A fire broke out at the Chinese Consulate General in Houston on the evening of the 21st local time, accidentally revealing that the consulate was ordered by the United States to close and evacuate its staff within 72 hours. Photographs provided by unanimous showed the "fire alarm" as the consulate personnel burning documents. After reporting by the US media, the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs confirmed that it was ordered to close the Embassy and claimed that it was a political provocation unilaterally initiated by the US. The US State Department also confirmed that "it has ordered the closure of the Chinese Consulate in Houston to protect American intellectual properties", an unprecedented move in 41yrs of diplomatic ties between US and China.
