Jaron Lanier, computer and digital network pioneer, author of "Who Owns the Future?"

He said people should be compensated for sharing their personal data with massive digital networks, such as Google, Facebook, Instagram, and in some cases, even the government. Mr. Ghayad led a study that found that employers frequently screen out job candidates who have been unemployed for more than six months. He found that employers showed about four times more interest in applicants out of work for six months or less, even if they had less experience and fewer qualifications than candidates unemployed for longer periods. He said job seekers must be willing to take any kind of work after a few months of unemployment, to avoid large gaps in their resume that will damage future prospects.

She discussed the rapidly changing landscape of technology and literacy, and how libraries have adapted.

Jon D. Miller, PhD, Research Scientist, Director of the International Center for the Advancement of Scientific Literacy at the University of Michigan

Dr. Smith's research found that 48 percent of Generation X (ages 37-48) are enrolled in continuing education courses or other job training. He explained why technology and the changing job market have made it necessary for midcareer professionals to pursue lifelong learning opportunities. He believes this is the new norm, particularly in technical fields, such as medicine, auto mechanics or information technology, and that workers will routinely return to school to stay up to date with changing technology and trends.

From visits to acupuncturists, chiropractors and naturopaths to the use of vitamins and supplements, half of the US population uses some form of alternative medicine. Dr. Offit said he believes that alternative medicine can be dangerous because it is an unregulated industry under no legal obligation to prove its claims or admit its risks. He explained why alternative medicine's popularity has grown so rapidly. He said he thinks some alternative treatments do work as a result of the placebo effect, enabled by the healing powers of the human mind.

Dr. Busse was the co-author of a study that found women frequently are quoted higher prices for car repairs than men. The research also found that consumers (of any gender) who do their homework about the cost of repairs usually pay less. She offered advice on how to avoid being ripped off.

He discussed the reasons why an annual checkup is so important and the reasons that men avoid trips to the doctor. In researching his book, Mr. Oswald visited and camped in 48 of our national parks over the course of several years. He found that the restrictions result in a rapid decrease in hospitalizations for heart attack, stroke, respiratory diseases, including asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. He said he favors even stronger legislation to restrict smoking, because he found that the strictest laws resulted in the highest health benefits.





The State of Michigan will begin accepting applications for the Healthy Michigan Plan on April 1, 2014. Michigan residents can enroll at any time online at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/mibridges">www.michigan.gov/mibridges</a>, by phone, or in person.

The Healthy Michigan Plan received approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on December 30, 2013.

On September 16, 2013, Governor Rick Snyder signed into law Michigan Public Act 107 of 2013, which directs the creation of the Healthy Michigan Plan. The State of Michigan plans to make health care benefits available through the Healthy Michigan Plan in early spring 2014.

The Healthy Michigan Plan provides health care coverage for individuals who:

- Are age 19-64 years
- Have income at or below 133% of the federal poverty level under the Modified Adjusted Gross Income methodology
- · Do not qualify for or are not enrolled in Medicare
- · Do not qualify for or are not enrolled in other Medicaid programs
- · Are not pregnant at the time of application
- · Are residents of the State of Michigan

Eligibility for the Healthy Michigan Plan is determined through the Modified Adjusted Gross Income methodology, coordinated through the Department of Human Services. All criteria for the Modified Adjusted Gross Income eligibility must be met to be eligible for the Healthy Michigan Plan.

Per federal requirement, individuals eligible for services under the Healthy Michigan Plan must have access to the following 10 Essential Health Benefits:

- · Ambulatory patient services
- · Emergency services
- · Hospitalization



# HPV Vaccine Key to Preventing Cancer Later in Life With HPV Vaccine Rates Down, MDCH is Reminding Parents of the Protection it Offers

LANSING – Recently, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced that HPV vaccination rates in girls ages 13-17 years failed to increase, and actually declined slightly between 2011 and 2012. With this new data, the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) is working to educate Michiganders about the importance of getting the HPV vaccine to protect against cancer.

Approximately 79 million Americans are currently infected with HPV, and about 14 million people become newly infected each year. HPV is also so common that nearly all sexually-active men and women will get at least one type of HPV at some point in their lives. In Michigan, 47.2 percent of females 13-17 years of age have received one or more doses of HPV vaccine, and only 27.5 percent of females 13-17 years of age have received all three doses of the vaccine, according to April 2013 data from the Michigan Care Improvement Registry (MCIR).

According to the CDC, for each year the 3-dose HPV vaccine series coverage remains near the current level of 33 percent, an estimated additional 4,400 women will be diagnosed with cervical cancer and 1,400 cervical cancer-attributable deaths will occur each year. Among girls unvaccinated for HPV, 84 percent had a healthcare visit where they received another vaccine, such as meningitis or pertussis, but not HPV vaccine.

"It is concerning to see the rates of vaccination against HPV at these low levels compared with other vaccines, particularly because vaccinating teens and young adults now with this critical vaccine prevents them from getting different types of HPV-related cancer in the future," said Dr. Matthew Davis, Chief Medical Executive with the MDCH. "As parents and medical professionals, our responsibility is to protect the health of our youth, including taking preventive measures. The HPV vaccine truly is an important tool for allowing us to do so."

Not receiving a healthcare provider's recommendation for HPV vaccine was one of the five main reasons parents reported for not vaccinating their sons or daughters. The other responses parents provided indicate gaps in understanding the vaccine, including why vaccination is recommended at ages 11 or 12. Parents also reported safety concerns as a reason for not vaccinating. In the seven years of post-licensure vaccine safety monitoring and evaluation conducted independently by federal agencies and vaccine manufacturers, no serious safety concerns have been identified.

Most private health insurance plans must cover the HPV vaccine at no out-of-pocket cost, meaning no co-pay or deductible. HPV is covered under the Vaccines for Children Program which provides no- or low-cost vaccines to eligible children, 18 years of age and younger. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to ask about vaccination every time they take children for a healthcare visit.



#### Fostering Futures Scholarship Application and Information

The Fostering Futures Scholarship (FFS) provides eligible foster youth with scholarship funds for tuition, fees, room/board, books, and supplies/equipment required for enrollment. The FFS is available to students on a first-come, first-served basis. Students must complete **one** application per academic year and return it to Student Scholarships and Grants, listed at the bottom of the application.

#### **Application Enrollment Period**

2015-2016 Academic Year (Fall 2015, Winter/Spring 2016, Summer 2016)

Application Enrollment Period is May 1, 2015 – July 6, 2015.

#### **Eligibility**

- · Student must have been in foster care on or after their 13th birthday.
- · Student may receive funding at any age. (There is no upper age limit.)
- Student must be an undergraduate, attending a Michigan public or private 4-year college/university or a community college at least half time.
