

## Quarterly Issues Report

KWAX FM 91.1

For the Period April 1 through June 30, 2017

KWAX is the primary control point for full power stations KWRX Redmond, KWRZ Canyonville, and KWVZ Florence and translators K255CA Bend, K215ED Sun River, K296AW Sutherlin, K287BF Glide, K225BF Salem, K217FZ Newport, K225CC Corvallis, K250BK Roseburg, and K270BJ Cottage Grove. All stations and translators repeat the programming originated at KWAX Eugene-Springfield in its entirety. KWAX provides live programming from their studios each Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. through 5 p.m.

KWAX is an all classical music format station with no local or national news sources. As such, the primary focus on community issues for KWAX is in support and awareness generation for the arts and the many arts groups active in the communities served by the station and network of transmitters and translators.

#### Eugene Symphony Orchestra Performances-April 18 and May 23, 2017

The Eugene Symphony performs monthly at the Hult Center for the Performing Arts during their season. As a service to listeners who may not have the means or mobility to attend in person and as a means to expand awareness of the Symphony's performances to a greater audience, KWAX rebroadcasts each past performance in the week prior to their next performance. KWAX also provides background on each performance from an historical standpoint on the composer and biographical information regarding the guest performer.

#### University of Oregon School of Music and Dance-Student Performances May 8, 11, and 12, 2017

The University of Oregon School of Music and Dance is a renowned arts education program offering undergraduate and graduate degrees in music and dance, including doctorates in music. As part of their program, they perform works of their student's own composition as well as professors and guest performers in Beall Concert Hall on the U of O campus. KWAX discussed three separate performances that included a band concert, a jazz-dance performance, and a wind ensemble and opera performed by graduate students.

#### Archaeology Channel International Film Festival-May 4-7, 2017

The annual Archaeology Channel juried film festival entries and winners were presented over four days of screenings at The Shedd Institute here in Eugene. As the home of the world renowned festival, KWAX discussed the scope of the festival with local Executive Director Rick Pettigrew. The Archaeologic Channel International Film Festival focuses on sharing the diversity of human cultures past and present in the exploration of our place in history and in our world. The festival is a free to the public.

#### Quack Chats-weekly announcement of scheduled events run throughout the quarter

As home to one of the Nation's premiere research institutions in the University of Oregon, KWAX has partnered with the University to present a series of free opportunities for our listeners to interact directly with a scientist or researcher from one of the many disciplines practiced there. Quack Chats are held both on and off campus and open to the public. KWAX highlighted topics during second quarter that included "trends in gender bullying" with Professor C. J. Pascoe, "why people love what they love" with marketing professor and former Disney "imagineer" Troy Campbell, and "the numbing of compassion" a talk about valuing human life amid rising death counts in the world's hot spots presented by Professor Paul Slovic.

#### High Desert Chamber Music-April 27, 2017

High Desert Chamber Executive Director Isabelle Senger joined morning host Peter van de Graaff for a four-hour fundraising shift on KWAX. During her visit, Ms. Senger was able to engage in discussions about the work of the HDCM arts group and the outreach work they do with Central Oregon music

students, connecting them directly with visiting performers through classes and classroom visits. In addition, High Desert Chamber Music provides free tickets to music students and all are high and middle schools.

#### Bach Festival Minutes-June 26-30, 2017

The world-renowned Oregon Bach Festival is in its 46<sup>th</sup> season with performances over 17 days at various venues in our local area. Daily “Bach Minutes” feature KWAX morning host Peter van de Graaff with OBF Executive Director Janelle McCoy discussing upcoming performances, their history, and backgrounds on guest performers. The Oregon Bach Festival is one of the most important annual events in Western Oregon.

#### Arts Line-Daily on-air community bulletin board for arts events throughout the KWAX coverage area

KWAX provides and solicits contributions to its Arts Line. Arts groups of all types are encouraged to call the KWAX Arts Line number and record a message regarding their event or performance. These recordings are assembled into a daily Arts Line message and broadcast several times each day as a service to local arts groups and listeners.

#### Weather Forecast-Weekdays between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Weather is an important topic in Western and Central Oregon. Because our service area has several micro climates from coastal conditions to mountain passes, weather information is an important service for listeners. In the absence of local news and information, KWAX provides weather forecasts for around our coverage area each weekday during their live programming block from 8 a.m. through 5 p.m.
