who was taken to a hospital. The passenger was arrested. No civilians or officers were hurt during the chase.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/21/2021 1 MIN. A twist Pueblo Police weren't expecting when they responded to a stabbing of a man over the weekend. Police responded to a call on Saturday night where a man was beaten and stabbed, and while investigating that, they found that the man beaten had allegedly poured a liquid on his girlfriend and lit her on fire just days before. Police say the victim is in the hospital, her condition is unknown. The 31-year-old male faces numerous charges and police say he was beaten up by his "drug buddies" prior to his arrest.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/23/2021 1 MIN. In what is now the second deadly officer-involved shooting in Colorado Springs this week, police say they were forced to shoot a rifle-wielding suspect after a Taser failed to stop him yesterday. It started at the Quality Inn parking lot off of Garden of the Gods Road when police spotted a stolen vehicle and attempted to make contact with the person inside. The driver attempted to flee but ended up getting stuck on a curb. The suspect exited the vehicle with an AR-15 rifle, placed it under his chin and walked

toward Garden of the Gods Road. Officers ordered the suspect to drop his weapon to no effect. The suspect continued to the parking lot of a Phillips 66 gas station where he approached someone pumping gas. That's when a CSPD officer deployed their taser, to no avail, and then used a rifle to shoot the suspect one time. The suspect later died at the hospital, and the officer involved was placed on administrative leave. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office is heading the investigation. No officers or civilians were injured.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/27/2021 1 MIN. A spokesperson for Widefield District 3 confirmed that a Sproul Jr. High School student brought a gun to school on April 15, and is being disciplined. The district says the school intervened as soon as it learned about the gun, but would not say what kind of gun was confiscated, if it was loaded, or how long it was on campus. The district said all involved students and parents were notified about the incident, but one parent complained that all parents should have been informed about the incident.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/04/2021 1 MIN. Leticia Stauch, the woman accused of murdering her own stepson, will now get public defenders back, after she pushed to represent herself at trial for weeks. Yesterday, court documents shared on the case broke the news. This comes as last month Stauch lost her library privileges. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for May 20. It isn't clear if the trial date will be impacted by this recent change in representation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/05/2021 1 MIN. An armed and dangerous man wanted for multiple shootings in Colorado, was arrested yesterday morning following a statewide manhunt. Pueblo Police were searching for a 28-year-old man in connection with with a murder in the area of Berkley Avenue and West Summit Avenue at around 3 a.m. Sunday. When police arrived on the scene, they found a man suffering from a gunshot wound. He died on the scene. The suspect allegedly fled to Fremont county and shot a second person in Florence, who survived and was released from the hospital. The suspect then fled to Custer County where he was given money and a new vehicle. Police eventually located the suspect in Arapahoe County, and took him into custody.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/06/2021 1 MIN. The husband of Suzanne Morphew, the woman who went missing in Chafee County last year on Mother's Day, has been arrested on suspicion of first-degree murder and other charges in her presumed death. Authorities say Barry Morphew was arrested yesterday in connection with the disappearance of his wife. The Chaffee County Sheriff says the arrest is the result of an ongoing investigation that has so far involved over 135 searches across Colorado and the interviews of over 400 people in multiple states. Suzanne Morphew's body has not been found. Morphew's defense team declined to comment on the case.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/10/2021 1 MIN. A gunman opened fire at a birthday party in Colorado Springs, killing six adults before killing himself yesterday. Police say the shooting happened around 12:40 a.m. at a home on Preakness Way inside the Canterbury Manufactured Home Community on the east side of the city. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/21/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police officers responded to a neighborhood in Old Colorado City yesterday afternoon following multiple reports of a man entering homes and attacking people. Police responded to Pioneer Lane on the north end of OCC just after 2 p.m. According to police, a man had unlawfully entered multiple homes and assaulted residents. The suspect charged at police when they tried to make contact with him. He was tased before multiple officers were able to take him into custody. Two officers had minor injuries following the struggle. Several of the victims involved in the home invasions had non-life threatening injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/21/2021 1 MIN. A Lincoln County Sheriff's deputy is in serious but stable condition after being shot multiple times while responding to a theft call near Limon early yesterday morning. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office said just after 3 a.m., they received a call from a truck driver that someone had broken into the trailer of a semi and was stealing merchandise near Highway 40/Highway 287 south of Limon. Deputy Michael Hutton responded to the call, and within seconds of getting out of his vehicle to investigate, he was hit with a hail of gunfire and struck multiple times. It's not clear if he was able to fire back, and multiple other agencies immediately responded to his call for help. According to the sheriff's office, the suspect was found dead of a self-inflicted gunshot wound about 1,000 yards away from the scene. No details about the suspect were immediately available.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/02/2021 1 MIN. Multiple arrests have been made for what is believed to be the largest money laundering case in Colorado stretching from Pueblo to Cheyenne. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office says the investigation started in 2019 after it was believed criminals were targeting King Soopers, Walmart, The Home Depot and other major retail stores. Police say the suspects would steal merchandise and then sell the items on the open market. More than 31,000 items that were stolen were recovered at the Phone Store Denver in Aurora. About \$1.7 million worth of items were recovered and investigators believe more than \$5.2 million worth of goods were stolen over recent years. More than \$100,000 in gold and \$100,000 in cash were also recovered. The seven suspects face a number of charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/07/2021 1 MIN. A Colorado Springs Police officer was shot Friday night and the suspect is on the loose. According to CSPD, an officer tried to make contact with two suspicious people on motorcycles in the area of E. Fillmore Street and Nevada Street. One of the motorcyclists fired shots, hitting the officer; the gunmen fled the scene, but the officer did not return fire. Police say the other motorcyclist stayed on the scene. The officer is in "stable" condition. The incident is being investigated as an attempted homicide. The suspect has been identified as 25-year-old Jacob Aaron Sedillo. He is considered armed and dangerous. Anyone with information on Sedillo is asked to call police at 444-7000 or crime stoppers at 634-STOP if you wish to remain anonymous.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/14/2021 1 MIN. A 31-year-old Doherty High School basketball coach is in custody after police say he assaulted a 16-year-old female. He is charged with Sexual Assault on a Child by one in a position of trust. Academy School District 20 released a statement regarding the arrest stating the coach has been placed on administrative leave and that the 16-year-old victim was not a student in their district, and that the alleged assault did not happen on campus.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/14/2021 1 MIN. A wanted woman attempting to escape police, jumped out of a 2-story building on Saturday morning in Colorado Springs. Police got a tip about a stolen Home Depot truck's location near Garden of the Gods road, and found a man sleeping inside. He told police the driver was a wanted woman. When officers located her apartment and knocked on the door, she asked them to identify themselves, and when they did, police say they heard shuffling and a loud crash. She had jumped out of the window to escape, sustained injuries to her foot and leg and had to be transported to a hospital for treatment. She was arrested on multiple charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/15/2021 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office arrested a local unlicensed daycare provider in connection to an infant's death earlier this year. Deputies responded to a call concerning an unresponsive infant at a home on Widefield drive back on February 5. Numerous children ranging in ages from 18 months to 7 years old were reportedly at the in-home daycare. Lifesaving efforts were performed by medical personnel on the scene, and the infant was then taken to a hospital where they died. The Sheriff's Office initiated an investigation into the infant's death and the overall conditions at the daycare, and made the arrest yesterday after determining charges. The woman is facing felony Child abuse resulting in death and 16 counts of misdemeanor child abuse related to the other children being cared for at the daycare.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/25/2021 1 MIN. A scary road-rage incident in Pueblo left one man with a knife in his head. Pueblo Police received the call just after 10:30 Wednesday night. Investigators believe during the road rage incident, the suspect threw a knife and it stuck in the side of the victim's head. The victim then tried driving himself to the hospital. State officials are doing this out of an abundance of caution after the CDC and FDA released a joint statement saying the vaccine could cause blood clots. Federal officials got reports of six individuals in the U.S. who got rare and severe blood clots after receiving the vaccine, but say that the reaction is extremely rare. All six cases occurred among women between the ages of 18 and 48, and symptoms occurred 6 to 13 days after vaccination. Those who got the Johnson & Johnson vaccine more than a month ago are at low risk of serious side effects. Anyone who received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine within the last three weeks and develops severe headache, abdominal pain, leg pain, or shortness of breath should contact their health care provider.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/14/2021 1 MIN. CDPHE has suspended the Dr. Moma Health and Wellness Clinic in El Paso County from the COVID vaccination program, because they were unable to verify if the vaccines already administered at the site were viable because they failed to provide proper documentation of temperature storage. If you received one dose of Pfizer vaccine at a Dr. Moma vaccination clinic, that dose is considered invalid and you should receive two additional doses, the first, 21 days after your initial Pfizer dose and the Final dose of Pfizer 21 days later. If you received both Pfizer they're considered invalid and you'll need one dose 21 days after your second shot. If you got the Moderna vaccine at a Dr. Moma you'll need your first dose 28 days after your initial dose, and your final 28 days later. If you received both Moderna shots they're considered invalid and you'll need one dose 28 days after your second shot.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/15/2021 1 MIN. The State of Colorado is expected to give local governments control over COVID restrictions tomorrow, and Colorado Springs Mayor John Suthers says there will be no COVID-19 capacity limits for businesses, but social distancing will be required. Pueblo County health officials will stick with capacity limits, in line with the State's COVID-19 Dial, which will see changes on tomorrow as well. Douglas County commissioners voted yesterday to allow businesses and churches to decide their own capacity limits. The mask mandate is still in effect until May 3.

Governor Polis announced that there are now three mass vaccination sites offering COVID vaccines without appointments: Ball Arena in Denver: 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday. The CDC eased its guidelines yesterday on the wearing of masks outdoors, saying fully vaccinated Americans don't need to cover their faces anymore while walking, biking or running alone or with members of their own household. Those who are unvaccinated should still wear masks at small outdoor gatherings that include other unvaccinated people, and keep their faces covered when dining at outdoor restaurants with friends from multiple households. The CDC added that everyone, fully vaccinated or not, should keep wearing masks at crowded outdoor events such as concerts or sporting events. The Governor cited similar programs that are working in Ohio, which saw a "surge of interest" in COVID-19 vaccines after the state announced its lottery. Governor Polis said the money is coming from unused funds which were set aside for vaccination advertising, and believed it would be more effective in the lottery than advertisements. The first drawing is June 4, with weekly drawings after that. Winners will be contacted by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment; you do have to be a Colorado resident, and at least 18 years old.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/26/2021 1 MIN. The Pueblo Department of Public Health and Environment announced that the vaccination site at the Colorado State Fair Grounds will close for good on June 14. The site will still offer first and second doses until then, according to Public Health, but any second doses scheduled after June 14 will need to be administered by another provider.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/1/2021 1 MIN. OSHA has joined the investigation into what caused a furnace explosion that injured 8 at the Evraz Steel Mill in Pueblo Saturday night. Currently the site is closed while the investigation is underway. So far none of the injured have been released from the hospital, though they are all expected to survive their injuries. Firefighters responded to the plant just after 6 p.m. on Saturday after a furnace used to melt steel exploded. The explosion was heard from nearby homes, and smoke was visible for miles.

According to documents, The Evraz Steel Mill in Pueblo, where eight workers were injured in an explosion over the weekend, had been cited for putting employees at risk before. OSHA had issued citations for not having proper safety protections in place, such as fire extinguishers and guardrails, or not routinely inspecting large, overhead cranes. These citations precede last weekend's incident, in which eight people were hurt when a furnace inside the mill ruptured. Three of those people were seriously hurt and hospitalized.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/3/2021 1 MIN. Manitou Springs has officially ended its mask guidelines, deferring to the state's new guidelines for COVID-19 protections. Manitou was one of the last cities in the state that still had a local mask ordinance in place. The local requirement was announced quickly after Gov. Jared Polis said the statewide mask requirement was largely lifted in mid-May, with the city citing tourists as the main reason they kept it in place. Manitou Springs says individual businesses can still require masks, and the city is "strongly urging" residents and visitors to respect those rules.

Though Pueblo County has detected just 9 cases of the new variant, how widespread it really is remains to be seen, because the testing window which found the variant was from May 25 to June 12, meaning there are likely more than just the nine cases. The White House announced, First Lady Jill Biden will visit Fort Carson tomorrow afternoon, Biden will visit the Mountain Post to deliver remarks and meet with military spouses during a USO Military Spouse Connection event, in advance of Military Spouse Appreciation Day.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/05/2020 1 MIN. The Cheyenne Mountain Air Force Station Fire Department is scheduled to conduct fire training exercises today May 6, from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the installation. He then got on a nearby school bus but later let the driver and students off before driving the bus for several miles himself. The trainee was later arrested without incident and will face multiple charges including kidnapping.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/21/2020 1 MIN. Soldiers from the 4th Combat Aviation Brigade returned to Fort Carson after a year of deployment. A ceremony was held at Fort Carson, reuniting families and friends yesterday, and marking the happy occasion. Lawmakers issued a wave of statements offering their condolences and gratitude to the 41-year-old officer.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/06/2021 1 MIN. Two weeks following a horrific scene at a King Soopers in Boulder, investigators announced they have turned back over the store to the owners. Boulder Police made the announcement on Twitter and added the store remains closed to the public. Police are still investigating the mass shooting on March 22. The suspect is facing 10 counts of first-degree murder and is due back in court on May 25.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/16/2021 1 MIN. Eight people were shot and killed at a FedEx facility in Indianapolis overnight. The shooter then killed himself. A police spokesperson says several other people were wounded in the shooting. Five were hospitalized, including one person with critical injuries. Another two people were treated and released at the scene. The shooter has not been identified. Police are still at the scene conducting interviews as of this morning. Family members have gathered at a hotel to await word on loved ones. The facility is near the Indianapolis International Airport.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/19/2021 1 MIN. Texas authorities say two people have been killed in the fiery crash of a Tesla that had no one in the driver's seat. Police in Houston said there was a person in the front passenger seat and another in a rear passenger seat after the wreck Saturday night in the Houston suburb of Spring. It's unclear whether the car's driver-assist system was being used before the crash. Authorities are certain that no one was driving the car at the time of the crash.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/22/2021 1 MIN. The Boulder District Attorney is expected to hold a press conference this morning around 10 a.m. to discuss 43 new charges brought against the Boulder King Soopers Shooting suspect. The mass shooting happened on March 22, claiming the lives of 10 people including a police officer. The shooter is currently facing 10 first-degree charges, along with an attempted murder charge for shooting at another officer.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/04/2021 1 MIN. Authorities in Southern Colorado have arrested seven people after the mummified body of Amy Carlson, who was known as "Mother God" by her followers, in a group called "Love Has Won" was found dead in a home in Moffat yesterday. The remains were found wrapped in a sleeping bag and decorated with Christmas lights. A follower told investigators he had taken in a group of people he believes transported the body from California. Investigators say the remains appear to have been set up as a shrine. The cause and manner of death have not been released.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/04/2021 1 MIN. A Colorado Parks and Wildlife pathologist has confirmed that human remains were found in two bears near Durango, reinforcing suspicions that a 39-year-old woman was killed in a rare bear attack last week. Necropsies were performed on the mother bear and two yearlings suspected of killing and eating the woman on April 30. According to the victim's boyfriend, she is believed to have been walking her two dogs when they encountered the bears. He last spoke to her in the morning and discovered the dogs loose outside of their home at 9:00 p.m. He went searching for her and made the discovery. The bears were all euthanized out of abundance of caution.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/05/2021 1 MIN. Seven people are facing charges ranging from abuse of a corpse to child abuse after the mummified body of a religious leader was found inside a southern Colorado home. According to the arrest affidavit, after searching the Crestone home investigators found the remains of a woman decorated with Christmas lights and encased in a sleeping bag. The area around where her eyes would be was dressed up with glitter makeup. A sergeant described the display as "some kind of shrine." The deceased is believed to be Amy Carlson, the founder and leader of religious group "Love Has Won." She was known as "Mother God" to her followers. Investigators say one of the followers tipped off the Saguache County Sheriff's Office to the remains, and alleged the group was holding his toddler son and wouldn't let the child leave. Court papers say a 2-year-old boy and 13-year-old girl were found sleeping in the same home where the decaying remains were recovered.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/12/2021 1 MIN. More than 1,000 gas stations in the Southeast reported running out of fuel, primarily because of what analysts say is unwarranted panic-buying among drivers, as the shutdown of a major pipeline by hackers entered its fifth day. Government officials acted swiftly to waive safety and environmental rules to speed the delivery of fuel by truck, ship or rail to motorists and airports. Even so, they sought to assure consumers that there was no cause for alarm. The Colonial Pipeline, which delivers about 45% of the fuel consumed on the East Coast, was hit by a cyberattack on Friday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/13/2021 1 MIN. Federal officials say two airplanes collided in the air near Denver and were able to land without injuries yesterday. Authorities say the collision between a twin-engine plane and a single-engine plane as both were preparing to land at the Centennial Airport. Key Lime Air says its Metroliner's tail section was substantially damaged, but the pilot was able to land safely at the Airport. Authorities say a pilot and one passenger were on the other plane, a single-engine Cirrus SR22, which unleashed a red and white parachute and drifted safely down to a field.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/20/2021 1 MIN. Governor Polis announced an incentive program called "Colorado Jumpstart" yesterday with hopes to get unemployed people back to work. Some unemployed residents will be eligible to receive an incentive of up to \$1,600 to support the transition into full-time work. To qualify, unemployed workers must have received at least one week of unemployment benefits of \$25 or more between March 28, and May 16, of this year, and have verified their identities via ID.me. Eligible claimants who return to work full time in May will receive a Colorado Jumpstart incentive of \$1,600. Those who return to work full time in June will receive an incentive of \$1,200. Authorities say an off-duty Los Angeles County firefighter fatally shot a fellow firefighter and wounded another at their fire station before going to his nearby home, setting it on fire and apparently killing himself. According to Officials, a 44-year-old fire specialist died and a 54-year-old firefighter was shot at the small community station about 45 miles north of Los Angeles. The wounded man is in critical but stable condition at a hospital. There is no known motive at this time.

The world's largest meat processing company is getting back to work after production around the world was disrupted by a cyberattack just weeks after a similar incident shut down a U.S. oil pipeline. Brazil's JBS SA, which has a facility in Greeley said late yesterday, that it had made "significant progress" in dealing with the cyberattack and expected the "vast majority" of its plants to be operating Today. JBS is the second-largest producer of beef, pork and chicken in the U.S.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/8/2021 1 MIN. A tragic turn of events in a deadly crash near Castle Rock yesterday had the Interstate shut down for hours. The Colorado State Patrol says a 21-year-old driver heading southbound hit an Elk with his Trailblazer. The driver pulled to the left side of the shoulder near the center concrete barrier, and exited the vehicle with his 18-year-old passenger. A good Samaritan stopped to assist the pair and all were in different positions near the vehicle. Meanwhile a Toyota 4Runner heading in the same direction driven by a 70-year-old male, hit the elk laying in the road and then traveled on the left shoulder colliding with all three pedestrians. They were thrown over the concrete barrier into the northbound lanes. The 18-year-old woman from the Trailblazer died at the scene, and the others involved suffered injuries from life-threatening to non-life-threatening.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/8/2021 1 MIN. A Las Vegas woman suspected of killing her own child was last sighted in Colorado. Las Vegas authorities identified the suspect as 35-year-old Samantha Rodriguez, who was last seen in Denver driving a 2007 Dodge Caliber with California license plate 6WLH211. 7-year-old Liam Husted was found dead near the Mountain Springs Trailhead in Las Vegas on May 28. Yesterday authorities revealed his identity and also announced his mom is suspected of murdering him. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/15/2021 1 MIN. Emergency crews are battling massive fires at a chemical plant in Rockton, Illinois that exploded into flames yesterday morning. The massive explosion sent huge plumes of thick black smoke into the air and prompted officials to order an evacuation of residents and business within a one mile radius. A public health official asked residents within a 3-mile radius of the chemical fire to wear a mask when outside to avoid respiratory irritation. The plant, which is near the Wisconsin border and about 95 miles northwest of Chicago, manufactures grease products, lubricants and other fluids.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/28/2021 1 MIN. Rescue workers are still holding out hope they will find survivors as they head into a fifth day of digging through the rubble of a partially collapsed condo building outside Miami. The death toll stands at 9 as of this morning, but more than 150 people remain missing. Families of the missing rode buses yesterday to a site nearby from which they watched rescuers work. The Israeli Die-as-pra Affairs Minister led a humanitarian delegation that included several Israeli experts in search-and-rescue operations. He said the experts have told him of cases where survivors were found after 100 hours or more.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/01/2021 1 MIN. The Pueblo Fire Department responded to a vehicle fire 12 miles south of the city early yesterday morning. According to the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office, the fire was called in around 5 a.m. after a FedEx driver towing two trailers pulled off to the side of the road as they saw smoke coming from one of the trailers. The driver "instinctively" moved the truck and a second trailer away from the smoking trailer, and it wasn't long before the trailer caught fire. That trailer along with many of the packages inside were destroyed. Crews were able to save about half of the cargo in the trailer. Thankfully, no one was injured.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/02/2021 1 MIN. Sad news out of Penrose, as a firefighter died in a work-related incident. Yesterday the Penrose Fire Department shared a post on Facebook about the death of Assistant Chief Greg Gatzke, and didn't release further details. Fort Carson Fire Services also posted to social media about Gatzke, who was the Emergency Vehicle Technician for the base for 16 years. According to that post, Gatzke lost his life in a work accident on Wednesday. The Fort Carson Fire Department will be flying a memorial flag and wearing mourning bands in honor of the firefighter.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/06/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs firefighters rescued a worker stuck in the bucket of a boom truck near power lines yesterday afternoon. The call came in at about 4:30 p.m. and Colorado Springs Utilities assisted in the rescue, as they had to deactivate the power lines. The worker was finally rescued just after 7 p.m. and suffered no injuries. Crews say in this case if anyone had been in the area they could have gotten shocked.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/09/2021 1 MIN. Police released statistics from its joint safety operation on I-25 Wednesday. The Colorado Springs Police Department, the El Paso County Sheriff's Office and the Colorado State Patrol lined up along I-25 from the El Paso/Pueblo County line to the El Paso/Douglas County line between 6:30 A.M. and 3:30 P.M. During that time officers issued 311 citations, took 3 DUI drivers off the roadway, recovered 8 firearms, made 2 felony arrests, and cited several drivers for going at least 90 mph on I-25. One driver was going 102 mph. The agencies hope to impact aggressive driving behaviors and make a difference in the community.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/19/2021 1 MIN. A 15-year-old and 9-year-old were killed Saturday night while crossing Fountain Mesa Road and Mesa Ridge Parkway in Fountain. According to police, the boys were struck by a westbound vehicle as they crossed the road against a red light. The older boy died on the scene, and the younger was rushed to the hospital where he later died. A third boy, 15, was also struck and suffered minor injuries. The driver remained on scene and was cooperating with the investigation. Police are still investigating what led up to the crash but say it currently does not appear the driver committed any traffic violations.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/20/2021 1 MIN. One person was killed in a crash involving a scooter yesterday evening in Colorado Springs. According to police, around 4 p.m., a scooter traveling southbound on N. Academy Boulevard hit an SUV that was stopped at a red light at Maizeland Road. The driver of the scooter died at the scene. Investigators don't believe the driver of the SUV was under the influence and it isn't clear if the scooter was speeding at the time of the crash.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/20/2021 1 MIN. A deadly crash near the Garden of the Gods exit on Southbound I-25 closed the interstate yesterday morning. The crash was reported at 11:45 a.m. between Fillmore and Garden of the Gods. Police say a pedestrian was killed by an oncoming semi truck, and investigators are trying to determine if the man was walking across I-25 or near the interstate at the time of the crash.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/3/2021 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Fire Department says a cooking fire led to two people being displaced at a duplex east of downtown Colorado Springs late yesterday morning. A bystander called 911 after seeing smoke drifting out of the house just before 10:30 a.m. CSFD says the fire started in one half of the duplex and eventually spread into the attic and over into the other side of the duplex. Both the occupant who was cooking and his neighbor were able to escape safely. Firefighters had the blaze contained in under an hour.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/10/2021 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's office is investigating an inmate death at the El Paso County Jail yesterday morning. The inmate was found unconscious inside his cell just before 1 a.m. The Sheriff's Office said, "Life-saving measures were immediately started and continued until AMR and fire personnel arrived and took over," but the "Life-saving measures were unsuccessful, and the inmate passed away." The county coroner's office is conducting an autopsy to determine cause of death.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/10/2021 1 MIN. Multiple agencies helped recover a bear, after it fell down a waterfall at the Broadmoor Seven Falls. According to Colorado Parks and Wildlife, the bear was estimated to be 3-4 years old and 250 pounds. It first fell 15 feet down an

upper fall and was unable to move it's back legs. The bear then fell another 40 feet down the waterfall. Officers with Colorado Parks and Wildlife were called in to euthanize the crippled bear. Firefighters with the Broadmoor Fire Protection District and El Paso Search and Rescue team were brought in to help recover the remains.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/19/2021 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Police Department believe a homeless warming fire is the cause of the second blaze in as many months at Johnny's Navajo Hogan yesterday. The fire was reported just after 1 p.m. on the side of a building near the restaurant. Firefighters were able to get the blaze under control. This is the second fire this year at Johnny's Navajo Hogan. The first was back in January and originated in the basement. In both cases, no one was injured.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/20/2021 1 MIN. An Alexa device is credited with saving a home in Pueblo from burning down after it alerted the home owners their smoke detectors were going off. fire. Pueblo Fire Department responded to the home, and found heavy smoke in the kitchen and a box burning on a glass stovetop. According to PFD, the homeowners' had just dropped off their groceries and headed out for another trip. A few minutes later their Alexa device called them to inform them that the smoke detectors were going off. They immediately called 911 and units were dispatched. Firefighters say that your stovetop should not be used to store or hold flammable materials. The knobs can be bumped on and a fire can start.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/2/2021 1 MIN. Multiple arrests have been made for what is believed to be the largest money laundering case in Colorado stretching from Pueblo to Cheyenne. The Douglas County Sheriff's Office says the investigation started in 2019 after it was believed criminals were targeting King Soopers, Walmart, The Home Depot and other major retail stores. Police say the suspects would steal merchandise and then sell the items on the open market. More than 31,000 items that were stolen were recovered at the Phone Store Denver in Aurora. About \$1.7 million worth of items were recovered and investigators believe more than \$5.2 million worth of goods were stolen over recent years. More than \$100,000 in gold and \$100,000 in cash were also recovered. The seven suspects face a number of charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/9/2021 1 MIN. Pueblo Police are looking for a suspect involved in shooting an off-duty firefighter on Sunday. According to police, the gunshot victim was just one of several off-duty Pueblo firefighters standing outside of a building on N. Main Street who witnessed individuals harassing a homeless man. After coming to the homeless man's aid, the individuals who were harassing him reportedly left the area, and a short time later someone fired several rounds in the victim's direction. The victim was struck once in the leg. He was taken to a hospital and treated for non-life-threatening injuries. Police identified the suspect as 41-year-old Esteban Gallegos. If you have any information about this incident or the

whereabouts of Gallegos call 553-2502 or crime stoppers at 542-STOP if you wish to remain anonymous.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/14/2021 1 MIN. A Pueblo Police officer assisted a pregnant woman giving birth on Saturday evening. The officer was patrolling an area near HWY 50 and Club Manor when she heard a woman screaming for help. The officer located the pregnant woman behind a building giving birth. The woman was 9-months pregnant and began having contractions, while she and her boyfriend were out walking. The Pueblo Fire Department and American Medical Response responded, and she was taken to a local hospital.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/28/2021 1 MIN. Colorado Springs police arrested a man after he accidentally started a fire inside a storage facility yesterday. The fire was reported at Securcare Self Storage off South Academy near Airport Road just after 11 a.m. According to officials, the suspect had a stash of fireworks inside his storage unit, and while working on something entirely unrelated inadvertently lit the fireworks on fire. The fire spread from unit to unit, damaging eight in all, however another 50 units -- possibly as many as 100 -- have smoke damage. Firefighters had the blaze under control in just under 30 minutes. It's not clear what charges that man will face.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/28/2021 1 MIN. An apartment fire at the Montebello Gardens Apartments led to multiple rescues by firefighters yesterday afternoon. The Colorado Springs Fire Department said that the first call came in just before 3:30 p.m. at the complex near Academy Boulevard and Austin Bluffs Pkwy. The fire started in one apartment, and the resident reportedly fled her home due to heavy smoke. Two people in the building were rescued by firefighters using ladders to reach them, and at least four residents were taken to the hospital, including a child. The cause of that fire is still unknown and under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/29/2021 1 MIN. The City of Colorado Springs is continuing to grow, and so will the Fire Department. CSFD plans to build four stations and will need 200 personnel in the next five to 7 years. Two of the four future fire stations will be in the northeast part of town, and one of those, Fire Station 23, will have a groundbreaking ceremony in less than a month. CSFD expects to go on over 70,000 calls this year. Standard medical calls are 8 minutes or less, structure fires are 12 minutes, and the Fire Chief says he doesn't want those numbers to drop off over time because they don't have the stations needed. Colorado Springs Fire Department currently has 467 firefighters and 72 civilian staff, the next class of firefighters will begin the academy next month.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/25/2020 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Utilities is installing new meters in businesses and homes that it serves, in an effort to improve efficiency and save money. By the beginning of June, customers can expect to see their electric, natural gas, and water meters getting upgraded. The company projects it will take until 2023 to install all of the meters. Customers can expect a secure wireless communication network to CSU, giving customers more information about how much water, gas, or electricity they're using, along with providing a breakdown of usage throughout the day. It also means these meters can quickly provide information about leaks or outages. As always, scammers can be expected, so CSU says expect two pieces of mail notification and one phone call ahead of the new meter's installation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/27/2020 1 MIN. Those who travel on Gold Camp road starting today, expect up to one-hour delays. Tomorrow, the road will be completely closed. Crews from multiple agencies will work to remove the boulder that fell from the mountain above and closed the road on April 25. Crews are asking people to avoid the area.
