

FCC EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY AUDIT RESPONSE
WWRB-TV, MAYVILLE, WISCONSIN
TRINITY BROADCASTING OF TEXAS, INC.

WWRB-TV Mayville, Wisconsin (FID #68547) (“WWRB” or “Station”), licensed to Trinity Broadcasting of Texas, Inc., d/b/a Trinity Broadcasting Networks (“Trinity”), hereby provides the following response to the Commission’s March 22, 2024 random audit notice (FCC DA: 24-179, herein “Audit Letter”) requesting information on WWRB’s implementation and compliance with Commission’s Equal Employment Opportunity (“EEO”) program in accordance with Commission Rule 73.2080.

WWRB follows the Commission’s religious broadcaster policy provided in Rule 73.2080(a) and employees share a common faith commitment. *Streamlining Broadcast EEO Rule Order and Policy Statement*, FCC 98-19, 13 FCC Rcd 322 (1998); *Second Report and Order in MM Docket No. 98-204, Review of the Commission’s Broadcast and Cable Equal Employment Opportunity Rules and Policies*, FCC 02-303, ¶ 50 (2002).

WWRB Has Fewer Than Five Full-Time Employees

WWRB has fewer than five (5) full-time employees regularly assigned to work 30 hours a week or more. Accordingly, in response to paragraph 2(a) of the Commission’s Audit Letter, the Station has one (1) full-time employee, its Network Engineer, who is regularly assigned to work 40 hours a week.¹

The Audit Letter also instructs that WWRB respond to question 2(b)(vi), *i.e.*:

[Disclose a]ny pending or resolved complaints involving the Unit filed during the Unit’s current license term(s) before anybody having competent jurisdiction under federal, state, territorial, or local law, alleging unlawful discrimination in the employment practices of the Unit on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex. For each such complaint, provide: (1) a brief description of the allegations and issues involved; (2) the complainant and other persons involved; (3) the date the complaint was filed; (4) the court or agency before which it is pending or by which it was resolved; (5) the file or case number; and (6) the disposition and date thereof or current status. Note that the Unit must reported, all complaints, regardless of their status or disposition.


WWRB’s last renewal application was granted on November 12, 2021 (LMS License 0000154196), for a term expiring December 1, 2029). During WWRB’s current license term, no complaint involving the Station has been filed alleging unlawful discrimination in its employment practices on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, or sex.

Pursuant to its operations and activities, the information on file with the Commission, and as provided with this submission, WWRB believes it properly complies with the Commission’s EEO regulations. If any additional information is requested, it will be promptly provided.
