## Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Issue:** PUBLIC SAFETY: The Shreveport Police Department lost a uniformed officer in January. The murder sparked outrage and concern over safety across the city, Parish, and region. We spoke with local leaders about the tragic event, the response from authorities, and the impact on our area.
- B. **Issue:** FLOODS: Our area experienced massive flooding early in the year. The floods washedout roadways, shut down parks, and caused issues with multiple local businesses. We spoke with local leaders from the Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office, City of Shreveport, and the National Weather Service.
- C. **Issue:** POVERTY: There are ongoing concerns about poverty in the Shreveport and Bossier areas. The United Way ALICE report came out in the first part of this year, and many local leaders reacted to the information about poverty levels in our region.
- D. Issue: SHREVEPORT GARBAGE FEE: The City of Shreveport has been losing hundreds of thousands of dollars by providing free garbage service in the city. To stop the loss of money, the city explored a fee for their garbage service.
- E. **Issue:** EDUCATION FUNDING: The State of Louisiana, and our local Parishes, are struggling to pay school teachers, and are looking to find ways to raise funding to raise teacher pay.
