1. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, January 24, Length :45** NewsChannel 3 is taking action for Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital. \$100 raffle tickets are now on sale for this year's Dream Home in Chesapeake's Deep Creek neighborhood. The home is worth \$450,000. The winner will be drawn in early May. Those who buy a ticket before March 7, will be entered to win a 2013 Dodge Dart.
2. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January 23, Length :35** NewsChannel 3 is taking action for Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital. \$100 raffle tickets are now on sale for this year's Dream Home in Chesapeake's Deep Creek neighborhood. 3. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, January 27 Length : 35** NewsChannel 3 is taking action for Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital. \$100 raffle tickets are now on sale for this year's Dream Home in Chesapeake's Deep Creek neighborhood. 4. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 8, Length 2:00** Thousands of people plunged into the Atlantic Ocean this afternoon for the annual Polar Plunge at the Oceanfront in Virginia Beach. This year, \$1.1 million was raised to support Special Olympics Virginia.
5. **NewsChannel 3 At Noon, February 14, Length :30** Today is Community Service Day and hundreds of sailors from the USS Abraham Lincoln are taking part in it. More than 200 sailors will visit 10 schools in Newport News today. They will participate in a variety of projects from reading to students, beautifying courtyards, to tutoring and mentoring students
6. **NewsChannel 3 at 6:30, March 2, Length :25** VDOT crews are getting ready to shut down a ramp to Interstate 264 East. The closure is happening for concrete pavement repairs. The closure will continue overnight until 5 a.m. and every night through Thursday, March 13. Detours are set up.
7. **NewsChannel 3at 5, March 31, Length :25** Having a College Degree doesn't guarantee you a high-paying job. The Bureau of Labor Statistics reports about 260-thousand graduates made at or below the federal minimum wage of 7.25 per last year. That's the lowest number since 2008. The worst year was 2010 -- when the number skyrocketed to 327-thousand. Experts blame the economy in the post-recession labor market for the number of college grads stuck in low paying jobs.

POLITICS

1. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January, 6 2014, Length: :20** Congress returns from its holiday break and senate majority leader Harry Reid plants to get right to work. Reid says the chamber will hold its first vote on a plan to extend unemployment aid to 1.3 Million Americans whose benefits expired at the start of the year. The plan faces stiff opposition in the house.
2. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January, 6 2014, Length: :20** Secretary of State John Kerry says the U.S. will not send troops back to Iraq. Right now, Iraq's military is battling Sunni Militants linked to Al-Qaeda in the cities of Fallujah and Ramadi. Iraqi officials say a series of bombs exploded in Shia neighborhoods in Baghdad yesterday -- killing more than 50 people.

3. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January, 7 2014, Length: :25** The arctic chill affecting business on Capitol Hill. Weather-related travel problems delayed a vote in the Senate on a bill to extend unemployment benefits. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid planned a procedural vote on the bill which would extend benefits for people out of work more than six months. But republicans noted that more than a dozen senators were unable to make it back to Washington, D.C. The vote is now planned for today.
4. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January, 8 2014, Length: :25** The race is tight between two candidates hoping to fill the 6th District State Senate Seat. A special election was held yesterday by Ralph Northam -- who is now the Commonwealth's Lt. Governor. With 76 of the 78 precincts reporting, Democrat Lynwood Lewis, Jr. has a slight edge -- just over 50 percent of the vote. Republican B. Wayne Coleman has over 49 point 9 percent of the vote.
5. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning January 9 2014, Length :15** The Obama Administration has unveiled new national guidelines of school discipline. The reforms are aimed at keeping more students in class and avoiding unnecessary suspensions. Education Secretary Arne Duncan and Attorney General Eric Holder announced the program at a Baltimore High School yesterday.
6. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 8 2014, Length :25** Senator Creigh Deeds is back at work. Yesterday he introduced his new gun law legislation. Senator Deeds told the Washington Post, his gun-control bill is not related to the death of his son, who committed suicide in November. He said the bill is in line with his past efforts to close the so-called gun show loophole.
7. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 14 2014, Length :25** Governor Terry McAuliffe already talking about change. Virginia's new governor says the tolls at the midtown and downtown tunnels are too high and put a huge burden on drivers trying to get to work and back each day. Governor McAuliffe has asked the transportation secretary to revise the tolling plan. Governor McAuliffe also announced that carnival cruises will be returning to Norfolk in 2015.
8. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 14 2014, Length :25** Congress has unveiled details of a one-point-one trillion dollar spending bill. It would fund the government for the rest of the year and avoid another shutdown. The measure finalizes a budget deal Republicans and Democrats agreed to last month. The house is scheduled to vote on the bill tomorrow.
9. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 17 2014, Length 1:30** President Obama lays out his new blueprint for the National Security Agency. The President promised to take a close look at the NSA after startling details about how the spy agency works were made public.
10. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 3 2014, Length :20** Former Governor Bob McDonnell is scheduled to be back in court today for a hearing in his corruption case. Lawyers for Governor Bob McDonnell and his wife Maureen disagree with prosecutors over whether the couple should be allowed to talk to close friends and family members who could be called as witnesses. The McDonnell's are accused of accepting gifts, cash, and loans.
11. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 4 2014, Length :20** President Obama sat down for a contentious interview with Fox News host Bill O'Reilly. The two sparred over

issues such as the President's Healthcare law, the attack on the U.S. compound in Benghazi, and IRS scrutiny of conservative groups.

12. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 4 2014, Length 1:20** A federal judge will hear a challenge to the ban on gay marriage. This could be a potentially game changing case here in the Commonwealth. Last night dozens of supporters of same-sex marriage gathered outside the courthouse. Among them, Tim Bostic and Tony Landon -- a Norfolk couple who applied for a marriage license last year and was denied. Supporters say they are hopeful for change, especially since Attorney General Mark Herring recently announced he thinks the ban on same-sex marriage is unconstitutional.
13. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 5 2014, Length 1:20** The debate on the state's same sex marriage ban came to a head in Norfolk Federal Court. Protestors on both sides lined the streets in front of the court house yesterday. Tony London and his partner Tim Bostic sued after a Norfolk Circuit Clerk denied them a marriage license last year. Lesbian couple Carol Schall and Mary Townley -- joined in the legal challenge -- since their California marriage is not recognized in Virginia. Attorney General Mark Herring said he is not defending the state's marriage law. The judge said she will make a decision soon on the constitutionality of the law -- but did not say exactly when that would be.
14. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 11 2014, Length :20** House republican leaders have unveiled their plan to raise the country's debt ceiling. The bill would raise the limit while also repealing the cost of living cuts to military retirees under the age of 62. To pay for the benefits, the plan would extend automatic cuts known as the sequester for one year to 20-24. A vote on the bill is scheduled for tomorrow.
15. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 11 2014, Length :20** The Obama Administration is giving some employers more time to offer workers healthcare. Now companies with 50 to 99 employees will have until 2016 to comply with the employer mandate. Larger companies must offer insurance to at least 70 percent of full time workers by 2015.
16. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 11 2014, Length :40** The senate is expected to vote today on a bill that would restore pension increases to hundreds of thousands of military retirees. The house voted 326-to-90 yesterday to undo cuts to cost-of-living hikes for military pensions for all current retirees and anyone who enlisted before January first. The vote comes after a December deal to fund the federal government led congress to trim cost-of-living raises for military retirees starting in 20-15. The move was expected to save the government more than six-billion dollars, by shrinking pensions for nearly 750-thousand retirees. A congressional research service report released this month said enlisted members would lose an average of 69-thousand dollars over their lifetime with those planned cuts.
17. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 12 2014, Length :30** New details on the push to repeal the mandate that requires a woman to get an ultrasound prior to having an abortion. Lieutenant Governor Northam made the tie-breaking vote yesterday, allowing the repeal to pass in the Virginia Senate. after breaking the 20-20 tie, Northam released this statement saying: "I've said time and time again that legislators€ " most of whom are men€ " have no business getting in between the healthcare decisions that a woman and her doctor make. As a practicing physician, I am hopeful that this mandate will ultimately be repealed."

18. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 12 2014, Length :15** The House of Representatives passed a bill to raise the country's borrowing limit -- no strings attached. The measure passed with mostly democratic support after republican leaders decided not to attach any conditions to the bill. Now it heads to the senate where it is expected to pass.
19. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 26 2014, Length :30** New this morning -- The White House says it is planning for the possible withdrawal of *all* U.S. troops from Afghanistan by the end of the year, if security agreement is not signed. White House officials say President Obama made a rare phone call to Afghan President Hamid Karzai yesterday, and made it clear that time is running out to properly plan for keeping any U.S. forces in the country beyond 2014. Several thousand U.S. soldiers are expected to remain in Afghanistan after combat operations end this year. Officials say, Karzai is refusing to sign a security agreement.
20. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 3 2014, Length :20** Federal Government offices in Washington are closed today because of the winter storm. House Majority Leader Eric Cantor also postponed all votes and legislative business for today. And the Senate has put off all votes until tomorrow. the Washington area is bracing for a tenth of an inch of ice, topped by eight to 12 inches of snow
21. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 6 2014, Length :20** The House is expected to vote today on a one-billion dollar of loan guarantees package to help bolster Ukraine's economy. Diplomatic solution to the Ukraine crisis. The White House is still attempting to persuade reluctant allies to go along with economic sanctions against Russia.
22. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 7 2014, Length :20** President Obama and Russian President Vladimir Putin discussed the crisis in Ukraine. The White House says the two leaders talked on the phone yesterday. The Obama Administration ordered sanctions against Russian and Ukrainian officials involved with the crisis over Ukraine's Crimea region. The move authorizes freezing the assets of those seen as destabilizing the situation.
23. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 7 2014, Length :15** President Obama has declared last month's winter storm that hit Georgia a major disaster. The move frees up federal aid for recovery efforts. The storm basically shut down Atlanta and surrounding areas while crews cleared snow and ice-packed roads. The storm also cut power to hundreds of thousands of customers
24. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 12 2014, Length :15** Ukraine's Prime Minister will visit President Obama at the White House today. He's urging the west to defend his country against Russia. People in Crimea will vote this weekend on a referendum to become part of Russia or remain in Ukraine.
25. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 17 2014, Length :25** The White House is launching a March Madness push to get people signed up for affordable health care. President Obama's new campaign begins this week and is tied to the annual basketball bonanza. Athletes and coaches will be part of the push to encourage Americans to sign up for health care before the march 31st deadline. Those who don't sign up will pay a penalty. The White House will also release a "16 sweetest reasons to get covered bracket." Magic Johnson, Alonzo Mourning and LeBron James will help make the pitches on television, radio, digital, online, and social media.

26. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 26 2014, Length :30** The Obama Administration is giving people more time to complete their enrollment for affordable health care. This applies to those who started the process but will not have it done by the March 31st deadline. Right now, it's unclear how long the extension will last
27. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 27 2014, Length :25** The Mayor of Charlotte, North Carolina has stepped down. Patrick Cannon resigned yesterday, just hours after he was arrested on federal corruption charges. The 47-year-old is accused of accepting bribes from undercover FBI agents who wanted to do business in Charlotte. Investigators say Cannon accepted about 48-thousand dollars in cash, airline tickets, a hotel room, and use of a luxury apartment. Cannon was later released on bond.
28. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 31 2014, Length :30** Time is running out if you need to sign up for Health Insurance coverage under President Obama's landmark healthcare law. The deadline is midnight tonight. President Obama announced last week that more than 6 million people have signed up so far. People who have already started enrolling but cannot finish by tonight can get an extension. They must first attest they tried to sign up before the deadline. There are penalties for those who do not have insurance. Under the health care law, they face a 95 dollar fee or one percent of their income -- whichever is greater.

RACE

1. **NewsChannel 3 at 5, January, 3 2014, Length: 1:15** An interracial couple is outraged after they say they were the target of racism while leaving a popular Atlanta restaurant. When they got home they noticed this tag left by the man who they say valet parked their car with a derogatory slur used to describe interracial couples.
2. **NewsChannel 3 at 4, January, 6 2014, Length: :26** A man who slapped a baby on a flight last year - gets eight months in prison as his punishment. 61-year-old Joe Rickey Hundley pleaded guilty last month to assault for using a racial slur and slapping a 2-year-old crying boy. They were all on a Delta flight from Minneapolis to Atlanta at the time. In federal court today - Hundley told the judge he takes full responsibility for his actions - he also apologized to the baby's mother.
3. **NewsChannel 3 at 5, January, 20 2014, Length: :15** People in Newport News came together today to honor Doctor King. There was a parade this morning at the Doctor Martin Luther King Junior Plaza at 25th Street and Jefferson.
4. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, February 9 2014, Length, :26** An Oklahoma State basketball star will spend the next 3 games as a spectator. Sophomore guard Marcus Smart was suspended three games today for shoving a Texas Tech fan in the final minute of the Cowboys loss to Tech on Saturday night. After the shove, smart told his coaches that the fan yelled a racial slur at him causing his reaction. But earlier today the fan, Jeff Orr, told the media he did not say that.
5. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 11 2014, Length :35** The Washington Redskins facing more pressure to change its name. this time -- from Congress. Senator Maria Cantwell, a Democrat from Washington State, along with Republican Representative Tom Cole from Oklahoma -- sent a letter to NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell urging him and the league to take a formal position in support of a name change. The letter says the NFL is "on the wrong side of history" for standing by while a term many feel is a racial slur, continues to be the name for the team in the nations' capitol.

6. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, February 27 2014, Length :27** An independent report into allegations of hazing and bullying involving the Miami Dolphins has found that Richie Incognito, John Jerry and Mike Pouncey engaged in harassment directed at Dolphins offensive lineman Jonathan Martin. The report condemns behavior in the team's locker room saying that it was consistent with a case of workplace bullying. Martin was taunted on a persistent basis with racial insults and offensive comments about his family
7. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, February 27 2014, Length :19** Paula Deen -- starting to work on her come-back. she's opening a restaurant this summer in Tennessee. it will be called "Paula Deen's Family Kitchen". The restaurant will be Deen's first attempt to revive her brand, since she admitted to using a racial slur last year. She later lost her TV show and a number of endorsement deals.
8. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 28 2014, Length :40** Paula Deen says she is slowly rebuilding her career after last year's controversy over her use of a racial slur. In an interview with people magazine, the celebrity chef compared her recent struggle with that of NFL hopeful, Michael Sam. She told the magazine... quote- "i feel like 'embattled' or 'disgraced' will always follow my name. It's like that black football player. He said 'i just want to be known as a football player. I don't want to be known as a gay football player.' I know exactly what he's saying." Deen's efforts to turn her career around include plans to open a new restaurant in Tennessee.
9. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, March 1 2014, Length :45** A court of appeals has ruled there was nothing wrong with banning American flag or patriotic t-shirts in a northern California school. The court said that the school's concern that star spangled t-shirts might provoke racial violence outweighed the students' rights to freedom of expression
10. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, March 1 2014, Length :14** 6 Virginia State Senators walked off the senate floor as the chamber took up a resolution to honor the life of former U.S. Senator. Harry F. Byrd Jr. Byrd, a former defender of racial segregation and previously a state senator from Winchester -- died July 30 at the age of 98.
11. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 2 2014, Length :15** Virginia State Senators walked off the senate floor as the chamber took up a resolution to honor the life of former U.S. Senator. Harry F. Byrd Jr. Byrd, a former defender of racial segregation and previously a state senator from Winchester -- died July 30 at the age of 98.
12. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, March 31 2014, Length 1:10** Thousands of soldiers and supporters want the Obama administration to change *new* army policies. You see, the updated appearance and grooming regulations were just released and some say they're biased against certain women. Army regulation 670-1 is 57 pages. It was released yesterday and clarifies several things including army-appropriate hairstyles. The army used pictures to show exactly what's considered proper. Females can't have multiple braids unless they're a certain size. They need to be small -- like a quarter inch. And women can't have "twists." This is a popular hairstyle - particularly for African American women. In an interview, an army spokesman said twists and dreadlocks have been prohibited since 2005, but the regulation at the time didn't clearly define what they looked like.

CRIME/DRUGS

1. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, January 3 2014, Length :35** Suffolk police need you to take action against crime and help catch the man that police say robbed the miller mart on

Holland road this morning. These are pictures from the store's security system. police say at around 5-15 this morning - the man walked into the store - pulled out a hand gun -- and demanded money. no one was hurt.

2. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 9 2014, Length :31** Police need you to take action to get an armed robber off the streets of Newport news. police released this surveillance video of the man they are looking for. Investigators say he robbed the shell gas station on Jefferson avenue.
3. **NewsChannel 3 at 5, January 13, Length :26** there were a record number of meth busts last year. law enforcement workers busted 560 labs in the tar heel state!! that's about one-hundred more than in 2012. north Carolina's attorney general says there were more busts last year because people have to give more information when buying cold medicine. an ingredient in the medicine is used to make meth - and when people give their information to buy the product - it's easier to track them down.
4. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 15 2014, Length :24** A man was found shot and now, investigators are trying to figure out what happened. This was the scene on 8th bay avenue - in the oceanview section of the city. Just before 9:30, police say they found a man who had been shot. So far - police have not released the man's identity.
5. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, January 13 2014, Length 1:54** marijuana should be legal in Virginia. that's some people were pushing for at the state capitol today. but so far -- with no bill proposals -- it doesn't seem like our delegates are in favor of the idea.
6. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, January 27 2014, Length :38** Two men charged in connection to an attack of an o-d-u student are scheduled to appear in court today. police say the student was walking on campus one night back in October last year, when several men approached him, assaulted him, and tried to steal his wallet. investigators believe the attack was motivated by race. o-d-u officials say the victim was white, and the attackers made several inflammatory statements. police believe David keonte and a navy sailor were two of the men involved in the actual attack. they say two other sailors, robert parker, and two other men were not a part of the attack, but are accused of making false statements and being an accessory after the fact. david and parker are due in court this morning.
7. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, January 31 2014, Length :21** someone braved the snow and cold to rob the bank of America on Lynn haven parkway -- and officials think he has done it before. police say the man walked into the bank just before four afternoon, showed a handgun, and demanded money. this man may be connected to other bank robberies in Virginia beach and Hampton roads.
8. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, February 13 2014, Length :29** new details about a beach man robbed and beaten when he got out of his car to move traffic barrels in the middle of the road. James sparkes told newschannel 3 when he got out of his car last Monday morning -- two guys attacked him and took his wallet and phone. his jaw had to be wired shut. investigators now say they've arrested these two guys. 22 year old Justin squires and 32 year old Steven farland junior face several charges in the attack and robbery. they're both behind bars without bond.
9. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 17 2014, Length :35** deputies say this home, on music circle near gargatha landing road, was where william williams, joanna strickland, victor garced and christian hemphill were cooking up meth. deputies say this was all taking place in front of williams and strickland's three young children.

investigators say the other couple did not live at the home, they just worked there making drugs. the house was boarded up and condemned after the bust. this morning all four are in jail and the children are with social services.

- 10. NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 19 2014, Length :18** two men shot overnight in Newport news. investigators say officers heard gunfire just after midnight on 32nd street near orcutt avenue. officers found one man shot -- a few blocks away. then another victim. both were taken to the hospital. one was released, the other is still there. so far -- no arrests.
- 11. NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 19 2014, Length :38** a Suffolk murder suspect has been captured in Nashville, Tennessee. officials have been looking for jeffrey jennings since June of last year. Jennings got into a fight with a Lloyd green senior -- according to police. he later tracked green down -- allegedly -- and shot him in the back of the head. the shooting happened on cogenic square near cypress manor apartments.
- 12. NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, February 19 2014, Length :28** in Newport News, a bold man walks into a family dollar employee only stock room and takes money from an employee's purse. police say the suspect then went behind the register and tied to pry it open. he left the store without getting into the register.
- 13. NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 21 2014, Length :26** a man accused of robbing a pizza hut -- the same store where he used to work - is scheduled to appear in court today. police say 21-year-old roberto marrero walked into the pizza hut on Indian river road armed with a pizza cutter back in December. investigators say he demanded an employee to give him her car keys, then he locked her in the freezer, stole money from the store, then left in the employee's car. police arrested Marrero the same night. he's facing a number of charges, including robbery, abduction and carjacking. Marrero is scheduled to be in court around nine this morning.
- 14. NewsChannel 3 at 11, February 28, Length :36** today - the York Poquoson sheriff's office announced the arrest of a man they say is behind the brutal attack of a 71-year-old. 25-year-old Quinton fields faces charges of robbery, burglary and aggravated malicious wounding. fields is accused of attacking Casey edlow. last night, edlow only shared his story with newschannel 3. he said a stranger broke into his home and left him bloody and bruised. his left eye swollen shut and he's lost nearly all of his eye sight. the victim's daughter says the attacker beat her father, then only took off with 17 dollars.
- 15. NewsChannel 3 This Morning, March 4 2014, Length :26** Police shot a woman in Newport news, and one of our newschannel three viewers captured the tense moments on video. police say this all started when officers were called out to an apartment complex in Denbigh yesterday afternoon. the video shows officers surrounding a truck with a woman inside. witnesses say the woman was not doing what officers told her to do, and they fired multiple shots at her. the video does not show the moment she was shot, but you later see paramedics loading her into an ambulance. police say the woman is expected to be okay. they have not said if the woman made any threats or told us exactly why she was shot. the shooting is under investigation.
- 16. Small pieces are breaking off and could choke children. If you have the three piece cork set stop using it right away. And contact Harvest company to find out how you can return the blocks
7. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, March 30 2014, Length :20** A GM recall for you. Some of the cars in today's recall, including some Saturn Ion's, Chevrolet HHR and Cobalts. The power steering defect covers those cars from the 2004 through 2010 model years. Since early February, General Motors has recalled 4.8 million vehicles. The problems range from transmission leaks, too weak axle shafts that could fracture. But the biggest recall

has been for faulty ignition switches that could shut off the engine while the car is still running. 13 deaths have been connected to that problem.

8. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, March 31 2014, Length :20** Today the Feds announced automakers will be required to install backup cameras in most new vehicles by May 2018. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration says the technology will reduce backover crashes, which caused about 210 deaths and 15,000 injuries per year. The camera has to show an area of 10 feet by 20 feet directly behind the vehicle. The cameras will be in all new vehicles under 10-thousand pounds.

Moving one carrier to San Diego.
3. **NewsChannel 3 at 5:30, January 16 2014, Length :25** Fresh Market is hiring at their newest store on the Outer Banks. The Nags Head store is hoping to fill at least 80 new jobs with locals. 4. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 19 2014, Length 2:00** Wallops Island is known for its rocket launches from our eastern shore. But one company is pushing hard to have wallops the site for sending people to outer space. Mike Gold works for Bigelow aerospace, a private Nevada-based company that wants to bring human spaceflight to Virginia in the near future. If this new budding industry takes off, it will greatly impact the economy of the Eastern Shore, bringing even more jobs, and more tourist to the area to see the increase number of rockets taking off.
5. **NewsChannel 3 This Morning, February 25, 2014, Length: 2:00** Secretary of Defense Chuck Hagel set to be in Hampton Roads today to talk about his plan to cut some military jobs. The cuts are a byproduct of cross the board large military spending cuts. These cuts also include less funding for commissaries that would end up costing a typical military family about 3,000 dollars a year. Hampton Roads economy would be one of the worst effected when these cuts are approved.
6. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, March 1 2014, Length :45** The Virginia Beach city council heard a proposal that would put a 18,500-seat arena near the Convention Center. It's estimated

to create more than 1,200 new jobs, \$98 million in economic impact, and more than 200 sports and entertainment events to the region in the first year. Comcast-Spectacor has also committed to pursue a professional sports franchise.

7. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, March 4 2014, Length :25** Virginia Beach school Interim Superintendent Doctor Sheila Magula said Saturday make up days were the only solution. But that came with a lot of backlash from parents, teachers and students. TRANSPORTATION

1. **NewsChannel 3 at Cut-In 9:20pm, January 21 2014, Length :15** Due to high winds, the Chesapeake Bay Brige Tunnel is operating on level one wind restrictions. Winds are pushing past 40 miles per hour. So people driving across the bridge shouldn't go more than 45 miles per hour.
2. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, January 27 2014, Length 1:00** VDOT is once again prepping for another round of snow. Crews replenished the 12,000 tons of salt they used last week and sure equipment was ready. Like last week, officials say 70 trucks will be on roads clearing the south side and 40 will be on the peninsula. Drivers are doing their part by gasing up and filling up their tires with air.
3. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, January 30 2014, Length 4:20** When red light cameras are watching your every move, each second counts in determining whether you get through or get slapped with a \$50.00 dollar ticket. But a NewsChannel 3 investigation has uncovered cities have taken away precious yellow light time after new cameras were installed. For example, the city of Norfolk installed new red light cameras this past November. When that happened, drivers lost one full second to make a left hand turn at St. Paul's Boulevard and Brambleton Avenue.
4. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, January 31 2014, Length 1:00** Slick streets and snow covered sidewalks have put the brakes on Hampton Roads Transit buses. For the third day in a row, folks have had to find another way to work. Frequent passengers are frustrated. HRT says for the safety of riders, service has been cancelled. The city of Hampton is taking action by sending out its own crews to dig out bus stops.
5. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 4 2014, Length :33** Virginia Beach's Ron Villanueva is behind a new transportation bill. It calls for VDOT and the Secretary of Transportation to update the state's smart travel programs. The bill would call for "smarter" technology for the roads.
6. **NewsChannel 3 at 4, February 11 2014, Length :33** The Virginia Department of Transportation has closed Interstate 64 eastbound at the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel. Emergency maintenance work must be done. Traffic is being detoured off of exit 268 (Mallory Street.) The extended closure is expected to last through rush hour traffic.
7. **NewsChannel 3 at 6, February 13 2014, Length :20** The Hampton Roads Transportation Planning Organization compared the number of cars and trucks going through the Downtown and Midtown tunnels before the tolls went into effect at the beginning of the month and after. Reports show tunnel traffic is down at both tunnels.
8. **NewsChannel 3 at 4, February 18 2014, Length 1:30** President Obama is calling for new fuel efficiency standards on medium and heavy trucks. Mr. Obama says he's

improving the efficiency of the nation's trucking fleet won't just make the air cleaner - it will also improve consumers' bottom line. The President visited a Safeway distribution center outside Washington, DC to make the announcement. Heavy trucks not only have a gas guzzling reputation - their exhaust amounts to nearly a quarter of all transportation greenhouse gas emissions.

9. **NewsChannel 3 at Noon, March 5 2014, Length :25** Snow is taking a huge chunk out of VDOT's budget. The agency is reportedly more than \$100 million dollars over budget because of how much it's costing to clear the roads. Here in Hampton Roads, the cost is a quarter of a billion dollars alone. But VDOT is stressing the budget issue will not affect how roadways are maintained this spring.
10. **NewsChannel 3 at 11, March 31 2014, Length :45** The long awaited rehabilitation of I-264 and I-64 started tonight. Crews were out near Independence Boulevard and by Willoughby Spit in Norfolk. They're doing permanent concrete repairs on the interstates. The plan will take 18 months and cover 163 lane miles.
