He also said that he would investigate the crimes committed by the Russian army in Ukraine. The perpetrators are brought to justice, calling for tougher international sanctions against Russia.

Topic: US offers \$10 million reward for 6 Russian military

intelligence officers

The U.S. State Department announced on Tuesday (26th) a \$10 million reward for the pursuit of six intelligence officers from the General Intelligence Service (GRU) of the Russian Army General Staff. They are suspected of participating in a global cyber attack using malware in June 2017. The U.S. said that the group of intelligence personnel belonged to the special cyber unit under the GRU and sought relevant information from the public to trace their location. The cyber attack caused the radiation monitoring system of the Chernobyl plant in Ukraine to go offline that year, and the failure of national computer systems in many European and American countries, including several private entities in the United States and a hospital system, suffered a total of billions of dollars in losses. This is regarded as the most destructive cyber attack in history. A U.S. federal grand jury in 2020 indicted the above-mentioned individuals on multiple counts of conspiracy to defraud and abuse, but Russia denied any involvement in the cyber attack.

Online political media Politico took the lead in revealing a 98-pages draft of the Supreme Court opinion on May 2nd, showing that the Supreme Court justices are preparing to overturn the "Roe v. Wade" established in 1973. A ruling that lays the foundation for a nationwide legal abortion right would wipe out nearly half a century of constitutional guarantees of the right to abortion. The Guardian's Washington correspondent, David Smith, called the leak "shocking and unprecedented" and said it was the "worst security breach" in US court history. The Supreme Court has confirmed the draft is true, but said it is not the final version.

Texas elementary school

A bloody shooting took place at an elementary school in Uvalde, a town in southwestern Texas, on Tuesday (24th), resulted in the death of at least 21 people, including 19 children, and the gunman was eventually killed. The gunman had previously hinted to others that he was going to commit the murder, believing that he committed the crime alone. This was the deadliest school shooting in Texas history. Wearing a bulletproof vest and armed with a rifle, Ramos closed the door immediately after breaking into the school, and shot wildly at the children and teachers present. Two police officers were injured in an exchange of fire with the gunman after police arrival. A Border Patrol team was called to break into the elementary school and eventually killed the shooter. Victims were primary school students aged between 7 and 11, and two adults, including a 44-year-old female primary school teacher. The gunman's grandmother was shot and taken to hospital in critical condition.

Per The Wall Street Journal - Americans are deeply pessimistic about the U.S. economy and believe the nation is deeply divided on some of the nation's most important values, according to a new survey by the National Public Opinion Research Center (NORC). The conclusions come from a survey commissioned by The Wall Street Journal and conducted by NORC at the University of Chicago, a nonpartisan research organization that assesses social attitudes. The survey found that Americans are depressed and dissatisfaction with the economy is among the highest in years. This pessimism is not limited to current economic conditions, and the US political system, its role as a global leader, and its ability to help many people realize the American Dream are also in doubt. About 83% of respondents described the economy as bad or not so good. More than a third of respondents (35%) said they were completely dissatisfied with their financial situation.

Topic: Biden calls for three-month moratorium on federal gasoline tax

President Joe Biden on Wednesday called on Congress to approve a moratorium on federal gasoline taxes for the three months from July to September to help consumers cope with the soaring cost of living in the U.S. Currently, the federal gasoline tax is 18.4 cents per gallon, which drivers typically add at gas stations. A full 15 gallons of gas is therefore an extra \$2.76. The tax cut for diesel is 24 cents a gallon. The tax cut, if enacted by Congress, would do little to dent inflation, which rose 8.6 percent in May from a year earlier, the fastest pace in four decades. Fuel prices led to the biggest price hikes for consumer goods, but food prices, rent, air tickets and many other goods also rose significantly from a year ago. Although it was trivial, Biden said the suspension of the federal gas tax would give American families "a little breathing room." The White House and some congressional Democrats supported the tax cuts, but many Republican lawmakers opposed, saying Biden and his administration pushed North Korea Shifting to renewable rather than continuing to use fossil fuels harms the oil industry.
