REPRESENTATIVE LISTING OF OUR PROGRAMING TO MEET COMMUNITY NEEDS

1. ISSUE/TOPIC: Bible Reading

PROGRAM: Revive our Hearts, January 5, 2022; 9:00-9:30am

DESCRIPTION: Sometimes it can feel overwhelming to approach the Bible and know how to go about reading, studying, and applying it to our lives. In this series from *Revive Our Hearts*, Gretchen Saffles offered practical advice on how to bring God's Word to your life.

2. ISSUE/TOPIC: Doubt

PROGRAM: Grace to You, February 1, 2022; 7:30-8:00pm

DESCRIPTION: Even if you've followed Christ for years, perhaps you still have moments when you wonder, "Is Christianity really true? How can I be sure Jesus is the Messiah?" John MacArthur explained where those doubts come from and how to respond to them in *When Believers Doubt*.

3. ISSUE/TOPIC: Miracles

PROGRAM: Point of View, January 11, 2022; 11am-1:00pm

DESCRIPTION: Does God Still Do Miracles Today? On this show Host Kerby Anderson interviewed author J.P Moreland about his new book [A Simple Guide to Experience Miracles](#). Internationally renowned philosopher J. P. Moreland looks at the nature of miracles and explains why bearing and receiving credible testimony to God's miraculous acts is a crucial feature of a mature Jesus-follower. He also shows how to distinguish a real miracle from a mere coincidence. Miracles bring comfort to believers, strengthening faith in God and creating boldness in our lives. While miraculous healings have occurred frequently throughout church history, Moreland provides data showing how the last fifty years have seen a massive outbreak of miracles and supernatural activity. Today, he argues, the church should humbly expect to see more of these miraculous works of God than we do.

4. ISSUE/TOPIC: LGBTQ Agenda

PROGRAM: Unshackled, January 22, 2022; 4:00-4:30pm

DESCRIPTION: In effort to cast aside the brokenness of biology and

her powerlessness, Laura gave it all to transition to a man. Within the LGBT community, she was surprised to find such disappointment. How it was always the next phase that would bring fulfillment, only to realize she still didn't fit in with a group of men. But that all changed when she saw a light she couldn't look away from. Listeners were amazed with the conclusion to her redemptive story sweeping the nation on UNSHACKLED!

5. ISSUE/TOPIC: Our Speech

PROGRAM: Grace to You, March 8, 2022, 7:30-8:00pm

DESCRIPTION: When you become a Christian, everything changes—including the words that should come from your mouth. What kind of speech habits should characterize your new life? How can you avoid unguarded responses that damage relationships? Listeners were encouraged as John MacArthur took a practical look at *Taming the Tongue*.

6. ISSUE/TOPIC: Love

PROGRAM: Joni and Friends, February 23, 2022; 8:05am

DESCRIPTION: Loving your spouse sacrificially is an important principle in any marriage. Giving up wants and wishes on behalf of the other is a way of communicating love and respect. Host Joni Tada encourages listeners if you are married, ask God to help you look not only to your own interests but also to the interests of your spouse.

7. ISSUE/TOPIC: Widow and Orphan Care

PROGRAM: Joni & Friends, March 30, 2022; 8:00am

DESCRIPTION: Joni and Friends is continuing to work alongside our partners in Ukraine to evacuate people with disabilities. Unfortunately, family members often must be left behind. Join us in praying for these “orphans and widows” who are separated from their loved ones.

8. ISSUE/TOPIC: Singleness

PROGRAM: Revive our Hearts, February 21, 2021; 9:00-9:30am

DESCRIPTION: Plenty of unmarried women think they would be happy if they got married. And plenty of married women think they'd be happy if they had a different marriage. But Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth says that what's true about your heart before you're married will be true after you're married. Listeners were encouraged as they heard how Nancy prepared to get married after 57 years of singleness.

9. ISSUE/TOPIC: Fearfully and Wonderfully Made

PROGRAM: Adventures in Odyssey, March 30, 2022, 4:00-4:30 pm

DESCRIPTION: Young Donny McCoy shares his journals about his many adventures at Camp What-A-Nut. Donny is often teased about his size and after a hike and adventure with Mr. Whitaker he learns an important lesson about God's unique design.

10. ISSUE/TOPIC: Addiction

PROGRAM: Unshackled, February 26, 2022; 4:00-4:30pm

DESCRIPTION: Adam Alexander suffered from childhood trauma that led to years of his own addictions and insecurity. While his brothers never gave up on him and prayed for his salvation, it wasn't until he was ready that Adam could receive the good news of which they spoke.

PROGRAM: Love worth Finding, March 1, 2022, 8:00-8:30pm

DESCRIPTION: In this message, Adrian Rogers explained how to pray and what happens when parents pray.

12. **ISSUE/TOPIC: Testimonies from Ukraine**

PROGRAM: Revive our Hearts, March 8, 2022; 9:00-9:30am

DESCRIPTION: Can God really be using the war in Ukraine for His glory and the good of His people? Olesia is there, and her faith says, "Yes," even when human reasoning can't understand it. Listeners were encouraged, and learned how to better lift up our brothers and sisters in Eurasia up in prayer.
