The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

THE DIANE JONES MORNING SHOW KLPW AM AND FM - LOCAL PROGRAMMING EXAMPLES

A "Meet the Candidate" invitation letter was send to all candidates in the November 6 Primary Election on the County, State, and Federal levels in the area. They were invited to take part in a free 15-20 minute informational interview to allow voters to hear their platform and reasons for running for office.

Approximately 22 candidates in the Primary Election took advantage of the free informational interview on The Diane Jones Morning Show. Attached is the list of candidates. Diane was able to keep her questions for each office consistent. The Propositions and Amendments on the ballot were also represented by those in favor and those opposed.

The Union Fire Department presented a Proposition which was on the November 6 ballot that addressed their staff shortage because of population growth and city limit expansion, especially on the east side of the city.
