Topic: START - "New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty" expires in 2026

The United States and Russian Federation signed a "New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty" in 2010, which came into effect the following year with a validation till 2021. And the two countries agreed on a five-year extension of New START to keep it in force through February 4, 2026. STARTlimits the number of US-Russian strategic offensive weapons, namely intercontinental ballistic missiles, submarine-launched ballistic missiles, heavy bombers for nuclear missions, and the nuclear warheads they are equipped with; no more than 1,550 nuclear warheads can be deployed on these delivery platforms. On August 8, 2022, Russia announced its decision to temporarily withdraw from the treaty facility inspection mechanism because the United States hopes to restart inspection activities without considering the current realities.
