10/06/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Jim Mahar, Bona Responds

Bona Responds returned to Breezy Point, Far Rockaway during the summer. They've made 11 trips to help clean up after Hurricane Sandy. They rushed out to Oklahoma City when tornadoes hit there. "We ran chainsaws for pretty much the whole week." The group has been installing wheelchair ramps, repairing floors, and installing roofs.

Additional issues: "We don't have to travel 1200 miles to help those in need." Bona Responds also helps out locally wherever it can. They've been around for 8 years, starting right after Hurricane Katrina. Anyone can volunteer, not just St. Bonaventure students.

10/13/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Bridget Dean, SPCA in Cattaraugus County

Bridget recently became Board Chairman of the SPCA in Cattaraugus County. Several other newcomers are onboard to help the SPCA. They will try to bring new ideas to help solve an overwhelming debt and get community support. It's very important to keep the animals warm, generally costing \$20,000 a month just to survive.

Additional issues: An independent financial and legal consultant is reviewing SPCA operations. The NY State Attorney General's office has made recommendations to the SPCA to better manage itself, and the SPCA is complying. Also, a big maintenance and cleanup day is set for Saturday, October 26th.

10/20/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Richard Zink, Southern Tier West Regional Planning Board

The Southern Tier West Planning Board continues to implement a locally-grown food project, now 2 years in the making. A farmers market summit is scheduled for November 4th to work through issues and take the next step. The effort so far has been "slow and steady."

Additional issues: A food hub is a central storage and distribution facility for food producers, and has yet to be built. More producers must be involved before a food hub system is started. Discussions are underway with 3 school districts to meet their needs with locally grown foods.

10/27/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG: Duration 15 minutes Guest: Eileen Skrobacz

Olean Middle School teacher Eileen Scrobacz discussed her students' involvement with a bully-free campaign. A blue and white bracelet effort grew to a bully-free atmosphere for the entire Olean School District. "The response by students was terrific."

Additional issues: "We'll make posters in December and January reminding the students how important it is to live in a safe environment. In Mach, a former player for Ohio State University will be visiting Olean, to encourage students to "stand tall and make positive choices."

11/03/13 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Mindy McCarthy, Americorps Representative

Mindy just got established at Allegany-Limestone School in May as the Americorps representative. Americorps is kind of like a domestic Peace Corps. It provides 7800 individuals across NY State to offer assistance to benefit youth. "Our students come in to hang out, to talk, to cool off, and for homework help.

Additional issues: High School students are mentoring Middle School students, "which is awesome." The program is just starting and seems to be a success. It could be to study for tests, help for a project, or for a social network to help younger students gain confidence in social interaction.

11/10/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Jay Tennies, Eldred World War II Museum

The Eldred World War II is presenting Dr. Richard Frederick in a Veterans Day program, about the "First Veterans" from World War I. He's a Museum board member and professor at Pitt-Bradford. The museum will open Veterans Day, admission is free.

Sixth graders at Otto-Eldred School will be visiting that day.

Additional issues: "If you see somebody who served, just say thank you." It's nice to see that become more common. Tennies explained the significance of the poppy with respect to World War I. As for the museum, it will continue to operate, despite the death earlier this year of founder Tim Roudebush.

11/17/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Bill Aiello, Olean Mayor-Elect

The newly elected Mayor of Olean is meeting with the person he defeated, Linda Witte, and city council members, getting up to speed. \$17,000 in the county budget was restored to the Olean-Cattaraugus Airport, for a new approach to the hangar. He's beginning to form his new budget for the city in 2014. Aiello says he'll try to "calm the fears" about plans to rebuild North Union Street downtown.

Additional issues...Aiello may revisit the landlord-tenant issues in Olean, trying to better involve landlords in the process of cleaning up rundown neighborhoods. Code enforcement, police, fire, and public works need to get on board to get to the problems. The landlords must "buy into" the process.

11/24/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Jim Boser, Cattaraugus County Legislature

Jim Boser updated listeners on Cattaraugus County issues, including plans to improve the Zoar Valley Park entrance. The area is a center for whitewater rafting and fishing, and the project will improve tourism. Gowanda is seeking casino funds for the work, as are people seeking to restore the Hollywood Theater in Gowanda. Also, Ontario Knife is seeking funds to expand their plant in Franklinville.

Additional issues: In addressing the fact that county taxes are high, Boser says a main reason is that the county operates two nursing homes, the only county in NY State that does so. Reimbursement rates received from the state do not cover costs, so the nursing homes lose money. Selling them might be considered.

12/01/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Colleen Taggerty, Olean School Superintendent

Colleen Taggerty says work on the coming budget has been continuous. A community advisory committee is assisting, to show people how a school budget is developed. The district is in its best financial shape since 2008. Continuing full-time pre-K is uncertain as grant funding has been lost. Olean has reduced the art and music program but does not intend to cut it further.

Additional issues: The now-vacant Ivers J. Norton Elementary School is in the process of being sold. If approved by the school board, residents will vote on the sale in February 2014. The interested party is as yet not identified. Work at the school track is completed except for the striping.

12/08/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Sue Fries, Cattaraugus County Election Commissioner

Sue Fries and Laura Howard speak about an open house coming up at their new location, the former Little Valley Central School. It is "very conducive to our needs," unlike the former building which is antiquated. Paper records must be kept on site for two years. "We're finishing work on the November elections, and next, we get ready for village elections, where petitions start January first."

Additional issues: The current voting machines are working out "very well," and were upgraded last year. People are now getting used to them after struggling with the new machines. The machine must keep a paper trail and does in a memory trail. The old lever machines are being used by schools.

12/15/13: 6:45 a.m. on WPIG; Duration 15 minutes Guest: Joseph Giglio, NY State Assemblyman

The assemblyman is once again hosting a "Toys for Tots" drop-off location and open house coming up. On the NY Safe Act, a motion to repeal the law is now in the courts. Giglio believes it's a violation of 2^{nd} amendment rights. There's still confusion over the law. On the governor's tax relief, Giglio says the problem continues to be mandates placed on counties and school districts, which drive taxes up.

Additional issues: Reggie Dallaire, with "Toys for Tots," says people can bring new, unwrapped toys in to Giglio's office, where applications are still available. Distribution of toys is set for Saturday, 12/21/13, at the Trinity United Methodist Church on North 9th Street in Olean.

Kevin Habberfield and Michael Marvin of United Way announce that the campaign has reached and even exceeded its goal of \$400,000. Last year, the campaign did not meet its goal.

Additional issues: There are more people in need, making fundraising more difficult. The money raised is shared by 18 agencies in Cattaraugus County. Habberfield wants to stress that United Way funds raised by the NFL are not used locally. Local dollars remain in the local area. Our next big event is Ski Day in Ellicottville.
