Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL on a monthly basis reported on the latest unemployment rates for local counties on both sides of the state line, including how many jobs the counties either gained or lost from a year earlier. These local news stories each aired three or four times per day.

Description: WSKL aired an announcement 259 times on behalf of a local

Description: WSKL aired an announcement 45 times that promoted the last production of the season by the Red Mask Players, a community theater group.

Description: Greg Green of WSKL conducted two interviews with organizer Doug Wallace of the Covington Business Association about the inaugural Home and Garden Show. The interviews focused on the reasons for holding the show and the variety of vendors.

Program: Public Service Announcement

Description: WSKL aired 135 times a Public Service Announcement in support of

the Covington Business Association's first-ever Home and Garden Show.

Description: WSKL aired an announcement 45 times that promoted a popular event at a local county park, the Maple Syrup Fest. During the event, park personnel demonstrate the process of making maple syrup from the sap collected from maple trees at the park. The syrup also is available for purchase.

Description: WSKL's Greg Green interviewed separately two local pageant queens, Audrey Galloway and Crissy Crowder, both of Covington. They helped to organize the annual Covington Easter Egg Hunt. The discussions focused on their solicitation of sponsors for the event and also their personal memories of Easter celebrations.

Description: WSKL aired a series of local news stories on grants that the Western Indiana Community Foundation made to organizations in Fountain and Vermillion counties. One story referred to a grant to Fountain Central High School in Veedersburg for the purchase of academic awards for students. Another story told of a grant to the Veedersburg Public Library for upgrades in the library's teen zone area. The stories aired an average of three times each.

Description: Greg Green of WSKL interviewed Hillsboro Church of the Nazarene Pastor Greg McDonald about the Winter Weekend Senior Lunch Program in Covington. The church's Young at Heart Ministry, which serves all of Fountain County, co-sponsored the program. It targeted home-bound seniors age 60 and older, the disabled, and their caregivers. The program delivered two cold lunches for each weekend to participants for a nominal charge.

Description: Greg Green of WSKL interviewed Western Indiana Community Foundation Chief Executive Officer Dale White about the creative placemaking grant applications that the foundation was soliciting. The foundation was looking for applications for out-of-the ordinary projects that would enhance the quality of life in Fountain and Vermillion counties. Past examples of such grants include those for pocket parks, murals, and a sand volleyball court.

Issue: Coronavirus Pandemic

Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL continued to air occasional local news stories dealing with the Coronavirus Pandemic. Most of these stories dealt with the CDC "Community Level" and COVID-19 metrics in local counties on either side of the state line, which were updated weekly. These stories aired an average of three times each.

Dates and times: 1/2, 1/9, 1/10, 1/16, 1/23, 1/30, 2/5, 2/13, 2/20, 3/1, 3/14, 3/20, and 3/27; 7:00 a.m.-10:05 a.m.

Duration: approximately 25 seconds for each airing

Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL aired numerous local news stories on various economic development subjects. Examples include a story on the groundbreaking ceremony for the new Attica Elementary School. Another story dealt with a fundraiser for the rehabilitation of Indiana's oldest covered bridge still in its original location, Cades Mill Covered Bridge near Veedersburg. These stories aired an average of three times each.

Issue: health and safety

Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL aired many local news stories on health and safety issues. They include a series of stories on the Indiana Department of Transportation's proposed safety improvements at a hazardous intersection near Covington. Another local story dealt with the imminent opening of two new medical facilities in Danville, at the same time that the only birthing unit in the area, which had served pregnant women from both sides of the state line, remained closed. These stories aired an average of three times each.

Dates and times: 1/6, 1/12, 1/13, 1/25, 1/27, 1/30, 2/2, 2/15, 2/16, 2/21, 2/27, 3/3, 3/7, 3/9, 3/21, and 3/30; 7:00 a.m.-10:05 a.m.

Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL aired several education-related local news stories. One reminded Fountain and Vermillion county students of the start of the application period for scholarships available through the Western Indiana Community Foundation. Another local news story cited a state Department of Education report about state graduation rates at local high schools, including those in all 3 Fountain County school corporations. These stories aired an average of three times each.

The interview touched on the expanded hours, how the program works, and how students needing help can access the program.

Duration: three minutes for each of 38 airings

Issue: better roads and bridges

Program: local news stories

Description: WSKL aired numerous news stories on local road and bridge construction projects and road closings due to construction activity. An example of these stories is one on state funding for construction on the bridge that carries State Street in Veedersburg over Coal Creek. The stories aired an average of three times each.

Description: WSKL aired an announcement 104 times on behalf of the Covington chapter of the philanthropic organization Tri Kappa, on the occasion of Tri Kappa Week. The announcement listed some of the ways in which the local chapter has benefited the community, including scholarships for local students, donating to the local food pantry and to the local Shop with a Cop program, and providing gift certificates for the needy at the winter holiday season.

Description: Greg Green of WSKL interviewed sisters Mary and Emily Greene, both members of the Warren County Foundation Youth Council, about their roles in a crowdfunding campaign. The youth council was one of seven youth organizations around the state chosen to receive a state matching grant through the state's "Creating Places Initiative." The Warren County group raised \$50,000 for the establishment of a nonprofit coffee shop in Williamsport.

Description: Covington High School Dean of Students Ryan Sowers and student "ambassadors" teamed up to voice a series of announcements that listed assorted upcoming school activities in an effort to build pride in both the school and community.
