TOP COMMUNITY ISSUES FOR KRXP.

FOR THE QUARTER BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2021 AND ENDING MARCH 31, 2021.

- 1. **CHARITY**: One local restaurant received much needed aid from none other than Dave Portnoy, the founder of Barstool Sports. Portnoy took matters into his own hands when restaurants shut down in New York City due to the coronavirus pandemic, and introduced the Barstool Fund in December with \$500,000 of his own money. Since then, The Barstool Fund has raised Nearly \$27M from the likes of many big names including Aaron Rodgers, Guy Fieri, Tom Brady, Kid Rock, the New England Patriots, and more. Portnoy has helped 142 businesses so far including one in Colorado Springs. Owner AJ Frasca of Panino's received the call from Portnoy, informing him he would receive some of the money to help the restaurant get along.
- 2. **CRIME:** Donthe Lucas, the Colorado man on trial for the murder of his pregnant girlfriend Kelsie Schelling in 2013, has been found guilty of her murder. The jury came to the verdict, and Lucas was immediately sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. Kelsie disappeared 8 years ago after she found out she was eight weeks pregnant, and drove from Denver to Pueblo to have a discussion with Lucas. The 21-year-old was never seen again, and to date her body has never been found. The mother of Kelsie urges those out hiking, to keep searching so she can be found and properly laid to rest.
- 3. **ECONOMY:** Starting April 16th, Colorado Springs City and County officials will be able to decide how to handle COVID-19 restrictions, as the state will no longer mandate the COVID dial. Mayor John Suthers met with Governor Jared Polis about how the state will give power back to local leaders. Suthers and City Officials say they have no intention of placing a City-wide ordinance that would require people to wear masks or restrict business capacity. While restrictions will be lifted, private businesses will still be able to implement their own restrictions.
- 4. EDUCATION: The federal government has approved a request from Colorado which will allow students to take one state standardized test this year in either math or English, due to the challenges the pandemic put on education last year. Students in fourth, sixth or eighth grades will take the math assessment and students in grades third, fifth and seventh will take the English or language arts assessment, however parents can opt to have their students do both.

- 5. ENTERTAINMENT: Red Rocks Amphitheatre announced yesterday it received approval from the State to open for its 80th anniversary season at a capacity of 2500 for physically distanced shows. The venue also announced new COVID protocols, and listed events coming up for the year. Red Rocks also said some event dates could change depending on artist availability, tour schedules and Covid-related conditions. In further detail the venue said guests are welcome until one hour after sunset, and concessions will be sold on the Top Plaza. Masks are required in the amphitheatre and no vehicles will be permitted in the park after 7 p.m.
- 6. **GOVERNMENT:** Colorado's entire congressional delegation has written a letter to President Joe Biden, hoping to keep the Space Command at Peterson Air Force Base. The letter urges the President to conduct a review on the decision to move U.S. Space Command from Colorado Springs to Huntsville, AL. The final decision for the permanent home of U.S. Space Command is expected in 2023, pending the results from a required environmental impact analysis.
- 7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** Three drive-up COVID-19 vaccine clinics are being offered through Centura Health as registration for the clinics is open. The clinics are being held in Colorado Springs, Pueblo and Commerce City. The first event is taking place tomorrow at the Broadmoor World Arena from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and will offer 2,000 Moderna vaccine appointments. If you are currently eligible for the vaccine, register on the Centura website. You can also call 1-877-COVAXCO for more information.
- 8. **MILITARY:** Actor Terry Crews gave a shout out to soldiers from Fort Carson with the 4th Infantry Division on Facebook after he got vaccinated at the mass COVID vaccine clinic in Los Angeles. The troops are deployed in L.A. helping with FEMA's mass vaccination sites. Crews added health care workers, doctors and military worldwide to the thank you as well.
- 9. NATIONAL & STATE: Ten people, including a Boulder Police officer, were killed at a King Sooper store in Boulder. Officers were initially called to the store for reports of a man shot in his vehicle. When they arrived the suspect started shooting at police. Windows to the store were seen shattered. Many customers were able to escape or hide. Hundreds of police officers from throughout the Denver area responded to the afternoon attack. Police announced a suspect was seriously injured and taken into custody. Boulder Police say Officer Eric Talley was killed. He had been with the department since 2010. The ATF and FBI are assisting in the investigation.

- 10. **POLICE & FIRE:** Pueblo Police are asking the public for help with any information tied to a house fire after two people were found dead and two others were seriously injured. The fire happened at a home on W. 15th Street, just northwest of Downtown. The home was fully engulfed in flames when crews arrived, and they discovered two people with critical injuries, and later found two others deceased in the basement. At this time, no one has been publicly identified. The coroner is working to determine the cause of death for the people found in the basement. If you have any information, call Pueblo Police.
- 11. **WEATHER & UTILITIES:** Winter Storm Xylia has affected areas across the state very differently. It was one for the record books according to predictions, and as of midnight, Denver had seen 27.1 inches of snow. The official snow recording comes from Denver International Airport, which moves this storm into fourth place on the Top 10 snowstorms in Colorado recorded history. 1913: 45.7 inches, 2003: 31.8 inches, 1946: 30.4 inches, 2021: 27.1 inches, 1982: 23.8 inches.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/04/2021 1 MIN. Two Pueblo County Sheriff's Office deputies are recovering after a standoff on Friday afternoon in Pueblo West. Officials say deputies were alerted about a man making threats against the Tennessee State Patrol and the capitol building in Tennessee. When police finally made contact with the suspect he immediately began firing, shooting one deputy in the head, and the other in the shoulder; both deputies are expected to recover. SWAT was called to the scene on Tenderfoot Lane, and the suspect was taken into custody.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/11/2021 1 MIN. Five teens are in custody after a riot at the Cedar Springs Behavioral Health Services Hospital in Colorado Springs. According to CSPD, officers were called to the facility around 9 p.m. Saturday night on reports of runaways; they were also advised that multiple patients were, "rioting, overriding the facility, destroying property and overtaking the staff." Police were able to identify and arrest five teens, who face multiple charges. No further information was provided about who ran away and if they were still at large.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/18/2021 1 MIN. A Pueblo man is dead after being shot at a party. Officers were called to a home in the area of 2nd Avenue and 29th Street around 2:45 a.m Saturday. According to police, the 36-year-old man and the suspect got into an argument which then turned physical. The suspect pulled out a firearm he was carrying and shot the victim. The victim died on the scene and officers arrested the suspect.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/19/2021 1 MIN. A judge has found Letecia Stauch competent to stand trial for allegedly killing her 11-year-old stepson Gannon Stauch. Two separate doctors found her competent during evaluations. The decision comes about a week before the one-year anniversary of Gannon's reported disappearance. Stauch's preliminary hearing is set for March 11.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/19/2021 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Police Department has made two arrests in an illegal gambling operation. Investigators served a warrant at a home near Water Street and Adams Drive in the Pleasant Valley area. According to Police during the search, 28 players were detained at the residence for illegal gambling. Two people were cited for professional gambling and gambling premises.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/22/2021 1 MIN. Two Colorado Springs men were arrested for stealing more than \$269,000 worth of marijuana from two legal grows in Pueblo County. The Pueblo County Sheriff's Office was called to The Spot 420 Dispensary in Pueblo West just before midnight on Monday. Deputies discovered thousands of dollars worth of marijuana was missing or damaged. Then around two hours later, the sheriff's office responded to a burglary-in-progress call at Los Suenos in Avondale on Highway 96. Deputies recognized the suspect vehicle from the first robbery, and located both suspects a short time later. 15 barrels of marijuana product were stolen from Los Suenos and were scattered throughout the area. The 32-year-old and 29-year-old suspects face multiple charges.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/29/2021 1 MIN. Pueblo police are investigating a bomb threat at a District 60 elementary school yesterday. Goodnight Elementary was evacuated around 8:20 a.m. after the school received a voicemail claiming bombs were in the campus drainage pipes. Police gave the all-clear just before noon after searching the school. No explosives or suspicious devices were located. A spokesperson for the Pueblo Police Department says they have been receiving swatting calls in the past few days and they aren't sure if this one is related to the others.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/01/2021 1 MIN. Pueblo police have located the suspect who made multiple bomb threats across the city last week, including one at an elementary school. Police say the juvenile, who hasn't been identified, is connected to the fake bomb threat at Goodnight Elementary, along with another threat toward the YMCA and two other threats toward the Pueblo Police Department. The juvenile faces multiple criminal charges for the threats.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/09/2021 1 MIN. A Trinidad man has been arrested in connection with two explosions from suspicious packages. One explosion happened Monday around 1 a.m. when police say two men were walking through an apartment parking lot and found a package. A 20-year-old man opened the package and it exploded leaving him with serious injuries; he was airlifted to a hospital, his condition is unknown. A similar suspicious package appeared on Friday, February 5. With the assistance of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, and the Pueblo Police Department Bomb Squad, The Trinidad Police Department located and arrested the suspect who faces numerous charges, and are questioning a second person of interest.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/18/2021 1 MIN. Police arrested two teenagers in Fountain who are suspected of a violent home robbery yesterday. Police say the two suspects entered a home on Ventana Lane around 11:30 a.m., stole firearms, and left the scene before officers arrived. A person inside the home had been violently assaulted in the incident. Police were able to identify the suspects, and they were located at a home on Lodi Lane, nearby. Police arrested the 15 and 16 year olds on unrelated warrants, and were later identified as the robbery suspects. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/22/2021 1 MIN. A Fort Carson sergeant was arrested Saturday morning after allegedly shooting and killing a woman in southeast Colorado Springs. Police responded to the shooting on Squawbush Ridge Grove off of South Circle around 1 a.m. Saturday, and say the woman was dead when they arrived on scene. The shooter, a resident of the address, was booked into the El Paso County Jail around 10:00 a.m. for charges of first degree murder and child abuse without injury. Police say several other people were inside the home during the shooting, but they believe they have everyone involved accounted for.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/01/2021 1 MIN. A shooting happened at a house party early yesterday morning in Old Colorado City. Around 1:20 a.m., neighbors reported seeing a black man carrying an AR-style rifle walking away from a house and up N. 25th street. Police responded to the shooting on Paradise Lane and say no one was injured, but a bullet did go through a neighbor's front door nearly hitting him, before exiting out the back door. The home is an Airbnb which was removed from the site immediately after the shooting. If you have any information that could help police call 444-7000.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/18/2021 1 MIN. Detectives with the El Paso County Sheriff's Office confirmed yesterday that a woman found dead in a field Monday afternoon was the victim of a homicide. The body of 33-year-old Alison Cantrell was discovered near the intersection of Old Pueblo Road and Midway Ranch Road, south of Fountain. The cause and manner of death is under investigation. Police shared surveillance photos taken of Alison on Saturday at the 7-Eleven on 21st Street in Colorado Springs at about 5:25 that night. If anyone had contact with Alison after that time, you're asked to contact the Sheriff's Office Tip Line at 719-520-6666.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/23/2021 1 MIN. A man in Colorado Springs was threatened with a hatchet after chasing burglars near downtown Sunday evening. The victim said he parked his car along Prospect Street near Shooks Run Park when he saw somebody going through his vehicle around 7 p.m. The man confronted the suspect who fled the scene in a 1996 Honda Accord. The victim got into his own car and chased the suspect who pulled over near Palmer Park and Union. The passenger got out wielding a hatchet in a threatening manner. The victim then contacted police, who did not locate the suspects. The car has been described as dark-colored and has Colorado license plate BIYV47.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 03/29/2021 1 MIN. In what is now the 12th bank robbery this year, Colorado Springs Police said a woman robbed a bank near Powers and Constitution at 10:30 a.m. Saturday morning. The woman walked into the FirstBank on Constitution Avenue, handed the teller a note, and left the scene with an unknown amount of cash. Detectives from the Colorado Springs Police Department Robbery Unit responded to the scene and are investigating the robbery.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/06/2021 1 MIN. Yesterday a team from The Pentagon toured Peterson Air Force Base, which has been the temporary home of the U.S. Space Command since May of 2020. The move comes as officials decide which city will be the permanent home of the new military branch. Other competitors include bases in New Mexico, Florida, Alabama, and Nebraska. If chosen, it would become one of the most significant economic decisions in decades for Southern Colorado. A decision is expected between January 15-20.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/07/2021 1 MIN. Yet another unemployment scam is making its way through Southern Colorado in the form of mail. According to Colorado Attorney General Phil Weiser, it's becoming a big problem for the state. Investigators say criminals are trying to pretend they are you in some cases to get unemployment benefits that aren't really warranted. The state's consumer protection experts say if you get unemployment benefit mail you did not apply for, destroy any bank card, and report the fraud at stopfraudcolorado.gov.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 01/12/2021 1 MIN. According to Colorado Public Radio, after the department completed the installation Sunday, the anti-fraud system flagged about 20% of approximately 32,000 claims for payment. The system looks for 27 attributes of suspicious accounts, ranging from claimants who are older than 100 to people listed as deceased in public records. According to one official those wrongly flagged, may experience a temporary suspension in benefits.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/01/2021 1 MIN. A new restaurant has opened on S. Academy Blvd. near Hancock. Felipe's 109 has gone from a food truck to a brick and mortar restaurant. The restaurant's signature is taco burgers served with french fries and green chili, along with other Mexican and American eats, and is operating at 25% capacity and offering carryout.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 02/16/2021 1 MIN. Topgolf is bringing its third golfing venue location in the state to Colorado Springs. The popular golfing venue will be opening this summer at the Polaris Pointe complex, near Powers and I-25.
