HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS/RECOVERY- Our iHeartRadio stations in Mobile/Pensacola informed our listeners about Hurricane Zeta, with updates from our news partner NBC 15 and their meteorologists, as well as on air reminders about the storm's location, intensity, changes in the forecast and how to prepare for the hurricane.

We continued to provide recovery information for both Hurricane Zeta and Hurricane Sally, including deadlines to apply for FEMA disaster aid and how to appeal denial of a claim.

We not only gave out information on air, but also on this station's Twitter and Facebook pages, and the Operation Stormwatch page on this station's website.
