The governor said Puerto Rico can't pay the bonds without cutting essential services. Island officials spent the weekend trying to negotiate a settlement that would have avoided the default but apparently came up short. The increases were small in some areas, and many big cities also had declines. But the numbers were particularly grim for a handful of places - Chicago, Los Angeles, Dallas and Las Vegas - where the number of homicides increased in the first three months of 2016 after killings and other violent crimes also went up in 2015. Criminologists and law enforcement officials, including Comey, say the causes of the increases are unclear, and they offer a variety of possible explanations, including gang violence and bloodshed stemming from drug addictions. Comey also again suggested that greater scrutiny of police had possibly changed the way officers and communities interact, which he said may be a factor in the uptick in homicides, an idea he voiced to much disagreement last year.
