The Jessica Lani Rich Show is an inspirational program where the host talks to members of the community who are making a difference in Hawaii and the world. In this episode, Michael Marsh, president and chief executive officer of Responsive Caregivers of Hawaii (RCOH.org) describes their day programs and group homes services for intellectual and developmental disabilities and seniors. Viewers learn of the availability of help for those who may need these services. Viewers also meet Connie Sizemore, executive director of Surfrider Spirit Sessions. She explains their adult mentorship program for at-risk youth which is a free program available to anyone. Finally, Jessica interviews Amy Hammond, executive director of the Made in Hawaii Festival. This is the 22nd year of the event which hosts 420 exhibitors this year. Attendance is over 50,000 over 3 days.
