He checked himself into rehab and took a Bible his mother had given him which began his journey to knowing Christ. Given the rise in gambling– including sports betting– Rob’s story of healing is even more critical to the times in which we live. He now serves as the Vice President of **The American Policy Roundtable** and is part of the panel on **The Public Square** radio program.

It started when he was 12 years old following the divorce of his parents. Life began to change for Dan in 1980 when he was given marijuana containing PCP and it scared him into quitting. He became a Christian in 1982, but even after becoming a pastor he began drinking again. In 2005 he was admitted to a psychiatric hospital in NE Ohio where he spent a month of inpatient treatment for alcohol addiction. He’s been clean since June 10th of that year and pastors the same church today.
