KZBT has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Traffic Awareness: The status of road conditions and traffic in the Permian Basin Area.

- C. Crime: Recent incidents of robberies in the downtown business district and the efforts of the community to deal with such crimes.
- D. Gas Prices: The price of gas and the impact on commuting patterns in our community.
- E. Stray animal population growth and pet adoptions
- F. Oil Prices: The impact that rising or declining oil prices have on the area..
- G. Public Health: The benefits of getting education on how to better take care of yourself. .

KZBT addresses these issues through responsive programming that includes:

- 3) Weekly Public affairs program called Radio Health Journal which airs at 5am Sunday morning
- 4) Weekly Public airs program called Viewpoint which airs at 5:30 Sunday morning
- 5) Live interviews with community leaders and citizens
- 6) Live appearances at various community and charity events by station personalities
- 7) Providing free air time for public service announcements (PSA's). KZBT airs PSA's throughout the day.
- 8) Partnering with other local media for breaking news reports
- 9) Weather alerts, storm coverage.
- 10)EAS messages (child abductions, storm warnings, etc.)
