- 1. CHARITY: Summer Justice talks with Pikes Peak State College about Career Advance Colorado, which provides zero-cost training for in-demand jobs across the state. The college receives state funding to pay for tuition, books, uniforms, and any other needed materials in the Pikes Peak Regional Law Enforcement Academy, Fire Science Programs, Early Childhood Education programs, and Building and Construction programs. Students interested just need to apply online. In another interview, Summer talks with The Police Foundation of Colorado Springs about an upcoming fundraiser. The nonprofit gives the Colorado Springs Police necessary equipment, training, and other resources, when city funds aren't available.
- 2. **CRIME:** The remains of Suzanne Morphew have been found. The Colorado Bureau of Investigation said they found her body on September 22. The El Paso County Coroner identified her remains yesterday. Investigators were searching in the area of Moffat in Saguache County for an investigation that wasn't related to her disappearance. Morphew was reported missing on Mother's Day in 2020. At one point, Suzanne Morphew's husband Barry was a suspect in the case but charges were eventually dropped.
- 3. **ECONOMY:** Notes Live officially broke ground on its state-of-the-art outdoor amphitheater, The Sunset, and unveiled new details of its Seafood & Chophouse yesterday. The 8,000 seat venue is set to open next summer and boasts over 90 VIP luxury fire pit suites, top of the line audio-visual systems, and a self-draining grass berm.
- 4. **EDUCATION:** The Biden administration is launching a beta website today for its new income-driven student loan repayment plan, allowing borrowers to begin submitting applications for the program as federal student loan payments are set to resume in October. The SAVE plan will determine payments based on income and family size, and around 1 million borrowers could see their payments shrink to as low as \$0. Borrowers can access the beta website online. The enrollment process will take about 10 minutes.
- 5. **ENTERTAINMENT:** Colorado's newest troll was completed over the weekend. The wooden sculpture, "Rita the Rock Planter," is made entirely of recycled wood, also serves as a bird house, and resides in Teller County. The new Troll sculpture, created by artist Thomas Dambo, joins the popular Breckenridge troll as a hiking destination in

Colorado's mountains. Dambo said he has completed 119 sculptures and birdhouses so far and has six left to go in the project.

- 6. **GOVERNMENT:** (9/25/2023) With government funding slated to run out in six days, the leaders in the house said "all options are on the table" to avert a looming shutdown. The House will return tomorrow and begin votes on a series of yearlong spending bills, but federal departments and agencies have already begun the mandatory process of planning to bring nonessential functions to a halt. A shutdown will impact nearly 4 million federal employees who will feel the effect immediately. Essential workers will remain on the job, but others will be furloughed until the shutdown is over. None will be paid during the impasse.
- 7. **HEALTH & SAFETY:** Pueblo County is reporting the first death due to West Nile Virus. No information has been released about the death. There have been nine confirmed human cases in Pueblo County this year. Pueblo Department of Public Health and Environment is reminding the public to practice the 4 D's: DRAIN standing water around your house weekly. DUSK and DAWN are when mosquitoes are most active, so limit outdoor activities. DEET is an effective ingredient to look for in insect repellents. DRESS in long sleeves and pants in areas where mosquitoes are active.
- 8. **MILITARY:** The wait is over. President Joe Biden has decided to keep the U.S. Space Command headquarters in Colorado Springs, overturning a last-ditch decision by the Trump administration to move it to Alabama. The choice ended months of deliberations. U.S. officials say Biden was convinced by the head of Space Command, who argued that moving his headquarters now would jeopardize military readiness.
- 9. **NATIONAL & STATE:** Donald Trump became the first former US president to have his mugshot taken when he was arrested yesterday. He was booked into the Fulton County Jail in Georgia after surrendering on more than a dozen charges stemming from his alleged efforts to overturn the state's 2020 election results. After he was released on a \$200,000 bond, Trump slammed the case as "a travesty of justice," and told reporters, "I did nothing wrong."

- 10. **POLICE & FIRE:** (9/11/2023) Firefighters cut power to a large portion of downtown in response to reported explosions and fires underground coming out of manholes, with some flames as high as 10 feet. This happened at around 2:30 this morning in the area just west of Nevada Avenue and Kiowa Street. The fire was believed to be in underground electrical vaults, and not the sewer system. Crews had it under control after 4:30 this morning, but say several streets in the surrounding area would be closed for a while, while buildings in close proximity to the fire were cleared out due to a carbon monoxide risk. The affected zone is in between Platte and Pikes Peak and Nevada and Kiowa. The cause of the fire is under investigation.
- 11. **WEATHER & UTILITIES:** A stretch of Kiowa Street in Downtown Colorado Springs that was closed following an underground fire on Sept. 11 will remain closed for several weeks, according to Colorado Springs Utilities. The stretch of Kiowa Street between Tejon Street and Nevada Avenue has been closed since Sept. 11, after an early-morning fire resulting from electrical equipment failure sparked underground, knocking out power for much of downtown. Springs Utilities asked that drivers follow signs and avoid the work zone.

That location was closed "temporarily" in June, out of what the company called an "abundance of caution" after testing indicated asbestos contamination at the store. There is no estimated time of reopening. The company said it will be automatically waiving delivery fees for customers of the closed store via a digital coupon that will be preloaded into their loyalty accounts.

The courts, public defender, and district attorney for the 4th Judicial District will come together to help people clear their warrants, including those for probation violations, and get connected with resources to resolve their legal matters. No arrests will be made for people seeking help. Offenses that are eligible for warrant clearance include misdemeanor or traffic offenses, class 4 drug felonies, as well as class 5 and 6 felonies.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/03/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police are investigating a downtown shooting that happened Saturday night. The shooting happened near Cimarron Street. They say a woman was shot while driving. She made it near Acacia Park and crashed her car into others at Bijou and Tejon Street, as hundreds of tourists and locals were in the area to celebrate the Fourth of July. It's unclear if a suspect is in custody. The woman was in serious condition Saturday night.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/07/2023 1 MIN. Multiple people were arrested yesterday after a maintenance worker caught them stealing electrical wires and causing more than a quarter of a million dollars' worth of damage to the old Union Printers Home building. The maintenance worker found multiple suspects inside the building stripping electrical wires and called police. CSPD said several K9 officers were in the area and were familiar with recent burglaries to the Printers Home. CSPD said the K9 units set up containment and watched the suspects leaving the building carrying copper wires and tubing. Police tried to approach the three suspects, who ran from officers. Police believe these suspects are responsible for other large copper thefts and burglaries in Colorado Springs.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/10/2023 1 MIN. CSPD said a suspect returned to the Union Printers Home to finish what he started last Thursday. At that time, police were made aware of three people in the home cutting copper tubing. They were able to arrest two suspects, but one got away. The 35-year-old man returned on Friday and police caught him inside using power tools to cut copper wire and tubing. He was placed under arrest.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/13/2023 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office has reported that an arrest has been made for the death of Fountain Police Officer Julian Becerra. Back in February, Officer Becerra fell 40 feet off a bridge on S. Academy while in pursuit of three suspects out of Pueblo. He died nine days later in the hospital from the injuries he sustained. The 32-year-old suspect he was chasing was arrested and charged yesterday with second-degree murder. The Sheriff's Office didn't elaborate on how they came to bring those charges just yet.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/20/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Parks & Wildlife says a Kansas man was convicted of illegally poaching a moose and "leaving it to rot," back in 2021 in Teller County. On Monday the 33-year-old pled guilty to a felony charge of willful destruction of wildlife and many other misdemeanor charges and was slapped with a \$20,000 fine. He received a two-year deferred jail sentence on the felony charge. It will be waived if he meets the terms of the plea agreement and two years of unsupervised probation. Witnesses reported the incident, and CPW says the man tried to take the head of the moose and laid tree branches and sticks across the carcass in an attempt to hide it.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/24/2023 1 MIN. The El Paso County Judicial Court has found the Club Q shooter's mother, Laura Voepel, mentally unfit for trial. The evaluation was requested by Voepel's attorneys after a verbal outburst at a court appearance in May.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/26/2023 1 MIN. A dangerous inmate broke out of a Las Animas jail and is still on the run. The Bent County Sheriff's Office said 46-year-old Mark Fox is one of four inmates who escaped from the jail. Two of the inmates were captured Tuesday, while a third was found dead in Pueblo, possibly from a drug overdose. Fox is described as a bald white male standing 6-foot-3 and weighing 210 pounds. The sheriff's office says he is considered dangerous. You can find his photo on the Bent County Sheriff's Office website. If you see him, call 911 right away.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/01/2023 1 MIN. Officers searched the Citadel Mall for a possible jewelry thief who reportedly broke into the building early yesterday morning. The owner of one of the mall's jewelry stores called police just after 4 a.m. after seeing a prowler roaming their shop on security video. By the time officers got on scene, the suspect had left the store -- but it wasn't clear if he had left the mall. Police had to do a sweep of the entire mall to make sure the suspect wasn't hiding inside. The scene was cleared a few hours later. It's unclear if the suspect was located.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/01/2023 1 MIN. The man who is suspected in a homicide that happened on Saturday 7/29/2023 in Pueblo involving a man killed and a dog wounded, allegedly shot at New Mexico Police yesterday. He pulled up beside New Mexico State Troopers while they were conducting a DWI stop, and asked if he was in Las Vegas. As a trooper approached the suspect's truck, the suspect started shooting from a rifle. He then drove off, still shooting at the trooper, who returned fire. The suspect then pulled over, got out of the truck with the rifle and laid face down on the roadway. He was arrested.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/03/2023 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office announced six juveniles were arrested for their connection in a shooting that left two teens dead. Earlier this past February, numerous 911 calls came in reporting multiple shots fired in a Meridian Ranch neighborhood. Responding deputies found multiple victims with gunshot wounds. Five people were taken to nearby hospitals. One died at the hospital, and another died five days later. Multiple people of interest were identified, most of them minors. Two teenage suspects have been arrested. One on charges of attempted murder, and another on charges of first-degree murder. There could be more arrests coming.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/08/2023 1 MIN. More than two weeks have passed since an inmate escaped a facility in Bent County. The U.S. Marshals announced a \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of 46-year-old Mark Desmond Fox. He reportedly escaped the facility in late July with three others. Two of the three were captured and a third was found deceased, possibly from a drug overdose. Fox is a white male, bald, stands 6 feet 3 inches and weighs approximately 175 pounds. Find his photo online. Anyone with information as to his whereabouts should contact the U.S. Marshals at 1-877-WANTED2.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/11/2023 1 MIN. Two teen girls are facing felony charges after allegedly assaulting a Pueblo West convenience store employee during a robbery early yesterday morning. Deputies responded around 12:20 a.m. on Thursday to the Loaf N Jug on South Purcell Boulevard on a reported robbery. An employee said two girls came into the store, and one of them took a case of beer and tried to leave without paying, but the door was locked. She dropped the beer, and then the employee approached the two girls, one of them hit him in the face with a wine bottle before the two left in an unknown car. The employee was treated for a cut to his face. The 15 and 16-year-old girls were quickly identified and arrested.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. The El Paso County Sheriff's Office shared a post to social media yesterday and said someone was reportedly driving 139 mph along Highway 24 just east of Colorado Springs. They said the driver was weaving in and out of traffic, and his excuse? He was late for work. The driver was not publicly identified, but the sheriff's office is reporting he faces a mandatory court appearance with a 32-point citation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. A weeks-long manhunt is over after an escaped Colorado inmate was found dead in an unoccupied farmhouse near Rocky Ford. The U.S. Marshals Office reported the body of 46-year-old Mark Fox was found on Saturday by a previous resident of the farmhouse, who had come to the property to gather some things. Based on evidence, officials say he was likely dead for two to three weeks.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/21/2023 1 MIN. The Pueblo Police Department is on the search for a woman who was indecently exposing her genitals to visitors at the Pueblo Zoo on Friday, August 5th. CDHE released a list of people who may have been impacted and will notify individuals once its investigation is completed. They will be offering those affected free credit monitoring for two years.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/09/2023 1 MIN. A Neo-pagan Woodland Park School District mother was banned from visiting her kid's elementary school for oracle card readings, and she's now filed a federal lawsuit for discrimination. The mother and her children practice a specific variation of eclectic Neo-Paganism, which involves engaging in rituals, conducting spells, crafting potions, and consulting oracle cards to seek guidance and insight. On a lunch visit to Columbine Elementary School, she conducted an oracle card reading which raised eyebrows with school officials. The principal approached her and told her it was inappropriate and asked her to leave. She was then sent a letter by the superintendent telling her she was banned from visiting the school, specifically citing the card reading. The district has not commented on the lawsuit.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/11/2023 1 MIN. This year, students across the state will have access to free lunch because of the state's new program Healthy School Meals for All Program. The state says this program helps to eliminate some of the stigma surrounding free lunch and getting rid of meal debts. They say the student removed the patches, and they will continue to ensure all students and employees can learn and work in a safe and nurturing environment.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/06/2023 1 MIN. Four million people have enrolled in President Biden's new student loan repayment plan, known as SAVE, which promises to lower their monthly bills. The program was launched earlier this summer in anticipation of federal student loan payments resuming next month, after a yearslong pandemic-related pause. Like other income-driven repayment plans, SAVE calculates monthly payments based on a borrower's income and family size, regardless of how much outstanding student debt is owed.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/26/2023 1 MIN. A House panel is holding a public hearing today on UFOs. Lawmakers on the House Oversight Committee's subcommittee on National Security, the Border, and Foreign Affairs will hear testimony regarding UFO sightings from three individuals who previously served in the US military. Last year, the director of the office formed to focus on the sightings said the government is tracking more than 650 potential UFO cases.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/31/2023 1 MIN. The CDC detected coronavirus, HIV, hepatitis and herpes at an unlicensed California lab in Fresno County California. Local and federal authorities spent months investigating the illegal lab in a warehouse. They said it was full of lab mice, medical waste and hazardous materials. County public health officials allegedly turned up medical devices thought to have been developed on-site, such as Covid and pregnancy tests. Hundreds of mice at the warehouse were kept in inhumane conditions. The city euthanized 773 of them. All of the biological agents were destroyed by the CDC.

His popular series "Pee-wee's Playhouse" earned 22 Emmy Awards during its run on CBS from 1986 to 1991. Reubens was nominated for 14 Emmy Awards during his career, winning twice. In other shocking news, Angus Cloud, a rising actor best known for his role in the HBO drama "Euphoria," also died yesterday. There was no word on his cause of death. He was 25.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/02/2023 1 MIN. Amazon is adding video telemedicine visits in all 50 states to a virtual clinic it launched last fall. Amazon said customers can visit its virtual clinic around the clock through its website or app. There, they can compare prices and response times before picking a telemedicine provider from several options. The clinic, which doesn't accept insurance, launched last fall with a focus on text message-based consultations. Those remain available in 34 states. Amazon says the clinic offers care for more than 30 common health conditions.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/08/2023 1 MIN. Colorado's newest troll was completed over the weekend. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/02/2023 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs City Council is discussing strategies that would give city officials a greater say in where and how murals can be painted. One member said the council would have to determine what is considered art, murals and graffiti. Another said some residents "feel like they're being demoralized or being beaten down by having to look at this stuff every single day." The issue is that some murals are on private property, which is something the City Council has little control over. While they battle freedom of speech versus art, supporters of the artwork say murals serve as a source of community pride. Residents are urged to give their opinions in meetings. The next one is July 25.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/01/2023 1 MIN. Starting August 7, drivers will be required to move over, or slow down if they can't change lanes, for any vehicle pulled over on the side of the road with its hazard lights on. Previously, this was only necessary for emergency responders or law enforcement. The change was signed into law by Governor Polis back in March. If a driver doesn't pull over or slow down 20 miles under the speed limit for a disabled vehicle, that person faces a possible \$150 fine and three points on their license. It could also mean prison time if anyone gets hurt or killed.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/02/2023 1 MIN. The town of Boone can't pay its bills after its ousted mayor closed its bank accounts. The former mayor has been closing the accounts for the past three weeks and drained \$400,000 from them after she claims she was ousted from her position and locked out of town hall. The city can't pay bills like the trash or utilities, and even city workers' paychecks are either bouncing or coming in late. One spokesperson said the process of opening a new bank account has taken longer than expected due to federal regulations. The former mayor said she closed the town's three bank accounts in the interest of the town and its residents, and had the checks made payable to the Town of Boone. She didn't take any money for herself.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/07/2023 1 MIN. Starting today, new legislation raises the minimum age to purchase any firearm in Colorado to 21 years old. Transferring or selling a firearm to a person under the age of 21 is a misdemeanor crime, punishable by up to 18 months in jail. Those who buy a gun under the legal limit can face up to a year in jail. Also today, the "Move over or slow down" law goes into effect. If a car is pulled over on the side of the road with flashers on, you must either change lanes to give it space, and if you can't do that, slow down 20 mph under the speed limit.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/09/2023 1 MIN. A federal judge temporarily stopped a new gun law from taking effect in Colorado because of a new lawsuit, and now it could take months to years before a final decision is made. As of Monday, the new law was to go into effect, making it illegal for anyone under the age of 21 to buy a firearm. But a group is suing the state over the law. A final decision on whether or not the law takes effect will not be made until the lawsuit is over.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. Congressman Doug Lamborn will be in Colorado Springs today to discuss the impacts of fentanyl with local school districts. Lamborn, and other U.S. representatives reintroduced the Protecting Kids from Fentanyl Act, which would allow schools to access grant funding to pay for naloxone and life-saving overdose training for school staff. The El Paso County Coroner reports 85% of accidental overdoses in 2020 involved fentanyl. The discussion will be at the District 11 office near El Paso Street and Uintah in downtown Colorado Springs at 11 a.m.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/30/2023 1 MIN. The Town of Monument is considering annexing Gleneagle and last night there was a meeting about it. Gleneagle is an unincorporated community in northern El Paso County. Baptist Road is the dividing line between houses in Monument and homes in Gleneagle. According to the Monument town manager, some people have expressed interest in a potential annexation of Gleneagle to the town of Monument. One woman at the meeting asked the audience to stand up if they disagreed with the annexation of Gleneagle; almost everyone in attendance at the meeting stood up. If Gleneagle became a part of Monument, residents would have to pay city taxes for police and road maintenance. Currently they don't pay city taxes.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/30/2023 1 MIN. Colorado's 4th Judicial District (El Paso and Teller counties) will soon launch an eviction diversion program in the El Paso County Court with a grant from the National Center for State Courts. They will provide landlords and tenants with a dispute-resolution process other than court-filed eviction and to help tenants find housing post-eviction when court action is warranted. The program will refer evicted tenants to appropriate community resources to help them avoid future evictions, and will include an effort to keep evicted children in their home schools.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/08/2023 1 MIN. The La Junta City Council unanimously censured a City Councilman after an independent investigation substantiated allegations that he looked at girls changing in city hall and tried to intimidate witnesses. A local dance performance company was at the City Council to announce their latest production. That's when one mother alleges the City Councilman tried to look inside the room where girls were changing after asking for tissues. She said she told him the girls were changing, and that he looked past her into the room. After a complaint was filed, the City Councilman sent a threatening "proposal," saying the woman needed to recant the complaint or "there would be damning information released about the mayor." The City Councilman denies seeing anything, and calls everything lies and plans on running for mayor.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/15/2023 1 MIN. Mayor Yemi Mobolade marked his first 100 days in office, in his inaugural State of the City address yesterday. The address highlighted significant achievements and outlined key priorities for Colorado Springs. Before his address, Mobolade presented former Mayor John Suthers with the Lifetime Achievement Award, honoring his dedication and service to the state for the past 35 years. The address wasn't accepted by everyone. A non-partisan and independent group believed the price to attend the event at The Broadmoor Hotel wasn't inclusive to all.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/19/2023 1 MIN. Today is National Voter Registration Day. The El Paso County Clerk and Recorder is reminding voters to register to vote, or update your information, especially if you changed your name or moved this year. Ballots will be mailed out to El Paso County voters on October 16th for the November 7th election. You can register to vote through Election Day.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/20/2023 1 MIN. Gas powered lawn mowers can start back up in Colorado. The government advocacy group The Regional Air Quality Council had initially recommended the state's Air Quality Control Commission ban the sale of internal combustion lawnmowers, but the state health department is pulling back, now only asking that gas-powered lawn mowers be banned for use by state and local government entities. The initial recommendation was designed to reduce ozone levels in the state.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/25/2023 1 MIN. With government funding slated to run out in six days, the leaders in the house said "all options are on the table" to avert a looming shutdown. The House will return tomorrow and begin votes on a series of yearlong spending bills, but federal departments and agencies have already begun the mandatory process of planning to bring nonessential functions to a halt. A shutdown will impact nearly 4 million federal employees who will feel the effect immediately. Essential workers will remain on the job, but others will be furloughed until the shutdown is over. None will be paid during the impasse.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/06/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Parks and Wildlife announced yesterday that Lake Pueblo State Park is experiencing issues with potable water due to a rupture in an 8-inch main pipeline. CPW said park staff noticed a pipeline leak near the chain of lakes along the Arkansas River on Monday. All of the park's campgrounds are being impacted, along with the Visitor Center, both marinas, swim beach and the ANS boat decon Station. No new reservations are being taken for its campgrounds until July 12 or later.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/14/2023 1 MIN. A bat found at the Starsmore Visitor and Nature Center in North Cheyenne Canyon tested positive for rabies last week, making it the first animal to test positive for the disease in El Paso County this year. On Monday, El Paso County Public Health was notified of a bat that was found crawling on the ground during the day. The bat was sent for testing, then confirmed positive for rabies on Thursday. Public Health says there are currently no known exposures between the bat and any visitors or staff. But, health experts advise taking proactive measures like vaccinating your animals and ensuring bats are not living in your home.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/25/2023 1 MIN. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) has confirmed the first case of West Nile virus in the state this year. The virus was found in a person from La Plata County. CDPHE said West Nile virus was found in mosquitoes in seven counties throughout Colorado: Arapahoe, Boulder, Delta, Denver, Larimer, Pueblo, and Weld. CDPHE said mosquito populations are at historic levels in some parts of the state due to the high rainfall. While most people infected with West Nile virus don't have symptoms, some can develop a serious, potentially deadly illness, especially those over 60 and those with certain medical conditions.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/26/2023 1 MIN. A dangerous inmate broke out of a Las Animas jail and is still on the run. The Bent County Sheriff's Office said 46-year-old Mark Fox is one of four inmates who escaped from the jail. Two of the inmates were captured Tuesday, while a third was found dead in Pueblo, possibly from a drug overdose. Fox is described as a bald white male standing 6-foot-3 and weighing 210 pounds. The sheriff's office says he is considered dangerous. You can find his photo on the Bent County Sheriff's Office website. If you see him, call 911 right away.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/02/2023 1 MIN. A person in El Paso County has tested positive for the West Nile virus, marking the first confirmed human case in the county in two years. The El Paso County health department confirmed the case yesterday. This is the 10th positive case in the county in the last decade. Most people with West Nile never exhibit symptoms, but about a fifth of those infected may feel like they have the flu. Those most at risk of complications are people over 60 and those with certain medical conditions, such as diabetes or kidney disease. Protect yourself by using an EPA-registered insect repellent, limit your time outdoors at dusk and dawn, wear loose clothing, and drain standing water around your surroundings.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/03/2023 1 MIN. The CDC has data that suggests a summer surge of Covid-19 could be underway, although not as significant as in past summers. The number of Covid-19 infections is rising, along with test positivity, ER visits and hospital admissions. Around 8,000 people in the US were hospitalized last week due to Covid-19, a 12% increase from the prior week, CDC data shows. Federal health officials have announced a new Covid-19 booster should be released around late September or early October, which will target the now-dominant XBB strains of the virus. And with a new vaccine forthcoming, experts say it is unlikely we will see a return to masking for everyone.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/07/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Parks and Wildlife is searching for a black bear that bit a man late Saturday night at a campground in Trinidad. It happened at the Purgatoire River bottoms east of I-25 after 10 p.m. The man told CPW officers he was relaxing in a hammock when he heard a rustling noise. He then turned on his headlamp and saw a dark-colored bear. The bear bit the camper on the upper right arm before wandering off. The victim left and went to a motel before calling an ambulance. CPW said he had a three inch bite. This is the third reported bear attack in Colorado this year.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/10/2023 1 MIN. The Seven Falls Tourist attraction has septic problems, and a much debated plan about The Broadmoor to truck sewage out of Seven Falls ended in a Pikes Peak Area Council of Governments board vote of approval yesterday, with conditions. There must be a plan to deal with possible spills while transporting the sewage to the Las Vegas Street wastewater treatment plant. The Broadmoor must also meet with neighbors in the Cheyenne Boulevard area to discuss altering truck routes. The only other way is Mesa Avenue, which would take the trucks past The Broadmoor resort itself. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment will have the final say so on the sewage plan.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/10/2023 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Fire Department is reminding the public to be aware of rattlesnakes in the area after a person riding a bike was bitten by one Tuesday afternoon. Crews responded to the reported bite at Ute Valley Park just after 4:30 p.m. Firefighters said the patient was transported to the hospital by 5 p.m., and crews called Penrose ahead of time to let them know anti-venom would be needed. According to officials, the patient was successfully treated. CSFD said it's imperative that you keep your distance from rattlesnakes if you see them, and if you are bitten, you should call 911 immediately.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/23/2023 1 MIN. Pueblo County is reporting the first death due to West Nile Virus. No information has been released about the death. There have been nine confirmed human cases in Pueblo County this year. Pueblo Department of Public Health and Environment is reminding the public to practice the 4 D's: DRAIN standing water around your house weekly. DUSK and DAWN are when mosquitoes are most active, so limit outdoor activities. DEET is an effective ingredient to look for in insect repellents. DRESS in long sleeves and pants in areas where mosquitoes are active.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/30/2023 1 MIN. A Pueblo West man is recovering at home after almost losing his life following a rattlesnake bite. On Aug. 11, just before 9 p.m., the man went outside to grab a backpack out of his car. He had taken just five steps outside his door when a rattlesnake attacked him - biting him on the upper part of his ankle. Luckily his wife was home and was able to get him the care he needed, because he almost immediately passed out. After just five days in the Intensive Care Unit, he was released, but the family said the recovery process has not been easy. The Pueblo West Fire Department is urging residents to make sure to cut their grass because snakes like to hide in the brush.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/31/2023 1 MIN. UCHealth is warning the public that infectious disease experts forecast a "concerning" virus season this fall and winter. COVID has already seen a resurgence recently, and RSV is expected to circulate at the same time. UCHealth urges people to get vaccinated against the flu as soon as possible, with a peak expected in December. They say it is safe to get the COVID and Flu vaccines at the same time.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/05/2023 1 MIN. Colorado doctors are predicting an earlier flu season, and are urging everyone to get the flu shot as early as possible. Doctors are basing their prediction on trends in Australia, the combination of COVID-19, RSV and the flu reached higher-than-average levels. UCHealth predicts it to begin in October this year and peak around Thanksgiving.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/06/2023 1 MIN. A new mental health care center in Colorado Springs will open next month bringing much-needed services to the area. The new treatment facility is expected to provide a unique kind of care for those who are struggling. It will include an intensive outpatient program focused on mental health. Treatment involves three hours of group therapy three days per week, and will accept patients ages 12 and up.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/07/2023 1 MIN. CSPD is warning community members of phone & email scams. They say scammers are spoofing the CSPD's and Colorado Springs Utilities numbers, and using fake emails to contact residents and either tell them there's a warrant out for their arrest and to send money, or they'll say their utility bill hasn't been paid in three months and demand payment via bitcoin, gift cards, or other methods. CSPD says neither they nor CSU will ever ask someone to pay for a warrant. If someone is unsure, they can hang up and call 719-444-7595 and select option 8 to speak to a representative who can determine if the caller works for CSPD or not. If you have been a victim of these scams, you can call the CSPD Non-Emergency line at 719-444-7000 to make a report.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/13/2023 1 MIN. The CDC has now recommended updated Covid-19 vaccines for all Americans 6 months of age and older. The shots will be available this week. The CDC said, "If you have not received a COVID-19 vaccine in the past 2 months, get an updated COVID-19 vaccine to protect yourself this fall and winter," citing a rising number of hospitalizations.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/14/2023 1 MIN. A hiker was trampled by a moose in Teller County, and Colorado Parks and Wildlife is reminding the public to stay away from wildlife. This happened on Tuesday as a pair of hikers were on the popular Crags Trail with three leashed dogs. They came across an adult moose and a calf and that's when the moose attacked. The pair said they tried to maintain a distance, but the moose kept getting closer, and that's when the dogs barked and chaos ensued. Luckily the hiker who was trampled was able to get away and they all ran to their vehicle. The hiker only suffered minor injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/26/2023 1 MIN. A death in Southern Colorado has been linked to the Plague. The death was reported in Archuleta County, according to San Juan Basin Public Health. The Plague can cause serious illness or death without treatment, and is usually transmitted via infected fleas or by direct contact with infected animals. The local health department is investigating.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/28/2023 1 MIN. There will be a full-scale emergency exercise at the Colorado Springs airport from 9 to noon today. The exercise is taking place to comply with regulations from the FAA, which requires airports to conduct these types of exercises every three years. During this time, people may see a lot of emergency vehicles, personnel, and smoke near the airport. The city says they'll be displaying signs in the concourse to inform travelers and visitors that there is no need for concern.

The aunt claims her niece was a victim of human trafficking and that she was sold for sex. Police took a Marine into custody for questioning. No one has been arrested.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/20/2023 1 MIN. The window to apply for benefits and qualify for retroactive pay through the PACT Act is closing in August. The act expands medical coverage and pay for veterans who were harmed by toxic exposure in the Gulf War, the Vietnam War, and the post-9/11 eras. The PACT Act also can compensate those left behind by veterans exposed to these toxic chemicals, so spouses can apply too. There is no deadline for benefits, but for those seeking compensation, August 9th is the deadline. Military relations or veterans can qualify for a year's worth of back pay from when the bill began - in August of last year. Apply at va.gov.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/26/2023 1 MIN. The U.S. Air Force Academy is hosting a job fair this Saturday from 9 a.m. to noon. Job openings include security forces, human resources, medical support, food service, hair stylists, arts and crafts, gardener, childcare, customer service, education and more. President Joe Biden has decided to keep the U.S. Space Command headquarters in Colorado Springs, overturning a last-ditch decision by the Trump administration to move it to Alabama. The choice ended months of deliberations. U.S. officials say Biden was convinced by the head of Space Command, who argued that moving his headquarters now would jeopardize military readiness.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/03/2023 1 MIN. The Cheyenne Mountain Space Force Station Fire Department is conducting fire training exercises from 9 a.m. to noon this Friday on the installation. It says the training is routine and ensures emergency responders are prepared for a variety of incidents on and off the station in coordination with mutual aid partners. The 44-year-old man was arrested last week on multiple charges. About 4 a.m. June 21, Thornton Police officers responded to a neighborhood looking for a suspicious person. Instead, they found a teenage girl on the street with her hands and feet tied with, "a large amount of tape, thick rope, and ratchet straps," Police said it took several minutes to untie her. The officers had responded to the area because a neighbor called after seeing a suspicious person near his window. That person turned out to be the teen, who was trying to escape. The Adams County Sheriff's Office said the suspect bonded out of jail last Tuesday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/06/2023 1 MIN. Meta has unveiled an app called Threads to rival Twitter. It's targeting users looking for an alternative to the social media platform owned — and frequently changed — by Elon Musk. Threads is billed as a text-based version of Meta's photo-sharing app Instagram. It went live yesterday in Apple and Google Android app stores in more than 100 countries. CEO Mark Zuckerberg says 10 million people had signed up in the first seven hours. It suggests Meta has been gearing up to directly challenge the platform after Musk's tumultuous ownership has resulted in a series of unpopular changes that have turned off users and advertisers. But Threads has raised data privacy concerns and won't launch in the European Union.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/12/2023 1 MIN. In 1969, Charles Manson dispatched a group of young followers on a two-night killing rampage that terrorized Los Angeles. Yesterday, Manson follower Leslie Van Houten was released after spending more than five decades in prison for two of those murders. She participated in the grisly stabbings of the LaBiancas. It came the day after Manson and some of his other followers killed actress Sharon Tate and three others. Van Houten is the only one of Manson's followers who participated in the infamous Tate-LaBianca murders to be released from prison. Manson died in prison in 2017.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/17/2023 1 MIN. Families of several women who were slain and dumped along the coastline of New York's Long Island are trying to find closure after the capture of a man who authorities say is responsible. Police announced the arrest of a 59-year-old suspect. They say the architect killed at least three of the 11 people whose homicides in the area have baffled investigators for more than a dozen years. There were doubts about whether the serial killer would ever be caught. But now that a suspect is in custody, families of the victims say they hope to get closure as they continue to process the unexpected news of a break in the case.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/18/2023 1 MIN. An 18-year-old Castle Rock man was arrested at DIA Friday for his alleged connection to ISIS, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Colorado. The man is charged with attempting to provide material support to a designated foreign terrorist organization. According to an affidavit, he pledged an oath of allegiance to the leader of ISIS and intended to travel to serve as a fighter for ISIS in Iraq. He contacted someone he believed to be an ISIS facilitator, but ended up being an undercover agent. He was trying to fly to Turkey to meet ISIS members who would take him to Iraq.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/24/2023 1 MIN. A Colorado State Trooper was seriously hurt overnight when two suspected impaired drivers crashed into a pair of patrol units in back-to-back wrecks all at the same scene. The chaos began at around 3:45 a.m. Saturday along I-270 in Adams County when a driver struck an unoccupied state patrol vehicle. The trooper driving that unit was investigating an earlier crash at the time and was uninjured. Shortly after that another vehicle struck an unoccupied patrol vehicle. That trooper was forced over a bridge barrier and down a 30-foot embankment as a result of the collision. The trooper was rushed to a local hospital with serious, but non-life-threatening injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/25/2023 1 MIN. Authorities say a 14-year-old is among the dead campers found at a remote Gunnison County campsite two weeks ago. A hiker stumbled upon one of the bodies at the campsite on July 9, and authorities located the other two nearby at the Gold Creek Campground, about 20 miles northeast of Gunnison. They say the bodies were heavily decomposed and identified two as sisters ages 41 and 42. The 14-year-old was the son of one of them. All three were from Colorado Springs. The campsite where the three were found was described as set up for long-term living and the coroner said it appeared as if the three had started a stint of camping in July of 2022, with their cause of death suspected to be malnutrition and exposure over harsh winter months, but the autopsies are pending.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/31/2023 1 MIN. The Biden administration is launching a beta website today for its new income-driven student loan repayment plan, allowing borrowers to begin submitting applications for the program as federal student loan payments are set to resume in October. The SAVE plan will determine payments based on income and family size, and around 1 million borrowers could see their payments shrink to as low as \$0. Borrowers can access the beta website online.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/31/2023 1 MIN. A Federal judge has denied the bail release for the Castle Rock teen who's accused of trying to join ISIS. The order said "the defendant has no criminal record to speak of, although as a juvenile, he had interactions with Douglas County law enforcement in relation to threats to his family."The judge also noted the many disorders the man suffers such as ADHD, Autism Spectrum disorder, as well as anxiety and depression among others. Because of the threat in the past against his mother, who is the only person he could be released to, the judge denied bail.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/02/2023 1 MIN. Donald Trump has been indicted on felony charges for working to overturn the results of the 2020 election in the run-up to the violent riot by supporters at the U.S. Capitol. The Justice Department's four-count indictment accuses the former president of assaulting the foundation of democracy. His lawyer called the indictment "an attack on free speech and political advocacy.' Trump is due in court tomorrow.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/03/2023 1 MIN. Donald Trump is due in federal court in Washington, D.C., today to answer charges he sought to overturn his 2020 presidential election loss. Trump is expected to be taken into custody and enter a not guilty plea in front of a judge before being released.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/03/2023 1 MIN. Authorities say a man who posed as an undercover police officer kidnapped a woman in Seattle, drove her hundreds of miles to his home in Oregon and locked her in a cinder block cell until she bloodied her hands breaking the door to escape. The FBI said that police in Reno, Nevada, arrested the 29-year-old suspect a day after he fled from his home last month. He is charged with interstate kidnapping and authorities are searching for additional possible victims after linking him to sexual assaults in at least four other states, including Colorado. If you have information or if you are a victim, contact the FBI.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/07/2023 1 MIN. Oregon drivers are now allowed to pump their own gas after the state lifted a ban dating back to 1951. The new law went into effect immediately over the weekend, leaving New Jersey as the only state in the US where service station customers can't pump their own fuel.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/07/2023 1 MIN. A 4-year-old girl was run over by a dog on a golf cart in Michigan. According to authorities, at a BBQ event, a firefighter was seated in the passenger seat of a golf cart while the fire station's arson dog was seated in the driver's seat. The dog jumped down and hit the accelerator pedal which lunged the cart forward. The firefighter was able to grab the steering wheel and veer it away from the crowd, but it rolled over the left leg of a 4-year-old girl. The child was assessed at the scene, and luckily had no serious injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/09/2023 1 MIN. A driving instructor at a driving school in Lakewood received a citation for a traffic violation after crashing into the school's building. Lakewood Police shared the image of an SUV halfway into the front of the building on social media yesterday. It's not clear what led up to the crash, and according to police, there was only one minor injury.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/10/2023 1 MIN. Thousands of Hawaii residents raced to escape homes on Maui as blazes swept across the island, destroying parts of a centuries-old town and killing at least 36 people in one of the deadliest U.S. wildfires in recent years. The fire took many by surprise as winds from Hurricane Dora swept the blaze. Crews battled fires in several places on the island yesterday, and the flames forced some adults and children to jump into the ocean.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/11/2023 1 MIN. At least 55 people have died in the devastating fires in Hawaii, and officials warn the toll could rise. Search and rescue teams from California and Washington state trained in disaster skills including using dogs to find human remains are traveling to Maui. President Joe Biden has declared Hawaii a disaster area, clearing the way for federal aid to help Maui residents and businesses recover.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. Colorado State Troopers in the Golden area arrested a 20-year-old man for speeding in excess of 120 miles per hour, eluding a trooper and placing other motorists at risk. Video shared in a press release shows the man speeding and weaving in and out of traffic on his motorcycle, even cutting off a State Trooper, who then gave chase, but decided it was too dangerous so they backed off. That's when the unit's Patrol aircraft took over the chase from the sky and followed the man to his destination, his workplace. Troopers then made contact and arrested him.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. The official death toll has reached 99 in the wildfires on Maui, and Hawaii's Governor said in the next 10 days, that number could potentially double as crews continue to search for remains. About 85% of the fire in Lahaina is contained. Authorities are expected to begin releasing the names of the dead whose families have been notified. More than 2,200 structures in the region — about 86% of them residential — were damaged or destroyed.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/18/2023 1 MIN. A day after defending his decision not to activate sirens during the wildfires in Lahaina on Maui, the head of Maui's Emergency Management Agency, Herman Andaya has resigned, citing health reasons. Andaya had previously said sirens were not activated because they're normally used for tsunamis, during which residents are used to seeking higher land, and he feared the sirens would send residents straight into the wildfires. As of press time, one hundred eleven people had been confirmed to have died in the fires.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/21/2023 1 MIN. President Joe Biden will visit Maui today to witness the devastation left by the wildfires more than a week ago up close. Thousands of residents remain displaced and more than 1,000 more are estimated to still be missing as crews continue to comb the burned ruins. Lahaina's community members recently gathered to urge state leaders to include residents in rebuilding efforts as fears begin to settle in that developers and outsiders are making predatory land grabs while native residents are mourning their losses.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/21/2023 1 MIN. This may very well change how movie and TV producers feel about using artificial intelligence. A U.S. district judge ruled Friday that works created by Artificial Intelligence can't be copyrighted. The judge ruled you can only copyright works created by humans. This may very well change how movie and TV producers feel about using artificial intelligence.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/22/2023 1 MIN. Governor Jared Polis signed an executive order yesterday, with the intention of creating plans for more affordable housing. The order instructs certain agencies in the state to take inventory of programs that help local governments with housing development, as well as transportation, economic development and water infrastructure, which he says all go hand-in-hand. Polis said many affordable housing units tend to be away from peoples' workplaces. This forces them to travel more for work, which creates more traffic and more air pollution.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/22/2023 1 MIN. Japan will start releasing treated radioactive wastewater from its Fukushima nuclear plant into the Pacific Ocean on Thursday, despite objections from some countries. The plan has been in the works for years, and Japan says space was running out to store the material and they had "no other options" but to release it. Japanese officials said the wastewater has been continually treated to filter out all the removable harmful elements, then stored in tanks. When the wastewater is released, officials said it will be heavily diluted with clean water so it has very low concentrations of radioactive material.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/24/2023 1 MIN. Some Denver Public Schools still don't have air conditioning, and yesterday seventeen closed early because of it. For years, DPS has been working on getting ac into a long list of schools without cooling. One principal tried to get today approved to have classes let go early but was denied, because the temperature in the school only read 85 degrees yesterday. To have early release it has to be above 85. Students will now be given popsicles to cool down.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/25/2023 1 MIN. Donald Trump became the first former US president to have his mugshot taken when he was arrested yesterday. He was booked into the Fulton County Jail in Georgia after surrendering on more than a dozen charges stemming from his alleged efforts to overturn the state's 2020 election results. After he was released on a \$200,000 bond, Trump slammed the case as "a travesty of justice," and told reporters, "I did nothing wrong."

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/28/2023 1 MIN. Las Vegas health officials are investigating cases of Legionnaires' disease found in guests who stayed at two hotels. Two guests who stayed at Caesars Palace and another who stayed at The Orleans Hotel & Casino tested positive for the disease. Steps to notify guests who may have been exposed to the illness are underway.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/01/2023 1 MIN. A Chicago t.v. news crew reporting on a string of robberies ended up robbed themselves at gunpoint by three armed men wearing ski masks. The reporter and photographer were filming in Chicago's West Town neighborhood when two vehicles pulled up and three masked men emerged with guns. They robbed the pair of personal items and a television camera. That was the second robbery in August involving a Chicago news crew. Early last month a photographer was assaulted and robbed while preparing to cover a weekday afternoon news conference.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/01/2023 1 MIN. The Defense Department released a new website that will provide official declassified information on UFOs, including pictures and videos, for the public to easily look through. The website is the official page for the public to interact with the All-domain Anomaly Resolution Office (AARO), a relatively new Pentagon office tasked with reviewing and analyzing UFOs. aaro.mil seems to still be under construction, but that's where the UFO information will be located.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/05/2023 1 MIN. Partygoers stranded for days at the Burning Man festival by a late summer storm were allowed to start leaving yesterday afternoon after muddy roads dried up enough for them to start leaving the Nevada desert. The unusual late-summer storm turned the week-long Burning Man fest into a sloppy mess, with tens of thousands stuck in foot-deep mud and with no working toilets. Nearly 80,000 artists, musicians and activists were at the festival. At least one death was reported. But festival organizers say it wasn't weather-related.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/05/2023 1 MIN. A U.S. official said that North Korean leader Kim Jong Un may travel to Russia to meet President Vladimir Putin. U.S. officials said Russia is trying to buy ammunition from North Korea for its war in Ukraine. In return, experts say, North Korea will probably ask for food, energy shipments and transfers of sophisticated weapons technologies. A meeting with Putin would be Kim's first summit with a foreign leader since North Korea closed its borders in January 2020.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/06/2023 1 MIN. The U.N. weather agency says Earth endured its hottest Northern Hemisphere summer ever measured with a record warm August capping a season of brutal and deadly temperatures. Last month was not only the hottest August scientists ever recorded by far with modern equipment. It also was the second hottest month measured, behind only July 2023. August was about 2.7 degrees Fahrenheit, warmer than pre-industrial averages.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/07/2023 1 MIN. Google will soon require that political ads using artificial intelligence be accompanied by a prominent disclosure if imagery or sounds have been synthetically altered. Starting in November, just under a year before Election Day, Google said in an update to its political content policy that disclosure of AI to alter images must be clear and conspicuous and be located somewhere that users are likely to notice it. Though fake images, videos or audio clips are not new to political advertising, generative AI tools are making it easier to do, and more realistic. Some presidential campaigns in the 2024 race are already using it.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/08/2023 1 MIN. So few tourists are coming to the Hawaiian island of Maui after last month's wildfires that restaurants and tour companies are laying off workers and unemployment is surging. State tourism officials initially urged travelers to stay away, but now want them to come back as long as they refrain from going to the burn zone and surrounding area. They say respectful travelers can help Maui recover from the tragedy by spending their money. Nearly 8,000 people filed for unemployment on Maui during the last three weeks of August. That's a huge leap from 295 people during the same period in 2022.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/11/2023 1 MIN. Today marks 22 years since the attacks on 9/11, and many will commemorate the lives lost. People are gathering today at memorials, firehouses, city halls, campuses and elsewhere to observe the 22nd anniversary of the deadliest terror attack on U.S. soil. Commemorations are planned at the attack sites at New York's World Trade Center, the Pentagon and Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and in many other places.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/14/2023 1 MIN. The confusion of roundabouts in Colorado may just get worse for some. There's a new law going into effect across the state on October 1 and was passed by Governor Polis. It gives the right-of-way in roundabouts to larger vehicles — specifically, trucks, buses, emergency vehicles and recreational vehicles longer than 35 feet or wider than 10 feet. Any normal vehicles that want to enter, exit or drive in a roundabout have to yield to these larger vehicles if they're also entering, exiting or already in the roundabout. You could be facing a \$70 fine if you don't.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/18/2023 1 MIN. MDMA-assisted therapy could be on track for federal approval in 2024, and if that happens, Colorado already has a law on the books to allow its use. A study published last week found the drug, known on the streets as ecstasy or molly, can reduce symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder when combined with talk therapy. According to a bipartisan Colorado law passed over a year ago, FDA approval would be the first step to allowing MDMA in the state.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/19/2023 1 MIN. The crash site for a stealth fighter jet that went missing during the weekend after its pilot ejected has been located in rural South Carolina after the military asked the public for help finding it. Authorities had been searching for the jet since the pilot parachuted to safety into a North Charleston neighborhood about 2 p.m. Sunday. He was taken to a hospital, where he was in stable condition.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/21/2023 1 MIN. A family is suing Google after a father of two died after driving his jeep over a collapsed bridge in North Carolina, allegedly led to his death by Google Maps. The family says Philip Paxson was leaving his daughter's birthday party and driving home on a dark and rainy night when Maps sent him over a bridge that had collapsed over nine years previously. The family also says multiple other people had notified Google of the inaccessibility of the bridge, but the company failed to update its driving directions software.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/25/2023 1 MIN. A tentative deal has been reached to end Hollywood's writers strike after nearly five months. The Writers Guild of America reached the deal with an alliance of studios yesterday, streaming services and production companies. The guild's board and members must approve the agreement before the strike officially ends. Hollywood's actors remain on strike with no deal yet in the works. The writers walked off the job May 2 over issues including the size of staff on shows, long-term payment for their work and the use of artificial intelligence in scripts.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/28/2023 1 MIN. The federal government is heading toward a shutdown this weekend that will disrupt many services. While some government entities will be exempt, others will be severely impacted. Social Security checks will still go out. Millions of federal employees, including members of the military, won't receive paychecks. The shutdown will begin Oct. 1 if Congress cannot enact a funding plan.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/29/2023 1 MIN. Sen. Dianne Feinstein has died, according to several sources familiar with the matter. She was 90, and the oldest member of the Senate, the longest-serving female senator.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/03/2023 1 MIN. The Titan Fire, which was burning in Las Animas County, is 100% contained at 930 acres. The Rocky Mountain Complex Incident Management Team 1 transferred command back to the local authorities yesterday. The fire started last Wednesday and burned 11 miles northwest of Trinidad. The cause is still under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/03/2023 1 MIN. Law enforcement agencies across the state are cracking down on drunk driving. Officials said the Fourth of July is one of the deadliest holidays for drivers in the state. CDOT says more than 50% of the crashes this weekend will be due to drunk driving. Last year, there were 208 arrests of drunk drivers during the Independence Day weekend. Don't drink and drive!

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/06/2023 1 MIN. A homemade firework exploded in a Colorado Springs resident's face on the fourth, making it the only firework-related injury report the Colorado Springs Fire Department responded to that night. It happened at the Stonebrook apartment complex. The resident who caught the incident on camera said the homemade firework was made with gunpowder. The person who lit it off was seriously injured and was taken to a hospital. Firefighters said if you have any leftover fireworks, you can bring them to your local fire station for proper disposal- no questions asked or consequences.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/11/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs firefighters are warning parents to take extra precaution on playgrounds during the hot weather. This comes after a 14-month-old boy is recovering after receiving second-degree burns on a playground in Douglas County. CSFD says concrete can reach temperatures of up to 130 degrees, asphalt up to 160 degrees, and rubber can go up to 190 degrees. Firefighters say it only takes three seconds to start feeling a burn on these hot surfaces. They say it's always a good idea to touch the equipment before letting your child play.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/12/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Police are investigating a deadly pedestrian crash that happened overnight. Just before 5 this morning the crash was reported at North Academy between Platte and Bijou near the Discount tire. Police say the driver remained on the scene. Drivers are advised to use an alternate route this morning.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/14/2023 1 MIN. The Colorado Springs Fire Department responded to a HAZMAT incident at UnderWater Connection after a small chemical explosion was reported yesterday afternoon. CSFD tweeted about the incident just after 5:30 p.m. It was later determined a chemical reaction near the pool, caused three employees to be affected by minor chlorine inhalation injuries. Crews ventilated the building and had the situation under control within an hour.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/17/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Parks and Wildlife says one man died after a boat sank Saturday night on Lake Pueblo, west of the North Shore Marina and boat ramp. They said a small ski boat carrying three people started quickly taking on water and sank about 50 yards away from the shore. Two of the three passengers were wearing life jackets, and were rescued by rangers, the third was not; he was wearing pants and boots. CPW said some witnesses attempted to swim to him, but they were unable to reach him before he disappeared below the water. It's unknown what caused the boat to start sinking. The Pueblo County Coroner is now investigating.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/24/2023 1 MIN. A Colorado State Trooper was seriously hurt overnight when two suspected impaired drivers crashed into a pair of patrol units in back-to-back wrecks all at the same scene. The chaos began at around 3:45 a.m. Saturday along I-270 in Adams County when a driver struck an unoccupied state patrol vehicle. The trooper driving that unit was investigating an earlier crash at the time and was uninjured. Shortly after that another vehicle struck an unoccupied patrol vehicle. That trooper was forced over a bridge barrier and down a 30-foot embankment as a result of the collision. The trooper was rushed to a local hospital with serious, but non-life-threatening injuries.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/25/2023 1 MIN. The U.S. Forest Service is investigating a fire in El Paso County. Late yesterday afternoon, emergency crews were called to battle a fire just west of Highway 115 in El Paso County. The "May Fire" started 6 miles west of Fort Carson, near Cheyenne Mountain, and was likely caused by lightning. Multiple crews responded to the fire, and a helicopter was being used to dump water on the fire while ground crews worked to hike to the remote scene. As of 6 last night the fire was about a quarter of an acre. Another fire was reported this morning. Firefighters are on the scene of a fire burning near Monument. The fire is off of Mount Herman Road just west of Monument and is reportedly at a half acre in size. So far no evacuations were in effect.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/31/2023 1 MIN. A fire that happened early yesterday is under investigation in Colorado Springs. Just after 5 a. m., crews responded to Cabin Creek Drive, near Dublin and Austin Bluffs to a garage fire. The fire department confirms two people were inside the house at the time and able to get out safely. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/01/2023 1 MIN. An early morning fire is under investigation this morning. It happened at a home on Colorado Avenue in Old Colorado City just after 1 this morning. 3 people had to be rescued after getting trapped on the second floor. One person was taken to a hospital for smoke-related injuries. 8 people are now displaced. The cause of the fire is still under investigation, although fire crew won't be ruling out lightning as a cause.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/01/2023 1 MIN. The Manitou Springs Fire Department asked some residents to move to higher ground last night as the city saw flooding. This was for homes and buildings near Fountain Creek, east of Old Man's Trail, but the order was lifted around 11:15 p.m. No one was injured during yesterday's flooding. City Public Works crews will be removing debris and cleaning storm drains ahead of more expected rain. The fire department is urging residents to prepare for more flooding. They say to sign up for peak alerts, monitor local news, and if you see flooding, move to higher ground.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/02/2023 1 MIN. An apartment fire is under investigation in Colorado Springs. Just before 10 p.m. yesterday, CSFD responded to the Fountain Springs apartment complex off of Jet Wing and Fountain to a fire. Crews discovered unattended cooking started the fire and got it out within minutes. Four people are now displaced. One person had minor injuries and was treated on the scene.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/04/2023 1 MIN. A car crashed into a Colorado Springs home last night. The Colorado Springs Police Department tweeted about the crash at around 8:30 and said it happened at a home near Highway 115 and Cheyenne Meadows. No one was injured. Police said they believe a mechanical issue with the vehicle may have caused the crash, but the exact cause is under investigation.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/04/2023 1 MIN. A woman was rescued at Lake Pueblo State Park yesterday afternoon by Lake Pueblo Rangers after her folding kayak collapsed and became trapped in the Arkansas River. Her foot became trapped after the kayak hit a log. Passing bicyclists on shore saw the woman in distress and called 911. CPW staffers immediately responded, one put on a wet suit and jumped in the water and swam to the victim who was wearing a life jacket. The ranger was able to free her foot and she floated to shore where the Pueblo West Fire Department pulled her from the water.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/04/2023 1 MIN. The Cheyenne Mountain Space Force Station Fire Department is conducting fire training exercises from 9 a.m. to noon today on the installation. It says the training is routine and ensures emergency responders are prepared for a variety of incidents on and off the station in coordination with mutual aid partners. Residents traveling on, or living near, the I-25 and Highway 115 corridors should not be alarmed if they see smoke or fire in the area. Fire danger levels will be monitored to ensure safe execution of the training.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/14/2023 1 MIN. A hiker was successfully rescued by firefighters Saturday evening after falling 30 feet off Pulpit Rock. The hiker was injured and taken to a hospital in stable condition. Firefighters said it was a complicated rescue. Meanwhile, one person is dead, and two were injured in separate falling incidents at Rocky Mountain National Park this weekend.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. A police detective was one of two injured yesterday afternoon when a car crashed into an unmarked CSPD vehicle. CSPD said the detective was driving through the intersection of Woodmen and Commerce Center Drive just west of the interstate when the other driver, traveling westbound on Woodmen, rear-ended them. The two-alarm fire was reported at about 9:30 a.m. 55 firefighters responded to the scene, and now 6 people are displaced. First responders saved several pets, and even resuscitated a cat.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/31/2023 1 MIN. Breaking this morning. A serious crash involving a pedestrian is under investigation in Colorado Springs. Police say they received a call just before 8 a.m. for the crash off of N. Academy in an area near King Soopers just south of Woodmen Road. Police did not have any details on how severe the injuries were.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/01/2023 1 MIN. An investigation is underway following a fatal accident involving a pedestrian in a King Soopers parking lot. This happened at the King Soopers off of N. In a press release, Peterson Space Force Base added that fire danger levels will be monitored to ensure safe execution of the training.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/11/2023 1 MIN. Firefighters cut power to a large portion of downtown in response to reported explosions and fires underground coming out of manholes, with some flames as high as 10 feet. This happened at around 2:30 this morning in the area just west of Nevada Avenue and Kiowa Street. The fire was believed to be in underground electrical vaults, and not the sewer system. KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/10/2023 1 MIN. Hail was a huge problem for some over the weekend. Saturday's storm busted windows and hit homes on the southeast side of Colorado Springs. Golf ball sized hail was reported there. Cripple Creek was also dealing with damages due to golf ball sized hail that fell there. Some parts of the city lost communication and Century Link was working to repair downed phone lines.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/18/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs has what is being called an urban heat island, which causes higher temperatures in areas with a lack of vegetation and more pavement, and will lower the life expectancy of residents by 16 years. According to a study from Colorado College, the southeast side of the Springs runs about eight degrees hotter than the rest of the city due to this issue. Community members have been working to address the issues caused by the urban heat island and are proposing other solutions like cooling centers, such as libraries and community centers and making roofs more reflective on buildings to try and mitigate the impacts of heat.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/21/2023 1 MIN. It was a wild day of weather across southern Colorado yesterday afternoon. There were several reports of golf-ball-sized hail or greater impacting Colorado Springs, with even larger hail reports east of I-25. There were also reports and pictures of potential tornado damage from the Pikes Peak Highway at around 2:00 pm. This comes as a tornado touched down in Baca county. The damage there is unknown at this time.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/24/2023 1 MIN. Prepare to do the Marksheffel Shuffle if your driving plans take you through the Marksheffel-Dublin intersection, it'll be closed Tuesday night through Thursday as the city begins a fifty to sixty million dollar project designed to improve the intersection and widen lanes. The project is expected to be completed in 2026.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 07/26/2023 1 MIN. The heat wave in Phoenix has NOT let up, and yesterday they recorded their 25th straight day of temperatures hitting at least 110 degrees. It's so hot in Arizona that doctors there are seeing a spike of patients who were burned just by falling onto the ground. Burn centers are becoming maxed out, and about one-third of the patients are people who fell on the ground, some are in ICU. Also in Arizona, an elementary school librarian claims his shoes MELTED as he was doing his crosswalk duties . . . helping kids cross the street after school. And he was only out for 30 minutes.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/07/2023 1 MIN. It was a wild weather day on Saturday with up to 3 tornadoes possibly touching down in northeast El Paso County. The National Weather Service in Pueblo said "Preliminary estimates are that 2 to possibly 3 tornadoes touched down in extreme northeast EL Paso County, each with an estimated strength of EF0." The National Weather Service is conducting a weather survey to determine just how many tornadoes touched down.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/08/2023 1 MIN. The National Weather Service in Pueblo released a statement on the funnel cloud that sparked a tornado warning in northern El Paso County on Saturday. The NWS said the funnel cloud was determined to be just that: a funnel cloud, which never touched down. There was no update on the other two possible tornadoes reported Saturday.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/09/2023 1 MIN. A tornadic thunderstorm near the Kansas border last night dropped what may have been a new state record for Colorado's largest hailstone. A storm chaser posted to Twitter a photo of the stone with a measuring device. It was measured at 5.25 inches in diameter and fell on highway 36, north of Burlington, on I-70 in Eastern Colorado. The previous hailstone record was 4.83 inches which fell on August 13, 2019 in Bethune. These are all preliminary numbers and official findings from the National Weather Service have yet to be released.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 08/15/2023 1 MIN. The Colorado Department of Transportation will temporarily close eastbound and westbound South Academy under I-25 starting tonight for the rest of the week, to work on the bridge there. East and Westbound lanes will close at 7 p.m. and 6 p.m., respectively, and all lanes will reopen at 6:30 a.m. each morning. These closures are weather dependent and subject to change.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/07/2023 1 MIN. No more left turns at The General Palmer Statue downtown Colorado Springs! No left turn signs were posted along Platte Avenue at North Nevada Avenue in Colorado Springs yesterday. They are permanent and they were installed as data showed the intersection was more dangerous than you would expect," according to a city spokesperson. The Palmer statue was funded by private citizens in 1929.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/08/2023 1 MIN. CDOT will temporarily close east- and westbound South Academy under I-25 as part of the bridge reconstruction project starting tonight, starting at 7 p.m. and lasting through Monday morning, Sept. 11. All lanes will reopen at 6:30 a.m. If your travels take you along that stretch of I-25 this weekend, you can expect delays.

The stretch of Kiowa Street between Tejon Street and Nevada Avenue has been closed since Sept. 11, after an early-morning fire resulting from electrical equipment failure sparked underground, knocking out power for much of downtown. Springs Utilities asked that drivers follow signs and avoid the work zone.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/21/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Utilities is proposing a rate increase. The utility is saying aging infrastructure is falling below state requirements and an eight percent bump in electricity, six percent for natural gas, is needed for an upgrade. If approved by the City Council, the rate increase would go into effect January first of next year.

KRXP NEWS UPDATE 09/22/2023 1 MIN. Colorado Springs Utilities says they will need to replace a water main in addition to the electrical work that has already been done on Kiowa Street in downtown Colorado Springs.
