



Despite the devastation hurricanes, tornadoes, wildfires, and other emergencies and disasters have caused in recent years, only 60% of American's say preparation for natural disasters is very important to them







DID YOU KNOW?

6 million 16-to-24 year olds are out of work and out of school—that's more than 1 in 7 young adults who are disconnected from the education system and mainstream economy, plus millions more who lack a stable connection to either. Many are bright, motivated, eager to learn, and hard workers who take responsibility for their futures, but lack access to career training and opportunities. Both employers and taxpayers lose out when the potential of these young people is not realized. Their disconnection is estimated to cost taxpayers \$93 billion per year in lost revenues and increased social services.

These young adults represent an unrealized opportunity for employers to access millians of talented workers to fill artical entry-level positions and to grow their businesses and the economy. Despite persistent high unemployment, there are more than 4 million job vacandes, in part because employers cannot find workers with the skills these jobs require. More than two-thirds of employers report difficulties filling job openings.

By raising emplayers' awareness of the potential of this talent pool, we will change lives and strengthen the economy.

What can The Campaign for YOU do. Disability Employment

Dear Public Service Director.

When we look at someone, do we see alt of who they are?

This is the question the PSA "Who I Am" was created to address, "Who I Am" features nine people with disabilities who, with the notable exception of R.J. Mitte (featured in television's "Breaking Bad"), are tog actors. Not defined solely by their disability, each of these individuals is the sum of their many life roles—which includes working in jobs they love.

Given that nearly one in five Americans has a disability—many of which are not apparent—nearly all of us will be affected by disability at some point in our lifetime. Anyone may acquire a disability through accident, injury or aging and many people have a parent, is spouse, relative, nelgibbor or friend with a disability. 
