### **Section I. Issues**

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- Shreveport City Budget: The first fully proposed 2020 Shreveport City budget, and a proposed \$186 Million bond proposal caused a big stir. The objections brought in front of the City Council became so controversial, an early October meeting lasted over 300 minutes due to public comments. By the end of the year, a balanced budget was approved by the city for the first time in decades, even with the bond proposal losing at the polls.
- Liquor Laws in Shreveport: A proposed liquor store in Shreveport's Highland neighborhood created uproar when a group from the neighborhood pushed back. The discussion led to deeper concerns about the fairness of liquor licenses in the city, and hours of operations for stores.
- **Election Coverage:** Shreveport, Bossier City, Caddo Parish, and the State of Louisiana had major elections this quarter. We worked hard to cover the issues, and inform the voters on every angle of every issue from city, parish, and state angles.
- Work Disputes with Caddo Parish School Bus Drivers: Issues came up with Caddo Parish School Bus Drivers multiple times this quarter. There were disputes brought up over pay, working conditions, and the safety of the buses being used by the school system.
