WETA-FM and WGMS-FM cover areas of interest for the greater Washington, Frederick and Hagerstown communities through broadcasts produced by NPR and PBS. These programs are selected for quality and appropriate content, presentation and technical excellence, with our audience - real and potential - in mind.

We continue to broadcast NPR's "From the Top." From the Top is a non-profit organization that encourages and celebrates the commitment of young people to music and the arts through a variety of media, including nationally broadcast radio shows. The show aims to entertain, educate and connect young musicians, their parents and teachers. It features young musicians who, along with the host, Chris O'Reilly. demonstrate that classical music has a place in youth culture.

We also continue to broadcast PBS' NewsHour, a news program hosted by Gwen Ifill and Judy Woodruff that airs each weekday from 7-8 PM. NewsHour presents coverage of a wide range of subjects, as below:

The Supreme Court united on cases concerning presidential appointments and mobile phone searches, however there was stark division on issues like campaign finance, contraception and religion. The Supreme Court temporarily exempted a religious college from the contraception coverage provisions of the Affordable Care Act. The decision, which came just days after a ruling in favor of some businesses objecting to provide birth control, provoked sharp rebuke from the court's three female justices. Immigration judges pushed for more resources as an influx of juvenile immigrants from Central America moved across borders to the US. The immigration courts have 375,000 cases pending before them right now, and only 228 immigration judges across the country to deal with those cases.

In National news, many states struggled with the issue of sheltering immigrant children who are crossing the southern border into the U.S. In Chicago, about a dozen people were killed and up to 80 people were in injured in shootings during just one weekend in July; and in Ferguson, Missouri, an unarmed black teenager was killed by police, triggering protests, and leading the Justice Department to investigate policies and procedures and patterns of possible unconstitutional behavior by the Ferguson Police Department. Regarding business and the economy, several American companies have relocated outside U.S. borders, usually through mergers with or purchases of a foreign company. The move, known as a tax inversion, means corporations are no longer subject to American corporate taxes. Bank of America will pay nearly \$17 billion for its role in writing and securitizing risky home loans in the run up to the housing crisis. Sallie Krawcheck, former Citigroup CFO, has started a socially responsibly stock mutual fund that promotes the world's 400 most female-focused firms. Across the country, states faced environmental challenges: in California, mandatory water restrictions were imposed; and in Colorado, the debate over pumping pressurized water underground to extract oil and natural gas turned local and state governments into rivals. When one city banned fracking altogether, the state launched two lawsuits.

This quarter's International news was dominated by conflicts in several countries. Israel and Palestine continued their dispute over Gaza; The UN human rights commissioner accused both Israel and Hamas of committing war crimes in their ongoing conflict. Fighting flared between Russia and Ukraine when Kiev blamed the Russians for shooting down a Ukrainian military plane, while Moscow accused Ukraine of killing a man on the Russian side of the border. Further complicating the situation, Ukrainian forces shot down a passenger airplane over the region, prompting questions and concerns from the international community. Iraq's Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki stepped down, clearing the way for a new government. However, as brutal attacks from the Sunni militant group known as the Islamic State continue, hundreds of thousands of Iraqi Christians and minority Yazidi community have fled to the country's Kurdish region. The three-and-a-half-year-old conflict in Syria reached another grim milestone. The United Nations reported that more than three million Syrians have now been forced to flee their country. Most of the refugees have fled to bordering nations, some of which are buckling from the strain of the massive influx. Protests in Hong Kong tested China's governance, as the citizens there pushed for autonomy. Voter turnout in Scotland topped an unprecedented 85 percent for a referendum on whether to leave the United Kingdom. In the end, 55 percent voted to stay.

Media, Arts and Culture marked the passing of several artists and personalities, including: writer and activist Nadine Gordimer, Reagan press secretary James Brady, actor and comedian Robin Williams, actress Lauren Bacall, journalist James Foley, television news correspondent Bruce Morton, and comedienne Joan Rivers. Pulitzer Prize-winning poet Charles Wright was recently named the U.S. Poet Laureate by the Library of Congress, and President Obama awarded the Medal of Honor to Sgt. Ryan Pitts for his heroism in Afghanistan. NFL commissioner Roger Goodell defended the two-game punishment of Baltimore Ravens' Ray Rice for domestic abuse, but later, The National Football League announced an investigation led by former FBI director Robert Mueller amid new questions about when league officials first saw images of Ray Rice hitting his then-fiancee. Apple unveiled its new products -- a larger iPhone, as well as the Apple Watch and a new pay system -- that boast advances for phone, watch and wallet. India has joined the U.S., the former Soviet Union and the European Union as one of the elite few to successfully send a spacecraft to Mars, on its first try and for only \$75 million, a fraction of the cost of other space missions. But there have been debates over whether the money could be better spent in a country where millions live in poverty.

Health and Healthcare covered both National and International issues. The dominant stories focused on the worst Ebola epidemic of the century. Public health officials sounded the alarm about the growing Ebola outbreak in West Africa, saying it could destabilize countries there, and warned the window is closing to keep it from spreading to other regions. The Ebola outbreak has killed more than 670 people and spread to four countries. Among those infected are two American aid workers and the lead Ebola doctor in Sierra Leone; as the quarter advanced, more cases appeared in the U.S. AIDS researchers announced a setback in the long search for a cure. Doctors believed that they had cured a baby girl by using aggressive and early treatment. But after years without requiring therapy, she tested positive for HIV during a follow-up visit. While the United Nations has reported optimistic news about controlling the global epidemic of HIV and AIDS, Uganda's infection rates are growing. A respiratory virus has infected hundreds of children in the U.S., sending them to emergency rooms across the country. The rare strain causes asthma-like symptoms and can exacerbate the disease. The

Obama administration warned that more than 300,000 people could lose health care coverage if they can't show proof that they are U.S. citizens or legal residents.

The Military debated warfare tactics on both sides of the Mideast conflict between Israel and Hamas. President Obama outlined a multi-step plan to defeat the Islamic State group; the expanded air offensive could last years, but the president insisted that it would not include combat troops and that regional partners would have to "step up." The United States and Afghanistan signed a bilateral security agreement, after months of uncertainty over what happens when the U.S.-led international mission officially ends at the end of the year. The deal will allow U.S. and NATO troops to carry out counterterrorism missions and support Afghan forces. The United States will offer 3,000 troops and financial help to health care systems in West Africa that are overwhelmed by Ebola. President Obama announced that U.S. forces will build new treatment facilities, airlift hundreds of thousands of home health kits and train and treat health care workers.

Concerning politics and campaigns, House and Senate negotiators reached a compromise on how to improve patient care in the VA health care system. The \$17 billion proposal would provide money for vets to seek out private care if their access is limited, hire additional doctors and nurses and lease new clinics around the country. House GOP members were called back for another day in hopes of passing a bill, but the divided Congress left Washington without an agreement on addressing the tens of thousands of migrant children arriving at the southern border. President Obama consulted key lawmakers on his strategy against the Islamic State group, and polls show the American public supports action. But the president has not sought formal congressional approval for an expanded military campaign.

Reports on Education included a retrospective on Freedom Schools and their role in fighting segregation; a program called Springboard Collaborative that has made strides in preventing summer learning loss by enlisting parents as partners to help teach children; and reform in Chicago City Colleges to not only provide wide access to higher education, but to put students on the fastest track to relevant credentials. In Houston, Texas, the superintendent of one school district has invited competing charter schools to set up shop alongside a regular middle school, and the wave of child migrants posed challenges for Florida schools.
