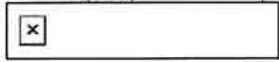

WHILE THIS DEVICE RAISES QUESTIONS ABOUT POTENTIAL USES BEYOND MEDICINE, THE STUDY'S RESEARCHERS SAY THEY ARE FOCUSED ON PRACTICAL; DOWN THE ROAD, THEY SEE IT FOR INSTANCE AS BEING USED AS A SMART BANDAGE THAT CAN HELP HEAL WOUNDS. .

AS FOR THE SEX OF THE CHILDREN, MALE BABIES EXPERIENCED NEARLY THREE TIMES THE RISK OVER FEMALE INFANTS, 26 VERSUS 9 PERCENT. AGE OF PARENT, GENDER OF THE OLDER SIBLING OR BIRTH ORDERS WERE NOT PREDICTORS OF THE CONDITION.

AUTHORS OF THE STUDY SUGGEST THEIR FINDINGS COULD IMPACT FUTURE GENETIC SCREENING AND FAMILY PLANNING DECISIONS WHEN IT COMES TO PARENTS WHO'S FIRST BORN HAS A-S-D -- AND THE KNOWLEDGE COULD LEAD TO EARLIER OBSERVATION AND INTERVENTION FOR THOSE YOUNG SIBLINGS.

IRENE, THE NINTH NAMED STORM OF THE BUSY 2011 ATLANTIC SEASON, LOOKS SET TO BE THE FIRST HURRICANE TO HIT THE UNITED STATES SINCE IKE SAVAGED THE TEXAS COAST IN 2008. ## **HISPANIC IMMIGRATION**

Demographic changes have made it much more difficult for Republicans to win national elections. In California, the GOP hasn't won a Senate seat since 1988 and has no discernable prospects for winning there anytime soon. Similarly, at the presidential level, California is impenetrably blue. Of course, what explains the leftward political tilt in formerly Republican states such as California is immigration, both domestic and Hispanic. Political analyst extraordinaire Larry Sabato confirms this change in today's *Wall Street Journal*. Seven "super swing states with 85 electoral [votes] will determine which party gets to the magic number of 270 electoral votes," Sabato writes. The seven states are notable because most of them (five by my count) have been transformed politically by domestic in-migration from other states, as well as Hispanic immigration from Mexico, Central America and the Caribbean.

## **HISPANICS NEW MAJORITY TO SENTENCED TO FEDERAL PRISON**

More than half of all people sent to federal prison for committing felony crimes so far this year were Hispanic, a major demographic shift swollen by immigration offenses, according to a new government report released Tuesday. Hispanics already outnumber all other ethnic groups sentenced to serve time in prison for federal felonies. Hispanics reached a new milestone for the first time this year, making up the majority all federal felony offenders sentenced in the first nine months of fiscal year 2011,

according to the U.S. Sentencing Commission. Hispanics comprised 50.3 percent of all people sentenced in that time period, blacks 19.7 percent and whites 26.4 percent. In comparison, last year Hispanics made up just 16 percent of the whole U.S. population.

## **CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR JOBS PLAN**

**VO :22**

Gov. Jerry Brown touted his jobs plan Tuesday at a Sorrento Valley biotech company, an effort that would provide tax incentives for companies to hire within the state. The governor made his pitch at medical diagnostics company Gen-Probe for his "California Jobs First" plan that, if passed, would expand an under- utilized tax break to give small businesses with up to 50 employees a \$4,000 tax credit for each new in-state hire and offer companies a sales tax exemption for purchases of new manufacturing equipment. Too many small businesses are currently ineligible for the credit, which would be available through 2013, Brown said. "The idea is hurry up and take advantage of it and hire in the face of this recession," he said. The proposal would provide \$1 billion in tax relief for companies that buy manufacturing and it eliminates what Brown calls a "toxic loophole" that allows companies to choose between two tax formulas. The governor wants to require all businesses in or out of state to base their tax payments on their sales in California, not the number of people they employ.

### **NEW MEXICO DRIVERS LICENSES MISIEGO - ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO PKG: 2:00**

Governor Susana Martinez last month ordered the state to verify that foreign nationals who've obtained a New Mexico driver's license actually live here to avoid fraud. Shortly after 10,000 letters were sent to people to confirm their residency earlier this month, several democratic lawmakers and a civil rights group sued to block the residency checks. In a packed courtroom Tuesday, Santa Fe Judge Sarah Singleton ordered a one-week extension of the temporary restraining order issued August 31st against the crackdown. Singleton told both sides to use that week to reach an



agreement on how the state can investigate license fraud. "You have potentially 85,000 people who may be unfairly targeted by this program and the judge has said this is an unconstitutional program," said attorney Vincent Ward, who is representing the plaintiffs in the case. The state claimed the letters mailed out were sent to random homes. But Singleton is questioning that because all the letters went to license holders who never provided the state with their Social Security numbers.

## **UTAH IMMIGRATION LAW**

Utah state attorneys said in a court filing Tuesday that federal authorities might get involved in a lawsuit challenging the state's tough immigration enforcement law that civil rights groups argue is unconstitutional. It's not clear, however, if the US Justice Department plans to take action regarding the Utah law. Spokeswoman Xochitl Hinojosa, said the department was reviewing the law but didn't elaborate. The case, which involves the election districts drawn by the Republican-led Texas Legislature, will likely be decided by a federal court in Washington, D.C. District boundaries are redrawn every 10 years to reflect changes in census data. Any changes to Texas' voting practices must be cleared by a federal court or the Justice Department to ensure changes do not discriminate based on race or color.

The country's first 24-hour Deportation Family Support Hotline will launch Sept. 19 to help Illinois families and children left behind in deportations. While Tennessee's new law requiring that all voters have photo IDs may stir controversy along party lines, Knox County early voters seem to largely support the legislation. "People just aren't honest anymore. I can't imagine why you wouldn't have to identify who you are to vote," said Paul Wittke, a West Knoxville resident early voting at Downtown West. "It's absolutely necessary." Wittke and his wife, Sheila, agreed that measures like this are crucial to ensure people aren't stuffing the ballots with illegal votes. But several Knoxville city primary early voters at Downtown West, South Knoxville and the Love Kitchen locations said they were unaware the law takes effect in January. "I'm concerned anytime there's a change in making sure people are aware of the new law and the requirements," Knox County Election Commissioner Cassandra Stuart said, adding that she got several concerned emails once the legislation passed. "I certainly don't want it to be prohibitive to anybody, so the main focus is just on getting the word out to everybody."

## **ALABAMA IMMIGRATION**

Tea Party conservatives are planning a rally in support of Alabama's new law against illegal immigration.

Members of the Rainy Day Patriots are staging a demonstration in favor of the Republican-backed law in Hoover on Tuesday evening. Organizers say they hope to send a message to a federal judge who's currently deciding whether to uphold the law. U.S. District Judge Sharon Blackburn of Birmingham has put the law on hold until she decides whether it's constitutional. Supporters of the law say states should have the right to crack down on illegal immigration because the federal government isn't doing enough. Among other things, the law makes it a crime to knowingly hire or assist an illegal immigrant.

## **TEXAS REDISTRICTING**

**JUAN JOSE RODAS - AUSTIN, TEXAS**

The Justice Department has made it harder to block a state Senate voting map that does injustice to some Fort Worth residents. But by concluding that two of Texas' redistricting plans violate federal law, the agency upped the ante in what is certain to be a complicated, drawn-out legal fight. Justice Department lawyers told a federal District Court in Washington, D.C., on Monday that two of the four maps developed by the Legislature comply with the Voting Rights Act, but two don't. That shouldn't be interpreted as a seal of approval for the Senate and the State Board of Education maps, which passed muster. For all four plans, DOJ said, Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott did not provide all necessary materials to determine whether they meet Voting Rights Act requirements. That's because Abbott went directly to federal court for approval, instead of submitting the plans to the department first. Although DOJ raised no issues about the Senate and education board maps, its brief said, "the court will have to make its own determination" about their legality. The agency didn't specify what problems it found with the Texas House and congressional maps. But it said neither complies with Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act. Under Section 5, Texas and several other states must get pre-clearance of district changes to make sure they don't dilute the electoral strength of racial or language minorities.

**SUPREME COURT DEPORTATIONS**

**LOURDES MELUZA - WASHINGTON, DC**

On Tuesday, the Supreme Court agreed to hear eight cases out of the hundreds of petitions received during its summer recess. The cases, which will likely be heard in early 2012, bring to the Court highly specific issues concerning immigration, criminal law, qualified immunity, workers' compensation and tax law. The new immigration cases seek to reconcile disagreements among the federal courts of appeal over the government's ability to deport permanent

residents who have committed criminal offenses. Under the Immigration and Nationality Act, the attorney general can cancel the removal of a deportable immigrant if that person has been a lawful permanent resident for at least five years, has continuously lived in the United States for seven years after admission in any status and has not been convicted of an aggravated felony. In *Holder v. Gutierrez* and *Holder v. Sawyers* which the Court consolidated into a single hearing, the United States sought the removal of men who entered the country illegally when they were children and then committed deportable offenses less than five years after obtaining lawful permanent resident status. The issue before the Court is whether these men, because they were unemancipated minors before obtaining that status, can apply to themselves their parents' satisfaction of the act's residency requirement in order to avoid deportation

## **LISTERIA DEATHS LATEST**

### **VO: 22**

A listeria outbreak caused by tainted cantaloupes has infected 72 people in the United States and killed 13, U.S. health officials said Tuesday. The death toll now exceeds the 2009 salmonella outbreak from tainted peanuts that killed nine and infected more than 700 people in the United States. So far, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said 18 states have reported infections from one of the four

strains of listeria involved in the outbreak. Of the 13 deaths, four were in New Mexico, two were in

Colorado, two were in Texas, and there was one each in Kansas, Maryland, Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma. All of the illnesses started on or after July 31.

the pending drawdown initially will focus on the temporary 22,000-soldier increase launched three years ago to support the Afghanistan troop surge. These soldiers can be removed from the force primarily through offsets in accessions and retention, sources say.

The New York Metropolitan Transit Authority turned on wireless service in four subway stations in Manhattan Tuesday, marking the first time a straphanger could reliably use their cellphone while waiting for their train. As previously reported service was turned on at four stations: the C and E platforms at 23rd Street and Eighth Avenue; the A, C, E and L platforms on 14th Street and Eighth Avenue; the F, M, and L platforms at the Avenue of the Americas and 14th Street; and the 1, 2 and 3 platforms at the Seventh Avenue station, also on 14th Street. AT&T and T-Mobile customers are the only ones to get service down in those stations, so Verizon Wireless and Sprint Nextel subscribers will still have to wait longer.

**CANTALOUPE LISTERIA****VO :21**

Cases of illness in the U.S. listeria outbreak linked to tainted cantaloupes -- already the deadliest in a decade -- likely will rise in the next month as more people who have been infected with the bacteria begin to develop symptoms, health officials said on Wednesday. To date, 13 people have died and 72 people have been infected in the outbreak in 18 states, including two pregnant women, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

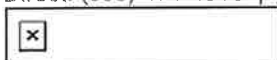

THE COLLEGE DREAMS OF THOUSANDS OF STUDENTS WHO ARE ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS MOVED CLOSER TO FULFILLMENT AFTER THE STATE SENATE APPROVED A BILL THAT FOR THE FIRST TIME WOULD GIVE THEM ACCESS TO PUBLIC FINANCIAL AID. PART OF A TWO-BILL PACKAGE KNOWN AS THE CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT THE MEASURE WOULD ALLOW UNDOCUMENTED STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY FOR REDUCED IN-STATE TUITION TO APPLY FOR CAL GRANTS, COMMUNITY COLLEGE WAIVERS AND OTHER PUBLIC AID PROGRAMS. TO BE ELIGIBLE, THEY MUST BE CALIFORNIA HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES WHO ATTENDED SCHOOLS IN THE STATE AT LEAST THREE YEARS, AND DEMONSTRATE FINANCIAL NEED AND ACADEMIC MERIT. THE MEASURE PASSED 22-11 ON A PARTY-LINE VOTE, WITH DEMOCRATIC SUPPORT AND REPUBLICAN OPPOSITION. IT IS EXPECTED TO RETURN THIS WEEK TO THE ASSEMBLY, WHICH PREVIOUSLY APPROVED IT, FOR CONCURRENCE ON SENATE AMENDMENTS. IF APPROVED, IT WILL BE SENT TO GOV. JERRY BROWN FOR HIS SIGNATURE.

THEY ALSO FOUND FAMILIES COULD REDUCE ABSENTEEISM IN THEIR CHILDREN BY 24 TO 34 PERCENT IF SMOKING WAS ELIMINATED FROM THEIR HOUSEHOLDS. WHEN IT CAME TO CERTAIN HEALTH CONDITIONS, RESEARCHERS FOUND, LIVING WITH TWO OR MORE SMOKERS, INCREASED A CHILD'S RISK OF DEVELOPING THREE OR MORE EAR INFECTIONS WITHIN THE YEAR, AS WELL AS INCREASED THE LIKELIHOOD OF A CHILD DEVELOPING A CHEST COLD.
