Law enforcement often issue warnings over holidays and major national events in an abundance of caution knowing that, from a terrorist's point of view, the timing of an attack can determine how much coverage it gets. For this holiday, though, there are additional concerns, including the recruiting ISIS has done in the United States and the potential for relatively small-scale, but still dangerous, "Lone Wolf" attacks. Following overseas attacks in June, Department of Homeland Security Jeb Johnson said law enforcement was being encouraged to be "vigilant and prepared" for Independence Day celebrations. **HISPANICS LARGEST ETHNIC GROUP IN CALIFORNIA**

It's official Hispanics are now the largest ethnic group in California. About 15 million Hispanics lived in California on July 1, 2014, compared to roughly 14.9 million non-Hispanic whites, according to U.S. Census Bureau estimates released late last week. The California Department of Finance predicted in 2013 that Hispanics would outnumber whites in 2014; the census figures confirm that prediction. The new data represents a historic shift over a short period of time. California has six times as many Hispanics today as it did in 1970. The number of non-Hispanic whites in the state has declined since 1970. California Hispanics today enjoy more influence than ever before. They run tens of thousands of California businesses; they support scores of Spanish-language newspapers, radio and TV stations; they make up a sizable proportion of nearly every county in the state, and they hold political positions ranging from mayor of Long Beach to president pro tem of the state Senate.

Cuomo said he directed the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services Office of Emergency Management to enhance monitoring of celebrations and events on July 4. "We are keenly aware that New York State remains a top target for terrorists," the governor said. "As we celebrate with family and friends this Independence Day, I urge all New Yorkers to not only remember the freedoms that we hold dear, but also remain cautious of their surroundings and learn to recognize and report suspicious activity."

**IMMIGRATION DETENTION CENTER EXPANDS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

**Synopsis:**

Immigration authorities are expanding a Southern California detention facility to get more bed space for women with criminal records, immigrants with medical needs, recently-arrived asylum seekers and other detainees. Immigration and Customs Enforcement is getting an additional 640 detention beds at a privately-contracted facility in Adelanto starting in July, raising the total number of beds to 1,940. ICE officials say the move helps consolidate detention space as beds are expensive and hard to find in cities like San Francisco. ICE officials say most detainees there have criminal records. Immigrant advocates say the expansion of the facility run by GEO Group clashes with Obama administration policies aimed at detaining fewer immigrants. They also questioned the quality of medical care at the center northeast of Los Angeles.

GEO officials declined comment.

Intelligence officials have said there is increased 'chatter' on terrorist networks, prompting fears homegrown extremists may try and stage an attack.

**VIOLENT WEEKEND IN CHICAGO**

**Synopsis:**

When a city has seven killings in two days, including the death of a 7-year-old boy, something is systemically wrong. That's what Chicago's police chief said after a spate of bloodshed that tormented the city over the weekend. "We need to repair a broken system," Police Superintendent Garry McCarthy told reporters Sunday. "Criminals don't feel the repercussions of the justice system." Take, for example, the death of 7-year-old Amari Brown. McCarthy said the boy was the unintended victim of bullet meant for his father, a ranking gang member. The system failed Amari, the police chief said. Amari's father, who has been arrested 45 times and has a lengthy criminal record, should not have been on the streets, McCarthy said. "If Mr. Brown is in custody, his son is alive," McCarthy said. At a vigil Sunday for Amari, family friend Michael Singleton told the media that unless real changes are made, the cycle of violence will continue. Even with a 30% increase in the number of police on the streets over the holiday weekend, seven people were killed between Friday morning and Sunday afternoon, the superintendent said. Another 40 people were wounded in weekend shootings, McCarthy said. And since Friday morning, Chicago police have recovered one illegal gun per hour across the city, McCarthy said.

**MIGRANT TRUMP WORKERS**

At Trump hotel site, immigrant workers are concern. Workers leave the site of the future Trump International Hotel, which is at the site of the Old Post Office Pavilion in Washington. For weeks, dozens of construction workers from Latin America have streamed onto the site of the Old Post Office Pavilion in downtown Washington and taken pride in their work building one of the city's newest luxury hotels. But that job site is now laden with tension after the man behind the project - billionaire developer Donald Trump - put himself at the center of the nation's debate over illegal immigration. Trump garnered headlines - and prompted several business associates to sever relations with him - when he launched his bid for the Republican presidential nomination last month with a controversial description of drug dealers and "rapists" crossing the border each day into the United States from Mexico. But a Trump company may be relying on some undocumented workers to finish the \$200 million hotel, which will sit five blocks from the White House on Pennsylvania Avenue, according to several who work there. A Trump spokeswoman said the company and its contractors follow all applicable laws. But in light of Trump's comments, some of the workers at the site said they are now worried about their jobs - while others simply expressed disgust over the opinions of the man ultimately responsible for the creation of those jobs. Trump: Immigrants bring 'drugs ... crime' to U.S. from Mexico Real estate mogul Donald Trump said during his presidential announcement that many Mexicans crossing into the United States are drug traffickers and rapists, though he said he assumes some are "good people." All of them said they have been talking about Trump ever since his inflammatory remarks dominated coverage of his presidential announcement on June 16.

**BILL COSBY 2005 DEPOSITION REVEALING**

The case, brought by a former head of women's basketball at Temple University in Philadelphia, Cosby's alma mater, is the only legal proceeding relating to sexual assault allegations against Cosby that has ever been brought to conclusion, despite numerous accusations that have been brought against him by multiple women. Andrea Constand claimed that she had been drugged and molested by Cosby at his home in January 2005, but following a private settlement in the case, all documents relating to it were sealed, casting the whole matter under a deep layer of secrecy. **DONALD TRUMPS CLAIMS TO HAVE THE HISPANIC VOTES**

The man who declared some Mexican immigrants to be criminals and "rapists" three weeks ago now says he'll win the Latino vote in 2016. "I'll win the Latino vote because I'll create jobs. I'll create jobs and the Latinos will have jobs they didn't have, I'll do better on that vote than anybody, I will win that vote," the Republican candidate and real estate mogul told NBC News' Katy Tur on Wednesday, as he defended his relationship with Mexicans in the wake of international outrage over his repeated and offensive remarks about undocumented immigrants. Trump also resurrected claims that the president is foreign-born, saying "fine, if you believe that" when asked about the president's released, long-form birth certificate, before diverting back to talking points. Trump's return to 'brotherism' - and of course his repeated condemnation of undocumented immigrants - signals that the real estate mogul turned presidential candidate isn't likely to shy from the bombastic style that's helped him dominate headlines in recent weeks and fueled his rising poll numbers.

Immigrants are less likely to Be Criminals than the Native-Born. When it comes to understanding the relationship between immigration and crime, anecdotes are no substitute for evidence. And, as a new report from the American Immigration Council explains, the evidence has been clear for more than a century: high rates of immigration are associated with lower crime rates, and immigrants are less likely to commit serious crimes or be behind bars than the native-born. This holds true for both legal immigrants and the unauthorized, regardless of their country of origin or level of education. In other words, the overwhelming majority of immigrants are not "criminals" by any commonly accepted definition of the term. Consider the following data presented in the report: Higher Immigration is Associated with Lower Crime Rates Between 1990 and 2013, the foreign-born share of the U.S. population grew from 7.9 percent to 13.1 percent and the number of unauthorized immigrants more than tripled from 3.5 million to 11.2 million. During the same period, FBI data indicate that the violent crime rate declined 48 percent-which included falling rates of aggravated assault, robbery, rape, and murder. Likewise, the property crime rate fell 41 percent, including declining rates of motor vehicle theft, larceny/robbery, and burglary. Immigrants are less likely than the Native-Born to Be behind Bars According to an original analysis of data from the 2010 American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the authors of this report, roughly 1.6 percent of immigrant males age 18-39 are incarcerated, compared to 3.3 percent of the native-born. This disparity in incarceration rates has existed for decades, as evidenced by data from the 1980, 1990, and 2000 decennial censuses. In each of those years, the incarceration rates of the native-born were anywhere from two to five times higher than that of immigrants. The 2010 Census data reveals that incarceration rates among the young, less-educated Mexican, Salvadoran, and Guatemalan men who make up the bulk of the unauthorized population are significantly lower than the incarceration rate among native-born young men without a high-school diploma.

Trading has been halted since 11:32 a.m. on the exchange because of a technical problem, the NYSE has said. Officials and the exchange have said that there is no indication that the problem is the result of a cyber-attack. Officials have also said there is no sign that it is related to a computer outage that grounded United Airlines flights Wednesday morning.

**REPUBLICAN RESENTMENT GROWS AGAINST DONALD TRUMP**

**Synopsis:**

The backlash growing, and this time it's coming from House Speaker John Boehner, R-Ohio. A day after Republican Party Chairman Reince Priebus called Trump to tell him to "tone it down," Boehner also tried to distance his party from the 2016 presidential candidate's comments about Mexican immigrants. "I disagree with Mr. Trump's comments and, frankly, I think political presidential candidates, they've all pretty much made their positions clear," Boehner said on Thursday, according to The Hill. "This has become the biggest political football I've seen in my congressional career, this whole issue of illegal immigration and what to do about it." Boehner said there's no chance of the immigration system being fixed if lawmakers repeatedly continue "sticking their heads in the sand." Donald Trump upped the volume in his already controversial political campaign Thursday, hinting that he could run as an independent if Republican leaders try to isolate him. Trump has dominated political news for two weeks as disparaging remarks he made about Mexican immigrants, labeling them drug runners and "rapists," have caused steadily mounting concern among many Republican strategists. Party officials, who have emphasized a need to reach out to Latino voters, have watched as Trump's comments have threatened to worsen the GOP's already weak image among that growing group of voters. His remarks have divided the GOP presidential candidates and delighted Democratic operatives. Since the initial remarks he made during his campaign kickoff last month in New York, Trump has escalated his comments in a series of radio and television interviews, claiming that the Mexican government had deliberately sent criminals to the U.S. Amid deepening concerns from GOP donors, Republican National Committee Chairman Reince Priebus spoke to Trump on Wednesday, urging him to "tone down" his comments.

**THE CONFEDERATE FLAG WILL COME DOWN AT SOUTH CAROLINA CAPITAL**

**Synopsis:**

South Carolina Governor Nikki Haley signed legislation on Thursday to permanently remove the Confederate battle flag from the state capitol grounds, following an emotional debate spurred by the massacre of nine black churchgoers last month. Haley signed the bill into law in the State House Rotunda before an audience of legislators and dignitaries shortly after 4 p.m. ET The flag will go to the "relic room" of a military museum in Columbia, the state capital. The rebel banner, carried by Confederate troops in the 1861-1865 Civil War, is seen as a symbol of racism and slavery by many, while others proudly hail it as an emblem of Southern heritage. It has flown at the state capitol for 54 years. South Carolina was planning to keep the flag relocation "as low-key as the national media will let us," said Haley spokeswoman Chaney Adams.

**APPEALS PANEL HEARS ARGUMENTS ON OBAMA IMMIGRATION ACTION

**Synopsis:**

A federal appeals court in New Orleans heard arguments over President Barack Obama's plan to protect from deportation as many as 5 million immigrants living illegally in the United States. Announced in November, the plan was harshly criticized by Republicans in Congress as an executive overreach. Texas and 25 other states challenged the plan in federal court, and U.S. District Judge Andrew Hanen in Brownsville, Texas, granted a preliminary injunction on Feb. 16. Arguments in the Obama administration's appeal were set for a two-hour hearing before a three-judge panel of the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeal. Supporters of the plan, including members of labor unions and immigrants' rights groups, planned to rally outside the courthouse Friday morning and hold a news conference after the hearing. Either side could appeal a loss to the full 5th Circuit or the Supreme Court - a process that will eat up time with only about a year and a half left in Obama's second term. Justice Department lawyers arguing for the administration have said Texas had no legal standing in the matter. Texas' solicitor general countered that granting legal status to immigrants will be costly for Texas, with the state incurring costs for providing drivers' licenses, schooling and health care to immigrants who are granted permission to stay. Two members of the panel hearing arguments Friday were on a panel that voted in May to not allow the plan to proceed while the appeal is pursued. In the May 26 ruling, judges Jerry Smith and Jennifer Walker Elrod said the federal government lawyers are unlikely to succeed on the merits of the appeal. Judge Stephen Higginson disagreed in a lengthy dissent. Friday's panel includes Smith, Elrod and Carolyn Dineen King.

**TRUMP LEADS GOP PRESIDENTIAL FIELD IN NEW NATIONAL POLL

**Synopsis:**

Media coverage of Donald Trump's controversial immigration remarks have lifted the GOP presidential candidate to the top of the Republican field, according to a new Economist/YouGov poll. Trump was the preferred GOP nominee for president for 15 percent of respondents - 4 points ahead of former Gov. Jeb Bush (Fla.) and Sen. Rand Paul (Ky.), who were tied for second place. Gov. Scott Walker (Wis.), Sen. Marco Rubio (Fla.) and former Gov. Mike Huckabee (Ark.) shared the third spot with 9 percent each. In addition to being the first choice for the majority of likely voters who participated in the poll, Trump was also the primary second choice for those who preferred another candidate as their nominee. 12 percent of respondents said Trump was second in line for their vote, while only 7 percent picked either Bush or Paul as their safety candidate. While Trump may be on top this week, registered Republican voters gave him a very weak chance of holding on to that spot in the long run. The vast majority of respondents - 29 percent - said they believed Jeb Bush would ultimately claim the GOP presidential nomination. Only 7 percent said the same about Trump. Unlike other polling companies, YouGov relies on a preselected pool of registered voters from which it pulls respondents at random. Though this methodology has been called into question by some, the results of this poll are in line with other surveys, including one from the left-leaning Public Policy Polling, which gave Trump a comfortable lead in North Carolina.

**TRUMP CONTROVERSIAL DECLARATIONS IN PHOENIX, ARIZONA

**Synopsis:**

It wasn't quite the 9,000 people Donald Trump had said would show up to his rally in Phoenix. The number, in fact, was less than half of that. But around 4,000 people still gathered to hear the real estate mogul, reality star, and presidential contender spout xenophobic words. "I love the Mexican people ... I respect Mexico ... but the problem we have is that their leaders are much sharper, smarter and more cunning than our leaders, and they're killing us at the border," said Trump, according to Politico. "They're taking our jobs. They're taking our manufacturing jobs. They're taking our money. They're killing us." No

one should interpret his words as anti-immigrant, Trump insisted, noting he's a fan of those who enter the country legally. "They flow in like water, and I love legal immigration. I love it," he said. "We should make it easier, and faster." Ever the showman, Trump made fun of his rivals for the White House and mocked the companies that have cut ties with him over his recent comments. He also expressed surprise at a poll that showed him tied with former Florida Governor Jeb Bush for the Republican vote. "How could I be tied with this guy? He's terrible!" Trump said. What qualifies Trump to be president? "I'm really smart," he said. In fact, he's so smart that as soon as he was to move in to the White House he could solve problems in no time at all. He told the crowd he would be able to get hostages returned "in an hour" and would tax Mexico each time someone crossed the border illegally. He said he could convince the head of Ford Motor Co to move a plant back to the United States from Mexico overnight, with a couple of phone calls. About 20 minutes into the speech a group of protesters interrupted the real estate mogul but were immediately drowned out by supporters shouting "U-S-A! U-S-A!" ... "I wonder if the Mexican government sent them over here. I think so," Trump said. "Don't worry; we'll take out country back."

**TOPIC: BORDER SHOOTING OF MEXICAN TEEN RAISES CONSTITUTIONAL ISSUE**

**Synopsis:**

The mother of a Mexican teen killed by a US border patrol agent in a cross-border shooting can continue a lawsuit in the case, a federal judge has ruled. The civil rights case against Agent Lonnie Swartz over the death of 16-year-old José Antonio Elena Rodríguez will go forward after US district court judge Raner C Collins denied a part of his motion to dismiss the case. An attorney for Swartz argued that Elena Rodríguez was not protected by the US constitution because he was in Mexico at the time of the shooting. In a similar case in Texas, a federal appeals court ruled that a teen killed in Mexico by a border agent in El Paso was not protected by the constitution. But Collins wrote he respectfully disagrees with that finding. "The court finds that, under the facts alleged in this case, the Mexican national may avail himself to the protections of the fourth amendment and that the agent may not assert qualified immunity," Collins wrote. The ACLU filed a lawsuit on behalf of the boy's mother. Elena Rodríguez was in Nogales, Sonora, near a border fence when Swartz shot him from Nogales, Arizona, on 10 October 2012.

Republican lawmakers expressed their discontent on Monday after the US and Cuba formally ended more than a half-century of estrangement, formally re-establishing diplomatic relations severed at the height of the Cold War. The family of a California woman shot and killed while walking along a San Francisco pier told Congress Tuesday they support changing the laws that allowed her alleged killer to remain in the United States despite being deported several times. Jim Steinle told the Senate Judiciary Committee that Congress should push forward with efforts to close legal loopholes that currently allow local authorities to decide if they will cooperate with federal immigration authorities. Steinle's daughter, Kathryn Steinle, was killed earlier this month as she and Jim Steinle walked along a San Francisco pier. The man who allegedly shot her, Juan Francisco Lopez Sanchez, has several felony convictions and had been deported five times before the shooting. He was last released by authorities in San Francisco, a city with a "sanctuary" policy

of minimal cooperation with federal authorities on immigration issues. Jim Steinle testified alongside several other relatives of people allegedly killed by immigrants living in the country illegally. Steinle's killing and the disclosure that San Francisco authorities released Sanchez despite a request from federal officials to keep him in custody prompted an outcry from lawmakers. The House will take up a bill this week blocking federal funding for jurisdictions that resist turning over immigrants to federal authorities. A similar proposal has been advanced in the Senate, but it's unclear how far it will go. Steinle's father said Tuesday that reform could save lives.

**TRUMP RISES IN POLLS AND CONTINUES "ATTACKS"**

Businessman Donald Trump surged into the lead for the 2016 Republican presidential nomination, with almost twice the support of his closest rival, just as he ignited a new controversy after making disparaging remarks about Sen. John McCain's Vietnam War service, according to a new Washington Post-ABC News poll. Support for Trump fell sharply on the one night that voters were surveyed following those comments. Telephone interviewing for the poll began Thursday, and most calls were completed before the news about the remarks was widely reported. Although the sample size for the final day was small, the decline was statistically significant. Still, it is difficult to predict what could happen to Trump's support in the coming days and weeks as the controversy plays out. Even with the drop in support on the final night of the survey, Trump was the favorite of 24 percent of registered Republicans and Republican-leaning independents. That is the highest percentage and biggest lead recorded by any GOP candidate this year in Post-ABC News polls and marks a six fold increase in his support since late May, shortly before he formally joined the race. Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker, who announced his candidacy a week ago, is in second place, at 13 percent, followed by former Florida governor Jeb Bush, at 12 percent.

**SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY FUND CAN RUN OUT BY 2016

The 11 million Americans who receive Social Security disability face steep benefit cuts next year. The trustees who oversee Social Security and Medicare said the disability trust fund will run out of money in late 2016. That would trigger an automatic 19 percent cut in benefits, unless Congress acts. The average monthly benefit for disabled workers and their families is \$1,017. The typical beneficiary would see a reduction of \$193 a month. In more bad news for beneficiaries, the trustee's project there will be no cost-of-living increase in benefits at the end of the year. It would mark only the third year without an increase since automatic adjustments were adopted in 1975. Separately, about 7 million Medicare beneficiaries could face a monthly premium increase of at least \$54 for outpatient coverage. That works out to an increase of more than 50 percent. The annual report card on the financial health of Social Security and Medicare shows that the federal government's largest benefit programs are feeling the strain of aging baby boomers as they both approach milestone anniversaries.

**NEW YORK TO INCREASE MINIMUM WAGE

New York moved on Wednesday to raise the minimum wage for fast-food workers to \$15 an hour by the end of 2018 in New York City and by mid-2021 in the rest of the state. The New York Wage Board voted unanimously for the increase, which would cover some 180,000 workers statewide and affect fast-food chains with 30 locations or more in the United States. The three-member board was formed at the behest of Governor Andrew Cuomo in May after the state legislature turned down his proposals for minimum wage increases for most workers. With the federal minimum wage at \$7.25 an hour since 2009, labor and religious groups have pressed state and local governments to enact pay raises as their hopes dim for an increase by the Republican-controlled U.S. Congress. Last month, Los Angeles set its minimum wage to rise from \$9 an hour to \$15 by 2020, affecting some 600,000 workers. Seattle and San Francisco also have increased minimum wages in recent years. A statewide wage increase for fast-food workers as opposed to city-based would be a first, said the National Employment Law Project, a nonprofit advocacy group. The rise to \$15 an hour marks a major step from New York's current minimum wage of \$8.75.

**FDA PROPOSAL RULES TO ELIMINATE TRANSFAT

Under new FDA regulations, partially hydrogenated oils, which have been shown to raise "bad" LDL cholesterol, will be considered food additives that cannot be used unless authorized by the FDA. The regulations take effect in three years, giving companies time to either reformulate products without partially hydrogenated oils or petition the FDA to permit specific uses of them. Following the compliance period, no partially hydrogenated oils can be added to human food unless they are otherwise approved by the FDA. The new regulations will apply to such oils added to human foods, regardless of whether they



are sold in a grocery store, restaurant, bakery or elsewhere, and whether the food is domestically produced or imported, the FDA said. They do not, however, apply to naturally-occurring trans fats found in some animal products such as meat and dairy.

From the moment he landed, wearing a white "Make America Great Again" baseball cap, Donald Trump's visit to the border of Mexico and the United States seemed to know only one speed: full throttle. 25-year-old Guatemalan Félix Valenzuela remembers the nightmare he went through on Sunday, when he was beat up by two white men in Williamsburg, Brooklyn. Valenzuela said that his attackers spewed anti-immigrant slurs as they battered him. "I told them to respect the stop sign when they stood in front of me blocking my way. Immediately, they pounced on me and started beating me up and screaming that I was an immigrant who had nothing to do in this country." According to the NYPD, the case is being investigated as a hate crime. Valenzuela has lived in Williamsburg for four years, said that he remembers hearing about hate crimes in the local and national news, "but I never thought that I would become another victim." One of the anti-immigrant attacks Valenzuela recalls hearing about happened at midnight on June 30 in Suffolk, when another Guatemalan, a 42-year-old, was savagely beaten by three men who stepped out of a van and kicked him in the face, arms and legs. The Suffolk police said that the victim was riding his bicycle from his job in Farmingdale to his home in Coram. His attackers also uttered racial slurs during the assault. Félix remembers that he was riding his bicycle around his neighborhood, when he bumped into two young white men on skateboards. A witness called the police, but the two aggressors fled before the officers reached the scene. Valenzuela was taken to 94th Precinct and later received medical attention at Woodhull Hospital.

The gunman who opened fire inside a packed movie theater in Lafayette, Louisiana, Thursday night, was John Russell Houser, police said at a news conference this morning. Houser, 59, who killed himself, is among three people who died, police said. The other two were Mayci Breaux, 21, of Franklin, Louisiana, who died at the theater, and Jillian Johnson, 33, of Lafayette, who died at the hospital. Nine others were injured, including one who was in critical condition, police said. Houser is from Alabama and has no

known connection to Lafayette, police said. Houser was described as a drifter by police, who said he had likely been in Lafayette since early July, staying at a motel. "It is apparent he was intent on shooting and escaping" before police forced him back into the theater where he shot himself to death, Lafayette Police Chief Jim Craft said at the news conference, explaining that his 1995 blue Lincoln Continental was positioned near the exit. Police found wigs and glasses in his car and motel room, Craft said. The shooting occurred at the Grand 16 Theater on Johnston Street where a screening of Amy Schumer's "Train wreck" was playing, according to the Associated Press. Conditions of those injured range from non-life-threatening to critical and their ages ranged from the late teens to their 60s, Lafayette Police Chief Jim Craft said at a news conference. The man once known as a church-going neighbor had grown into someone better known by neighbors and colleagues as an angry provocateur. Police say John Houser's anger culminated Thursday night in a slaughter at The Grand 16 theater in Lafayette, Louisiana, leaving two women dead and nine other people hurt. Houser had a dark side that went way beyond talk. In 1989, court records say, he was accused of hiring someone to burn down a Columbus lawyer's law office. His wife and other relatives filed papers accusing him of domestic violence in 2008. Houser flew a large Confederate flag on a flagpole outside his house for a time and even put a "doomsday-type" flier in neighbors' mailboxes warning that a global economic collapse was about to occur. Investigators uncovered clues that lead them to believe John "Rusty" Houser may have been planning his deadly attack on a Lafayette, Louisiana, movie theater for some time. Public records reveal Houser faced criminal charges many years ago, and acquaintances say he has a long history of mental illness. The gun he used in the rampage was legally purchased at an Alabama pawnshop in February 2014, officials said. Houser, who police described as a "drifter" from eastern Alabama, had been living in a run-down Lafayette motel since early July. Members of Houser's estranged family told authorities he might have been trying to get a fresh start on life after a failed marriage and other struggles in recent years in Alabama and Georgia.

The Transportation Department is investigating possible price gouging by the five biggest domestic airlines while train service was disabled between New York and Washington after a deadly Amtrak crash in May, it said on Friday. The regulator sent letters on Friday asking each airline to detail average fares along the route before, during and after the crash. It demanded an explanation for any price increases and asked the airlines whether they communicated with one another about those fares, which might signal collusion. The review involves Delta Air Lines, American Airlines, United Continental, Southwest Airlines and JetBlue Airways, all of which said they were cooperating with the investigation. United States airlines are already the subject of a Justice Department investigation into whether they worked together illegally to keep fares high by signaling plans to limit flights.

Trump's popularity among Republican voters does not translate to the broader pool of registered voters. When tested in hypothetical general election matchups against top Democrats, he trails both frontrunner Hillary Clinton and upstart Senator Bernie Sanders by wide margins. Bush and Walker run just behind Clinton and about even with Sanders. Trump's no favorability rating is sky high. Overall, 59% of all registered voters have an unfavorable opinion of Trump, though that dips to 42% among GOP voters. None of the other Republicans landing near the top of the field have such a negative image nationwide, though many remain little known. Clinton is the only candidate who is about as well-known as Trump, and while she is more well-liked than the developer, her favorability rating is net negative among registered voters nationally: 49% have an unfavorable view while 44% have a positive impression.

**JUDGE ORDERS RELEASE OF IMMIGRANT CHILDREN DETAINED BY U.S.**

A federal ruling criticized the conditions in which children who crossed the border from Mexico are held. A federal judge in California has ruled that the Obama administration's detention of children and their mothers who were caught crossing the border illegally is a serious violation of a longstanding court settlement, and that the families should be released as quickly as possible. In a decision late Friday roundly rejecting the administration's arguments for holding the families, Judge Dolly M. Gee of Federal District Court for the Central District of California found that two detention centers in Texas that the administration opened last summer fail to meet minimum legal requirements of the 1997 settlement for facilities housing children. Judge Gee also found that migrant children had been held in "widespread deplorable conditions" in Border Patrol stations after they were first caught, and she said the authorities had "wholly failed" to provide the "safe and sanitary" conditions required for children even in temporary cells. The opinion was a significant legal blow to detention policies ordered by Homeland Security Secretary Jeh Johnson in response to an influx of children and parents, mostly from Central America, across the border in South Texas last summer. In her 25-page ruling, Judge Gee gave a withering critique of the administration's positions, declaring them "unpersuasive" and "dubious" and saying officials had ignored "unambiguous" terms of the settlement.

**WHISTLEBLOWER EXPOSES TORTURE AND CHILD ABUSE AT FOR-PROFIT PRISON**

The Karnes County Residential Center is operated by GEO Group-the second largest private prison company in the country that has faced numerous accusations of atrocities and civil rights violations. It is also the site of recent-and repeated-hunger strikes led by mothers incarcerated with their children, in protest of their conditions, detentions, and in many cases, their looming deportations. Social worker Oliva López corroborated the accounts of people on the inside when she conducted an exclusive interview with McClatchy DC, published Monday, in which she countered federal and local authorities' narratives which cast the detention center as a safe and tolerable place for families to reside during asylum application processes. López said that, in fact, Karnes is a prison, and its atrocities include: A five-year-old girl who survived sexual assault during her migration was falsely declared fit for discharge by a prison psychologist despite numerous warning signs, including the fact that she was suffering from nightmares, losing weight, and had reverted to wearing a diaper.

**FDA BANS SOME CILANTRO FROM MEXICO, CITES HUMAN FECES IN FIELDS**

Since that year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, along with state public health officials, have identified hundreds of outbreaks of cyclosporiasis in the United States associated with fresh cilantro from the state of Puebla, Mexico, the FDA said Monday. Cyclosporiasis is an intestinal illness caused by the microscopic parasite cyclosporiasis cayetanensis, according to the CDC. Symptoms typically appear a week after ingestion and may include diarrhea and vomiting.

**L.A. CITY COUNCIL BANS LARGE-CAPACITY AMMUNITION MAGAZINES

Defying sharp warnings from gun rights groups, Los Angeles thrust itself into the national debate over gun control Tuesday, as city lawmakers voted unanimously to ban the possession of firearm magazines that hold more than 10 rounds. Such magazines have been "the common thread" in almost all the mass shootings that have devastated the country, from Newtown to Virginia Tech to Columbine, said Juliet Leftwich, legal director for the Law Center to Prevent Gun Violence. Backers of the plan said it was a small but meaningful step to minimize the bloodshed, by forcing attackers to at least interrupt their rampages to stop and reload. The National Rifle Assn. and other gun rights groups have threatened to sue over Los Angeles' new rules, arguing that they violate the 2nd Amendment and are preempted by existing state law. Mayor Eric Garcetti said he was eager to sign the L.A. measure, which passed 12-0 with three council members absent. Even as city officials celebrated the newly passed restrictions, some gun control activists were dismayed to hear about a proposal to exempt retired police officers from the rules - an 11th-hour change sought by the union that represents Los Angeles police. California law already generally bans the manufacturing of such large-capacity magazines, as well as offering them for sale or bringing them into the state. But state law does not prohibit people from possessing them, which Krekorian and others argued is a "loophole" that jeopardizes public safety.

It's a record I'll gladly compare with anyone else in the field." Also due to speak at the meeting Friday in Fort Lauderdale were Republican candidate Ben Carson, as well as Democratic candidates Hillary Rodham Clinton, former Maryland Gov. Martin O'Malley and Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders. The conference marks the first time in the 2016 presidential race that Clinton and Bush are set to appear at the same event. Bush planned to tell the crowd that as governor in Florida from 1999 to 2007, he ordered the removal of the Confederate battle flag from the state capitol, raised the number of black judges and tripled the state's hiring of minority-owned businesses.

But this month, one of his companies, the elite Mar-a-Lago Club resort in Florida, applied to import 70 foreign workers to serve as cooks, wait staff and cleaners. A Reuters analysis of U.S. government data reveals that this is business as usual in the New York property magnate's empire. Trump owns companies that have sought to import at least 1,100 foreign workers on temporary visas since 2000, according to U.S. Department of Labor data reviewed by Reuters. Most of the applications were approved, the data show. Nine companies majority-owned by Trump have sought to bring in foreign waitresses, cooks, vineyard workers and other laborers on temporary work-visa programs administered by the Labor Department. The candidate's foreign talent hunt included applications for an assistant golf-course superintendent, an assistant hotel manager and a banquet manager. Two of his companies, Trump Model Management and Trump Management Group LLC, have sought visas for nearly 250 foreign fashion models, the records show. Trump's presidential campaign and a lawyer for the businessman declined to comment. The Mar-a-Lago Club could not be reached for comment.

**NEW YORK LEGIONNAIRES DISEASE OUTBREAK**

**PRESIDENT OBAMA AND CLEAN AIR**

US President Barack Obama has unveiled what he called "the biggest, most important step we have ever taken" in tackling climate change. The aim of the revised Clean Power Plan is to cut greenhouse gas emissions from US power stations by nearly a third within 15 years. The measures will place significant emphasis on wind and solar power and other renewable energy sources. However, opponents in the energy industry have vowed to fight the plan. "I'm convinced no challenge provides a greater threat to the future of the planet," Mr. Obama said. "There is such a thing as being too late." Those opponents say Mr. Obama has declared "a war on coal". Power plants fired by coal provide more than a third of the US electricity supply. The revised plan will aim to cut carbon emissions from the power sector by 32% by 2030, compared with 2005 levels. He likened the plan to taking 166 million cars off the road in terms of environmental impact. He called taking a stand against climate change a "moral obligation". **50 YEARS ANNIVERSARY OF THE VOTING RIGHTS BILL AND TEXAS VOTER ID**

**Synopsis:**

A federal appeals court declared that Texas' strict 2011 voter ID law has a "discriminatory effect" on minorities and violates the Voting Rights Act. But the three-judge panel's unanimous, 49-page decision also overturned a lower court's previous assertion that the law amounted to an unconstitutional "poll tax." Here's a closer look at the Wednesday ruling, the law and where the case stands now. The U.S. 5th Circuit Court in New Orleans found that Texas' law requiring residents to show state-approved IDs in order to cast ballots violated Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, a 50-year old federal statute prohibiting discrimination against minorities. Its ruling followed a decision last year by the lower, Corpus-Christi-based U.S. District Court that likened the law to an unconstitutional "poll tax" that could require some poor Texans to pay to vote because of fees associated with obtaining necessary IDs. The ruling Wednesday rejected the "poll tax" finding since Texas has taken steps to allow residents to receive IDs for free. But it upheld the lower court's assertion that the effect of the law was nonetheless discriminatory. The case returns to the U.S. District Court, which will have to decide whether the Texas Legislature intended to discriminate against minority voters when it drafted and passed the law. Opponents of voter ID cheered Wednesday's ruling as a victory -- albeit a narrow one. Republican Gov. Greg Abbott, who defended the law in court as state attorney general before becoming governor in January, vowed that "Texas will continue to fight for its voter ID requirement to ensure the integrity of elections."

**US OFFICIALS ASK JUDGE NOT TO END IMMIGRANT FAMILY DETENTION**

**Synopsis:**

The U.S. government has asked a federal judge to reconsider her ruling calling for the immediate release of children and their mothers caught entering the U.S. illegally from Mexico, saying recent changes mean federal authorities are no longer violating a ban on holding immigrant children in secure facilities. In late July, U.S. District Judge Dolly Gee ordered the release of all children from immigrant family detention

centers "without unnecessary delay," along with any mothers not deemed a flight or national security risk. Justice Department lawyers late Thursday filed documents at the California Central District Court urging Gee to not implement her decision, saying the Department of Homeland Security intends to turn the centers into short-term processing facilities that her ruling "addressed practices and policies that no longer exist." The government says detention time has been reduced to only a few weeks for most families, and that reducing it further would hinder processing asylum claims and could force the separation of mothers from their children in the event of another wave of migration. Moreover, further limits on detention "would heighten the risk of another surge in illegal migration," the filing said, "by incentivizing adults to bring children with them on their dangerous journey as a means to avoid detention and gain access to the interior of the United States." The government asked for another chance to argue its case before the judge, citing the "potentially far-reaching scope of the remedies proposed," and the short time -- 90 days -- it would have to put them in place. Homeland Security spokeswoman Marsha Catron said the agency has asked to the judge to reconsider, "taking into account the current legal landscape and considerable changes we have already made to address the situation."

Here's precisely what Trump said: Erickson took issue with Trump's comments - particularly the "wherever" part - in a post to his blog overnight. A taste: "While Mr. Trump resonates with a lot of people with his bluntness, including me to a degree, there are just real lines of decency a person running for President should not cross. unfortunate to have to disinvite him. But I just don't want someone on stage who gets a hostile question from a lady and his first inclination is to imply it was hormonal. It just was wrong." Erickson elaborated on Saturday morning, telling the event's hundreds of attendees that he thought it was "weak and pathetic to take a tough question from a journalist and assume she's on her period and that's why she asked a tough question." "I have said some really unfortunate things in my life, and I've apologized for them. It is not political correctness, it's common decency," said Erickson, an occasional, paid analyst for Fox News. "If you don't have a little voice in your head saying, 'No you actually screwed up,' it's going to end badly for you." He added: "I don't want Donald Trump in the room with my daughter tonight so that's why he was disinvited." In an interview with The Atlanta Journal-Constitution, Erickson said he called and emailed the Trump campaign late Friday night in search of clarification or an apology. Neither came. "They were immediately hostile and refused to even admit he said it," Erickson said. Trump on Saturday took to Twitter to defend himself and said the "wherever" part of his comments to CNN referred to Kelly's "nose."

### DANGERS OF "SEXTING"

Researchers at Drexel University's Women's Health Psychology Lab conducted an online survey to explore the potential benefits of sharing sexually explicit messages or images through electronic means, cell phones in particular. Preliminary findings suggest some correlation between sexting and relationship satisfaction, the researchers said. Among 870 respondents surveyed online who identified as adults in the United States between the ages of 18 and 82, 88% reported having sexted at least once. A slightly lower number of respondents, 82%, reported sexting in the past year, according to an abstract published on the American Psychological Association's website. The research, which was presented Saturday at the APA's annual convention, is in the process of being submitted for publication in peer-reviewed journals, said co-author Emily C. Stasko, a clinical psychology PhD student at Drexel. Sexting often gets a bad rap as risky behavior associated with sexual harassment, unwanted sexual advances or worse, especially for teens. The research aims to "reframe sexting as a positive relationship behavior," she said.

### ANOTHER UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT ACUSED OF MURDER

**Synopsis:**

A man who was in the U.S. illegally and charged with raping, torturing and killing a Santa Barbara County woman last month had been arrested repeatedly in recent years - and was released from jail just days before the fatal attack. Police say Victor Aureliano Martinez Ramirez, 29, and another man broke into the home of 64-year-old Marilyn Pharis in Santa Maria on July 24 and attacked her with a hammer and sexually assaulted her. Pharis, a veteran of the U.S. Air Force who worked at Vandenberg Air Force Base, died Aug. 1 from her wounds. Ramirez, who also goes by the name Victor Martinez, was booked into Santa Barbara County Jail on drug and weapons charges July 17, according to the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's Office. He was ordered released July 20 after pleading no contest to the weapons charge. Pharis' death came weeks after the arrest of a Mexican immigrant in connection with the fatal shooting of a 32-year-old woman at San Francisco's Embarcadero. The man charged in that homicide, Juan Francisco Lopez-Sanchez, is a seven-time felon who was in the country illegally and had been deported five times. In the Ramirez case, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement asked Santa Barbara custody officials to put a detention hold on him last year after he was charged with felony assault with intent to commit sexual assault. The detainer was meant to ensure Ramirez would be transferred into federal custody before his release.

**NEW VIOLENCE AND ARRESTS IN FERGUSON, MO**

A man who opened fire on officers in Ferguson, Missouri, is in "critical, unstable" condition after being struck when the officers returned fire, the St. Louis County Police chief said early Monday. Chief Jon Belmar said at a news conference that plainclothes officers had been tracking the man, who they believed was armed, during a protest marking the anniversary of the death of 18-year-old Michael Brown. The man approached the officers, who were in an unmarked police van, and opened fire, Belmar said. The officers returned fire from inside the vehicle and then pursued the man on foot when he ran. The man again fired on the officers, the chief said, and all four officers fired back. He was struck and fell. The man was taken to a hospital, where Belmar said he was in "critical, unstable" condition in surgery. He was not immediately identified. None of the officers was seriously injured. The shooting happened shortly after what the chief called "an exchange of gunfire between two groups" rang out around 11:15 p.m. Sunday as protesters were gathered on West Florissant Avenue, sending the crowd running for cover. Belmar waved off any notion that the people with the weapons were part of the protest. Several other events earlier Sunday marked the anniversary of the killing, which cast greater scrutiny on how police interact with black communities. Brown's father, Michael Brown Sr., led a march through town after a crowd of hundreds observed 4 1/2 minutes of silence. The group began their silence at 12:02 p.m., the time Brown was killed, for a length of time that symbolized the 4 1/2 hours that his body lay in the street after he was killed. Two doves were released at the end.

**COLORADO RIVER POLLUTION**

The head of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency says it "pains me to no end" to see the 3 million gallons of mine waste that has turned a southwest Colorado river into an orange-colored pollution stream. Gina McCarthy made the comments Tuesday in Washington, D.C., as her agency came under siege after federal and contract workers accidentally unleashed the spill as they inspected an abandoned mine. She took full responsibility for the spill and said the EPA is working around the clock to assess the environmental impact. The mine waste contains arsenic, lead and other heavy metals and has flowed at least 100 miles downstream to New Mexico. McCarthy called the spill tragic and said the agency's commitment is to "get this right and protect public health." Tuesday marks the first day people affected by a Colorado mine spill can file claims with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The agency accidentally unleashed the contaminated wastewater last week as federal and contract workers inspected the abandoned mine near Silverton, Colorado. The agency estimates more than 3 million gallons of sludge laden with lead, arsenic and other heavy metals flowed at least 100 miles downstream to New Mexico. Communities and farmers along the Animas and San Juan rivers were forced to stop using river water, and it's unclear when it will be safe to resume irrigating. The EPA says it's committed to taking responsibility for the spill and effects to downstream communities.

The poll results come as the bill heads to the California Senate Appropriations Committee. The statewide poll, conducted in July for the ACLU of California Center for Advocacy and Policy, found that nearly two-thirds of voters (65%) in California believe black people are more likely to be discriminated against by police. This includes nearly 9 out of 10 black voters (89%) who believe the same. Additional poll findings include: Nationwide events:

Nearly every voter (95%) reports having heard of the recent high-profile police shootings and misconduct cases in Ferguson, New York and Charleston and most voters (80%) believe something like that could very well happen in California. Police discrimination: 71 percent of California voters believe police are most likely to discriminate against young black men. Similarly, voters view Latinos (58%) and young Latino men (61%) as groups that are more likely to be discriminated against. Use of force legislation: There is strong voter support (71%) for legislation aimed to increase transparency and accountability when it comes to law enforcement's use of force reporting practices, such as AB 619 (Weber) and AB 71 (Rodriguez). The numbers speak for themselves. When it comes to AB 953: The Racial and Identity Profiling Act of 2015, Californians across the board support this solution-based proposal to put us on the path to fair policing. In the wake of events in Ferguson, New York, Charleston and Baltimore, we have been left heartbroken and shaken by the sometimes lethal impacts of racially biased policing. This year in California, over 100 people have died at the hands of police officers.

Two in three U.S. adults favor a plan to allow immigrants who are living illegally in the U.S. to remain in the country and become citizens if they meet certain requirements over time. Far fewer support allowing those immigrants to remain in the U.S. to work for a limited period of time (14%), or to deport all of these immigrants back to their home countries (19%). U.S. adults' views have been largely stable over the past decade. The latest update comes from Gallup's 2015 Minority Rights and Relations poll, conducted June 15-July 10. The poll included larger samples of blacks and Hispanics. Immigration is of special significance to Hispanics, about half of whom are immigrants themselves, according to the poll. Hispanics (77%) are more likely than non-Hispanic whites (62%) or non-Hispanic blacks (70%) to favor a path to citizenship for immigrants who are in the U.S. illegally. One in five whites, compared with 14% of blacks and 8% of Hispanics, prefer deporting undocumented immigrants back to their home countries. Hispanics are slightly less likely now than in 2006 (86%) to favor a path to citizenship for immigrants. The 2006 survey was the last time Gallup asked the question in a poll that included an expanded sample of Hispanics. Whites' and blacks' views are largely unchanged since then.

## FDA APPROVES FEMALE SEX PILL, BUT WITH SAFETY RESTRICTIONS

Federal health officials have approved the first prescription drug to boost sexual desire in women, a milestone long sought by the pharmaceutical industry. But safety restrictions on the daily pill, called Addy, mean it will probably never achieve the blockbuster sales of men's impotence drugs like Viagra, which have generated billions of dollars. The new drug's label will carry a bold warning that combining it with alcohol can cause dangerously low blood pressure and fainting. ## NO CITIZENSHIP FOR ILLEGAL MIGRANTS' BABIES

Many legal scholars believe the issue was settled by an 1898 decision of the U.S. Supreme Court involving a man born in the United States to Chinese parents who lived here legally. After a trip abroad, Wong Kim Ark was blocked from re-entering the country on the grounds that he was not a citizen. He fought back and won. By a 6-2 vote, the court said the 14th Amendment applied to virtually everyone born here, except for children of enemies of the U.S. or of foreign diplomats, or children born on Native American reservations, which were considered sovereign entities. Nearly 100 years later, in 1982, the Supreme Court used language that seemed to indicate the protection applied to children of illegal immigrants as well. In ruling that Texas must provide a free public education to undocumented children,

the court said in a footnote that "no plausible distinction with respect to Fourteenth Amendment 'jurisdiction' can be drawn between resident aliens whose entry into the United States was lawful, and resident aliens whose entry was unlawful."

OIL PRICES MAY TAKE AN EVEN SHARPER FALL

Oil prices have already taken a dramatic fall that's saved consumers big time at the pump. Last week, crude tumbled below \$42 a barrel, down from \$100 last year. One big-name investor is predicting an even sharper drop. A further decline to \$15 a barrel would be huge. Oil hasn't traded that low since early 1999, when gasoline at the pump was selling for under \$1 a gallon. Oil prices have already suffered a stunning decline. They're down nearly 60% and trading at levels unseen since early 2009. It's been a blessing to American drivers. The average price of gasoline is now \$2.66 a gallon, down from \$3.45 a year ago, according to AAA. The big problem is the world still has more oil than it needs, especially given China's economic slowdown. The American energy boom that began last decade created a supply glut. OPEC, led by Saudi Arabia, has been unwilling to balance the market by cutting production.

NEW SECURITY PROCEDURES AT MOVIE THEATRES

Movie theater chain Regal Entertainment Group has begun to check bags in response to shootings at theaters around the country, a procedure it acknowledged on its website was "not without flaws" and would inconvenience guests but provide better security. Regal spokesman Richard Grover did not respond to requests for comment Wednesday. The Knoxville, Tennessee, company operates some 570 theaters around the country. On its website, the company says that security issues have become a daily part of the lives in America and says that bags and backpacks are subject to inspection before entering. National Amusements Inc.'s Showcase chain, which runs about 30 theaters in the northeastern U.S., says on its website that it has banned backpacks and packages and reserves the right to search purses and bags. It says the policy, which began Aug. 7, will be in place "for the time being."

NYC IS LOOKING FOR WORKERS WHO ARE OWED \$3.7 MILLION

He said his office had been unable to locate the workers, and urged people to check its website to see if they were owed money. Mr. Stringer said his office would spread the word through social media, and through fliers distributed throughout the city in eight languages. Mr. Stringer said that since 2014 his office had reached settlements worth \$8.6 million with contractors who underpaid workers, mostly immigrants working nonunion jobs.

**MEXICAN UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANT BEAT BY 2 MEN IN BOSTON**

**Synopsis:**

Donald Trump on Friday denounced a violent attack against a homeless Hispanic man in Boston whose attacker told police he was inspired, in part, by Trump's rhetoric that people in the country illegally should be deported. It was a change in tone for the Republican presidential candidate, who's known for his incendiary remarks. "Boston incident is terrible. We need energy and passion, but we must treat each other with respect," Trump tweeted after coming under criticism for failing to condemn the attack more strongly. "I would never condone violence." Scott and Steve Leader were arrested early Wednesday on

charges they beat a 58-year-old Hispanic man while he slept near a Boston train station. One of the brothers later told police Trump "was right" about deporting "all these illegals," according to a police report. The comments marked a change in tone for Trump, who on Wednesday appeared far less troubled by it. After being told about the attack at a press conference ahead of New Hampshire town hall on Wednesday evening, Trump said it was the first he'd heard of it. "I think that would be a shame," he said, before adding: "I will say, the people that are following me are very passionate. They love this country. They want this country to be great again. And they are very passionate." Trump has inflamed Latinos by describing Mexican immigrants as "criminals" and "rapists" and saying he would build a wall between the United States and Mexico to crack down on illegal immigration. He recently said he would deport the millions of people already in the United States illegally, sort them into groups of "good ones" and "bad ones" and then allow those deemed good to re-enter the country. Police and the Suffolk County district attorney's office said the two brothers came across the victim while heading home from a Boston Red Sox game and proceeded to urinate on him, punch him and beat him with a metal pole while he slept. Witnesses flagged down a state trooper at about 12:30 a.m. Wednesday after they saw the attack and reported seeing the brothers walk away laughing, prosecutors said. The victim was treated for a broken nose, serious bruises and other injuries. The brothers were arraigned Wednesday on a slew of charges, including assault and battery, according to prosecutors. They were being held without bail on charges including assault and indecent exposure. They pleaded not guilty.

#### **ANCHOR BABIES, A HATEFUL EXPRESSION**

In trying to explain his recent remarks on so-called "anchor babies," former Gov. Jeb Bush said he was actually speaking about organized efforts to bring pregnant women into the United States, on legal visas, so they could give birth. (The term "anchor baby" refers to the theory that having a child as a U.S. citizen makes it hard for an illegal immigrant to be deported, but in reality more than 70,000 parents to U.S. citizens were deported in 2013. Our colleague Janell Ross wrote a detailed look at the "myth" of the anchor baby.) Meanwhile, his GOP rival, business executive Donald Trump, in a widely cited tweet decried the number of children who are born in the United States each year to illegal immigrants. Trump has called for denying birthright citizenship to children of illegal immigrants.

#### **CALIFORNIA JUDGE ORDERS RELEASE OF DETAINED UNDOCUMENTED CHILDREN HELD AT DETENTION CENTERS**

#### **Synopsis:**

In a filing late on Friday, US district judge Dolly Gee refused the government's request to reconsider her ruling in late July that children held in family detention centers after crossing the US-Mexico border illegally must be released rapidly. Calling the government's latest arguments "repackaged and reheated", she found the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in breach of a longstanding legal agreement stipulating that immigrant children cannot be held in unlicensed secured facilities, and gave agency

officials until 23 October to comply. DHS lawyers had asked the judge to reconsider her ruling, arguing that the agency was already doing its best to move families through detention quickly and that the facilities had been converted into short-term processing centers. Attorneys for the government are reviewing the order, said Nicole Navas, a DHS spokeswoman, on Friday night. This is the second time Gee has ruled that detaining children violates parts of a 1997 settlement from an earlier case. The settlement requires minors to be placed with a relative or in appropriate non-secure custody within five days. If there is a large influx of minors times may be longer, but children still must be released as expeditiously as possible, under the terms of the law. In her order, Gee countered that immigration officials "routinely failed to proceed as expeditiously as possible to place accompanied minors, and in some instances, may still be unnecessarily dragging their feet now". Peter Schey, executive director of the Center for Human Rights and Constitutional Law, said that the court's order "will protect refugee children and their mothers from lengthy and entirely senseless detention". The government poured millions of dollars into two large detention centers in Texas after tens of thousands of immigrant families, mostly mothers with children from Central America, crossed the Rio Grande into the US last summer. Many have petitioned for asylum after fleeing gang and domestic violence back home.

More than 138 million people, nearly 44% of the U.S. population, live in areas where air pollution reaches dangerously high levels during parts of the year. While exposure to low quality air has declined in recent years, some cities still experience alarming levels of pollution. Based on "State of the Air," a report released annually by the American Lung Association (ALA), 24/7 Wall St. reviewed the 10 leading metro areas with the highest levels of year-round particle pollution. The Fresno-Madera, California metro area led the nation with the worst long-term pollution level.

## **HISPANICS AND ANTIBIOTICS**

#### **Synopsis:**

Many U.S. adults, including almost half of Hispanics, believe that taking antibiotics will ease the symptoms of a cold, a new study shows - even though most colds are viral and antibiotics don't work against viruses. Compared to all Americans on average, Hispanic consumers are almost three times as likely to get antibiotics from a source other than a prescribing physician or to use antibiotics left over from a previous illness, according to a new report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Using antibiotics when they won't work, or using them incorrectly, helps bacteria become resistant, making the drugs less effective when they're really needed. The CDC researchers used data from national Internet surveys collected from participants living in the U.S. in 2012 and 2013, comparing surveys of more than 7,000 U.S. consumers in general to another set of surveys directed at 1,000 Hispanic consumers. Almost 50 percent of Hispanic consumers believed that antibiotics help a cold get better faster, compared to 25 percent of the general public. Twenty-five percent of Hispanic respondents said they had used antibiotics left over from a previous illness, and almost as many said they had gotten antibiotics at a neighborhood grocery store, compared to nine percent and five percent of U.S. consumers overall, the researchers

reported in the CDC Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report. In many other countries, including some in Central and South America, antibiotics do not require a prescription, which may explain why Hispanic people have different beliefs about where to get them and how they should be used, said Dr. William Schaffner of Vanderbilt University School of Medicine in Nashville, Tennessee. More than half of providers thought that patients expect an antibiotic at a visit for a cough or cold, when in reality that number is 41 percent of Hispanic consumers and 26 percent of consumers generally. Pediatricians tend to experience the most pressure to give antibiotics for colds, but teaching middle and high-schoolers about appropriate antibiotic use would help change beliefs over time, Schaffner said in a phone interview. Antibiotics are appropriate for whooping cough, strep throat or urinary tract infections, but not for bronchitis, flu or other sore throats, according to a CDC info graphic. Antibiotics may cause side effects, allergies or secondary infections, which happen when the drug kills important healthy bacteria in the body.

**POLL ON HISPANICS AND REPUBLICAN PRESIDENTIAL PRE-CANDIDATE DONALD TRUMP**

**Synopsis:**

U.S. Hispanics are still getting to know most of the Republican contenders for president. At this point in the campaign, less than half have formed an opinion of any Republican candidate except Donald Trump and Jeb Bush. Partly because of this, Hispanics' views of most GOP candidates range from mildly positive to mildly negative. The sole exception is Trump, whose favorable rating with Hispanics is deeply negative. Gallup began tracking the images of all the major announced candidates for president nightly in early July. Since then, 14% of the roughly 650 Hispanics interviewed have said they view Trump favorably, while 65% have viewed him unfavorably, yielding a net favorable score of -51. This separates Trump from

the next-most-unpopular Republicans among Hispanics -- Rick Perry (-7), Ted Cruz (-7) and Jim Gilmore (-6), who are viewed far less negatively. Bush presents the greatest contrast to Trump. Bush's average 34% favorable and 23% unfavorable ratings among Hispanics since July give him a +11 net favorable score -- the highest of any GOP candidate. The net favorable scores of Marco Rubio (+5), Carly Fiorina (+3), George Pataki (+3), Scott Walker (+2) and Ben Carson (+2) all tilt slightly positive, although none of these candidates is nearly as well-known among Hispanics as Trump and Bush. In terms of familiarity, only Trump and Bush are recognized by a majority of Hispanics. Eight in 10 have formed an opinion of Trump and about six in 10 of Bush. Familiarity dwindles to roughly 40% for Rubio and Cruz, both Cuban-Americans, as well as for Perry and Chris Christie, but drops well below that for all the others. Trump's Image Among Hispanics as Negative in August as in July Trump blasted Mexico in his June announcement speech, charging the United States' neighbor to the south with intentionally sending criminals of various kinds over the border, and claiming that as president he would compel Mexico to pay for a border wall.

The adversarial relationship between Mr. Trump and the Spanish-language news media, which has simmered publicly since he announced his candidacy in June, boiled over on Tuesday at a news conference in Dubuque, Iowa, when the candidate erupted at Jorge Ramos, the main news anchor at Univision and Fusion, when he tried to ask a question without being called on. Mr. Trump signaled to one of his security guards, who removed Mr. Ramos from the event. And though cable news and the Sunday morning news shows have blanketed their political coverage with stories about many aspects of Mr. Trump's improbable campaign, the focus of Spanish-language news programs has been almost exclusively on Mr. Trump's controversial stance on immigration. About 58 percent of all mentions of Mr. Trump in mainstream news media - broadcast, cable, radio and online outlets - in the past month have focused on immigration, while on Spanish-language news programs, the proportion is almost 80 percent, according to an analysis by Two.42.Solutions, a nonpartisan media analytics company. The Spanish-language news media has also been more critical in its coverage of Mr. Trump's positions on the issue, with nearly all of it negative in tone.

**CALIFORNIANS FAVOR EXTENDING HEALTH CARE COVERAGE TO ALL RESIDENTS

**Synopsis:**

California voters are embracing the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in record numbers, and a growing majority now supports expanding health care coverage to undocumented residents, according to the latest Field Poll, released here in the Capitol August 26. The survey found that sixty-two percent of voters support the law, compared to 56% last year, while 33% oppose it. And while last year only a slight majority of voters (51%) favored the idea of extending health care coverage to undocumented Californians, this year 58 percent of voters approve, with the strongest support coming from Latinos, followed by African Americans and Asian Americans - findings that bode well for the Health for All bills sponsored by Sen. Ricardo Lara, D-Bell Gardens. Views about the ACA have consistently been partisan-based, and this year was no exception. Democrats back the law overwhelmingly (85 percent to 11 percent) while Republicans oppose it by 68 percent to 25 percent.

A new poll shows Joe Biden performing a little better than Hillary Clinton against the leading GOP candidates in a general election matchup, and his favorability is higher than that of any candidate -- Democrat or Republican. Quinnipiac University's national poll, released Thursday, finds that Clinton remains the Democratic frontrunner with 45 percent, but her lead over Bernie Sanders has slipped by 10 percentage points. Sanders has 22 percent, and Biden comes in third with 18 percent. On the Republican side, Donald Trump broadened his lead -- he's now at 28 percent, with Ben Carson trailing at 12 percent and Jeb Bush slipping back into a three-way tie for third with Ted Cruz and Marco Rubio (they each have 7 percent). But Trump is also the candidate with the highest percentage of GOP voters (26 percent) who say there's "no way" they would support him. Eleven percent of Democrats would say "no way" to Clinton.

This forum offers alternatives and fast-track options to achieve this. A Migration Policy Institute study estimates that as of 2006, there were 6.1 million immigrants 25 years old and older who have completed a Bachelors' degree or more. More than 1.3 million are now unemployed or work as taxi drivers, dish washers, security guards, and other jobs outside their fields. **BODY CAMS FOR LAPD**

After nearly two years of fundraising, testing and negotiating policy, Monday's rollout marks a significant moment for the police department's long-awaited body camera program. The city plans to purchase and deploy more than 7,000 devices in the coming months, making it the largest in the country to use the cameras on a wide scale. The first batch of cameras - 860 devices purchased with about \$1.5 million in private donations - will be given to officers within the next month, the LAPD's chief information officer told the Police Commission on Tuesday. Officers working the LAPD's Mission Division - which covers San Fernando Valley cities including Sylmar and Panorama City - will get their cameras on Monday, Maggie Goodrich told the commission. Officers assigned to South L.A.'s Newton Division will start using the cameras in mid-September, followed by those working specialized units, such as Central Division traffic and SWAT.

**CHRIS CHRISTIE'S IMMIGRATION PROPOSAL**

Chris Christie said Saturday that if elected president, he will track undocumented immigrants like FedEx packages. "I'm going to have Fred Smith, the founder of FedEx, come work for the government for three months. Just come for three months to Immigration and Customs Enforcement and show these people," the New Jersey governor said at a town hall event here. Christie added that while FedEx can track boxes, the U.S. can't track undocumented immigrants. "You go online and at any moment, FedEx can tell you where that package is," he said. "Yet we let people come into this country with visas, and the minute they come in, we lose track of them." Christie added, "We need to have a system that tracks you from the moment you come in and then when your time is up," he said. "However long your visa is, then we go get you and tap you on the shoulder and say, 'Excuse me, it's time to go.'" Smith is the father of Samantha

Smith, a Christie spokeswoman. Christie added that conversations about "anchor babies" make the Republican Party look unfairly hostile to immigrants. "The entire conversation about 'anchor babies' is a distraction that makes us sound like we're anti-immigrant, and we're not," he said. "Our party is not that way. We want people to do it legally. Do it the right way." Christie made it clear in an interview on "Fox News Sunday" that he was not equating people to packages.

Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders and businessman Donald Trump - the two biggest anti-establishment candidates in the Democratic and Republican presidential primary fields, respectively - have seen their support surge, according to a new survey of voters likely to participate in the Iowa caucuses. In the Des Moines Register/Bloomberg Politics poll, Sanders is now polling just seven points behind Democratic front runner Hillary Clinton, nearly doubling his share of the vote since the last survey was conducted in May. Sanders takes 30 percent support, while Clinton draws 37 percent, marking the first time she's dropped below 50 percent in the poll. Trump Talks, the Other GOP Candidates Listen 1:24 Trump, meanwhile, has seen a remarkable reversal in both his support and popularity in the state since May. Back then, he was polling at just 4 percent support and his favorability was at -36 points; now, he leads the pack with 23 percent support and his favorability is at +26 points. Retired neurosurgeon Ben Carson has also seen significant gains in the Hawkeye state, surging from 10 percent support in May to 18 percent now, and improving an already strong favorability rating of +41 points to +71 points.

Pope Francis participated in a virtual audience today with Americans from around the country during an event hosted exclusively with ABC News. The event was moderated from inside the Vatican by ABC News' "World News Tonight" anchor David Muir, as the pontiff engaged via satellite with individuals from three different groups: students at the Cristo Rey Jesuit High School in Chicago's inner city, congregants from a McAllen, Texas, church located near the U.S.-Mexico border and homeless men and women and those working with the homeless in Los Angeles. The event coincides with the pope's upcoming visit to the United States, scheduled for later this month, when Francis is expected to travel to Washington, D.C., New York City and Philadelphia from Sept. 22 to Sept. 27. The pope's U.S. trip includes a meeting with President Obama at the White House, an address in front of a joint-meeting of Congress, an address at the U.N. General Assembly in New York and a "multi-religious service" at the 9/11 Memorial and Museum. His trip will conclude in Philadelphia at the World Meeting of Families, a global event organized by the Catholic Church that focuses on strengthening family bonds. Event organizers expect up to two million people to attend the pope's closing mass.

**SAN ANTONIO POLICE KILL A HISPANIC MAN THEY SAY WAS ARMED**

A seemingly quiet northwest San Antonio, Texas neighborhood is now the scene of a possible case of abuse of authority. Last Friday a man recorded with his phone camera 2 agents from the Bexar County Sheriff's office mortally wounded Gilbert Flores (41 years old), he was shot when he appeared to have both arms raised. The incident took place as officers responded to a domestic disturbance call, but, the incident has gained scope and the FBI is now investigating to seek if there was excessive use or unjustified use of force. Michael Thomas, a man who recorded the incident with his camera phone says that he saw that the man put his hands in the air and they just shot him twice. Gilbert Flores' family has retained the services of a lawyer and there is talk of another video phone recording of what took place.

**ICE RAID IN LOS ANGELES, LOOKING FOR CRIMINAL UNDOCUMENTED IMMIGRANTS**

**Synopsis:**

U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers (ICE) arrested 244 immigrants from across the Southland, who have previous criminal records and pose a threat to public safety, during a four-day raid. All 244 immigrants taken into custody had criminal records, with 56 percent involved in felony convictions for serious or violent offenses such as weapons charges, drug violations and child sex crimes. The remaining 44 percent had previous convictions for significant or multiple misdemeanors, according to ICE. Four of those detained were previously removed from the states and are currently being prosecuted by the U.S. Attorney's office for felony re-entry after removal. Two of the men, a 46-year-old Guatemalan from Upland and a 50-year-old Salvadoran man from Sunland, were involved in child sex abuse cases. The Guatemalan man had served 10 years in prison for sexually abusing two children. The remaining immigrants who are not being criminally prosecuted are being processed for removal from the U.S. The immigrants came from 21 different countries including Mexico, Peru, Thailand, France and Ghana. The majority of those arrested, 99, were from Los Angeles County, with 55 coming from Orange County, 43 from San Bernardino County, 24 from Riverside County, 20 from Santa Barbara County, and three from San Luis Obispo County.

**ACLU FIGHTS U.S. FUNDING FOR LOS ANGELES POLICE BODY CAMERAS**

A civil rights group asked the U.S. government on Thursday to deny Los Angeles police the funding they sought for body cameras for patrol officers, objecting to a policy that would allow the police chief to withhold video footage from the public. The nearly 9,900-member Los Angeles Police Department is the nation's third-largest metropolitan police force and the biggest to commit to equipping all its patrol officers, numbering about 7,000, with so-called bodycams. City officials say the cameras will build public trust after a series of racially charged police shootings and other encounters sparked protests and unrest in the United States.

And so Davis consigned herself to jail, sparking a fresh round of legal wrangling and political calculation in the face of the most audacious display of defiance on the issue of same-sex marriage since the Supreme Court declared in June that gay couples had a constitutional right to wed. On one hand, Davis's situation is rare. For the most part, even the most ardent opponents of same-sex marriage have followed the law, with gay rights groups reporting that the vast majority of county officials across the country are issuing marriage licenses to all couples, gay and straight. But on the other hand, the prospect of a wife, mother and longtime public servant sitting in jail to defend her beliefs will probably inflame the debate over how to balance the rights of gays to marry with the ability of people of faith to freely exercise their religion.

**EMPLOYERS ARE GETTING AWAY WITH NOT PAYING FAIR SALARIES**

Elsa Castañeda used to clean aircrafts for a living, between planes, they had a free 1/2 hour to an hour that went unpaid, and also, extra accrued hours went unpaid. Taking into account that one of every 5 workers in Los Angeles works overtime, this adds up to thousands of dollars accumulated in their work lives. Elsa claims that in just one year she lost 7 thousand dollars, an amount that she could have spent in things for her family. Several cases have been won in favor of employees, but, a few companies use appeal times to close and reopen as new businesses that are hard to target. The LA County is working on laws that can be enforceable and can punish those employers that break them.

U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services have launched a Spanish-language myE-Verify, the free web-based service from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security used by over 600,000 employers to confirm the employment eligibility of people they hire. This gives U.S. workers and jobseekers a free and secure way to participate in the E-Verify process by accessing features such as the Employee Rights Toolkit and a place to lock their Social Security numbers to avoid identity theft. Those with an account will be able to see when their data was used in E-Verify. Elizabeth Ramirez is against E-verify because INS agents arrive at work places as results of tips and people stop working for fears that they may be arrested. Ivan Jimenez, cofounder of LVITAL NAILS says that all information by law is property of the government in order to enforce laws; anyone with the proper documents should know that it will be verified but the government. Some critics say the data makes easier for the feds to conduct silent raids, something preferred by those who wish to protect their identities. The new E-VERIFY system allows users to configure their personal accounts and blocked their social security number to avoid identity fraud. Since its inception last month, already 7,626 Spanish language E-verify accounts have been set up.

**SMOKING AND TYPE 2 DIABETES**

Smokers have a much greater risk for type 2 diabetes than those who never smoked, and the same is true for those routinely exposed to secondhand smoke, a new study suggests. But the Harvard researchers said this increased risk gradually drops over time once smokers kick the habit. Countless studies have linked smoking to serious health issues, including cancer, lung disease and heart disease. In conducting the study, the researchers investigated the link between smoking and diabetes. The study was only designed to find an association, and not a cause-and-effect relationship. The new analysis included 88 previous studies involving nearly 6 million people. The studies specifically examined the effects of smoking on the risk for type 2 diabetes. Compared with never smoking, current smoking increased the risk for the disease by 37 percent, according to the report published Sept. 18 in The Lancet Diabetes & Endocrinology. Former smokers were also at 14 percent greater risk for type 2 diabetes than those who never smoked, and people exposed to secondhand smoke on a regular basis had a 22 percent higher risk for the blood sugar disease, the findings showed.

**REPUBLICAN CARLY FIORINA RISES IN POLLS**

Meanwhile, support for Trump's candidacy - which stood at 32 percent in August - has slipped to 24 percent, the new poll shows. Marco Rubio, who appeared to score points on foreign policy during the debate, is fourth, at 11 percent - up from 3 percent in August. Rounding out the top 10 are former Florida Gov. Jeb Bush (9 percent), Texas Sen. Ted Cruz (6 percent), former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee (6 percent), Kentucky Sen. Rand Paul (4 percent), New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie at (3 percent) and Ohio Gov. John Kasich (2 percent). Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker, who was once leading the crowded GOP field, registered less than half a percentage point of support among Republican voters, the CNN/ORC poll found.

The U.S. Border Patrol arrested nearly 10,000 unaccompanied immigrant children and families caught illegally crossing the border with Mexico in August, a 52 percent jump from August 2014, according to statistics published by the agency Monday afternoon. Since the start of the fiscal year in October, border agents have arrested more than 35,000 children traveling alone and more than 34,500 people traveling as families, mostly mothers and children. The total number of arrests for the year is down nearly 50 percent compared with a year ago, but border agents have reported a jump in arrests since July. The Border Patrol reported arresting 6,424 unaccompanied immigrant children and families in August 2014, compared to 9,790 this year. The August increase comes a year after a surge of more than 68,000 unaccompanied children at the U.S.-Mexico border. Many were trying to escape violence in Honduras, El Salvador or Guatemala. For much of the year, the number of illegal border crossings by families and children has been far lower than last year, before increasing in July and August. It's unclear exactly what has led to the overall decrease in border arrests of families and children, but Mexico has stepped up enforcement along its southern border.

But there were gaps along sidewalks at the height of attendance Saturday night. Some people, however, remained on side streets and outside the security area. The pope is attending the World Meeting of Families festival Saturday, where he is meeting with families from the U.S., Australia, Ukraine, Jordan, Nigeria, and his homeland of Encuentros is the Spanish word for meetings or encounters. Catholic officials say the cross will be taken to dioceses across the country as a symbol of an ongoing national pastoral movement called Encuentro, which has spurred Hispanic ministry in the country.

HALF OF LATINOS UNAWARE THEY HAVE HIGH CHOLESTEROL

VO: 25 SEC.

Synopsis:

Nearly half of Latinos in the United States are unaware that they have high cholesterol, and less than a third receive any kind of cholesterol treatment, according to a new study in the Journal of the American Heart Association. Latinos are one of the fastest growing ethnic groups in the United States, with 52 million people. Yet, in contrast with other ethnic groups, their awareness and management of high cholesterol clearly lags, experts say. Consequently, they say educating Latinos on the importance of maintaining healthy cholesterol levels could significantly reduce heart disease in this country.

Researchers reviewed data from 16,415 Latinos, between 18 and 75 years of age, who participated in the Hispanic Community Health Study/Study of Latinos. They found that 49 percent of Latinos had no idea their cholesterol levels were high. Of those who were aware, only 29 percent received treatment. High cholesterol was more common among men than women, 44 percent versus 40 percent. Men also had lower rates of cholesterol treatment compared with women, 28 percent versus 30 percent.

The U.S. agency burglarized by suspected Chinese hackers has completed its long-awaited damage assessment and more than 22 million people inside and outside government likely had their personal information stolen, officials announced today. That number is more than five times larger than what the Office of Personnel Management announced a month ago when first acknowledging a major breach had occurred. At the time, OPM only disclosed that the personnel records of 4.2 million current and former federal employees had been compromised. Investigators ultimately determined that 19.7 million applicants for security clearances had their Social Security numbers and other personal information stolen and 1.8 million relatives and other associates also had information taken, according to OPM. That includes 3.6 million of the current and former government employees for a total of 22.1 million.

Gasoline prices have reached as high as \$5 a gallon in the region, and experts predict the daily double-digit increases that began last week could continue a few more days before retreating. Prices have risen 50 cents a gallon from a week ago in the Los Angeles-Long Beach region amid a shortage of refined petroleum, according to the Automobile Club of Southern California. The Tesoro Corp. plant in Carson, for instance, just reduced its refining capacity to perform maintenance. Statewide, the average price for a gallon of regular gas stood at \$3.72. The Auto Club put Monday's average price at \$4.05 in the L.A. area. That compares with an average of \$2.77 nationally.

**DOES SMOKING INCREASE SCHIZOPHRENIA RISK?**

Quitting smoking is just about one of the hardest things you can do, but new research suggests there may be yet another serious reason to consider it. The new study in The Lancet Psychiatry finds a link between smoking and the development of schizophrenia. Whether the link is causal or not remains to be seen, but the authors suggest that it may well be, given how nicotine is known to affect the brain. More studies may be necessary to understand the link fully, but in the meantime, smoking has enough marks against that it probably doesn't even need another as evidence that it's bad. The link between smoking and schizophrenia isn't exactly news: Researchers have known about it for a long time, but mostly chalked it up to self-medication - that is, people with schizophrenia are simply self-medicating their symptoms, which may be stressful and disturbing to experience. It certainly makes sense. But the authors of the new study, from Kings College London, carried out a meta-analysis to see whether there might be more going on - like a link in which smoking may actually increase the odds that schizophrenia will develop in the future.

Hello again two-dollar gas... analysts say drivers can expect to see a significant drop in gas pump prices this fall. The savings is due in part to a nuclear deal announced Tuesday between Iran and six major world powers, including the U-S. And when it came to extra cholesterol and sodium? Those eating at restaurants actually fared worse than their fast-food eating counterparts. **I-10 AT WASHED OUT BRIDGE IN CALIFORNIA TO REOPEN FRIDAY**

The main route connecting Los Angeles and Phoenix, which was closed when a surge of floodwater damaged several bridges spanning small desert gullies, is set to partially reopen Friday -- far sooner than officials first estimated. The California Department of Transportation had expected repairs on Interstate 10 to take weeks but announced Tuesday that it will be able to handle traffic again less than a week after the spans were damaged. Travelers will still face delays, however, because just one lane will be open in each direction where one bridge collapsed. The hardest hit bridges were over Tex Wash, a normally dry gully that filled with rainfall Sunday amid the kind of sudden, intense storm that can happen in the desert. That fast-moving water severely eroded soil under the concrete that anchors one side of the interstate's westbound span, making it unsafe. The eastbound span fared worse, buckling onto the desert floor. One driver was seriously injured when his truck partly fell off the roadbed toward the raging water below.

## **RESEARCHERS FIND THAT FATHERHOOD MAKES MEN GAIN WEIGHT**

New research has found that men gain weight when they become fathers for the first time, even if they don't live with their children. In a study published in the American Journal of Men's Health, Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine researchers reported the typical 6-foot-tall man who lives with his children gained an average of 4.4 pounds after becoming a first-time dad. Even first-time dads who did not live with their children were found to have gained about 3.3 pounds. The results also showed an increase in body mass index (BMI) of 2.6 percent for fathers who lived with their children, and an increase of 2 percent for non-resident fathers. However, the average 6-foot-tall man who did not have children was found to have lost about 1.4 pounds. Fatherhood may have even worse effects on the health of young men, Dr. Craig Garfield, an associate professor of pediatrics and of medical social sciences at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, and attending pediatrician at Ann & Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago, said in a news release.

## **AFTER 2 DEATHS, IKEA WARNS OF RISKS WITH 27M DRESSERS**

A year after Ikea chests tipped over and fatally injured two boys, the Swedish furniture giant and safety regulators say consumers should keep the furniture -- 27 million chests and dressers -- away from children unless the products are mounted to a wall. Ikea is offering a free kit to help consumers affix the furniture to a wall. The kit will be available to people who bought chests and dressers above specific heights, including 7 million of Ikea's Malm chests. "They are unstable when built and used without a wall anchoring device," said CPSC spokesman Scott Wolfson. Neither the company nor the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission described the move as a recall, but an offer to repair or replace a product is technically a recall. The CPSC said it could not find a record of any furniture recalls this size. Ikea and the CPSC say two boys, both around two years old, were killed in 2014 after Malm chests that had not been secured to walls tipped over and fell on them. The agency and Ikea say they have received 14 reports of Malm chests tipping over, resulting in four injuries. Ikea is aware of three other deaths were reported from other models of chests and drawers that tipped over. Those deaths were described as happening since 1989.

## **62 ILLNESSES IN MULTISTATE SALMONELLA OUTBREAK LINKED TO RAW TUNA**

A salmonella outbreak in 11 states is linked to raw tuna in sushi. Now there's a recall of that tuna -- as authorities investigate the illnesses. The centers for disease control and prevention says at least 62 cases of salmonella are linked to raw tuna. This is file video of yellow-fin tuna, similar to the variety affected by the recall. **FIAT CHRYSLER WILL PAY A \$105 MILLION FINE**

Fiat Chrysler has been hit with a record \$105 million fine for the way that it handled a car recall affecting millions of vehicles. The Italian car maker has signed an agreement with the US National Highway Traffic Safety Administration agreeing to buy back hundreds of thousands of vehicles, including more than one million Jeeps, whose owners can trade their cars in or get them repaired. The unprecedented deal is unprecedented is accompanied by an agreement to allow an independent monitor to audit Fiat's recall over the next three years. The Fiat fine sets a record for the NHTSA, eclipsing the previous record of \$70 million imposed against Honda in January for failing to report death and injury.

**SURGICAL ROBOTS LINKED TO HUNDREDS OF DEATHS**

A study into the safety of surgical robots has linked the machines' use to at least 144 deaths and more than 1,000 injuries over a 14-year period in the US. The events included broken instruments falling into patients' bodies, electrical sparks causing tissue burns and system errors making surgery take longer than planned. The report notes that the figures represent a small proportion of the total number of robotic procedures. The work was carried out by researchers at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Chicago's Rush University Medical Center.

**WALMART ANNOUNCES INFANT CAR SEAT DESIGNED TO PREVENT HOT CAR DEATHS**

Walmart and Evenflo announced this week a new infant car seat with technology designed to remind drivers of their backseat passengers, and stop children from dying in hot cars. In most new cars, an alert sounds if a driver or passenger is not wearing a seat belt or if headlights are left on. Using a similar idea, a sensor on the infant seat harness triggers a series of tones if a child is still buckled in when the ignition is switched off. The feature is meant to remind drivers who might forget that a child is in the vehicle. On average, 38 children die every year as a result of being trapped in hot cars. In about half the cases, children are forgotten in the back seat, according to the nonprofit KidsAndCars.org. Often, a parent has forgotten to drop a child off at daycare. The Evenflo Advanced Embrace with Sensor Safe infant car seat retails for about \$150, which is comparable to other popular infant car seats on the market. It has a wireless receiver that plugs into a car's on-board diagnostic port and syncs with the chest clip that goes around the baby. It does not require the use of Bluetooth, cellular or other devices, the companies said.

Asking them what advice they received about breastfeeding, immunizations, pacifier use and putting their baby to sleep. Doctors were the most common source of advice. What the researchers found -- one in five women didn't recall receiving any advice on breastfeeding? And more than half reported no advice on pacifier use. Even more concerning -- more than one in four women said they got advice on where and how to put their babies to sleep that went against current guidelines. A reminder for new parents might be that when you're looking for advice, go to trusted medical professionals. But seek a second opinion if you are still unsure.

**FORD F-150 CRASH TESTS GET MIXED RESULTS**

**LAWSUIT ACCUSES CVS OF OVERCHARGING FOR GENERIC DRUGS**

CVS Health Corp. deliberately overcharged some pharmacy customers for generic drugs by submitting claims to their insurance companies at inflated prices, according to a lawsuit filed Thursday in federal court in San Francisco. The suit says those inflated prices led to higher co-pays for customers that exceeded what they would have paid for the drugs if they had no insurance and participated in a CVS discount program. "We've seen people who pay \$20 for a 30-day supply as their copayments on a drug that was \$11.99 for a 90-day supply had they been in the (discount program)," said Kristen Broz, an attorney with Hausfeld, the firm that filed the suit. The lawsuit seeks class-action status, a court order

prohibiting CVS from engaging in the behavior, and unspecified damages. Broz estimated that hundreds of thousands of people may have been affected since 2008.

## **AMERICANS CUTTING CALORIES, BUT NOT EATING HEALTHY**

It turns out Americans have been cutting calories, but are still far from eating healthy. A recent study found that in 2010, the average adult ate nearly 100 fewer calories a day than seven years before, in 2003. Decreases in the consumption of sugary drinks and Trans fats have played a large part in the calorie decline. Despite the decrease in calories, there has \*not\* been a real increase in healthy eating. Americans are still eating too much fast food and foods with added sugar -- and not enough fruits and vegetables.

### **STUDY: THE KINDS OF FRIENDSHIPS YOU HAVE IN YOUR 20S AND 30S PREDICTS YOUR WELL-BEING LATER IN LIFE**

**VO: 38**

A new study shows that when it comes to friendship, it's quantity over quality that matters in your 20s-and vice versa in your 30s. That pattern turns out to be a predictor of psychological well-being later in life, and it happens to be one that comes relatively naturally to many of us. "Earlier on in life, we're more interested in exploring and acquiring as much information and knowledge about the world as we can. We do that in part by socializing with an array of people," says Paul Duberstein, a psychiatry professor at the University of Rochester in New York. "As we reorient our goals and move into our 30s, we begin to clip the wings of our social network. The amount of people and the effort we spend on people in the network are more concentrated and of higher quality." The effects of this shift are documented in a study co-authored by Duberstein and published in *Psychology and Aging* in March. The study spanned 30 years and followed about 100 University of Rochester students from the 1970s. At 20 and 30, the participants were asked to record their daily interactions with others, and to score them on intimacy and unpleasantness. Decades later, the subjects answered questions about their psychological well-being, including loneliness and depression, and the quality of their friendships. The researchers found that the quantity of friends at 20 predicted well-being in midlife, while at age 30 it was quality that was a better predictor.

### **KRAFT SINGLES CHEESE RECALLED**

The Kraft Heinz company is recalling 36-thousand cases of individually-wrapped cheese singles because they may present a choking hazard. The voluntary recall involves the three pound and four pound boxes of Kraft singles American and white American pasteurized cheese. The affected products have a 'best when used by' date of between December 29, 2015 and January 4, 2016. Followed by the manufacturing codes "s54" or "s55." Kraft says a thin strip of the packaging film could remain adhered to the cheese slice even after the wrapper has been removed. The company said it has received at least ten complaints about the packaging, including three reports of choking.

### **STUDY-A CHILD'S PICKY EATING MAY BE SIGN OF DEEPER ISSUE**

Picky eating in children is often considered a phase. But when picky eating turns into selective eating it could lead to deeper issues. A study conducted by Duke University Center for Eating Disorders found that selective eaters are more likely to show symptoms of depression and social anxiety. The eating habits of more than 9-hundred children were evaluated, 20-percent of the children scored as picky eaters. Those children ate only a small variety of foods and had trouble eating with others. 3-percent of the children fell into the severe selective eaters category. Those children were twice as likely to show symptoms of depression or social anxiety. Researchers say the study shouldn't alarm parents and that picky or selective eating isn't a medical condition. Instead they say the information should help parents and doctors identify and address symptoms early surrounding children and food.

### **EATING SPICY FOOD LINKED TO LONGER LIFE, STUDY SUGGESTS**

Spices have long been used to enhance food flavor. But aside from the color and aroma, a recent study published in BMJ journal suggests that those who eat spicy food will most likely live longer. The team led by researchers at the Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences examined dietary data from nearly 490,000 people, aged 30 to 79, in China who participated in the China Kadoorie Biobank study between 2004 and 2008. Aside from controlling variables such as family medical history, age, education, diabetes, smoking habits among others, the participants were consistently asked about how often they are hot spicy food and the major source of the spices usually used. The study concluded that those who consume spicy food one or two days a week were at a 10 percent reduced risk of death. It also added that if you eat more than two days a week, the risk of death is also lowered. Further analysis also showed that fresh and dried chili peppers were the most commonly used spices. According to the study, there are no definite explanations about cause and effect, but the finding might be because of the active ingredient found in fresh chili called capsaicin.

People with diabetes know it's important to stay vigilant about their health and constantly monitor their food intake and exercise. This is something that Greg Mader has done most of his life check his blood sugar levels. Diabetics have to test those levels frequently with a glucose meter to make sure they are not too high or too low. Based on the readings, they can make adjustments with medication. To measure glucose, diabetics put a drop of blood on a testing strip and insert it into a glucose meter that reads the sugar levels in that blood. But if those strips have been compromised, the reading could be off. Recommends patients consistently use a control solution- that is basically a measured amount of sugar water. You put the solution on the strip where you would put your drop of blood and then into the meter. If the meter reading does not match the number on your control solution bottle, you know you have a problem.

#### **GAS PRICES DOWN 11 CENTS IN TWO WEEKS**

#### **THE CONSEQUENCES FOR KIDS WHEN THEIR PARENTS WORK IRREGULAR NIGHT SHIFTS**

**Synopsis:**

Having a regular schedule matters - especially when it comes to young people of all ages. According to a new research brief from the nonprofit Economic Policy Institute, children of parents working non-standard and unpredictable schedules are more likely to have decreased cognitive and behavioral outcomes. Who is more commonly affected? Blacks, less-educated parents, and young low-income single moms. What are some of the negative outcomes? The brief says that toddlers whose mothers work non-standard hours, for example, have worse sensory perception, learning, problem solving, and verbal communication, while 13- and 14-year-olds whose parents work at night are more likely to be depressed and to engage in risky behavior, such as smoking and drinking, than kids whose parents are at home at night. The brief, titled "Parents' Non-Standard Work Schedules Make Adequate Childrearing Difficult: Reforming Labor Market Practices Can Improve Children's Cognitive and Behavioral Outcomes," was written by Leila Morsy, a lecturer at the University of New South Wales by Morsy and Rothstein that examines social class characteristics that hinder children's cognitive and behavioral development and provides policy recommendations to address these characteristics. Morsy and Rothstein make some recommendations for policy changes in the brief, including that businesses compensate workers who have irregular schedules.

#### **AIR CONTROLLER STUDY SHOWS CHRONIC FATIGUE**

**Synopsis:**

A study the government kept secret for years says that air traffic controllers' work schedules often lead to chronic fatigue, making them less alert and endangering the safety of the national air traffic system. Federal Aviation Administration officials posted the study online Monday, hours after. The Associated Press reported the findings -- and noted that agency officials had declined to furnish a copy despite repeated requests over the past three months, including a Freedom of Information Act filing. The report FAA posted online was dated December 2012, although the findings appear to be nearly identical to the draft. The impetus for the study was a recommendation by the National Transportation Safety Board to the FAA and the National Air Traffic Controllers Association to revise controller schedules to provide rest periods that are long enough "to obtain sufficient restorative sleep." The study found that nearly 2 in 10 controllers had committed significant errors in the previous year -- such as bringing planes too close together -- and over half attributed the errors to fatigue. A third of controllers said they perceived fatigue to be a "high" or "extreme" safety risk.

#### **DEATH TOLL FROM LEGIONNAIRES' DISEASE UP TO 12**

**Synopsis:**

The reported number of deaths from the largest outbreak of Legionnaires' disease in New York City has increased from 10 to 12, NYC Mayor Bill de Blasio said during a press conference Monday. The total number of Legionnaires' cases is now 113, up from 101 on Friday. Of those patients who have been hospitalized, 76 had been discharged as of Monday afternoon. De Blasio confirmed that the bacteria had also been found in an additional two cooling towers in the neighborhood, and officials said a total of 12 of 39 cooling towers in the South Bronx had been impacted. Those cooling towers, which are used to cool down large air conditioning units, have been disinfected or would be by the end of the day Monday, the mayor said.

**BILL TO REMOVE THE TERM 'ALIEN' FROM CALIFORNIA LABOR CODE**

**Synopsis:**

Gov. Jerry Brown signed a trio of immigration-related measures Monday, including one removing the word "alien" from California's labor code because it is seen as a disparaging term for those not born in the United States. Brown also signed into law legislation allowing noncitizens in high school to serve as election poll workers and protecting the rights of immigrant minors in civil lawsuits. The bill banning "alien" is needed to modernize state labor law, in the same way many newspapers have stopped using the term "illegal alien," said state Sen. Tony Mendoza (D-Artesia), author of the bill. A 2013 Pew Research Center survey of media organizations found that the use of the term "illegal alien" declined to 5% of the terms used that year, down from 21% usage six years earlier.

**MIGRANTS CROSSING INTO U.S. FROM MEXICO SURGE AGAIN**

The Rio Grande Valley area, in Texas, has seen an uptick in the number of people - notably fathers - crossing the border, according to a local relief group and federal officials. Border agents are arresting hundreds more than usual, with as many as 750 detained in a single day recently, the Monitor of McAllen quoted a Border Patrol official as saying. Border Patrol spokesman Omar Zamora said the rise is not as dramatic as the daily arrests that rose to 1,500 last year. But at least one local relief group is feeling the strain of more immigrants seeking help in the last month. But an immigrant relief center that Catholic Charities of the Rio Grande Valley opened about a year ago is reporting seeing a tripling of immigrants coming to it in the last month.

**REPORT: AMERICA'S UNINSURED RATE FALLS BELOW 10%**

America's uninsured rate fell below 10 percent for the first time in decades, according to a new report by the Centers for Disease Control's National Center for Health Statistics. **STRESSED OUT PARENTS: 'NEVER AGAIN'**

If they're being honest, most mothers will tell you that no matter how badly you want a child, the transition to parenthood is hard. Really hard. According to a recent study, the drop in happiness experienced by parents after the birth of first child was larger than the experience of unemployment, divorce or the death of a partner. The ickiness you feel in pregnancy as your body becomes alien to you. The childbirth, and the healing after. The breastfeeding struggles -- oh, the struggles and the tears. The isolation of being home alone all day with a crying infant while your partner is at work. At least, that's what it was like for me, when my first child was born in 2011. A new study suggests when people experience early parenthood -- pregnancy, childbirth and the baby days -- as particularly stressful, they are less likely to want to do it again. The study by the Max Planck Institute for Demographic Research in Rostock, Germany, found "the larger the loss in well-being, the smaller the probability of a second baby." The effect is especially strong for highly-educated parents and those who waited longer to have a second child. That might sound obvious, but it has policy implications for countries with low birth rates, the authors suggest.

**LOW LIBIDO? FDA WEIGHS DRUG FOR WOMEN THAT DRIVES DESIRE**

The Food and Drug Administration will decide the fate of a drug to treat low libido in women by Tuesday. Depending on your point of view, the "little pink pill," flibanserin - popularly but incorrectly dubbed the "female Viagra" - is either the answer to a woman's prayers or a risky drug that turns a normal condition into a medical problem that only pharmaceuticals can solve. It will be FDA's third consideration of flibanserin in five years. The agency has rejected the drug twice since 2010. This time around, the drug is benefiting from a major public relations push from an advocacy group, Even the Score, which is supported by flibanserin's manufacturer, Sprout Pharmaceuticals of Raleigh, N.C. High-profile supporters include the National Organization for Women and 11 members of Congress who wrote to the FDA on flibanserin's behalf. Dozens of women filled FDA hearing rooms at meetings over the past year, testifying about the anguish and marital turmoil caused by their loss of sex drive. Sprout's CEO, Cindy Whitehead, has acknowledged that her company paid for many of the women's travel expenses. "It's important to put the patient voice at the center of the discussion," Whitehead said in an interview.

**FDA APPROVES FIRST PILL AIMED AT BOOSTING FEMALE LIBIDO

The Food and Drug Administration has approved the first prescription drug designed to boost sexual desire in women, a milestone long sought by a pharmaceutical industry eager to replicate the blockbuster success of impotence drugs for men. But stringent safety measures on the daily pill called Addyi mean it will probably never achieve the sales of Viagra, which has generated billions of dollars since the late 1990s. The drug's label will bear a boxed warning -- the most serious type -- alerting doctors and patients to the risks of dangerously low blood pressure and fainting, especially when the pill is combined with alcohol. The same problems can occur when taking the drug with other commonly prescribed medications, including antifungals used to treat yeast infections. "Patients and prescribers should fully understand the risks associated with the use of Addyi before considering treatment," said Dr. Janet Woodcock, director of the FDA's drug center, in a statement announcing the approval Tuesday. Under an FDA-imposed safety plan, doctors will only be able to prescribe Addyi after completing an online certification process that requires counseling patients about Addyi's risks. Pharmacists will also need certification and will be required to remind patients not to drink alcohol while taking the drug. Opponents of the drug say it's not worth the side effects, which also include nausea, drowsiness and dizziness. They point out that the FDA rejected the drug twice, in 2010 and 2013, due to these risks.

## **WOMEN WITH VERY EARLY STAGE 'BREAST CANCERS' MAY NOT NEED TREATMENT ACCORDING TO A NEW STUDY**

Australian women with very early stage "breast cancers" are being given potentially unnecessary invasive treatment that may not decrease their risk of dying from the disease, a groundbreaking international study indicates. The research has the potential to revolutionise mammogram screening programs across the world and breast cancer treatment - and even to change the very definition of what we call cancer, when it comes to the breast. The study of more than 100,000 women, published in the prestigious JAMA Oncology journal, represents the most extensive data collection ever of the early-stage cancers, known as ductal carcinoma in situ, or DCIS. It followed the women for more than 20 years, finding those who develop DCIS have only a very small chance of actually dying from breast cancer, and treatment may not make a difference to their outcomes. Cancer Council Australia medical adviser and breast cancer expert Susan Fraser said the research was likely to change medical practice in the near future - with women treated for DCIS based on their own set of risk factors, not just the fact abnormal cells were found. In DCIS, abnormal cells are found only within the milk duct, and no cancer is seen anywhere else in the breast. "It looks like DCIS is not just one disease, it's a group of diseases," Dr Fraser said. "We will have to start looking at things like the grade and the size, whether it is oestrogen positive or negative, if it's in a very young person or a much older person and if it is very small. "It will take a while to change medical practice but I think women will have to ask the questions about what the pathology is, and what the evidence is for treatment."

## **POLICE TRACK CELLPHONES**

**Synopsis:**

The crime itself was ordinary: Someone smashed the back window of a parked car one evening and ran off with a cellphone. What was unusual was how the police hunted the thief. Detectives did it by secretly using one of the government's most powerful phone surveillance tools - capable of intercepting data from hundreds of people's cellphones at a time - to track the phone, and with it their suspect, to the doorway of a public housing complex. They used it to search for a car thief, too. And a woman who made a string of harassing phone calls. In one case after another, the police in Baltimore and other cities used the phone tracker, commonly known as a stingray, to locate the perpetrators of routine street crimes and frequently concealed that fact from the suspects, their lawyers and even judges. In the process, they quietly transformed a form of surveillance billed as a tool to hunt terrorists and kidnapers into a staple of everyday policing. The suitcase-size tracking systems, which can cost as much as \$400,000, allow the police to pinpoint a phone's location within a few yards by posing as a cell tower. In the process, they can intercept information from the phones of nearly everyone else who happens to be nearby, including innocent bystanders. They do not intercept the content of any communications.

## **SECOND CANCERS ARE ON THE RISE IN THE US**

**Synopsis:**

Second cancers are on the rise. Nearly 1 in 5 new cases in the U.S. now involves someone who has had the disease before. When doctors talk about second cancers, they mean a different tissue type or a different site, not a recurrence or spread of the original tumor. About 19 percent of cancers in the United States now are second-or-more cases, a recent study found. In the 1970s, it was only 9 percent. Over that period, the number of first cancers rose 70 percent while the number of second cancers rose 300 percent. Strange as it may sound, this is partly a success story: More people are surviving cancer and living long enough to get it again, because the risk of cancer rises with age. Second cancers also can arise from the same gene mutations or risk factors, such as smoking, that spurred the first one. And some of the very

treatments that help people survive their first cancer, such as radiation, can raise the risk of a new cancer forming later in life, although treatments have greatly improved in recent years to minimize this problem. Psychologically, a second cancer often is more traumatizing than the first.

**APPLE IPHONES RECALL**

**Synopsis:**

The company's website says the issue applies mostly to phones sold between September 2014, when they were released for sale, and January 2015. Apple (AAPL, Tech30) said these phones may have a defective component in the camera and will take fuzzy pictures. The issue is with the iSight camera on the back of the iPhone 6 Plus -- and not the "selfie" camera -- according to the company. Apple said it will replace the cameras for free. Affected customers can go to an authorized service provider, any Apple store, or contact technical support to set up a swap. The company noted wireless carriers are not able to fix the issue. Owners can check if their phone is included in the recall by entering a serial number on this website. Serial numbers can be found under "Settings > General > About" on an iPhone. It's also on the device's original box and can be looked up on iTunes. Issues have been reported with the phones since last fall. One thread about the problem on Apple's support site has more than 100 replies reporting issues with focusing the iPhone 6 Plus camera.

**SURVEY: RECALLS MAKE AMERICANS LESS SATISFIED WITH CARS**

Americans are less happy with their cars and trucks than at any time in more than a decade, and it's largely because they're getting sick of dealing with recalls. The 2015 American Consumer Satisfaction Index, an annual survey that involved 4,300 consumers, found that satisfaction with automobiles dropped for the third straight year to the lowest level since 2004. High new-car prices also were a factor. "While it is true that all cars are now much better than they were 10 to 20 years ago, it is alarming that so many of them have quality problems," said Claes Fornell, chairman and founder of the survey. Last year automakers recalled a record 64 million vehicles for problems such as exploding air bags and ignition switches that can unexpectedly cause engines to stall. The problems can be deadly. So far General Motors has agreed to compensate families of 124 people who died in crashes caused by the faulty switches. Eight more people have died worldwide after being cut by shrapnel from exploding Takata air bag inflators. Rising prices also contributed to the consumer frustration. Car prices are up 11 percent since 2010 and hit records all year, rising to an average \$32,932 in July, according to the Edmunds.com auto website.

**WALMART TO STOP SELLING AR-15S AND SIMILAR WEAPONS**

Wal-Mart will stop selling the AR-15 rifle and other semi-automatic weapons at its stores because fewer people are buying them, a spokesman said Wednesday. The AR-15 rifles and other modern sporting rifles were being sold at less than a third of the company's 4,600 U.S. stores. Company spokesman Kory Lundberg said Wal-Mart Stores Inc. will remove the remaining inventory as stores transition from summer to fall merchandise, which should take a week or two to complete. Lundberg said the decision to remove the weapons was not political and that the Bentonville, Arkansas-based retailer made the decision earlier this year. "It's similar to what we do with any product. Being what it is, it gets a little more attention, but it's the same process for any other product," Lundberg said. Lundberg said the company had seen a decrease in sales of the particular models of guns, but declined to give specific sales numbers. He said stores would increase inventory of other models of shotguns and rifles popular among hunters.

**SLEEP RAISES RISK OF GETTING SICK**

How much sleep are you getting? If it's not at least six hours a night, the sniffles could be around the corner. A new study in this week's journal 'sleep' finds your likelihood to catch a cold goes up if you're getting less than six hours of sack time. In fact, you're four to five times more susceptible to falling prey to the virus. The study's lead researcher says not enough sleep can impact our immune systems in a variety of ways. On top of that, mental alertness, driving ability and higher risk of heart attack - can come from lack of sleep.

**STUDY: ALZHEIMER OBESITY**

One more reason to watch the waistline: New research says people's weight in middle age may influence not just whether they go on to develop Alzheimer's disease, but when. Obesity in midlife has long been suspected of increasing the risk of Alzheimer's. Researchers at the National Institutes of Health took a closer look and reported Tuesday that being overweight or obese at age 50 may affect the age, years later, when Alzheimer's strikes. Among those who eventually got sick, more midlife pounds meant an earlier onset of disease. It will take larger studies to prove if the flip side is true -- that keeping trim during middle age might stall later-in-life Alzheimer's.

**FROZEN CORN RECALL**

More than nine-thousand cases of frozen corn are being recalled due to listeria fears. Bonduelle U-S-A issued the recall after one of its products tested positive for the bacteria in Tennessee. **JOHNSONVILLE PORK SAUSAGE RECALLED OVER POSSIBLE CONTAMINATION

**Synopsis:**

Kenosha Beef International, the maker of Johnsonville sausages, is recalling more than 89,000 pounds of pork sausage patty products because they may be contaminated with extraneous materials, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service said Thursday. The Kenosha-based company is recalling 24-ounce cartons and 13.5-pound cases of Johnsonville Grillers, cheddar cheese and bacon flavor. Consumers have found small pieces of metal in the products. The recall was classified as Class I, meaning there is a reasonable probability that consuming the product could cause serious, adverse health consequences or death. There have been no reports of oral injury, adverse reactions or illness, the federal agency said. The products being recalled are marked EST.425B and expire by Dec. 29. They were shipped to retail locations in Arkansas, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio, Illinois, Iowa, Texas and Wisconsin.

**KRAFT CHEESE RECALL

**Synopsis:**

Kraft Heinz is expanding a recall of Kraft Singles products, saying a problem with the packaging film affects 10 times as many cases as it first thought. The company recalled 335,000 cases Thursday because a thin strip of packaging film may stick to the slice after the wrapper has been taken off, creating a choking hazard. Kraft Heinz took 36,000 cases off the market July 31 for the same reason. The privately-held company said it's received two new reports of customers choking. It disclosed three such reports in July. The recall covers 1-, 3- and 4-pound Kraft Singles American and White American cheese product sold in the U.S., Puerto Rico, and 10 other countries and territories. The cases have "Best When Used by Dates" from Dec. 29 through Jan. 4.

**ALLEGED TSA GROPING

**Synopsis:**

Newly-released video shows the alleged groping by a former TSA screener that led to a scandal at Denver International Airport. Airport security camera captured the controversial footage of the pat-downs. The video of the morning of Feb. 9 shows former TSA workers Ty Spicha, 27, patting down travelers the Colorado airport, while Yasmeen Shafi, 22, operated the scanner. According to one TSA employee who reported the pair, Shafi would manipulate the scanning machine to identify males Spicha found attractive as female. That would trigger the machine to detect an anomaly in the passenger's genital area and permit Spicha to perform a pat-down. Three months after that tip, the TSA began an investigation and eventually fired the pair.

## **PRESIDENT OBAMA OBSERVES LABOR DAY, EXTENDS CONTRACTORS' PAID LEAVE**

Showing solidarity with workers on Labor Day, President Barack Obama will sign an executive order Monday requiring paid sick leave for employees of federal contractors, including 300,000 who currently receive none. The White House wouldn't specify the cost to federal contractors to implement the executive order, which Obama was to address at a major union rally and breakfast in Boston. The Labor Department said any costs would be offset by savings that contractors would see as a result of lower attrition rates and increased worker loyalty, but produced nothing to back that up. Under the executive order, employees working on federal contracts gain the right to a minimum of one hour of paid leave for every 30 hours they work. Stretched out over 12 months, that's up to seven days per year. The order will allow employees to use the leave to care for sick relatives as well, and will affect contracts starting in 2017 -- just as Obama leaves office. The Obama administration has been working on the executive order for months, and chose Labor Day to announce it as Obama works to enact what policies he can before his presidency ends despite resistance in Congress to laws he's proposed to improve workplace conditions. That push has reverberated in the 2016 campaign, where Democratic candidates are seeking to draw a distinction with Republicans on who's most supportive of the middle class.

## **3 LOUISIANA SALMONELLA CASES MAY BE IN 27-STATE OUTBREAK**

Three cases of salmonella in Louisiana may be part of the outbreak that sickened 285 people in 27 states, killing a 99-year-old California woman, according to the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals. The Louisiana cases were in the Baton Rouge area, the northeast and the northwest, according to a news release Saturday. The outbreak also included one or two cases in Mississippi, 60 in Arizona and 51 in California as of Thursday, according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention website. Andrew & Williamson Fresh Produce of San Diego made a voluntary recall Friday of "Limited Edition" brand cucumbers, which are produced in Mexico. Louisiana's health department received notification Friday night and began calling national companies with Louisiana outlets that might have sold or used the cucumbers, spokeswoman Ashley Lewis wrote. The agency said Red Lobster restaurants in Louisiana disposed of the cucumbers Friday. Whole Foods also was on the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's recall list of chains which had bought the cucumbers, and managers at the Baton Rouge store told state sanitarians Saturday that they had stocked and were getting rid of the vegetables, said Olivia Watkins, also a spokeswoman for the Department of Health and Hospitals.

## **MORE KIDS KEPT SAFE FROM HOUSEHOLD MEDICINES, ER TREND SAYS**

New research suggests parents are doing a better job of keeping household medicines out of the hands of young children. Emergency room visits by children who swallowed medicine while unsupervised have declined substantially, reversing an earlier trend, the

study found. By contrast, ER visits for bad reactions from medicines meant for kids and given by parents increased during the same time. Here are five things to know about the study, published Monday in Pediatrics. Researchers from the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention analyzed nationally representative data for 2004 through 2013 from a government surveillance system involving emergency room visits for bad drug reactions in kids aged 6 or younger. During those 10 years, there were about 640,000 ER visits involving young children who'd swallowed medicine they'd found around the house, and slightly fewer visits -- about 623,000 -- involving medicine intended for children and given by parents or other caregivers. ER visits for unsupervised medicine use increased from 54,140 in 2004 to almost 76,000 in 2010, but then fell each following year, to about 60,000 visits in 2013. Visits for parent-given medicine exposure climbed steadily throughout those years, from almost 47,000 to 70,400. In the unsupervised group, the most common prescription drugs involved were opioids including the anti-addiction drug buprenorphine and painkillers, along with sedatives and anti-anxiety medicines. Over-the-counter vitamins, alternative medicines and acetaminophen painkillers in pills or syrups were also commonly used.

**NY SODIUM ON MENUS**

Some sub sandwiches, movie theater pretzels and even milkshakes and salads will soon come with a first-of-its-kind salt warning symbol in New York City after officials agreed Wednesday to stake out new ground in a national push for healthier eating habits. The city Board of Health voted unanimously to require chain eateries to put salt-shaker emblems on menus to denote dishes with more than the recommended daily limit of 2,300 milligrams of sodium. That's about a teaspoon. Applauded by public health advocates but slammed as misguided by salt producers and restaurateurs, the plan is a first in the U.S. and furthers a series of novel nutritional efforts in the biggest city. "This really represents, to me, the next step in allowing usable information for our community to make better health decisions," health board member Dr. Deepthiman K. Gowda said. Members said they hoped the idea would spread to other locales and spur eateries to cut down on salt. The average American consumes about 3,400 mg of salt each day, most of it from processed and restaurant food, studies show. Overconsumption of

sodium raises the risk of high blood pressure and heart disease, the leading cause of death in the U.S.

**NEW POLL FAVORITES AMONG REPUBLICANS**

**Synopsis:**

Two non-politicians, businessman Donald Trump and retired neurosurgeon Ben Carson, dominate the contest for the Republican nomination, together accounting for more than half of the potential vote as support for traditional politicians continues to decline, according to a new Washington Post-ABC News poll. In the contest for the Democratic nomination, Hillary Rodham Clinton has lost significant ground over the past two months, as she has struggled to manage the controversy over her use of a private e-mail server while secretary of state. She still leads the field of Democrats, but for the first time her support has dropped below 50 percent in Post-ABC surveys, with the biggest decline coming among white women. Overall, the survey underscored the degree of dissatisfaction toward government and politics that is shaping the campaign. More than 7 in 10 Americans say people in politics cannot be trusted. The city of Seattle already announced plans to provide all-day care for up to 3,000 students beginning Monday. More than 20 local community centers will open with full supervision.

**ILLINOIS MANDATORY CIVIC'S CLASS TO GRADUATE**

**Synopsis:**

Picky eating among kids can be a challenge for parents, but because it's so common, it's often seen as a normal part of development. Yet a new study linking picky or selective eating to symptoms of psychological disorders such as anxiety and depression suggests it may be worth a closer look. To be clear, the "picky eating" explored in the study wasn't an aversion to Brussels sprouts or a short-lived preference for a particular food. Rather, it referred to broader and more persistent food aversions - the sort that lead parents to prepare special meals for kids, and in severe cases, make it hard to eat anywhere outside of home. The study, published in the journal Pediatrics, included 917 kids ages 2-5. Researchers from Duke University and Duke University School of Medicine assessed the kids' eating habits, psychiatric symptoms, functioning, and other variables through interviews with caregivers.

### **NEW YORK SMOKING RATE GOES BACK DOWN AFTER STARTLING RISE**

**VO: 28**

The ranks of smokers are dwindling after a surprising uptick in a city known for tough steps to discourage tobacco use, health officials said Wednesday. A 2014 Department of Health survey showed fewer than 900,000 adults smoked, down from more than 1 million the year before. The 13.9 percent smoking rate last year roughly equals an all-time low in 2010. "We have made strides in reducing the number of smokers in New York City" but have more work to do, Health Commissioner Dr. Mary Bassett said in a statement. Still, the drop is a relief to officials and public health advocates following the startling news that the rate had hit 16 percent in 2013. The city has since run somber new anti-smoking ads, and health officials say they believe the city's efforts generally have been working despite the 2013 upturn. Cigarette maker Altria Group Inc., which produces the top-selling Marlboro brand, declined to comment on the new smoking-rate statistics. R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., maker of brands including Camel, and cigarette retailers' group the National Association of Tobacco Outlets didn't immediately respond to requests for comment Wednesday evening.

### **MARINES SEEK TO CLOSE COMBAT JOBS TO WOMEN**

**VO: 32**

The Marine Corps is expected to ask that women not be allowed to compete for several front-line combat jobs, inflaming tensions between Navy and Marine leaders, U.S. officials say. The tentative decision has ignited a debate over whether Navy Secretary Ray Mabus can veto any Marine Corps proposal to prohibit women from serving in certain infantry and reconnaissance positions. And it puts Gen. Joseph Dunford, the Marine Corps commandant who takes over soon as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, at odds with the other three military services, who are expected to open all of their combat jobs to women. No final decisions have been made or forwarded to Pentagon leaders, but officials say Defense Secretary Ash Carter is aware of the dispute and intends to review the Marine plan. The Marine Corps is part of the Navy, so Mabus is secretary of both services. The ongoing divide has put Dunford in the spotlight as he prepares to start his new job next week. And it puts him in a somewhat awkward position of eventually having to review and pass judgment -- as chairman -- on a waiver request that he submitted himself while serving as Marine commandant.

### **HEALTHIER SCHOOL MEALS**

Congress is deciding whether it wants another pitched battle with first lady Michelle Obama and the administration over school lunches that put more whole grains in kids'

meals and cut salty foods. Last year, school food rules pitted Mrs. Obama against Republicans seeking full exemptions for some schools. The first lady declared that she'd fight "to the bitter end" to make sure kids have good nutrition. Lawmakers are now hoping to find bipartisan compromise on the rules and also dollars for the nation's child nutrition programs before the law expires Sept. 30. So far, however, negotiations have failed to produce a bill in either the House or the Senate. Lawmakers may not seek an immediate extension if the law expires. The school foods rules won't change unless Congress takes action, and the Agriculture Department says other programs would continue to operate as long as Congress passes a budget this fall. The school foods rules phased in since 2012 set fat, calorie, sugar, grain and sodium limits on foods in the lunch line and beyond. Schools have long been required to follow government nutrition rules if they accept federal reimbursements for free and reduced-price meals for low-income students, but the new standards are stricter.

**DESTROYING 162 MORE HOMES, FIRE RANKS AS FOURTH WORST IN CALIFORNIA HISTORY

One person died and 10 homes burned in a fire that started Saturday in California's Carmel Valley south of Monterey, fire officials said. Two nearby communities are under evacuation as the fire has burned 1,200 acres so far and is only 10% contained. **MYSTERY AMBULANCE RIDES**

Medicare paid \$30 million for ambulance rides for which no record exists that patients got medical care at their destination, the place where they were picked up or other critical information. The mystery ambulance rides are part of a bigger problem with Medicare payments for transporting patients, according to a federal audit being released Tuesday. The Department of Health and Human Services' inspector general's office also found that some urban ambulance services got paid for an average distance of more than 100 miles per ride. That contrasts with a national average of just 10 miles for urban ambulance rides. Four major metro areas seemed to be breeding grounds for ambulance schemes. Philadelphia, Los Angeles, New York and Houston accounted for about half of the questionable rides and payments. Medicare has barred new ambulance companies from joining the program in Houston and Philadelphia, and the report recommends a similar approach in certain other places. Across the country, 1 in 5 ambulance companies had at least some questionable billings. The audit involves medical claims dating to the first six months of 2012, but the inspector general's office said it believes the findings reflect continuing weaknesses in Medicare's efforts against fraud. A Medicare spokesman says the agency has taken action since the auditors privately shared their findings last year. Investigators went to great lengths to try to explain the \$30 million in mystery ambulance rides.

## **CALCIUM SUPPLEMENTS AREN'T DOING YOUR BONES ANY GOOD, STUDIES SAY**

Two new studies suggest a lack of evidence to support taking calcium for better bone health or to prevent fractures. Two new studies published Tuesday in the journal *The BMJ* add to growing skepticism over whether older adults should increase calcium via supplements in order to prevent osteoporosis and risk for bone fractures. For older adults, a daily intake of 1,000 to 1,200 mg of calcium has long been recommended. But the two papers, written by the same team of New Zealand researchers, find little evidence to support the recommendations. Recent concerns over calcium intake have emerged, suggesting that "small reductions in total fractures seem outweighed by the moderate risk of minor side effects," the study authors write. Those side effects can include constipation as well as more severe complications, like cardiovascular issues. "Collectively these results suggest that clinicians, advocacy organizations and health policymakers should not recommend increasing calcium intake for fracture prevention either with calcium supplements or through dietary source
