On this episode, suggestions for spring break vacations are Nashville, Louisville, Kentucky and Washington DC. On a budget, travel on weekends and book early. The fight against Alzheimer's survey shows that few seniors are taking cognitive assessments by their doctors because they do not ask for them. Neither do doctors routinely cover this. With so many viewers affected in some way by this disease, the segment stressed early diagnosis. Other short subjects included product labelling on foods and how to use these labels to select healthy options.

Charlee Abram is the show manager for the Hawaii Hulacat Club Show. Her family is 4-generations of organizing and working at the show exhibiting pedigree cats to the general public. They also do rescue efforts, spay and neuter. With a high rate of homeless animals in the islands, this segment helps viewers minimize this problem.
