TOP COMMUNITY ISSUES FOR KRXP.

FOR THE QUARTER BEGINNING APRIL 1, 2022 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2022.

1. **CHARITY:** A Fountain police dog named Goose will receive a bullet and stab protective vest from a non-profit organization. Vested Interest in K9s, and sponsor John Allamani of Colorado Springs works with dogs in the U.S. that are at least 20 months old and actively certified with law enforcement or related work. Goose's new vest will have a patch that reads, "Honoring those who served and sacrificed."
2. **CRIME:** Family and friends are remembering a girl killed at a Walgreens in Colorado Springs on June 11. The group that gathered for a vigil last night say Riley Whitelaw was murdered by a coworker at the store near Centennial Road and Flying W Ranch Road on the northwest side of Colorado Springs. Colorado State Troopers arrested a man near Walsenburg wanted in connection with the homicide investigation later that night. Joshua Johnson, 28, was found walking along I-25. He's currently being held without bond at the El Paso County jail on a charge of first-degree murder.
3. **ECONOMY:** According to the latest Economic and Revenue Forecast by the Colorado Legislative Council Staff, many Coloradans now can expect about \$750 for individual taxpayers and \$1,500 for joint taxpayers in the form of TABOR refund checks.
4. **EDUCATION:** A Colorado bill to change Pikes Peak Community College's name was signed into law by Governor Polis. It's now known as Pikes Peak State College.
5. **ENTERTAINMENT:** Colorado Avalanche fans are ready to celebrate the franchise's third championship! The rally is scheduled to start at 9 a.m. inside Civic Center Park in Denver on Thursday, June 30. The parade is scheduled to start at about 10 a.m. at Union Station, 17th and Wynkoop. The route runs down 17th Street to Broadway and then south to Civic Center Park.
6. **GOVERNMENT:** The Government Accountability Office released its report on the decision to move the Space Force Command from Colorado Springs to Huntsville Alabama. The office was asked to review the process and methodology that led to the decision. The GAO looked at criteria including whether the process was comprehensive, well-documented, unbiased and credible, and found there were significant shortfalls in the decision-making transparency and credibility. The GAO says it is up to Congress and the Department of Defense to decide what to do with their report. Lawmakers are calling on President Joe Biden to review it.

7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** A 52-year-old man from Colorado Springs died on a trail after suffering from a heat-related illness in record-breaking heat. The Mesa County Sheriff's Office said the man ran out of water while biking the trail alone when three other riders stopped to check on him, but unfortunately, they had run out of water themselves and called 911 for help. A helicopter responded to the scene, and life-saving measures were given to the man but were unsuccessful. The other bikers were rescued from the scene. Hikers and bikers are reminded to be prepared for extreme weather situations, including having enough water.
8. **MILITARY:** The Memorial Day boating accident on Lake Pueblo has become even more tragic; the two killed were husband and wife Joshua and Jessica Prindle. Jessica, 38, was pulled from the water on the night of the incident. Her husband was found the next day. Neither was wearing a life jacket. Joshua Prindle was a soldier stationed at Fort Carson. The Prindles leave behind four children. A Gofundme has been set up for the family. According to officials, eight kids and five adults were piled on a smallish boat Sunday evening -- one that should have probably carried only five or six people.
9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** An 18-year-old gunman killed 19 children all located in one classroom at a Texas elementary school in the town of Uvalde yesterday. Two adults were also killed in the attack. A law enforcement official said the attacker was killed by a Border Patrol agent who rushed into the school without waiting for backup. It is believed the gunman shot his grandmother before carrying out the attack. Two other officers were also shot but are expected to be ok. Authorities are continuing to search for clues about the gunman's motive.
10. **POLICE & FIRE:** A busy 24 hours for fire crews on 5/12/22. The Colorado Springs Fire Department responded to a fire at a home in Security at around 9:45 a.m. on Chieftan Drive. Then in the afternoon, CSFD issued a mandatory evacuation order in the Stetson Hills area due to a grass fire. After nearly four hours, the evacuation order was lifted. In all, 30 acres were burned there. At the same time, another fire burning in a mobile home park located off N. Cascade near Fillmore, burned eight homes, killing one. A third fire was reported near the Colorado Springs Airport off Powers and Milton E. Proby Pkwy which was sparked by a Sheriff's Office vehicle. 182 acres burned in that fire, and no structures were damaged. Evacuation orders were issued for a large area west of Cripple Creek due to a fire.

11. WEATHER & UTILITIES: (5/10/2022) Three semi trucks were blown over yesterday in hurricane-force wind gusts on I-25, north of Walsenburg. Luckily all drivers escaped without injury. State Patrol said two flipped at mile marker 59, and another a few miles north of the Pueblo County line. Troopers say gusts were as high as 90 mph.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/01/2022 1 MIN. According to court documents released yesterday, a Colorado Springs man claims he killed his mother because he was possessed by a demon. The 48-year-old man says drugs put demons in him and he strangled his mother on what he believes was Mother's Day last year. Her body was found under a tarp on a property on West Cheyenne Road last May after crews responded to a fire at the home. On the same night, police received a call about a man intentionally hitting other cars with his truck, trying to run over one of the other drivers, and when they arrived, the man menaced police with a metal pole. He was tased and taken into custody. It wasn't until this week when police served him with the warrant for murder. He was still in custody for the other crime.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/01/2022 1 MIN. The 11th Judicial District Attorney has now called on the Colorado Bureau of Investigation to look into potential criminal allegations in the city of Florence. Florence has been at the center of a potential corruption inside city hall. Some of those allegations include misuse of funds, to include personal loans given to city employees, forcing employees to use COVID sick days to use federal money to pad the budget, and potential wiretapping at city hall. On March 22, all six city council members resigned, leaving only the mayor.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/04/2022 1 MIN. A shooting in Security is under investigation. It was reported just after 5 a.m. on Metropolitan near Fontaine Boulevard. Deputies found two shooting victims at the scene. Both victims are expected to survive. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office says a suspect matching the description of the shooter was located in an area near Stratmoor Valley along B Street, barefoot and carrying an assault rifle. He was taken into custody by the SWAT team.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/05/2022 1 MIN. A shootout on Saturday night in southeast Colorado Springs ended with the initial shooter in the hospital after he was run over with a truck by the people he was targeting, according to police. They say an 18-year-old man was shooting at people in a home on Astrozon Circle. The people in the home returned fire. Moments after responding, police received another call about a shooting on Barkman Drive. They say the residents ran over the shooter with a truck as he continued firing at them. Four people suffered injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/18/2022 1 MIN. An active shooter near Florissant yesterday caused evacuations of people from their homes for several hours overnight. The suspect allegedly shot into people's homes. When deputies finally made it into the house, they found the suspect had taken his own life. Deputies discovered several firing points staged around the house, aimed at neighboring homes. No motive is known at this time

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/20/2022 1 MIN. After 5 months in jail, Barry Morphew is a free man. The murder charges against him were dismissed yesterday, without prejudice, in Fremont County. His wife, Susanne Morphew, went missing nearly 2 years ago. Investigators say they're close to finding Suzanne's body in the mountains near their home. Charges can be refiled.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 04/29/2022 1 MIN. A lengthy standoff between a suspect and El Paso County deputies south of Yoder ended in an officer-involved shooting and a suspect believed to be buried under the remains of his burned home. Deputies went to the suspect's home after allegedly violating a protection order. Shots were fired from inside the home and surrounding neighbors were told to shelter in place. Firefighters were called but it was too dangerous to get near the home. Two deputies did fire on the suspect.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 05/04/2022 1 MIN. A man wanted out of Castle Rock for allegedly killing his mother was arrested yesterday in the Florida Keys. The 32-year-old was taken into custody at a gas station after being on the run for several days. Castle Rock firefighters were called to a house fire at a home in Castle Rock on April 26 where they discovered the body of the 59-year-old woman. Her son was identified as a suspect, and the search began. Someone tipped off the police that they had seen the man at the gas station. A 50-year-old Florida woman was with him at the time of his arrest but she was released.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 05/12/2022 1 MIN. Four Pueblo security guards at St. Mary-Corwin Medical Center have been charged with negligent homicide in the death of a man in February 2021. According to documents, the victim was in an altercation with the security guards before police arrived. He was taken to a hospital in Colorado Springs where he later died; the El Paso County Coroner ruled his death a homicide.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 05/20/2022 1 MIN. A former employee of a Pueblo West business is suspected of embezzling more than \$240,000. A 52-year-old woman was arrested yesterday. The investigation started in January of 2020 when the owner of P&A Flooring reached out after there had been thousands of dollars in fraudulent charges made on a company credit card. "After an extensive investigation, detectives learned that woman, who was the longtime bookkeeper for the business, had used the credit cards to charge more than \$212,000 in personal services, to include groceries, clothing and online purchases," "It was later learned that she made another \$41,000 in charges on two additional credit cards belonging to the business."

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 05/31/2022 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police responded to the Babilonia Bar on East Platte Ave. late Friday night for a report of a shooting of two people. Those victims were transported to a hospital. Police believe a third victim was shot but fled the scene. This is the third reported shooting at Babilonia Bar since the beginning of the year. Eight people have been shot near the bar since the start of 2022.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 06/03/2022 1 MIN. A convicted murderer on the run since escaping a prison bus in Texas after stabbing its driver last month has been fatally shot by law enforcement after he killed a family of five and took their truck. Prison officials confirmed the man was killed south of San Antonio yesterday. Police suspected he was hiding in a town nearby, and after a family member called in a welfare check, they discovered the remains of one adult and four minors. Authorities say the family was from Houston.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE: 06/10/2022 1 MIN. We were expecting a judge's decision today whether Leticia Stauch would face a jury trial or not, but unfortunately her state mental evaluation wasn't ready. Stauch initially pled "not guilty" in the case where she is accused of murdering her stepson, but later changed it to "not guilty by reason of insanity"; her defense lawyers filed a motion to waive a jury trial. The case is now postponed until July 28, with the possibility of a trial being set for next year.

Facing a nationwide shortage in truck drivers, Walmart said yesterday that they're increasing the salary truckers can earn in their first year to as much as \$110 thousand dollars. The average salary for a long haul truck driver is just over \$56 thousand a year. Sysco, another food distributor, is also advertising \$110 thousand a year to drive for them.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/08/2022 1 MIN. If you want a new gas guzzling GMC hummer, you're outta luck. The new hummers will only be electric. The price tag is somewhere between \$80 thousand to \$110 thousand. Already there are over sixty five thousand pre-orders. If you want to take it on a deep woods camping trip, ironically, you'll need to bring a generator and a whole bunch of gas....

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/13/2022 1 MIN. The mayor, John Suthers, announced yesterday the city will spend \$2.7 million dollars to combat litter. The campaign called "Keep it Clean COS" is not only about the city spending funds to clean up litter, but encouraging residents to do their part.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/14/2022 1 MIN. Co-workers who teamed up to purchase lottery tickets together for about 10 years now, have won a million dollars in the Colorado lottery. Before taxes, that comes out to \$70thousand dollars each.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/26/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs City Council voted yesterday to give Colorado Springs residents a \$14.54 per month natural gas break. It goes into effect may 1st. Along with the discount to our utilities, an Anti-prostitution ordinance passed. The ordinance is designed to help police crack down on illicit massage parlors

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/03/2022 1 MIN. An official groundbreaking was held yesterday at Acacia Park for a new playground area. The area is part of a bigger rejuvenation plan for Acacia park, which includes a permanent ice-skating rink that will become a lawn with turf games in the summer, a new visitor center, and permanent food stalls. The Uncle Wilbur Fountain will remain open during construction, with the new playground set to open Labor Day weekend.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/10/2022 1 MIN. The Front Range Passenger Rail Commission updated the Colorado Springs City Council about the study for the Amtrak Southwest Chief and Front Range Passenger Rail passenger station being proposed for the city. Several locations were cited as great potential spots for the station, including four downtown: America the Beautiful Park Area, Drake Power Plant Area Tejon - Nevada Area, and Rio Grande Depot area. If a location is selected, local and regional travel would be possible.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/18/2022 1 MIN. Governor Polis announced a new partnership yesterday to address the formula shortage impacting families across the country and in Colorado. Colorado and Mothers' Milk Bank are asking for donations of breast milk or financial donations that would help families with the cost of supply, and bringing awareness to an alternative supplemental milk supply during the current crisis. The findings showed the blood of the 346 participants, levels of PFAs in their blood were up to 6.8 and 1.2 times the national levels.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/09/2022 1 MIN. Officials say a Marine Corps aircraft carrying five Marines crashed in the Southern California desert yesterday afternoon. The Osprey belonged to the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing based at Camp Pendleton and went down at 12:25 p.m. during training in a remote area. Local and federal firefighters are responding. The site is about 115 miles east of San Diego. Information was still being gathered about the five Marines who were on board.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/15/2022 1 MIN. A man taking out trash in a Colorado Springs neighborhood yesterday recognized a grenade in a bin. The Colorado Springs Police Department responded to the call of explosives near Bonfoy Ave. and E. St. Vrain St., at about 10:30 yesterday morning. It was determined that indeed, explosives were found on the scene. The 71st Fort Carson EOD transported the device to Fort Carson for proper disposal.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/15/2022 1 MIN. Results are in from a CDC study on Security-Widefield residents' blood, and it's not good. A new report released by the federal government finds Security-Widefield residents have elevated levels of 'forever chemicals,' or PFAS, in their blood. The study was conducted in 2020, though this has been an ongoing problem for the area, as Peterson Air Force Base was using a firefighting foam since the 70s which contaminated the local water supply. The findings showed the blood of the 346 participants, levels of PFAs in their blood were up to 6.8 and 1.2 times the national levels.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/16/2022 1 MIN. Two U.S. veterans from Alabama who were in Ukraine assisting in the war against Russia haven't been heard from in days and are missing, according to family members. The U.S. State Department says it's looking into reports that Russian or Russian-backed separatist forces in Ukraine had captured at least two American citizens aged 27 and 39. If confirmed, they would be the first Americans fighting for Ukraine known to have been captured since the war began Feb. 24.

According to the Colorado State Patrol, the suspect had a warrant out of Minnesota, and would not stop after being pulled over. The chase started on Highway 85 heading south into Colorado. An Ault Police Officer and a State Trooper both successfully utilized stop sticks. The suspect lost control, swerved into a State Trooper's vehicle, and veered into a ditch. The trooper's vehicle flipped. Police say the suspect died from injuries sustained in the crash, as they believe he wasn't wearing a seatbelt. The trooper in the crash had minor injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/01/2022 1 MIN. Ukraine's nuclear operator company says Russian troops are leaving the Chernobyl nuclear power plant and heading towards the country's border with Belarus. Reports were confirmed that the Russians dug trenches in the Red Forest and received "significant doses of radiation." The forest is in the nearly four-square-mile area surrounding the Chernobyl plant within the Exclusion Zone. The operator said the Russian troops "panicked at the first sign of illness," which "showed up very quickly," and began to prepare to leave. The claim couldn't be independently verified.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/04/2022 1 MIN. Colorado lawmakers are working to make essential items, like period products and diapers, more affordable. The bill would create a tax exemption for all state sales and use taxes on period products and diapers. If passed, these products would join other tax exempt essentials like food and medicine.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/07/2022 1 MIN. Family members of an Indiana couple that had been missing for more than a week are trying to figure out how they got lost in Nevada's high desert. The wife survived but the husband didn't. Authorities say the 72-year-old man was dead when a search team reached them Tuesday about 177 miles northwest of Las Vegas. They also say the 69-year-old woman was airlifted to a Reno hospital where she's reported in good shape. They had been traveling from Oregon to Arizona.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/07/2022 1 MIN. Authorities in Washington D.C. say a fox that attacked a congressman and injured eight others on Capitol Hill has tested positive for rabies. A representative from California was walking to the Capitol for votes Monday evening when he was attacked. A warning noted that there are possibly several fox dens on the Capitol grounds, and unfortunately the fox that attacked tested positive for rabies and was humanely put down. Those bitten had to undergo a series of shots to stay well.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/03/2022 1 MIN. A draft opinion suggests the U.S. Supreme Court could be poised to overturn the landmark 1973 Roe v. Wade case that legalized abortion nationwide. That's according to a Politico report released yesterday. A decision to overrule Roe would lead to abortion bans in roughly half the states in the U.S. It's unclear if the draft represents the court's final word on the matter — opinions often change in the drafting process. A Supreme Court spokeswoman says the court has no comment. The Associated Press couldn't immediately confirm the authenticity of the draft.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/03/2022 1 MIN. Authorities are searching for an “extremely dangerous” murder suspect who escaped from an Alabama jail and the official they now believe may have helped him to escape. The thirty-eight-year-old inmate was scheduled for trial next month on a capital murder charge. The assistant director of corrections at the jail, told coworkers she was taking the inmate to the courthouse for a mental health evaluation. But authorities later determined that no such evaluation was scheduled. The Lauderdale County Sheriff said they have issued an arrest warrant for Vicky White on charges of permitting or allowing an escape.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/05/2022 1 MIN. Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser announced his office has secured millions of dollars for tens of thousands of low-income Coloradans and military members who were “deceived” by TurboTax. Those who used the TurboTax “Free Edition” from 2016 to 2018 are expected to receive \$30 for each year they filed, thanks to a nationwide settlement. More than 80,000 payments are expected to be made to Coloradans.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/10/2022 1 MIN. Authorities say a former Alabama jail official has died and the murder suspect she is accused of helping escape from custody has been apprehended in Indiana after more than a week on the run. The two fugitives were caught yesterday in Evansville, Indiana, after U.S. Marshals pursued their vehicle and then crashed into it. Officials say Casey White surrendered and Vicky White died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/17/2022 1 MIN. The estimated cost of battling the High Park Fire in Teller County is \$2 million after 5 days, and county officials ask for a state wildfire emergency declaration. The fire is at an estimated 1,600 acres, and was first spotted Thursday. It has forced the pre-evacuation or evacuation of 580 homes, impacting about 400 people and 75 businesses. The fire is burning west of Cripple Creek.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/24/2022 1 MIN. Yesterday Governor Jared Polis signed the proposed TABOR bill into law. This means if you're a Colorado taxpayer who files taxes by June 30, you're expected to receive a rebate later this year. Based on conversations with the Department of Revenue, the current administration estimates it will be at least \$500 for single filers and \$1000 for joint filers.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/25/2022 1 MIN. An 18-year-old gunman killed 19 children all located in one classroom at a Texas elementary school in the town of Uvalde yesterday. Two adults were also killed in the attack. A law enforcement official said the attacker was killed by a Border Patrol agent who rushed into the school without waiting for backup. It is believed the gunman shot his grandmother before carrying out the attack. Two other officers were also shot but are expected to be ok. Authorities are continuing to search for clues about the gunman's motive.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/01/2022 1 MIN. The Memorial Day boating accident on Lake Pueblo has become even more tragic, the two killed were husband and wife Joshua and Jessica Prindle. Jessica, 38, was pulled from the water on the night of the incident. Her husband was found the next day. Neither was wearing a life jacket. Joshua Prindle was a soldier stationed at Fort Carson. The Prindles leave behind four children. A Gofundme has been set up for the family. According to officials, eight kids and five adults were piled on a smallish boat Sunday evening -- one that should have probably carried only five or six people.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/02/2022 1 MIN. More than a dozen cars were damaged after a pothole on the interstate wreaked havoc on the morning commute yesterday. Calls started coming in after 5 a.m., after cars started getting popped tires and other damage northbound on I-25 at the S. Academy exit. Some drivers were forced to abandon their vehicles on the side of the road. Troopers responded to the area, and a construction crew made repairs on the pothole. They were finished around 8 a.m. and the roadway was fully reopened.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/08/2022 1 MIN. The family of an Arkansas couple camping in Colorado who stopped communicating with them says they're very concerned. The couple, in their 70s, are experienced campers who told family they were heading for the Great Sand Dunes National Park, and then would head up the mountain, but didn't specify which. The family doesn't think the two would be without their camper or their ATVs. Authorities are searching, and you can find photos of the vehicle and trailer on the Alamosa Sheriff's Office site.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/13/2022 1 MIN. A body was found inside of the Walgreens at the corner of Centennial and Vindicator in northwest Colorado Springs on Saturday, and police were able to track the suspect to Walsenburg. Police pulled over the 28-year-old suspect walking along I-25 after ditching his vehicle, and arrested him without incident. Police say he was covered in bruises and he told them he had been attacked at a Walgreens in Colorado Springs. When troopers checked with CSPD they learned he was actually the suspect in the incident. No other information was released about the case, and it's not clear whether the victim and suspect knew one another. The store has been closed since the murder investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/20/2022 1 MIN. An internal investigation has led to two sheriff's deputies in Florida being disciplined for sharing information about comedian Bob Saget's death with the public before his family was notified. Both deputies admitted they improperly shared the information, which is a violation of department policy. One texted his brother, who put it on Twitter, and the other texted their neighbors the details. The exact nature of the disciplinary action was not specified.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/28/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Avalanche broke records in their recent Stanley Cup win, specifically the record of shortest possession of the Cup before damaging. About five minutes after the Avs win, right wing Nicolas Aube-Kubel was holding the trophy and skating towards teammates for a photo when he lost his footing and fell to the ice, denting the Cup's base. The Hockey Hall of Fame's Keeper of the Cup, Phil Pritchard, said "I guess it's a new record today. Five minutes into the presentation it happened. It's the first time it's ever happened on the ice."

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/06/2022 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office is warning the public of a new social media challenge, presenting its own challenges for law enforcement. It's called the Orbeez challenge, and it encourages participants, typically teenagers, to video themselves approaching pedestrians and shooting them with water-filled beads from high powered water bead guns and to post the results on TikTok. They're seeing a particularly high number of complaints out of Falcon. This challenge has resulted in serious injuries to victims and those responsible are facing Felony level charges. They also say the guns look like real firearms, and it poses the potential for police shooting a prankster.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/10/2022 1 MIN. A fire broke out in Teller County near Cripple Creek, reportedly started at an unattended campfire that spread outside the burn ring. That fire burned three acres and was contained; two large fires are still burning in Southern Colorado- The Bent's Fort Fire, about 25 percent contained, and the Fort Lyon fire, about 50 percent contained.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 04/13/2022 1 MIN. A brush fire started by a vehicle fire was quickly put out by the Fountain fire department off 1-25 yesterday afternoon. Yesterday students at King Elementary School in Security-Widefield got a special surprise from local law enforcement and fire department personnel who held a surprise meet and greet to teach the kids the importance of calling 911. 8-year-old Isabella Montano, who was called out from the crowd of her classmates and recognized for her heroic actions, after calling 911 and alerting a dispatcher her mother was having a medical emergency. She says it's thanks to her favorite show, 9-1-1, and she'll be getting a special ride from firefighters on Monday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/05/2022 1 MIN. A Colorado Springs Police Officer is in jail this morning after being charged with felony stalking. The 27-year-old was assigned as a patrol officer in the Sand Creek Division. She has been employed by CSPD since June 2016, and was placed on administrative leave.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/09/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Fire Department has been busy the past 24 hours. A fire near the Lowes off of North Nevada was fully contained yesterday afternoon. CSFD says the cause is under investigation. This morning CSFD saved the KILO/X1039 building from a dumpster fire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/13/2022 1 MIN. A busy 24 hours for fire crews yesterday. The Colorado Springs Fire Department responded to a fire at a home in Security at around 9:45 a.m. on Chieftan Drive. Then in the afternoon, CSFD issued a mandatory evacuation order in the Stetson Hills area due to a grass fire. After nearly four hours, the evacuation order was lifted. In all, 30 acres were burned there. At the same time, another fire burning in a mobile home park located off N. Cascade near Fillmore, burned eight homes, killing one. A third fire was reported near the Colorado Springs Airport off Powers and Milton E. Proby Pkwy which was sparked by a Sheriff's Office vehicle. 182 acres burned in that fire, and no structures were damaged. Evacuation orders were issued for a large area west of Cripple Creek due to a fire.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/13/2022 1 MIN. A person was hit and killed by a train in Florence this morning, and police are investigating. Florence officers responded to the tracks just south of Frazier Avenue and 2nd Street at 1:30a.m., where they found the victim's body. The train stopped after the collision, and as of 6:30 this morning, was still blocking Houston Avenue and Frazier where the tracks intersect with the road. Police are unsure why the victim was on the tracks, and are working to notify their family.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/17/2022 1 MIN. A Las Animas Code Enforcement Officer is under arrest for causing the Fort Lyons fire. He turned himself in yesterday. According to police the cause of the fire was "intentional burning of various limbs and wood debris on a high-wind, Red-Flag day with low humidity and high temperatures, as well as the fire being left unattended." He is facing three felony arson charges totaling \$100k - \$1 million.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/25/2022 1 MIN. A woman is facing charges for allegedly posing as a Colorado Springs police officer. CSPD was alerted Monday that someone was impersonating one of its officers "in an attempt to intimidate a community member." Police didn't elaborate any further and arrested the suspect yesterday morning. She is facing felony charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 05/31/2022 1 MIN. One person is still missing after a boat capsized in Lake Pueblo Sunday night, killing one and injuring nearly a dozen others. Eight kids and five adults were on board the boat when strong winds knocked the boat over just after 7:30 p.m. A 38-year-old woman died before help arrived, presumably from drowning; the county coroner will release the official cause of death. One other adult is still missing. Eleven others, including all of the children, were rescued from the water and transported to area hospitals.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/01/2022 1 MIN. A teenager is back in custody following an allegedly violent attack on a guard in Colorado. The 17-year-old was being held at a Youth facility in Denver and was at a dentist appointment Tuesday morning when he stabbed the guard and fled. At about 2 p.m., the sheriff's office reported he was back in custody. The guard had non-life threatening injuries and was expected to be released from the hospital before Wednesday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/03/2022 1 MIN. The cause of two large fires that sparked in Pueblo yesterday are under investigation. The fires were visible after 3:30 p.m. on the east side of Lake Minnequa. Firefighters contained the blazes just after 6:30 last night. Officials say in all, about 52 acres burned.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 06/06/2022 1 MIN. The Colorado State Patrol said a motorcyclist hit a bear on I-25 near Northgate Boulevard on Saturday night, closing the roadway for about two hours.
