Title: Medication for Young Asthma Sufferers

Interview with Dr. Warner w. Carr, M.D., National Asthma and Allergy expert. There are more than 6 million children in the U.S. that have asthma – that’s nearly 1 in 10 children. Although there are medicines to treat the condition, more than 38 percent of children with asthma continue to experience uncontrolled symptoms, which could lead to emergency room visits, hospital stays and missed days of school. Up until now, additional treatment for uncontrolled asthma was only available for those over 12. However, the FDA just expanded the use of a medicine to treat uncontrolled asthma to include children as young as 6.
