## Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Education** This quarter was big for education news locally. Voters in Bossier Parish and Caddo Parish were both asked to vote on raising teachers' pay. The State of Louisiana was exploring teacher pay raises at the state level. There was also a lot of talk about our local colleges and universities, including a proposed plan to merge two.
- B. Shreveport's "Saggy Pants" Law The city of Shreveport was the focus of national attention when the City Council decided to vote to repeal the law. It became a major focus locally as well. Sparking outrage and excitement. We spoke with multiple Council Members and Shreveport's Chief of Police on the subject before the vote, and after the vote.
- C. Weather Issues Our region dealt with multiple severe weather issues this quarter. Flooding on the Red River caused roads to close, homes to be evacuated, and a lot of damage. Additionally, a tornado struck Ruston, destroying homes, damaging the Louisiana Tech campus, and even killing two.
- D. Sports Betting & Fantasy Sports Louisiana voters legalized Fantasy Sports in most Parishes last November, but the State Legislature didn't allow it to start right away, and fought about it this quarter. Additionally, 67% of Louisiana voters supported the state legalizing Sports Gambling at our local casinos, but that became a large fight at the state level too. We stayed up to date with state officials this quarter.
- E. **Medical Marijuana** Louisiana's Medical Marijuana law was passed in 2015, but by early 2019, the medicine had yet to make it to patients. We regularly checked in with Shreveport's only licensed medical marijuana pharmacist for updates on the program as the state ran into multiple issues this quarter.
