A red salon chair is attracting some interesting looks for being hauled around the streets of Minneapolis. The chair provides a place for homeless men and women to get free haircuts. Katie's a hair stylist and owns her own salon. Her services for the homeless include a trim and style but she says it goes far beyond that. She's able to connect with those she serves.

She got by okay but tended to hide her arm when out in public. Eventually, life changed for her in two big ways. Hope was adopted by an American family and then, at age seven, loving hearts and technology combined to help complete that left arm! Connor Hart – then a high school sophomore - was learning about prosthetics made by way of a 3D printer. He heard about little Hope, who lived in his region of Ohio. In time, Hope was presented with a custom-crafted printed arm, free of charge. It was life-changing! After seeing how the printed arm made such a difference in Hope's life, Connor eventually helped create a non-profit called Hands of Hope (note the word Hope). The organization provides no-cost prosthetics – and they faithfully encourage those they help.

The operation is called D.R.A.G.G. (Drag Racing Against Gangs & Graffiti) and offers high school credits while creating positive relationships with law enforcement. "Coaching, mixed in with my experience as a gang officer...and myself and (co-founder) Sgt. (Dan) Shrubbs being into the automotive side of life, that's what connected it all," Sgt. Woodruff explains. The officers go under the hood alongside the students to turn wrenches and the time invested builds more than fast cars. "They get to actually see what it's like to interact with a police officer." The program currently has four student-built vehicles and located in Oxnard, Santa Barbara and recently expanded to Phoenix, Arizona. Since D.R.A.G.G. began in 2011, more than 400 students have graduated from the program, some of whom have gone on to careers in the automotive industry.

Then the tickets get displayed on a wall, that includes verses from Matthew 25. Ortiz says he's learned compassion from his grandmother. Alejandro's gotten nothing but positive reactions about the pay-it-forward meals from both customers and those using the tickets. He's more than the owner of Papi's, he's also there for anyone who wants to chat about life.

Teresa has long had a heart for those less fortunate and has made it her personal mission to get to know men and women who've fallen on hard times. One day she was curious and asked Benny, one of her friends on the street, how long it had been since he'd had a hot shower. He revealed that it had been a year. Benny became the inspiration for 'Shower Power,' a mobile shower unit designed to bring dignity and hope to those on the street. Teresa and her husband bought a box truck and spent the next year converting it into a mobile shower unit. She recruited volunteers too and made sure she had hairstylists, a clothing coordinator and plenty of food to hand out each week. Teresa's website, www.showerpower.ms says "'Shower Power' is more than a shower. We want to bring hospitality to the streets by delivering mobile hygiene services to people experiencing homelessness. It's about taking time to show people that you care and restoring dignity by providing resources needed for self-care. Even if they can get to a shelter, the shelter may not have a shower."
