- Oct 4th:** YOUTH PRIDE is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping and advocating for over 850 lesbian, gay, transgender teens and young adults in Rhode Island. **KERRI KANELOS**, executive director and **BARBARA MARGOLIS**, board chair discuss the 23 year history and programs that YOUTH PRIDE offers to so many LGBTQ youth.
- Oct 11th:** Look deep into nature and you'll understand everything else better. **NATASHA HARRISON**, executive director of Norman Bird Sanctuary discusses the 65 year history of this RI natural gem that Mabel Norman Cerio left in her will for hikers, bird watchers, and the eco-conscious.
- Oct 18th:** **JANET COIT**, Director of Department of Environmental Management, is one of the few reappointments by Governor Raimondo. Her LEAN INITIATIVE, a process that promotes efficiency without eliminating the worker, has turned DEM around making it a more 'customer-friendly' state agency. Will other state agencies follow DEM's lead?
- OCT 25th:** *Get Off the Bench* is the new slogan for RI Coalition Against Domestic Violence's campaign. **DEB DEBARE** explains why saying something can help end domestic violence.
- Nov 1st:** Rhode Island was one of the first states in the country to pass mandatory recycling in 1986. As the landfill nears capacity, can we recycle our way out of this? **SARA KITE REEVES**, director of Recycling Policy and Programs at RI Resource Recovery discusses municipal tipping fees, recycling, and 'pay as you throw'.
- Nov 8th:** **KIM RIPOLI**, a 26 year veteran of the US NAVY is Associate Director of Veterans Affairs for state of RI. She is a key member of the team working on the new \$94 million dollar RI Veteran Home project in Bristol.
- Nov 15th:** Technology plays an important role in our everyday life. Yet only 18% of computer science degrees go to women and only 19% of software developers are women. Where are the girls? **DEBORAH PERRY**, CEO of YWCA Rhode Island talks about her new program, ***Fantastic Girtastic Code Company*** to educate and inspire girls to pursue careers in computer sciences and technology.
- Nov 22nd:** **ROSE WEAVER** is a singer, songwriter and actress who performed with Viola Davis at Trinity Rep, starred across Jodi Foster in the Accused, and performed in a one-woman show, Menopause Mama. She's an old friend who talks about the loss of her son, her mother, her husband and how singing is helping her to heal.

- Nov 29th:** Rhode Island Superior Court **JUDGE NETTIE VOGEL** has presided over some of the state's high profile cases over the past 20 years on the bench. She is a colorful justice with a daredevil spirit. She bikes cross country and zip lines, but don't cross her in the courtroom.
- Dec 6th:** **Secretary of State Nellie Gorbea** is the first Hispanic elected statewide in all of New England. She discusses her vision for the office which includes transparency, easier access for businesses, upgraded voting machines and the future of online voting.
- Dec 13th:** Roger Williams was the first minister at the First Baptist Church in Providence in 1638. Today, it's **REVEREND JAMIE WASHAM**. She discusses Roger Williams' ideas of soul liberty and freedom of conscience and the historic and religious significance of America's oldest church.
