Many major city police agencies forbid officers from inquiring into the immigration status of witnesses and suspects, a policy adopted by local officials to shield illegal immigrants from federal authorities. But the Secure Communities program has divided those cities and the politicians within them. Houston and Los Angeles are participating in the fingerprint sharing program despite such rules, and San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom opposes the efforts of the sheriff and some county supervisors to keep his city out of it. The federal program was designed to assuage such cities, Venturella said, because it doesn't require their active cooperation. The fingerprints are shared automatically, and ICE officers arrest those they intend to deport. This arrangement stands in contrast to a more active federal-local effort known as the 287(g) program, under which ICE signs agreements that allow local police to arrest and detain people under immigration laws. Few big cities participate in that program.

BP is now collecting about 11,000 barrels per day of the leak volume with a containment cap over the blown-out well, and plans to nearly double collection efforts in coming days to 20,000 barrels per day. With an eye toward the U.S. hurricane season that began June 1, BP and the U.S. government are designing an oil-collection system that can be quickly connected and disconnected in the event that stormy seas require the temporary abandonment of oil-collection efforts. BP is also preparing containment enhancements that BP Chief Executive Tony Hayward says could capture "the vast majority" of the oil. The justices on Monday unanimously reversed a federal appeals court ruling that upheld the deportation to Mexico of Jose Angel Carachuri-Rosendo. "Caruchuri-Rosendo, and others in his position, may now seek cancellation of removal and thereby avoid the harsh consequence of mandatory removal," Justice John Paul Stevens wrote for the court. He noted that immigrants may still be deported in such instances, but said immigration judges have the discretion to allow people to remain in this country.

Results monitored from control rooms on ships at sea and hundreds of miles away at the company's U.S. headquarters in Houston showed the oil staying inside the cap, rather than escaping through any undiscovered breaches, BP PLC vice president Kent Wells said on a conference call.

Utah officials said Friday they have identified at least two state workers who apparently accessed confidential documents to create a list of 1,300 purported illegal immigrants that was mailed to law enforcement officials and the news media. The employees have been placed on administrative leave.

KARLA GOMEZ ESCAMILLA. TUCSON, ARIZONA

A county medical examiner says deaths among illegal immigrants crossing the southern Arizona desert from Mexico are soaring so much this month the office is using a refrigerated truck to store some of the bodies. Pima County medical examiner Dr. Bruce Parks said Friday that the bodies of 40 illegal immigrants have been brought to his Tucson office since July 1. At that rate, he says deaths could top the single-month record of 68 in July 2005. Authorities believe the high number of deaths are likely due to above-average heat and tighter border security that pushes immigrants to more remote terrain. The deaths occur despite the efforts of the Border Patrol and humanitarian groups to help those in distress.

Most of the world's 33.4 million people who live with HIV/AIDS are in Africa, where the highest burden of HIV infection is among women younger than 30 years. The trial involved 889 women in Durban and a remote rural village in South Africa. Half the women were given the gel containing the medicine to use before and after sex, while half were given a placebo gel. After one year, the study results showed the gel lowered the risk of infection by 50% . After two-and-a-half years, the gel reduced the rate of infection by 39%. The lower level of effectiveness in the second year was associated with a drop-off in usage by women who became infected with HIV. Also, there were 54% fewer infections among those who used the gel more than 80% of the time and a 28% reduction among those who used it least. While the study used the gold standard for clinical research, some flaws would prevent applying for regulatory approval of the gel.

Utah Governor Gary Herbert is still planning to hold his immigration summit later this month, in spite of the lawsuit filed by the Department of Justice on Tuesday. Herbert wants a diverse group of Utahns to sit down and talk about how Utah should deal with the problem of illegal immigration. During its last three sessions, the Utah legislature has tried to enact stronger immigration legislation. Employer verification for public employees, state contractors and recipients of public assistance went into effect with limited success in 2008. Proof of citizenship when renewing a driver's license created long lines at the Department of Motor Vehicles when it became law in 2009. On July 1, 2010, private employers began e-verifying immigration status of employees. There is no penalty for non-compliance.

The heat from Arizona's new immigration law, considered the toughest in the country, burns far from its borders, from Florida to California, Denver to New York. City councils in many cities have considered or decided to condemn Arizona, while legislators in several states promised their own immigration enforcement bills largely copying Arizona's. All this even before the law takes effect, which if it survives legal challenges will be in late July. Here is a look at how the law has inspired reactions across the country.

TENT CITY

On a swelteringly hot day in 1993, Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio opened the doors to the nation's largest canvas incarceration compound. Tent City, as it became known, would prove to be one of Sheriff Arpaio's best known and potentially most controversial programs. Tomorrow, Sheriff Arpaio will celebrate the 17th anniversary of Tent City by another grand opening of sorts - that of SECTION 1070 - a newly created part of Tent City dedicated specifically for anyone arrested by local law enforcement agencies on or after July 29th for violating Arizona's new immigration law, SB1070. Section 1070 is set to hold up to 100 inmates convicted under the new law but is poised to grow at a rate relative to the numbers arrested by local law enforcement.

Federal officials say they are making it easier for families and attorneys to find people held in 250 immigration detention facilities around the country. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agency has created a search tool on its website similar to one used by the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Searchers can look by name or so-called "alien" numbers given to people who immigrate to the U.S. or end up in immigration custody. The detainee locator was to be running beginning at midday Friday. Some 30,000 people a day are in immigration custody. ICE has its own facilities but also contracts with local law enforcement agencies for bed space in local and state jails and prisons. Creating such a locator was one of the reforms the Obama administration proposed to make the detention system more humane and transparent.

Maricopa County Sheriff's detectives arrested five people on Tuesday in a theft identity raid at a south Phoenix business. Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio said the investigators received a tip about three months ago that at least one person working at Valley View Building Services Inc. was believed to be in the United States illegally. That employee had been working on the Fort Huachuca military base in Sierra Vista. After further investigation, investigators suspected more than 20 people could have been working illegally at Valley View Building Services, which is near 19th Street and University Drive. A warrant was served to the business Tuesday morning, and five women were arrested. Four of the women were arrested on suspicion of identity theft, and the fifth woman, who is believed to be a U.S. citizen, was arrested on a warrant in connection with failing to appear on a traffic citation. Sheriff Joe Arpaio said detectives are continuing to investigate the company, in efforts of locating up to 20 more people suspected of using false identification, who may be on other worksites.

US MULLS LESS JAIL-LIKE IMMIGRANT FACILITIES VO :24 In an agreement U.S. immigration officials hope will begin to reshape the entire 30,000-bed detention system, some asylum-seekers and immigrants awaiting deportation proceedings could soon be held in facilities where they can wear their own clothes, participate in movie and bingo nights, eat continental breakfasts and celebrate holidays with visiting family members. It could end confinement in prison-like facilities -- complete with razor wire, jail-style uniforms, armed guards and partitions that prevent physical contact with loved ones -- for those who have never been convicted of a crime and are not considered a threat.

The Supreme Court Monday extended gun rights to every state and city in the nation in a ruling involving Chicago's 28-year-old handgun ban. By a 5-4 vote and splitting along conservative and liberal lines, the nation's highest court extended its landmark 2008 ruling that individual Americans have a constitutional right to own guns to all the cities and states for the first time. The right to bear arms, under the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, previously applied to just federal laws and federal enclaves, like Washington D.C., where the court struck down a similar handgun ban in its 2008 ruling.

US COURT TO HEAR ARIZONA IMMIGRATION LAW VO :25 The Supreme Court said Monday it would hear a legal challenge by business, civil rights and immigration groups to an Arizona law that punishes employers who knowingly hire illegal immigrants. The nation's highest court agreed to decide whether the 2007 state law infringed on federal immigration powers and should be struck down. The law at issue in the case is different from the strict new Arizona immigration law passed earlier this year and criticized by President Barack Obama that requires the police to determine the immigration status of any person suspected of being in the country illegally.

President Barack Obama is meeting with activists who are pressing him for action on immigration legislation and Arizona's tough new enforcement law. The employment report for June released Friday by the Labor Department confirms that the United States is in the grips of a protracted economic slump with no recovery in sight. Hurricane Alex is not expected to make landfall until tonight or possibly tomorrow, but it's already inundating roads in Mexico. The flat, marshy region around Matamoros, Mexico, and across the border in Brownsville, Texas, is prone to flooding and forecasters say Alex could bring as much as 12 inches of rain. At latest report, the National Hurricane Center says the storm has top winds of 80 miles per hour, but those could pick up before Alex comes ashore. The nation's top civil liberties group on Wednesday issued travel alerts for Arizona, saying the state's new law cracking down on illegal immigrants could lead to racial profiling and warrantless arrests. American Civil Liberties Union affiliates in Arizona, New Mexico and 26 other states put out the warnings in advance of the Fourth of July weekend. The Arizona chapter has received reports that law enforcement officers are already targeting some people even though the law doesn't take effect until July 29, its executive director said. The alerts are designed to teach people about their rights if police stop and question them. The Arizona law requires police, while enforcing other laws, to question a person's immigration status if officers have a reasonable suspicion that the person is in the country illegally. It also makes it a state crime for legal immigrants to not carry their immigration documents and bans day laborers and people who seek their services from blocking traffic on streets.

Section 1070 is set to hold up to 100 inmates convicted under the new law but is poised to grow at a rate relative to the numbers arrested by local law enforcement.

ICE LAUNCHING WEB TOOL TO LOCATE PEOPLE

The United States added just 83,000 private-sector jobs in June, a dishearteningly low number that could add to the growing number of economists who warn that the economic recovery is stalling. Over all, the nation lost 125,000 jobs, according to the monthly snapshot of the job market released by the Labor Department on Friday. Most of the lost jobs came as temporary workers hired by the federal government to help with the census exited their jobs. The unemployment rate, based on a different survey, declined to 9.5 percent in June from the previous 9.7 percent.

Implausible offers are flourishing. There have also been big changes in how they're advertised, largely online. Scam artists know that many people are aware that work-at-home opportunities are often questionable, so the most egregious frauds "advertise that they are 100% scam-free. Americans responding to "work at home" ads helped scammers pull over \$10 million dollars from credit card accounts, according to investigators. The Federal Trade Commission revealed details of a four-year investigation into "money mules" that set up U.S.-based front companies for overseas con artists. Once these seemingly legitimate businesses were established in the names of unsuspecting accomplices, scammers used them to process credit card transactions as to millions of stolen account numbers
