MIDWEST FLOODING

VO :24

The National Weather Service says the flooding in Missouri is going to get worse before it gets better. Parts of the Missouri, Platte and Grand Rivers may stay at flood stage until the weekend. Dozens of levees have been breached around the state since last weekend's drenching rains. Missouri state troopers have been working 24-hour shifts near the village of Big Lake, after nine levee breaks soaked the area. But a forecaster says the good news is: there's no significant rain expected in the region over the next few days.

SUBTROPICAL STORM ANDREA

VO :21

The first named storm of the year remains more than 100 miles off the coast of Georgia and Florida. Forecasters expect Subtropical Storm Andrea to show little movement over the next day and dissipate near the coast in about four days. Andrea has top sustained winds of about 45 miles-per-hour, blowing the smoke from wildfires across Georgia and Florida. The storm has also been sending five-foot waves crashing down on Georgia beaches. High waves have already luring surfers to the beach. Authorities say one Florida man may have drowned as a result, when he wiped out after being hit by a "gigantic wave." The hurricane center has issued a tropical storm watch for parts of Georgia and Florida, meaning tropical storm conditions are possible within 36 hours.

GONZALES PROSECUTORS

VO :22

Attorney General Alberto Gonzales faces new grilling from Congress today over the firings of eight federal prosecutors. Gonzales will appear before the House Judiciary Committee. This time, the focus will be on the White House's role in the firings, and whether political affiliation played any role in picking entry-level prosecutors. Such consideration would violate federal law. Gonzales last testified about the firings before the Senate Judiciary Committee in April. At that time, he repeatedly said he did not recall or could not remember conversations or events related to the firings.

US IRAQ BUSH

VO :27

The White House calls President Bush's meeting today with the Joint Chiefs and Defense Secretary Gates a routine strategy session on Iraq and Afghanistan. The White House says the short-term war funding bill the House is considering today would still tie the hands of U-S commanders, and still has unacceptable non-war spending. So Bush would veto it. Meanwhile, there are fresh signs of Republican discontent on Iraq. Eleven moderate House Republicans met secretly with the president Tuesday and warned him in blunt terms that U-S involvement can't be sustained without public support.

SANCTUARY MOVEMENT

BLANCA ROSA VILCHEZ / NUEVA YORK

Alarmed by immigration raids on illegal workers, a coalition of U.S. religious groups is launching a sanctuary movement Wednesday to harbor immigrant families who risk being torn apart. Roman Catholic, Protestant, Jewish and Muslim groups are opening churches and synagogues to shelter families who face deportation.

BORDER COALITION

VO :23

Members of a group called the "Texas Border Coalition" re-affirmed their opposition to a proposed border fence between the U.S. and Mexico Wednesday (5/9) during a meeting in Austin. The coalition says federal officials have assured them that local communities will have a say about any construction

of a barrier between the two countries. The issue became a political hot button recently when a map surfaced showing federal plans for a fence. But Customs and Border Protection says that map was developed early on and no longer applies. The map showed Texas having more than 150 miles of fencing along the Mexico border. The Texas Border Coalition says the Rio Grande River is a natural border and if illegal immigrants can swim across it they can also climb a fence.

E COLI OUTBREAK MN

Customers of two Minnesota grocery chains are bringing back beef after an E coli outbreak. In the past few weeks, seven people have come forward with symptoms related to the bacteria. After testing, it was confirmed they all had it. Three were hospitalized but have since been released. State health officials are looking into whether more bad beef could still be on store shelves. That's because the stores' parent company, Lund Food Holdings uses a single processing facility for its ground beef production. Authorities are now urging anyone who bought ground beef at either Lunds or Byerly's stores to return it immediately.

IMMIGRATION BILL LATEST

FERNANDO PIZARRO/ WASHINGTON, D.C.

Senate leadership has chosen the Hagel Martinez bill approved last year by the senate to begin debating immigration next week. They are invoking a special rule to introduce an immigration bill to be debated directly on the senate floor. However, there is still no agreement between democrats and republican and White House negotiators.

NEW FORMAT MISSING CHILDREN

Those little cards with black-and-white pictures of missing children are being replaced by larger, color images. Direct mail advertiser ADVO sends the cards to 114 million homes every month, along with its ShopWise mail circular. Starting Monday, the cards will be eliminated and larger, color pictures of the missing children will be included on page four of the circular itself, the company said Thursday. The change to the larger, color images was welcomed by John Walsh, co-founder of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

PARKINSON PATCH

Patients with early Parkinson's disease have a new treatment option -- and it comes in the form of a patch. The once-daily Neuro patch is a first in American medical treatment for symptoms of the disease. It contains a drug called rotigotine, which federal regulators say has not been sold in the U-S before this. Parkinson's disease results from the loss of dopamine-producing brain cells. Rotigotine works by activating dopamine receptors, and mimicking the neurotransmitter's effect. The patch is made by Schwarz Pharma A-G. An estimated one (m) million people in the U-S have Parkinson's, and an additional 60-thousand cases are diagnosed each year.

Tonight's commencement ceremony at Virginia Tech will be bittersweet. About five-thousand students will earn bachelor's and advanced degrees. As many as 30-thousand people are expected at the ceremony. But the killings of 32 students and faculty by a mentally ill student last month will weigh heavily on everyone's minds. The 27 students who were killed will be given posthumous degrees. Richard Roopan is among those graduating. He says while it "feels good" to be finished, everything is a

bit more somber. Security will be tightened for the ceremony. Bags will be checked but no one will have to go through metal detectors.

CATALINA WILDFIRE
JULIO CESAR ORTIZ / LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA

Fire crews are getting the upper hand on a blaze that's triggered evacuations on the island of Santa Catalina off the coast of southern California. The fire chief says weather conditions are helping keep property safe. Hundreds of residents have left the island by ferry. One resident says the falling ash looked like snow. Fire broke out yesterday afternoon and has scorched four-thousand acres. It's being fed by dry brush and a steady wind. The island that's about 30 miles offshore has gotten only two inches of rain since January.

US WILDFIRE
VO :22

Wildfires still raged across parts of the US state of Florida on Thursday. In the small town of Taylor in north Florida, nearly every resident has had to leave their homes to flee the encroaching flames. The early season subtropical storm Andrea was to blame for the fires - it was supposed to bring rain to the drought parched region, but instead brought gusty winds. The erratic nature of that wind is a serious concern for firefighters.

FORT DIX PLOT COURT
VO :24

Six Muslim men suspected of plotting to massacre U.S. soldiers at Fort Dix were due in federal court Friday morning for a bail hearing. The government will argue that the men, all born outside the United States, pose a flight risk and should be held without bail. They are being held at a federal detention center in Philadelphia. The men were arrested Monday night during what the FBI said was an attempt to buy AK-47 machine guns, M-16s and other weapons. They targeted Fort Dix, a post 25 miles east of Philadelphia that is used primarily to train reservists, partly because one of them had delivered pizzas there and was familiar with the base, according to court filings. Their objective was to kill "as many American soldiers as possible," the documents said.

US IRAQ VOTE

With the House having passed another limited Iraq war funding measure, concerned Iraqi government officials have been lobbying lawmakers from both parties. Senior Baghdad officials have been on Capitol Hill warning members that a U-S troop withdrawal will be a disaster for Iraq. Last night, the House approved 43 (b) billion dollars to pay for the war through July. An additional 53 (b) billion later this summer would hinge on a progress report from the Bush administration on how Iraq is doing in meeting certain benchmarks.

Efforts to reach an immigration compromise faltered Thursday as Democrats and Republicans staked out divergent positions and prepared to blame each other for scuttling the best chance for a broad overhaul this year. Talks continued on a possible deal that would tie residency for millions of illegal immigrants to tougher border security and a crackdown on employing undocumented workers. At the same time, however, Republicans and Democrats set the stage for a partisan battle next week that could squash any agreement. Democrats plan to force a debate starting Tuesday on last year's Senate-passed immigration measure. Most Democrats supported that plan, which a majority of Republican senators opposed.

IPODS PACEMAKERS

Ipods are a popular little item for listening to music, but now there is research suggesting those devices could interfere with how a pacemaker works . A very sharp teenager from Michigan conducted research to see if there were any potential problems and now that teen's work has caught the eye of cardiologists from around the country. 17-year-old Jay Thaker says he wanted to know if an Ipod could have an effect on a pacemaker's performance. He found that using the Ipod close to a pacemaker caused abnormally high heart rate readings. Thaker says his research even showed one instance where the Ipod kept a pacemaker from working correctly. Because of his discovery, the teenager is attending a heart rhythm conference in Denver, Colorado.

FCT MILK ADS**VO :24**

An ad campaign that suggested milk can help people lose weight is ending amid claims from a doctors group the ads were false and misleading. The two marketing campaigns at issue involve the "Milk your diet. Lose Weight!" ads on television, Internet and in magazines, and the "3-A-Day. Burn More Fat, Lose Weight" ads, which are now mostly Web-based. A spokeswoman for the National Fluid Milk Processor Promotion Board defended the ads saying "There's a strong body of scientific evidence that demonstrates a connection between dairy and weight loss."

CONGRESS IMMIGRATION**VO :21**

A bipartisan effort in the Senate aimed at striking a compromise on immigration is getting a little more time. Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid has pushed back a key test vote until Wednesday. He says the progress has been "incremental and slow." Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell says the delay offers "the maximum opportunity" to piece together an agreement that was almost reached a week ago.

FARMERS BRANCH VOTE**SANDRA SILVESTRUCCI / DALLAS, TEXAS****PKG 1:57 & VO : 31**

Voters in this Dallas suburb Saturday overwhelmingly approved a measure banning landlords from renting to most illegal immigrants, in the first public vote on any of the more than 90 measures local governments around the country have proposed to crack down on illegal immigration. With two-thirds of precincts reporting, the measure had 68 percent support, with 32 percent opposed. It requires apartment managers to verify that renters are U.S. citizens or legal immigrants before leasing to them, with some exceptions. With Saturday's approval of the ban, opponents plan to fight it in court, and will seek a restraining order to stop the city from enforcing it.

POSTAL RATES UP**VO :17**

The cost of mailing a card or letter goes up two cents today, to 41 cents. The new "forever" stamp is also available. It will remain valid regardless of any future rate increase. There is a break on the cost of mailing a letter that weighs more than one ounce. The cost for each additional ounce drops to 17 cents, so heavier letters such as wedding invitations will cost less to mail. The rate had been 24 cents per extra ounce.

CA: CATALINA FIRE**VO :24**

In California crews are getting control of the wildfire on Catalina Island, off the coast. The fire is now about 70 percent contained. And many residents are back home. Only one home was destroyed in the fire, which burned through more than 4-thousand acres. Normal ferry service to the popular tourist island is set to resume Monday.

FLORIDA WILDFIRES

Hope in the form of rain turned to fear of stronger wind gusts Monday as firefighters faced another tough day battling a massive wildfire along the Georgia-Florida line. The wildfire that raced through the Okefenokee Swamp in southeast Georgia and into Florida was started by lightning more than a week ago. By Monday, it had burned 102,500 acres in Florida after charring 132,000 acres in Georgia -- more than 366 square miles in all.

DROP MAMMOGRAPHY RATE

U.S. women are getting mammograms to screen for breast cancer at declining rates, according to a study describing a trend that experts fear may portend a reversal of progress against the deadly disease. The percentage of women 40 and older saying they had a mammogram within the past two years slipped from 70 percent in 2000 to 66 percent in 2005, according to the study appearing on Monday in the journal Cancer.

ARIZONA IMMIGRANT BUST

A truck full of illegal immigrants was busted in Phoenix. The Arizona Department of Public Safety spotted the truck when its tire blew out. There were about a dozen men, some sitting on the road, handcuffed, and waiting for Federal Immigration Custom Enforcement Agents to arrive.

FIRED PROSECUTORS
VO :27

A leading Democratic senator says he finds it ironic that the number two Justice Department official has resigned, while embattled Attorney General Alberto Gonzales remains on the job. Senator Charles Schumer noted that Paul McNulty "at least tried to level" with the Judiciary Committee, while he says Gonzales "stonewalled" members. McNulty did not mention the controversy over the firings of eight federal prosecutors in his resignation letter. Two other officials have left the Justice Department in the past two months over the firings. And McNulty's resignation is expected to be the start of significant turnover at the department.

PADILLA TERROR CHARGES**VO :23**

Testimony begins today in Miami in the trial of Jose Padilla and two co-defendants accused of supporting Islamic extremists. One early witness will be a C-I-A agent who will be disguised during his testimony.

During opening statements yesterday, a federal prosecutor said "al-Qaida" 91 times in just over an hour and also made several references to Osama bin Laden.

GA WILDFIRE**VO :29**

Wildfires are raging across southern Georgia. Authorities say the state has 41 active wildfires burning more than 260-thousand acres. The largest, was ignited by a lightning strike May 5th on Bugaboo Island. It's been dubbed the 'bugaboo' scrub fire...And has burned more than 130-thousand acres in Georgia, and has spread into Florida. This (Monday) Morning, officials said it was about 50-percent contained. But humidity is expected to drop, and winds are expected to pick up today.

ARIZONA WILDFIRE**VO :15**

Firefighters are battling a wildfire in north-central Arizona that has burned more than 200 acres. The fire is burning in the Tonto National Forest on the Mogollon Rim near Payson. So far the fire is zero percent contained. Two air tankers have brought in. The fire broke out Sunday afternoon. (5/13) So far the fire is not threatening any structures or private homes.

USA IMMIGRATION VISAS**VO :27**

Worried that a visa program for high-skilled foreign workers is being abused to displace higher paid Americans, two U.S. senators Monday asked nine foreign-based companies to explain how they are using the work permits. Senate Assistant Majority Leader Richard Durbin, an Illinois Democrat, and Sen. Charles Grassley, an Iowa Republican, said in letters to the companies that they had received reports of fraud and abuse of the H-1B visa program that allows companies to bring highly skilled workers into the United States.

IMMIGRATION MARTINEZ**VO :19**

Sen. Mel Martinez, tapped as party chairman to help expand the GOP's appeal to Latino voters, is struggling to bridge seemingly intractable divides among Republicans over immigration. In months of intense closed-door talks among White House officials and key Republicans and Democrats, the Florida senator's main task has been to referee between warring GOP factions. He has prodded business-minded moderates like himself who are eager for a politically palatable compromise to partner with hardline conservatives who are wary of one.

GAS PRICES RECORD**JAIME GARCIA / LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA****PKG 1:49 & VO : 31**

With the price at the pump hitting record highs, the head of the Energy Department's Energy Information Administration is set to brief lawmakers this morning on the gasoline outlook for the summer.

The E-I-A says the average retail price of regular gas jumped almost a nickel a gallon this past week, to more than three dollars and ten cents a gallon. That's more than four cents higher than the previous record, which was set in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. Gas prices have risen more than 93 cents a gallon since hitting their low point this year in January.

DENVER FLOODING**VO :21**

Authorities in Denver are looking for a toddler swept away in a flash flood. A mother was pushing her child in a stroller along the platte river last night (monday) When a storm moved in, causing the water to rise rapidly. She fell, and the water swept the child away. Firefighters found the stroller, but fear the toddler may be dead. Rescuers are also searching for a missing teenager caught in a rising creek.

ROAD RAGE

For a second straight year, Miami tops the latest road rage ranking. You know the type, drivers chatting too often on cell phones and speeding through red lights. An AutoVantage spokesman says Miami is at the intersection of two cultures on the road with retirees out for leisurely drives and young professionals headed to-and-from work. The automobile membership club says there was plenty of rage to go around. Other cities at the top of the rude drivers' list were New York, Boston, L-A and Washington, D-C.

CRIME CITIES

VO :26

Increasing violence among teenagers and other youths appears to have contributed to a nationwide crime spike, the Justice Department said Tuesday. Gangs and gun violence are partly to blame for the rise in crime that is on pace to increase for the second straight year, says Attorney General Alberto Gonzales in a prepared speech. FBI data from last fall show violent crimes, including murders and robberies, rose by 3.7 percent nationwide during the first six months of 2006. Those findings came on top of a 2.2 percent crime hike in 2005 -- the first increase since 2001.

The Senate votes today on a variety of Iraq war measures. Republican John Warner is rallying fellow Republicans behind a bill that would threaten to cut off (b) billions of dollars in Iraqi aid. That measure is viewed as another sign of growing Republican impatience with the war. A Democratic measure that has the support of two leading presidential hopefuls would cut off funding for combat operations after next March.

CA BORDER TUNNEL

An elaborate border tunnel between Mexico and southern California is in the process of being destroyed. Fifty feet below the earth's surface, this concrete is filling a tunnel used to smuggle drugs, people, and weapons. The tunnel extended half a mile from Tijuana to Otay Mesa in San Diego and was complete with electricity and ventilation. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is filling the cavity with concrete. The process is seen here through a camera extended into the tunnel.

GA & FL FIRES

Firefighters say they're making progress against that massive wildfire still burning on the Georgia-Florida border. That despite the fact that the flames jumped containment lines three times this week, as firefighters contended with brisk winds, low humidity and high temperatures. But on each occasion, they were able to quickly extinguish the blazes. Officials say 725 homes in Florida have been evacuated. Meantime, a fire north of Atlantic City, New Jersey, has scorched 12-thousand acres of brush and pine forest and forced the evacuation of 25-hundred homes. It's believed to have started when a National Guard fighter plane dropped a flare.

MY SPACE SEX OFFENDERS

MySpace-dot-com says the request wasn't legal. So the social networking Web site won't comply with a request by attorneys general from eight states to hand over the names of registered sex offenders who

use the site. MySpace says it regularly discloses information to law enforcement officials, but the federal Electronic Communications Privacy Act says it can only do that when proper legal procedures are followed, such as obtaining subpoenas or court orders.

NEW JERSEY WILDFIRES

A wildfire along the border of Ocean and Burlington counties in southern New Jersey has burned thousands of acres of sparsely populated brush and pine forest. A fire official says the blaze has closed several highways, forced hundreds of residents to evacuate and damaged several homes. The fire, which is only ten-percent contained, started on a 94-hundred-acre expanse of sand and scrub pine used for aerial bombing practice by Air National Guard units. A spokesman for the New Jersey Air National Guard says a flare dropped from one its F-16s may have started the blaze. Dry conditions and winds gusting to 30 miles-per-hour contributed to its rapid spread.

KIDS RX

A new study shows that the number of adolescent girls taking drugs for Type Two diabetes nearly tripled in just five years. The study also finds that use of chronic medicines for psychotic behavior and insomnia roughly doubled among boys and girls aged ten to 19. But the use of drugs for depression and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, or A-D-H-D, has leveled off or dropped in the last two years. Experts say the findings raise questions about physical and mental health problems in youth and the appropriateness of putting them on long-term medicines mostly designed for adults.

LA MC ARTHUR PARK PROCESSION

Activists planned a candlelight vigil Thursday to assure immigrants of their right to peaceful protests, weeks after another demonstration ended with police wielding batons and firing rubber bullets. The office of Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa said he planned to take part in the evening rally at MacArthur Park, the site of the May 1 melee. At that event riot police beat demonstrators and journalists with batons and fired more than 240 rubber bullets into a crowd that included children. Several Democratic Senators have sent Gonzales a letter asking him if he stands by comments he'd made in House and Senate testimony last year. At issue is former Deputy Attorney General James Comey's testimony before the Senate Judiciary Committee Tuesday.

US IRAQ VOTE

VO :17

A Senate vote today will trigger formal three-way talks with the House and White House aimed at crafting a bill to pay for the war in Iraq. There is expected to be widespread bipartisan support for a nonbinding resolution that expresses support for the troops. It comes after anti-war Democrats failed in an effort to cut off funds for the war. The vote will set the stage for negotiations on a war-funding bill.

First gas, now food. The household budget in Southern California is getting no relief these days. Southland residents already pay among the highest grocery prices in the nation, and the forecast is for even higher costs. Prices are going up for much of what gets dumped into the grocery cart including cereals, bread, bacon, pork roasts, chicken, eggs, cookies, hot dogs, oranges, soda pop and dried beans. Nationally, food prices rose 3.9% in April compared with the same month in 2006, and the outlook is equally chilling wherever you shop. It is happening for many reasons: inflation, drought, freezing weather, even the rising cost of corn - highly sought after not only as ingredients for thousands of food products but also to make ethanol.

Researchers say more than three-quarters of those travelers will drive but they're also predicting a slight rise in air travel.

New Jersey Democratic Senator Robert Menendez doesn't like the fact that skills and education-level would outweigh family ties in deciding whether immigrants get permanent legal status. He says it will rip families apart. Meanwhile, many conservatives say no matter how backers spin it, the bill offers amnesty to illegal immigrants. President Bush says the measure strikes just the right balance. He says people will be "treated without amnesty, but without animosity." But he acknowledges it's a tough issue and passage is not assured.

Hundreds of demonstrators have returned to the scene of a controversial police response to a May first immigration rally in Los Angeles. Police hit demonstrators and journalists with batons and fired 240 rubber bullets to disperse the crowd after the rally. Four investigations, including one by the F-B-I, have been launched. Marchers gathered in front of a church for a town hall-style meeting before proceeding to MacArthur Park, just west of downtown. Organizers say the purpose of the latest demonstration was to strengthen the immigrant community's trust that they could exercise their constitutional rights.

**GONZALES PROSECUTORS

The White House is calling the Senate's upcoming no-confidence vote on Attorney General Alberto Gonzales nothing more than a "political stunt." A White House spokesman says the president's support for his longtime ally and friend will not change. Two Democratic senators, Chuck Schumer of New York and Dianne Feinstein of California, have said they would offer a nonbinding resolution expressing the view that Gonzales is too weakened to run the Justice Department.

**SCHOOL SAFETY

The nation's schools aren't making the grade when it comes to preparing for emergencies. An analysis by the Government Accountability Office shows most schools could do more when it comes to planning for emergencies such as terror attacks, hurricanes or flu pandemics. About half of school districts don't have plans for educating students in the event of a lengthy closure. Districts also generally haven't been working with first responders on how to implement emergency plans. And two-thirds of districts cite a lack of expertise and equipment as impediments to emergency plannings.

US IRAQ MEETING**VO :23**

Leaders of congressional Democrats have a crucial meeting with President Bush's top aide today on continued funding for the Iraq war. Bush wants about 90 (b) billion dollars with no strings attached. Democrats insist on a penalty for Baghdad if it doesn't meet political and security benchmarks.

NJ WILDFIRES**VO :34**

Rain expected today should help firefighters tamp down flames that have continued to pop up from a huge fire in southern New Jersey. The fire started Tuesday on an Air National Guard gunnery range, apparently when a fighter jet dropped a flare. It spread over nearly 22 square miles, destroyed or damaged 18 homes but caused only two minor injuries. Most of the 25-hundred evacuated families have been allowed to go home. The military has agreed to pay for the damage if an investigation shows that the flare was what started it.

Nevada, Florida and delegate-rich California all hold primaries February Fifth.

GONZALES LATEST**VO :22**

The top Republican on the Senate committee investigating Attorney General Alberto Gonzales said Sunday he believes Gonzales could resign before a no-confidence vote sought this week by Senate Democrats. In a further sign of his eroding support within the GOP, Gonzales failed to draw a public statement of support from Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell. Asked whether Gonzales effectively can lead the Justice Department, McConnell said "that's for the president to decide." The issue carries heavy political consequences for both parties. Five Republican senators have joined Democrats in calling for the attorney general's resignation. A no-confidence vote could come later this week.

A U.S. federal judge has temporarily barred the Dallas suburb of Farmers Branch from enforcing a law against renting to illegal immigrants. Plaintiffs had challenged the ordinance, adopted by a two-to-one citywide vote on May 12, arguing that the city had no authority to regulate immigration. Lindsay issued a temporary restraining order against enforcing the law. Another hearing will be scheduled within 10 days to hear city arguments against extending his order.

HURRICANE FORECAST**VO :35 & VO:33 & VO :34**

There's no El Nino this year to counteract tropical weather development and two leading experts are predicting a busy hurricane season ahead of the official government forecast due out today. Experts predicted a bad season last year, too, in the wake of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005. But the unexpected development of El Nino climate conditions, a warming of the tropical Pacific Ocean, helped make for a mild season in 2006. Now that El Nino has ended, the potential again exists for more tropical storms to threaten the East and Gulf coasts. Experts at Colorado State University and AccuWeather Incorporated say they anticipate a more active storm cycle this year.

AVANDIA STUDY

U.S. regulators are reviewing the safety of GlaxoSmithKline's Plc's diabetes drug Avandia but have not yet determined the significance of risks reported in a study released Monday, a Food and Drug Administration official said. A study published in the New England Journal of Medicine said Avandia increased the risk of cardiac-related deaths by 64 percent and heart attacks by 43 percent. Dr. Robert Meyer, head of the FDA office that reviews diabetes drugs, said other data contradicted those findings.

AIRPORT SECURITY LIQUIDS**VO :25**

Federal security workers have started using hand-held scanners to inspect bottled carry-on liquids for explosives at some of the nation's busiest airports, the government said. The Transportation Security Administration has finished testing the device at Miami International Airport and Newark Liberty International Airport. Testing is ongoing in Los Angeles, Detroit and Las Vegas, agency spokesman Nico Melendez said Tuesday. Testing was to begin in Boston on Wednesday.

IOWA PRIMARIES**LUIS MEGID/ COUNCIL BLUFFS, IOWA****PKG 2:05**

Bill Richardson on Monday declared himself a candidate to become the first Hispanic president of the United States. Also discussed the latest polls in the race for US President in the 2008 elections.

MY SPACE SEX OFFENDERS**VO :18**

MySpace now says it will release data on registered sex offenders it has identified and removed from its site. The company previously cited federal privacy laws in refusing to provide the information. That brought pressure from eight state prosecutors, led by North Carolina Attorney General Roy Cooper. They've been demanding access to information that had been compiled by a security database company MySpace had partnered with to weed out sex offenders.

BIRTH CONTROL PILL**LOURDES DEL RIO/ MIAMI, FLORIDA****PKG. 2:02**

Women looking for a simple way to avoid menstrual periods could soon have access to a pill for just that. The F-D-A is expected to announce approval Tuesday for Lybrel the first birth control pill designed to let women suppress monthly bleeding indefinitely. Some women raise concerns about whether blocking periods is safe or natural. But most doctors say there's no medical reason women need monthly bleeding. It can also trigger health problems from anemia to epilepsy in many women.

The fragile immigration overhaul compromise comes under more fire today on Capitol Hill. George's processing plant in Butterfield, Missouri was the latest to be searched. Federal officials said Tuesday's arrests were part of a continuing investigation into identity theft and false documents. They believe those arrested are illegal immigrants who have used stolen Social Security numbers and other false documents to obtain employment.

BUSH SPEECH TODAY

President Bush takes his defense of his war policy to the U-S Coast Guard Academy today. His commencement address to the smallest of the service academies is the last of three he's delivering this year. The president is to discuss the nature of the terrorist threat America is facing and his belief that the U-S needs to keep the pressure on, including in Iraq.

TEXAS FLOODS

There were reports of flooding, evacuations and high water after overnight rains pounded parts of Central Texas. Nearly six inches of rain fell in the Killeen area. Flooded streets and swollen creeks in Bell County and southern Lampasas County forced some residents out of their homes.

Former top aide to Attorney General Alberto Gonzales will be asked today whether politics played a role in the firing of those federal prosecutors. Goodling quit last month and invoked her right against self-incrimination in refusing to testify until now. Justice Department e-mails show Goodling played a major role in compiling names of prosecutors to fire and was in close contact with political operatives at the White House.

Republicans and Democrats placed strict new conditions on a broad immigration measure Wednesday, as the White House and the bipartisan group that crafted it fought to keep their compromise intact. The Senate voted overwhelmingly to slash the number of foreign workers who could come to the U.S. on temporary visas. It also endorsed toughening the security measures that would have to be in place before millions of illegal immigrants could begin gaining permanent legal status or a new temporary worker program could be launched. The measure faced new challenges as Democrats sought to loosen its limits on family-based immigration and Republicans proposed further security measures. The guest worker program would be capped at 200,000 a year under the Democratic proposal approved Wednesday, which passed 74-24 over strong opposition by the Bush administration.

As the immigration debate heats up in the Senate, the Center for Immigration Studies has released a new report. Titled "Low salaries for low skills," the report examines wages for workers in the h-one-b visa program. According to the study, that temporary visa is widely used by high-tech employers. But the study shows those workers are paid well below the salaries of comparable US workers.

SEAT BELT CAMPAIGN

This week marks the launch of law enforcement's annual seat-belt campaign known as "Click It or Ticket." So inquiring minds want to know, does the president of the United States wear his seat belt? The issue has gotten national attention since New Jersey Governor Jon Corzine was critically injured in a crash last month. Corzine was not wearing his seat belt.

AGING EXERCISE

California researchers say a simple intervention may be able to make you younger. New research by the Buck Institute on Aging finds exercise may do more than make you feel good -- it may actually reverse the aging process. Researchers tested a group of healthy young people with the average age of 21 and a group of healthy older people, average age 70. No surpris - the seniors had about half the muscle strength of the young people. But after exercising twice a week for 6 months, the seniors closed the gap and developed almost as much strength as the young adults.

FERTILITY PROGRAM

Doctors employ a range of medical treatments for infertility, but a new low-tech treatment may be worth trying first. Walnut Creek, California OB/GYN Janette Walker says the concept is simple. After intercourse using a special condom, semen is immediately transferred into a cervical cap. The conception kit website says it's "FDA-cleared" - not "FDA-approved." The FDA says, that simply means this kit is similar to other cervical cap devices already on the market. Doctors warn sophisticated fertility techniques work better but the kit is a much cheaper option. Nearly one in five couples struggles with infertility.

IMMIGRATION DEBATE LATEST LOURDES MELUZA, WASHINGTON, D.C. PKG. 2:06 & VO :26

Senate leaders battled to hold together a fragile compromise on an overhaul of the immigration system Thursday as President Bush, in an impassioned plea for the bill, insisted 12 million people could not be sent home. The measure, which would tie tough border security and workplace enforcement measures to a guest-worker program and a plan to legalize the millions of illegal immigrants, is under attack from the right and left. Conservatives argue it will give amnesty to people who broke U.S. laws, while unions say the temporary worker program will create an underclass of cheap laborers. Bush defended the bill as a comprehensive approach that will fix what most Americans believe is a broken immigration system through which millions of illegal immigrants have entered the United States.

MINIMUM WAGE VO :27 & VO :26

America's lowest-paid workers won a \$2.10 raise Thursday, with Congress approving the first increase in the federal minimum wage in almost a decade. President Bush was expected to sign the bill quickly, and workers who now make \$5.15 an hour will see their paychecks go up by 70 cents per hour before the end of the summer. Another 70 cents will be added next year, and by summer 2009, all minimum-wage jobs will pay no less than \$7.25 an hour.

WAR FUND**VO :27 & VO :17**

The war funding bill passed by Congress doesn't have a troop withdrawal deadline, but it does have goals for the Iraqi government to meet as it strives to build a democratic country able to defend its own borders. Continued U-S reconstruction aid would be conditioned on progress toward the benchmarks, although President Bush retains the authority to order the money to be spent regardless of how the Baghdad government performs. After the bill was passed, Bush said the Iraqi government needs to show real progress in return for America's continued support and sacrifice.

IMMIGRANTS RENT CALIFORNIA**VO :23**

Cities and counties could no longer enact ordinances barring landlords from renting to illegal immigrants under a bill approved Thursday by the state Assembly. The legislation comes more than six months after the city of Escondido sought to involve landlords in immigration enforcement, a job the bill's supporters said should be reserved to federal authorities. The Assembly passed the bill, 42-23. It now goes to the Senate for consideration.

DIET DIABETES**VO :24**

Doctors already say too much television isn't good for kids. Now there's a study illustrating what may be another downside. Scientists in Norway say children with Type-One diabetes who spent the most time watching television had a tougher time controlling their blood sugar. Type-One diabetes is not related to obesity and is caused when the body can't make insulin, which converts sugar from food into energy. People who have it must take insulin daily and regulate their blood-sugar levels.

Overloaded pews and aisles filled to standing room only capacity are what's usual at the best-attended weekly Mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish. At 11 a.m.. Down the block is a skyscraper that has been identified by President Bush as a target for a September eleventh-style airplane attack.

CRITICAL CARE

Every year tens of thousands of americans are severely injured in traffic accidents, shootings and other emergencies. For decades, emergency workers have been using the same techniques to try to revive them. The problem is these patients are unconcious, near death.. and unable to give their consent to be part of an experiment. As first reported in today's washington post, the researchers will try new methods of stabilizing blood pressure and restarting hearts, to see if they save more lives.

SMOKING WORK PLACE

The World Health Organisation, which has been championing an international campaign against tobacco use, called on Tuesday for a global ban on smoking at work and in enclosed public places. Immigration officials said they will proceed with plans to double the cost of applying to become a U.S. citizen and triple the fee for seeking legal permanent residency. The fee increases will take effect July 30. Citizenship fees will rise from \$330 to \$595, plus \$80 for required electronic fingerprints, an increase of \$10. For legal permanent residency and fingerprints the cost will be \$1,010 for those over 14. The cost now is \$325.

IMMIGRATION CHECKING WORKERS

The nation's employers say a major problem with system overload is on the way if Congress forces them to prove, electronically, that all their workers are legal. Currently, 16,727 employers check employees through a system previously known as Basic Pilot and now called the Electronic Employer Verification System. They have checked 1.77 million employees, according to Citizenship and

Immigration Services, an agency within the Homeland Security Department. Current immigration law leaves it to employers to verify that they are hiring legal workers. But that law, passed in 1986, has not been enforced strictly.

TUBERCULOSIS

The United States has placed in isolation a man who may have exposed fellow passengers and crew on two May trans-Atlantic flights to a tuberculosis strain that is extremely hard to treat, officials said Tuesday. It was first time the U.S. government has issued such an isolation order since 1963, when it took action against a smallpox patient, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The man, a U.S. citizen from the state of Georgia, is suffering from extensive drug-resistant TB, known as XDR TB, which resists virtually all antibiotics, the CDC said. Tuberculosis is a bacterial infection that usually attacks the lungs. CDC Director Dr. Julie Gerberding said authorities in the United States and other countries were trying to notify passengers who traveled on Air France flight 385, arriving in Paris from Atlanta on May 13, and on Czech Air flight 0104, arriving in Montreal from Prague on May 24.

MC CAIN IMMIGRATION

Republican presidential candidate John McCain says opponents of the immigration reform compromise should offer a better alternative if they have one. McCain is urging Congress to approve the revision, which includes tougher security, guest workers and a path to citizenship for (m) millions of illegal immigrants.

President Bush Tuesday pleaded with congressional opponents of a compromise immigration reform bill not to kill it. Fighting to salvage what many analysts see as one of his few shots at a major legislative achievement in his final term, Bush insisted there is a "desperate need" to overhaul the immigration system. "The system is broken to the point where people are being used as human cargo," Bush said in a speech at a federal law enforcement training center.
