

OBAMA IMMIGRATION**VO: 23**

President Barack Obama appealed to Hispanics on Wednesday to support Democrats in the November elections despite his failed promise to pass an immigration overhaul. "Don't forget who is standing with you," the president said as he blamed Republicans for standing in the way of progress. Less than two months before midterm elections that could prove disastrous for Democrats who run Congress, Obama acknowledged the disappointment among Latinos over the immigration issue and pledged anew to keep pushing for a comprehensive overhaul of the nation's immigration laws.

NO EVIDENCE FOR ROUTINE PROSTATE SCREENING: STUDY**VO: 24**

Routine prostate cancer screening does not appear to help men live longer, according to a new study that pooled the best available data on the controversial topic. U.S. federal experts and several medical associations discourage screening in men 75 years or older, but say the evidence is insufficient to make sweeping recommendations for younger people. Still, many U.S. doctors still test for the disease.

MEMORY PROBLEMS NOT A NORMAL SIGN OF AGING: STUDY**VO: 25**

Mild memory problems in older people are often excused as "senior moments," but a new study has found the same changes in the brain that cause severe dementia may also be responsible for those memory lapses. The findings contradict a long-held notion that memory loss is a normal part of aging, the U.S. team said on Wednesday.

SWINE FLU CAN BECOME DRUG-RESISTANT QUICKLY: STUDY**VO: 27**

A swine flu virus infecting a woman in Singapore mutated into a drug-resistant form virtually overnight, doctors reported in a study that they say shows the limitations of using drugs to treat influenza. While the woman recovered, the mutation developed within 48 hours, rendering the infection increasingly resistant to the effects of Tamiflu, the main drug used to fight flu and which is known generically as oseltamivir.

GENE THERAPY APPEARS TO HELP PATIENT WITH ANEMIA**VO: 18**

A patient with a rare genetic form of anemia is getting by without blood transfusions after experimental gene therapy, French and U.S. researchers reported on Wednesday. The case, reported in the journal *Nature*, is a rare success for the troubled field of gene therapy, although the researchers and

other experts said it still needs fine-tuning.

NEW DIET DRUG FACES U.S. ADVISERS AMID RISK DEBATE

Arena Pharmaceuticals Inc <ARNA.O> faces a pivotal test on Thursday as U.S. government advisers consider whether to back the company's weight-loss pill amid questions about tumors in rats and other health problems reported in studies. Winning the panel's support would move the drug, lorcaserin, closer to the U.S. market. The medicine is crucial to the small San Diego-based drugmaker, which was founded in 1997 and has no approved products.

MAKING OWN MEALS MAY NOT MEAN BETTER DIET QUALITY

Young adults who have a hand in making their own meals may not eat much better than those who leave dinner to someone else, a new study suggests. In a study of 2,800 Australians between the ages of 26 and 36, researchers found little evidence that those who typically helped prepare the main meal on a workday had more healthful diets than those who left the cooking to someone else in the household.

Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio says he is ramping up his fight against illegal immigration and is calling on armed volunteers to do the patrols. Sheriff Joe is always talking about his department's efforts to crack down on illegal immigration but now he wants to commission a posse whose only job will be to enforce illegal immigration and human smuggling laws. The sheriff explains, "We have 57 different posses. I want 58." Arpaio says posse 58 will be devoted solely to illegal immigration. "I want a little specialized unit. I think it's time to do that." Details are sparse but, like the sheriff's other posses, this one will be made up of armed volunteers who will patrol rural areas looking for border crossers and human smugglers.

President Barack Obama on Friday plans to announce Wall Street critic Elizabeth Warren as a special adviser overseeing the creation of a new consumer protection agency. Warren will report to both the president and Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner (GYT'-nur). She'll have the job of starting the

consumer bureau established in the financial regulatory bill Obama signed into law earlier this year.

The ranks of the working-age poor climbed to the highest level since the 1960s as the recession threw millions of people out of work last year, leaving one in seven Americans in poverty. The overall poverty rate climbed to 14.3 percent, or 43.6 million people, the Census Bureau said Thursday in its annual report on the economic well-being of U.S. households. The report covers 2009, President Barack Obama's first year in office. The poverty rate increased from 13.2 percent, or 39.8 million people, in 2008.

TEXAS CHILD LEFT IN VAN

Police in Dallas Texas are investigating the death of a 2 year-old boy that was left in side of a hot van. Authorities say the boy was left inside of a daycare van for about six hours. The driver and another adult worker thought all the children had been dropped off at the daycare, so they parked the van and went to perform other duties. Police say that around 3:30 in the afternoon a three-year-old girl who was getting into the van to go home discovered the boy's body. Police say the girl identified the boy as Sir Anthony Smith. Paramedics transported the child to Baylor Medical Center where he was pronounced dead. Temperatures reached 92 degrees in Dallas Thursday afternoon. The van belongs to HH Banks Learning Center in Dallas, which is operated by a church. The daycare says they are closed until further notice following the investigation.

The Henry and Stark County Health Departments announce that September has been designated National Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. This year's designation is emphasizing the importance of prostate screening and testing. The National Prostate Cancer Coalition reports that one in six men will get prostate cancer, but if caught early, nearly 100 percent survive. The risk of prostate cancer increases with age and obesity. Doctors recommend annual PSA tests

after age 50. The Health Department offers the following additional facts on prostate cancer: * Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men, afflicting 1 out of every 11 American men and killing 34,000 men every year. For African-American men, the rate of affliction is even worse; African-American men have the highest incidence of prostate cancer in the world.

The private meetings are taking place at a hotel near Kennedy Airport. The groups plan to hold a news conference Monday at the site.

CHILDHOOD COLD VIRUS COULD LEAD TO DEVELOPMENT OF OBESITY

Researchers at the University of California in San Diego examined 124 children aged eight to 18 for antibodies created when their immune systems were exposed to adenovirus 36. The antibodies were found in 15 out of 67 obese children, compared with just four out of the 57 non-obese youngsters, the researchers report in the journal Pediatrics. Children who had been exposed to the virus weighed 50lb more on average. It is not clear to what extent the virus can be used to explain the epidemic proportions of western obesity when compared to other factors such as lack of exercise and poor diet. Study leader Dr Jeffrey Schwimmer said: "It is time that we moved away from assigning blame in favour of developing a level of understanding that will better support efforts at both prevention and treatment. These data add credence to the concept that an infection can be a cause or contributor to obesity."

GENE STUDIES ZERO IN ON BREAST, OVARIAN CANCER RISK

Scientists have found a region of DNA that can increase or decrease the high chance of breast cancer linked to a particular gene variant -- a finding that could help doctors keep a closer eye on women most at risk. The findings were published in Nature Genetics journal on Sunday along with two other separate studies linking this same region and four others to ovarian cancer.

SUPPLEMENTS-JOINT PAIN

A study by Swiss experts revealed that two supplements taken by millions people around the world to combat joint pain do not work. According to the team, health authorities and insurance should not cover glucosamine supplements and chondroitin, which are taken alone or in combination to reduce pain caused by

osteoarthritis in hips and knees.

ALZHEIMER-GEN

People with a Alzheimer develop specific genetic variation at a rate faster than others, U.S. researchers in a finding that could help in the search for drugs neurodegenerative disease to keep under control. Experts noted that a mutation of a gene regulates tau protein is closely linked to Alzheimer's, had a strong impact on the rate of progression of the condition.

WN CORDON BLOOD

Some companies ensure that store umbilical cord blood of newborn helps cure any disease which could develop during their lifetime. IMMIGRATION ARIZONA

A federal appeals court says it will hear arguments Nov. 1 in Arizona Gov. Jan Brewer's appeal of a ruling that put parts of the state's new immigration law on hold. Brewer asked the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco to reverse the ruling that arose out of a lawsuit by the U.S. Justice Department. Her lawyers say a judge erred by accepting speculation that the law might burden legal immigrants and by concluding that the federal government would likely prevail. Justice Department attorneys argue that the law that was designed to draw local police into the fight against illegal immigration is disrupting the United States' relations with Mexico and other countries and that the state law is trumped by federal law.

LUIS MEGID- SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

The longest recession the country has endured since World War II ended in June 2009, according to a group that dates the beginning and end of recessions. The National Bureau of Economic Research, a panel of academic economists based in Cambridge, Mass., says the recession lasted 18 months. It started in December 2007 and ended in June 2009. Previously the longest postwar

downturns were those in 1973-1975 and in 1981-1982. Both of those lasted 16 months. NBER's end date for the recession was consistent with the thinking of many private economists. The economy started growing again in the July-to-September quarter of 2009, after a record four straight quarters of declines. Thus, the April-to-June quarter of 2009, marked the last quarter when the economy was shrinking. At that time, it contracted just 0.7 percent, after suffering through much deeper declines. That factored into the NBER's decision to pinpoint the end of the recession in June

Sami Samir Hassoun was charged Monday with one count each of attempted use of a weapon of mass destruction and attempted use of an

explosive device. The 22-year-old is a Lebanese citizen who has lived in Chicago for about three years.

OBESITY COSTS

Obesity is a burden not only to health but also for the U.S. economy, especially for women, according to a new report released Tuesday. Doctors have long known that medical costs are higher for obese people in the United States but account for only a portion of the costs they face in real life.

PROHIBIT SMOKING HELPS CONTROL ASTHMA IN CHILDREN

New research shows that in public places where smoking is prohibited it prevents many children with asthma to be hospitalized, a finding that suggests that the legislation providing for smoke free places have even greater benefits to health than previously thought. Other studies have followed the decline in rates of stroke in adults after they were implemented the no smoking places.

SALMON FDA

If the Food and Drug Administration approves the engineered fish for human consumption, the agency then will have to decide the label it will carry in grocery stores. According to FDA rules, the fish will not be labeled as genetically modified if the agency decides it has the same material makeup as conventional salmon. It is still unclear whether the agency will approve the fish, which was created by a Massachusetts company and grows twice as fast as its conventional counterparts. FDA officials reviewed the science of the modified fish Monday and will hold a hearing Tuesday to discuss the labeling issue, which has many food safety and consumer groups concerned.

BREAST CANCER

MORE U.S. DOCTORS MOVING TO E-PRESCRIPTIONS: REPORT

DREAM ACT

The chance for hundreds of thousands of young people to legally remain in the U.S. evaporated Tuesday when Republicans blocked a defense spending bill in the Senate. Democrats failed to get a single Republican to help them reach the 60 votes needed to move forward on the defense bill and attach the DREAM Act as an amendment. The vote was 56-43. Arkansas Democratic Sens. Blanche Lincoln and Mark Pryor voted with Republicans. Majority Leader Harry Reid also voted to block the bill in a procedural move that allows the defense bill to be revived later. The DREAM Act allows young people to become legal U.S. residents after spending two years in college or the military. It applies to those who were under 16 when they arrived in the U.S., have been in the country at least five years and have a diploma from a U.S. high school or the equivalent.

OBAMA HEALTHCARE OVERHAUL

President Barack Obama once told Democratic lawmakers they'd be proud to campaign on historic health care legislation. Six months later, the only Democrats running ads about it are the ones who voted "no." Now, with crucial midterm elections approaching, the White House is preparing to use the law's six-month anniversary to reintroduce it to skeptical voters and trumpet new reforms that are taking effect, such as new coverage for preventive care and young adults and a ban on canceling insurance for someone who falls ill. Democrats are packaging the provisions, which kick in Thursday, as a "Patient's Bill of Rights," and Obama is advertising them Wednesday at an event in Virginia with beneficiaries.

OBAMA-ECONOMIC ADVISER

The departure of President Barack Obama's top economic adviser at the end of the year could provide the White House with an opportunity to revamp its economic team after the November elections, when voters are expected to take out their anxieties on Democrats. The White House said Tuesday that Lawrence Summers, director of the National Economic Council, would leave at the end of the year to return to Harvard University. Though administration officials said Obama had known for some time that Summers would depart this year, news of his pending exit comes amid deep concern over the sluggish pace of the recovery, as well as criticism of the team that conceived the administration's economic policies.

BELL SALARIES

The mayor, the ex-city manager and six current and former officials of the blue-collar suburb of Bell are expected to head from jail to court a day after residents of the modest city near Los Angeles celebrated their arrest. The eight were scheduled to be arraigned in court Wednesday on charges of misappropriating more than \$5.5 million in public funds. Former City Manager Robert Rizzo, Mayor Oscar Hernandez and the others were rounded up during Tuesday morning raids on their homes. Residents across the city honked their car horns, burst into cheers and staged impromptu celebrations.

TAINTED EGGS

VO: 17

The owner of an Iowa egg company says in testimony prepared for a House hearing that he was "horrified" to learn that his eggs may have sickened as many as 1,600 people in an outbreak of salmonella poisoning this summer. Austin "Jack" DeCoster and his son, Peter DeCoster, are scheduled to testify before a House Energy and Commerce subcommittee Wednesday. In testimony released by the company, the two men say they believe an ingredient sold to them by an outside supplier may be to blame for the outbreak. An FDA investigation found towers of manure and bug and rodent infestations at the farms, and an investigation by the House subcommittee found that the companies had received hundreds of positive results for salmonella in the two years before the outbreak.

NEW MEXICO ELECTIONS

Governors race out of New Mexico the Republican candidate Susana Martinez said that will repeal the law that allows illegal immigrant to have drivers licence and will revoke the licenses that have been issued. The Democratic candidate

also supports the cancelation of the drivers license. The immigration issue plays an important roll in this race. What's the future of the undocumented immigrants in this state that are now welcome.

GAYS-MILITARY

VO: 28

The U.S. Senate Tuesday blocked a measure that would let homosexuals serve openly in the military, in a setback for one of President Barack Obama's policy goals. Sixty votes were needed for debate to begin on the bill authorizing defense programs and repeal of the policy known as "don't ask, don't tell." Just 56 senators voted yes and 43 no, but the measure will probably have another chance this year.

OBESITY RATES REMAIN 'DISTURBINGLY HIGH'

Chances are slim to none that the U.S. will meet its public health goal of sharply reducing the number of obese adults by this year, according to federal health officials with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta. While just 13 percent of adults were obese in the early 1960s, more than 30 percent were by 1999. In Healthy People 2010, a series of health objectives published in 2000, the U.S. government set forth the goal of reducing the percentage of obese Americans to 15 percent by 2010.

INFANT FORMULA RECALL

Abbott Laboratories Inc <ABT.N> said it is voluntarily recalling millions of containers of its top-selling Similac powdered infant formulas after beetles were found in the products and in a Michigan plant where they are made. Abbott said on Wednesday that the recall, which could result in \$100 million of lost revenue, comes after reports by two consumers of contamination, and its inspection of an area of the plant in Sturgis, Michigan, where beetles or their larvae were found.

HEALTH CARE REFORM

LIVE INTERVIEW 2:00

Several key consumer protections under the nation's new health law begin taking effect Thursday - six months after its enactment. Insurers can no longer set a dollar limit on the amount of care they'll provide over a person's lifetime or deny coverage to sick children. Young adults can stay on their parents' health plans until age 26. And consumers get greater rights to appeal insurers' decisions.

Many people, however, will have to wait until Jan. 1 for the changes to help them. That's because most of the new provisions apply to insurance policies that begin on or after Thursday. Many plans operate on a calendar year, and this fall will begin enrollment for next year.

NORWEGIAN RESEARCH ON MAMMOGRAMS

Routine breast screening with mammograms is less effective at preventing cancer deaths than expected, Norwegian researchers said on Wednesday in a study that reignites a fierce debate over the value of screening. They said inviting women aged 50 to 69 to have routine mammograms and offering them better care from a team of experts helped cut the breast cancer death rate by 10 percent.

NATIONAL CHILDREN STUDY

The National Institutes of Health announced Wednesday that 30 new study locations are about to start recruiting for the National Children's Study, the largest, long-term look at children's health ever conducted in the United States. It aims to follow 100,000 children from before birth to age 21 to understand how the foods they eat, water they drink and chemicals they are exposed to interact with their genes to cause or prevent diseases. The study launched in Salt Lake County, along with six other locations, last year. So far, 255 Utah women have joined and 103 babies have been born into the study. The study is still in a pilot phase. Cache County is part of a test of recruitment strategies. Instead of recruiters knocking on doors, as they are in Salt Lake County, women in the half of Cache County that is eligible to participate will receive a questionnaire in the mail. Those that are interested and fit the criteria - they plan to become pregnant - will be enrolled.

ARIZONA SENATE-DEBATE

VO : 27

Republican Sen. John McCain framed the porousness of America's borders as both a national security concern and a human rights issue Sunday in the only scheduled general election debate in Arizona's U.S. Senate race. Democratic

challenger Rodney Glassman says McCain's emphasis on border security was meant to further the four-term senator's political future. The issue of America's porous borders, illegal immigration and drug violence in Mexico took center stage at the debate.

GULF OIL SPILL-INVESTIGATION

Engineering experts probing the Gulf of Mexico oil spill have exposed holes in BP's internal investigation, as the company was questioned today about its findings. In more than three hours of questioning Sunday, BP's lead investigator acknowledged that the company's probe had limitations. Mark Bly, head of safety and operations for BP PLC, told a National Academy of Engineering committee that BP's study was limited by a lack of physical evidence and interviews with employees from other companies.

FBI RAID-TERRORISM-CHICAGO

A group of anti-war activists in Chicago is planning demonstrations and rallies early in the week to protest searches of homes in Minneapolis and Chicago related to an apparent terrorism-related probe. Those homes included that of Hatem Abudayyeh, the executive director of the Arab American Action Network. The nonprofit group advocates for Arabs and new immigrants. Recently, its focus has been to combat anti-Arab and anti-Muslim sentiment.

ILLEGAL GUNS

VO:20

A report being released Monday by a mayors group finds that nearly half of the guns that crossed state lines and were used in crimes in 2009 were sold in just 10 states. Those states accounted for nearly 21,000 guns connected to crimes in other states, says the survey by Mayors Against Illegal Guns, an association of more than 500 mayors led by New York's Michael Bloomberg and Boston's Thomas Menino. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives traced more than 145,000 guns used in crimes in 2009 and found that more than 43,000 guns were sold in other states. Forty-nine percent of those guns were sold in Georgia, Florida, Virginia, Texas, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, California or Arizona.

U.S INTELLIGENCE TO SPY ON THE INTERNET

VO: 19

The government of President Barack Obama is preparing a new legislation which would facilitate law enforcement and U.S. intelligence to spy on the Internet and learn about electronic messages, such as social networking and multifunction phones like the BlackBerry, said on Monday The New York Times. EXERCISE HAS LASTING BENEFITS FOR OLDER WOMEN

Older women with thinning bones who exercise regularly have sustained improvements in their balance and walking speed that may protect them from fractures and even extend their lives, new research shows. The recession seems to be socking Americans in the heart as well as the wallet: Marriages have hit an all-time low while pleas for food stamps have reached a record high and the gap between rich and poor has grown to its widest ever. The long recession technically ended in mid-2009, economists say, but U.S. Census data released Tuesday show the painful, lingering effects. The annual survey covers all of last year, when unemployment skyrocketed to 10 percent, and the jobless rate is still a stubbornly high 9.6 percent. The figures also show that Americans on average have been spending about 36 fewer minutes in the office per week and are stuck in traffic a bit less than they had been. But that is hardly good news, either. The reason is largely that people have lost jobs or are scraping by with part-time work. "Millions of people are stuck at home because they can't find a job. Poverty increased in a majority of states, and children have been hit especially hard," said Mark Mather, associate vice president of the Population Reference Bureau.

CAFFEINE MAY NOT UP PRETERM BIRTH RISK**VO: 24**

A new analysis adds to evidence that pregnant women can have a morning cup of coffee without fearing they will raise their risk of preterm delivery. Combining the results of 22 previous studies, researchers found no evidence that pregnant women who downed the most caffeine -- roughly equivalent to three to four cups of coffee per day -- had a higher risk of preterm birth than women who avoided caffeine throughout pregnancy.

PARENTS' DRINKING MAY BE RISK FACTOR FOR SIDS**VO: 20**

Parents and caretakers who drink alcohol may put infants at a higher risk for sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), new research suggests. Researchers at the University of California-San Diego found that SIDS cases occur 33 percent more often on New Year's Day than any other day of the year, which is also
