TWO WORKERS FROM THE CRIPPLED NUCLEAR PLANT IN FUKUSHIMA WERE SENT TO HOSPITAL AFTER THEY WERE EXPOSED TO RADIATION. OPERATORS OF THE FUKUSHIMA DAIICHI PLANT SAID THE WORKERS HAD DEVICES TO MEASURE RADIOACTIVITY ON THEIR BODIES, BUT THEY STEPPED INTO RADIOACTIVE WATER WHICH SEEPED OVER THE TOP OF THEIR BOOTS AND SOAKED THEIR FEET UP ABOVE THEIR ANKLES. THE WATER IS BELIEVED TO BE SEAWATER THAT FLOODED THE REACTOR WHEN IT WAS HIT BY MASSIVE TSUNAMI WAVES ON MARCH 11.

=====CA-Drug-Resistant Bacteria Found in Medical Facilities Across Country Appears in Southern Cal Hospitals (20 sec)

THE L.A. COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH SAYS ROUGHLY 350 CASES OF CRKP, WERE REPORTED IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY BETWEEN JUNE AND DECEMBER OF 2010, WHICH HAS ALARMED MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS. BUT THIS NEW SUPERBUG IS NOT LIMITED TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. CRKP WAS FIRST DISCOVERED IN A NEW YORK CITY HOSPITAL AND THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL HAS BEEN TRACKING IT ACROSS 35 STATES SINCE 2009. CRKP JOINS MRSA, IN A GROUP OF BACTERIA THAT HAS BECOME RESISTANT TO TYPICAL ANTIBIOTICS.

=====SLEEP, STRESS AND WEIGHT LOSS STUDY (18 SEC)

A NEW STUDY BY KAISER PERMANENTE FOUND THAT PEOPLE TRYING TO LOSE AT LEAST 10 POUNDS WERE MORE LIKELY TO WHEN THEY SLEPT MORE THAN SIX HOURS A NIGHT, BUT NO MORE THAN EIGHT. NEARLY 500 PEOPLE TOOK PART IN THE STUDY IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST. PREVIOUS HAVE FOUND AN *ASSOCIATION BETWEEN THESE FACTORS AND OBESITY, BUT FEW HAVE LOOKED AT WHETHER THEY ACTUALLY PREDICT WEIGHT LOSS. THE PAPER IS PUBLISHED IN THE INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF OBESITY.

COMPLAINED OF THE SAME MOLDY, MUSTY ODOR. THE COMPANY SAID CONSUMERS WHO
PURCHASED PRODUCTS FROM THE LATEST RECALLED LOT SHOULD STOP USING THE PRODUCT

===== STUDY EXERCISE REVERSES MEMORY (19 SEC)

A NEW STUDY SHOWS MODERATE EXERCISE CAN INCREASE THE SIZE OF THE BRAIN'S HIPPOCAMPUS AND REVERSE MEMORY LOSS IN OLDER ADULTS. THE HIPPOCAMPUS IS IMPORTANT FOR LEARNING AND FOR THE STORAGE OF MEMORIES. THE SIZE TYPICALLY DECREASES WITH AGE. RESEARCHERS SAY THEIR STUDY SHOWS IT IS NEVER TOO LATE TO START BEING ACTIVE.

A VACCINE ENCOURAGED FOR YOUNG WOMEN APPEARS TO ALSO HAVE BENEFITS FOR BOYS AND YOUNG MEN. THE HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS, OR H-P-V, VACCINE PREVENTS CERVICAL CANCER IN FEMALES. BUT A NEW STUDY OF MALES SHOWS THE VACCINE CAN HELP PREVENT THEM FROM CONTRACTING THE COMMON SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED DISEASE AND SOME OF THE CANCERS THAT COME WITH IT. SOME 20-MILLION AMERICANS ARE CURRENTLY INFECTED WITH H-P-V.

=====NASA-NEWLY DISCOVERED PLANETS (22 sec)

AN ORBITING NASA TELESCOPE IS FINDING WHOLE NEW WORLDS OF POSSIBILITIES IN THE SEARCH FOR ALIEN LIFE, INCLUDING MORE THAN 50 POTENTIAL PLANETS THAT APPEAR TO BE IN THE HABITABLE ZONE. DURING A NEWS CONFERENCE AT NASA HEADQUARTERS IN WASHINGTON, NEW DATA FROM THE ONGOING KEPLER TELESCOPE MISSION WAS RELEASED. IN JUST A YEAR OF PEERING OUT AT A SMALL SLICE OF THE GALAXY, THE KEPLER TELESCOPE HAS DISCOVERED 1,235 POSSIBLE PLANETS OUTSIDE OUR SOLAR SYSTEM. AMAZINGLY, 54 OF THEM ARE SEEMINGLY IN THE ZONE THAT COULD BE HOSPITABLE TO LIFE - SO CALLED "GOLDILOCKS' ZONE" - THAT IS, NOT TOO HOT OR TOO COLD.

=====Processed foods may affect kids IQ (20 sec)

TOO MUCH PROCESSED FOOD AT A YOUNG AGE MAY LOWER A PERSON'S I-Q. RESEARCHERS IN BRITAIN TRACKED WHAT THOUSANDS OF KIDS ATE AND DRANK AT THE AGES OF THREE, FOUR, SEVEN AND EIGHT-AND-A-HALF. THEY FOUND WHEN A THREE-YEAR-OLD ATE A LOT OF FATTY, SUGARY, PROCESSED FOODS, THEIR I-Q WAS LOWER AT THE AGE OF EIGHT. BUT, THE SCIENTISTS DIDN'T FIND THE SAME CORRELATION IN KIDS AGED FOUR AND SEVEN. DOCTORS SAY THIS STUDY IS SOMETHING TO KEEP IN MIND, BUT THAT MANY VARIABLES ARE ALSO IN PLAY AT THESE AGES.

=====Diet Soda Linked to Heart Attack, Stroke Risk (21 sec)

PEOPLE WHO DRANK DIET SODA DAILY HAD A 61 PERCENT INCREASED RISK OF CARDIOVASCULAR EVENTS COMPARED TO THOSE WHO DRANK NO SODA, EVEN WHEN ACCOUNTING FOR SMOKING, PHYSICAL ACTIVITY, ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION AND CALORIES CONSUMED PER DAY, ACCORDING TO A STUDY OF MORE THAN 2,500 PEOPLE PRESENTED TODAY AS A POSTER AT THE AMERICAN STROKE ASSOCIATION INTERNATIONAL STROKE CONFERENCE IN LOS ANGELES. THE RESEARCHERS USED DATA OBTAINED THROUGH THE MULTI-ETHNIC, POPULATION-BASED NORTHERN MANHATTAN STUDY TO EXAMINE RISK FACTORS FOR STROKE, HEART ATTACK AND OTHER VASCULAR EVENTS SUCH AS BLOOD CLOTS IN THE LIMBS. PARTICIPANTS REPORTED THEIR SODA CONSUMPTION FOR AN AVERAGE OF 9.3 YEARS. WHILE 901 PARTICIPANTS REPORTED DRINKING NO SODA.

=====SLEEP AND HEART ATTACKS (22 sec)

A NEW STUDY OUT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF WARWICK IN ENGLAND SUGGESTS PEOPLE WHO SKIMP ON SLEEP-- LESS THAN SIX HOURS PER NIGHT--- COULD BE AT AN INCREASED RISK FOR HEART ATTACKS AND STROKES. WHEN THE BODY DOESN'T GET ENOUGH REST-- IT PRODUCES HORMONES AND CHEMICALS WHICH INCREASE THE RISK OF SERIOUS HEALTH PROBLEMS. THE FINDINGS ARE FROM A LONG-TERM STUDY BASED HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE FROM EIGHT DIFFERENT COUNTRIES. THEY ALSO FOUND THAT LACK OF SLEEP CONTRIBUTES TO HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE AND CHOLESTEROL, DIABETES AND OBESITY.

=====HIGH FIBER DIET MAY INCREASE LIFE (19 sec)

THE WALL STREET JOURNAL REPORTS PEOPLE WHO CONSUMED HIGHER AMOUNTS OF FIBER, PARTICULARLY FROM GRAINS, HAD A SIGNIFICANTLY LOWER RISK OF DYING OVER A NINE-YEAR PERIOD COMPARED TO THOSE WHO CONSUMED LOWER AMOUNTS OF FIBER, ACCORDING TO A NEW NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF HEALTH STUDY RELEASED ONLINE. OTHER STUDIES HAVE SUGGESTED THAT FIBER MAY LOWER THE RISK OF HEART DISEASE, DIABETES AND SOME CANCERS, BUT THERE'S BEEN CONFLICTING EVIDENCE ON WHETHER THERE'S ANY MORTALITY BENEFIT FROM CONSUMING FIBER. RESEARCHERS NOTE, HOWEVER, THAT IT COULD BE THAT PEOPLE WHO EAT MORE FIBER ARE HEALTHIER OVERALL-- AND ARE THEREFORE LESS LIKELY TO GET HEART AND RESPIRATORY DISEASES.

=====ENERGY DRINKS AND KIDS (16 sec)

THE AUTHORS OF A STUDY IN THE JOURNAL "PEDIATRICS" REVIEWED THE MEDICAL LITERATURE ON ENERGY DRINKS. THEY FOUND THAT BETWEEN THIRTY AND FIFTY PER CENT OF ADOLESCENTS AND YOUNG ADULTS CONSUME THESE BEVERAGES WHILE THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT LIMITS CAFFEINE

CONTENT IN SOFT DRINKS, WHICH ARE CLASSIFIED AS FOOD, NO SUCH LIMITS ARE PLACED ON ENERGY DRINKS, WHICH ARE CONSIDERED DIETARY SUPPLEMENTS. HIGH CAFFEINE CONTENT HAS BEEN LINKED TO SERIOUS BAD REACTIONS, ESPECIALLY IN CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADULTS WITH SUCH UNDERLYING PROBLEMS AS DIABETES, SEIZURES, AND MOOD DISORDERS. OF THE 5448 CAFFEINE OVERDOSES REPORTED IN 2007, FORTY-SIX PER CENT WERE IN THOSE YOUNGER THAN NINETEEN. WHAT CAUSED THE OVERDOSES WAS NOT REPORTED .

OVERWEIGHT OLDER WOMEN MAY BE LESS LIKELY THAN THEIR THINNER PEERS TO DEVELOP THE POTENTIALLY BLINDING EYE DISEASE GLAUCOMA, A STUDY SUGGESTS. RESEARCHERS FOUND THAT OF NEARLY 4,000 OLDER DUTCH ADULTS FOLLOWED FOR A DECADE, HEAVIER WOMEN WERE LESS LIKELY TO BE DIAGNOSED WITH SO-CALLED OPEN-ANGLE GLAUCOMA.

MEXICAN DRUG GANG HITMEN WERE BEHIND THE SHOOTING OF TWO U.S. IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS AGENTS, THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE WHERE THE MEN WERE ATTACKED. ONE IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT (ICE) AGENT WAS KILLED AND A SECOND WAS WOUNDED IN THE SUSPECTED AMBUSH ON TUESDAY, WHICH COMES AGAINST A BACKDROP OF SPIRALING VIOLENCE BETWEEN MEXICAN SECURITY FORCES AND DRUG CARTELS. =====TOYOTA RECALL (20 SEC)

TOYOTA MOTOR CORP. RECALLED 2.17 MILLION VEHICLES IN THE UNITED STATES TO ADDRESS ACCELERATOR PEDALS THAT COULD BECOME ENTRAPPED IN FLOOR MATS OR JAMMED IN DRIVER'S SIDE CARPETING, PROMPTING FEDERAL REGULATORS TO CLOSE ITS INVESTIGATION INTO THE EMBATTLED AUTOMAKER. THE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT SAID IT HAD REVIEWED MORE THAN

400,000 PAGES OF TOYOTA DOCUMENTS TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE SCOPE OF THE COMPANY'S RECALLS FOR PEDAL ENTRAPMENT WAS SUFFICIENT. TOYOTA HAS NOW RECALLED MORE THAN 14 MILLION VEHICLES GLOBALLY TO FIX GAS PEDALS AND OTHER SAFETY PROBLEMS SINCE 2009.

=====LOSE WEIGHT BY TURNING DOWN HEATER (23 SEC)

A STUDY IN THE INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL OF OBESITY LINKS HOME TEMPERATURE AND LACK OF SLEEP TO OBESITY. RESEARCHERS FOUND PEOPLE WHO KEEP THEIR HOMES WARMER WERE TWICE AS LIKELY TO BECOME OBESE. DOCTORS SAY IT'S POSSIBLE THE BODY BURNS MORE CALORIES IF IT NEEDS TO WORK HARDER TO MAINTAIN A STABLE TEMPERATURE. THE STUDY ALS FOUND FOR EVERY HOUR OF SLEEP PEOPLE GOT EACH DAY, THEIR ODDS OF BECOMING SEVERELY OVERWEIGHT DROPPED 30 PERCENT.

=====LIBIA LATEST PROTESTS AND CAOS (57 SEC)

PROTESTERS DEMANDING MOAMMAR GADHAFI'S OUSTER CAME UNDER A HAIL OF BULLETS FRIDAY WHEN PRO-REGIME MILITIAMEN OPENED FIRE TO STOP THE FIRST SIGNIFICANT ANTI-GOVERNMENT MARCHES IN DAYS IN THE LIBYAN CAPITAL. THE LIBYAN LEADER, SPEAKING FROM THE RAMPARTS OF A HISTORIC TRIPOLI FORT, TOLD SUPPORTERS TO PREPARE TO DEFEND THE NATION. WITNESSES REPORTED MULTIPLE DEATHS FROM GUNMEN ON ROOFTOPS AND IN THE STREETS SHOOTING AT CROWDS WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS AND EVEN AN ANTI-AIRCRAFT GUN. THE NAVY IS INVESTIGATING INTO THOSE CRUDE VIDEOS FROM AN AIRCRAFT CARRIER THAT WERE LEAKED EARLIER THIS WEEK AND THE MAN AT THE CENTER OF THE CONTROVERSY, THE SHIP'S SECOND IN COMMAND, CAPTAIN OWEN HONORS. THE NAVY IS INVESTIGATING INTO THOSE CRUDE VIDEOS FROM AN AIRCRAFT CARRIER THAT WERE LEAKED EARLIER THIS WEEK AND THE MAN AT THE CENTER OF THE CONTROVERSY, THE SHIP'S SECOND IN COMMAND, CAPTAIN OWEN HONORS. =====CANADA-10YR OLD DISCOVERS SUPERNOVA (17 sec)

A 10-YEAR-OLD CANADIAN GIRL HAS WON HERSELF A LITTLE STAR POWER FOR DISCOVERING A SUPERNOVA. KATHRYN AURORA GRAY OF FREDERICTON SPOTTED AN EXPLODING STAR ON SUNDAY WHILE LOOKING AT IMAGES OF THE NIGHT SKY SENT TO HER BY AN ASTRONOMER FRIEND OF THE FAMILY. SHE IS THE YOUNGEST PERSON EVER TO MAKE SUCH A DISCOVERY. THE IMAGES WERE TAKEN THROUGH A TELESCOPE IN THE BACKYARD OBSERVATORY OF AN ASTRONOMER. THE ROYAL ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY OF CANADA HAS CONFIRMED THE DISCOVERY AND SAYS THE SUPERNOVA WAS FOUND IN A GALAXY 240 LIGHT-YEARS FROM EARTH.

=====AUTISM STUDY FRAUD (1'30")

DR. ANDREW WAKEFIELD, THE-NOW DISGRACED BRITISH DOCTOR WHO PUBLISHED STUDIES LINKING VACCINES WITH AUTISM, COMMITTED AN "ELABORATE FRAUD" BY FAKING DATA, THE

BRITISH MEDICAL JOURNAL SAID.

THE JOURNAL'S EDITORS SAID IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE THAT WAKEFIELD MADE A MISTAKE BUT MUST HAVE FALSIFIED THE DATA FOR HIS STUDY, WHICH CONVINCED THOUSANDS OF PARENTS THAT VACCINES ARE DANGEROUS AND WHICH IS BLAMED FOR ONGOING OUTBREAKS OF MEASLES AND MUMPS. THE JOURNAL, COMMONLY NICKNAMED THE BMJ, SUPPORTED ITS POSITION WITH A SERIES OF ARTICLES BY A JOURNALIST WHO USED MEDICAL RECORDS AND INTERVIEWS TO SHOW THAT WAKEFIELD FALSIFIED DATA. FOR INSTANCE, THE REPORTS FOUND THAT WAKEFIELD, WHO INCLUDED DATA FROM ONLY 12 CHILDREN IN HIS REPORT, STUDIED AT LEAST 13 AND THAT SEVERAL SHOWED SYMPTOMS OF AUTISM BEFORE HAVING BEEN VACCINATED. Amid a number of bills filed in Texas that address the issue of illegal immigration, one, proposed by Republican state Rep. Debbie Riddle, stands out. As proposed, House Bill 1202 would create tough state punishments for those who "intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly" hire an unauthorized immigrant. Violators could face up to two years in jail and a fine of up to \$10,000. But it is an exception included in the bill that is drawing attention. Those who hire

unauthorized immigrants would be in violation of the law -- unless they are hiring a maid, a lawn caretaker or another houseworker. It is a tough immigration bill with a soft side that protects those who hire unauthorized immigrants "for the purpose of obtaining labor or other work to be performed exclusively or primarily at a single-family residence." UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS LOWEST IN ALMOST 3 YEARS

Applications for unemployment benefits fell by 20,000 last week to 368,000, the lowest level in almost three years, the Labor Department said Thursday. The four-week average for applications, considered a more reliable indicator of U.S. unemployment trends, fell last week to 388,500, the lowest figure since July 2008. Requests for unemployment benefits have fallen by 27 percent since August and there appears to be a clearly defined trend toward fewer layoffs and more hiring. In the week that ended on Feb. 19, the number of people who were receiving unemployment benefits fell by 59,000 to 3.77 million, excluding workers eligible for federally funded emergency jobless benefits. According to Labor Department figures, 9.24 million people received some type of state or federal unemployment benefit during the week that ended Feb. 12, 74,000 more than the week before. In other economic news, the Institute for Supply Management's Non-Manufacturing, or Service, index climbed to 59.7 in February, marking its 15th consecutive month in positive territory.

GEORGIA IMMIGRATION LAW

Georgia House of Representatives passed an Arizona-like immigration law on Thursday in a mostly partisan vote 113-56. Under the Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act of 2011 all employers would have to use E-verify to ensure they don't hire illegal immigrants. Right now only government workers have to be checked out by E-verify, according to federal laws. Another provision in the law would make it a felony to present false documentation when applying for a job, with a possibility of 15 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. H.B. 87 would also authorize law enforcement officers to verify citizenship and immigration status, when enforcing other laws, as long as they have a "reasonable suspicion" that the subject is an illegal immigrant. In addition, the legislation goes after those who transport and hide illegal immigrants, or in any other way encourage them to enter US without legal documents. The law would also make it more difficult for undocumented to file for unemployment or receive any other benefits funded by federal and state taxes, which is illegal under the federal law. Opponents of H.B. 87, mostly Democratic lawmakers, believe the legislation would cause racial profiling, kill jobs, and discourage tourism and foreign businesses from coming to Georgia.

UTAH IMMIGRATION REFORM

Utah lawmakers have approved an immigration package that includes an enforcement law reminiscent of Arizona's but tempered with a guest worker program for illegal immigrants. The immigration measures approved by both chambers Friday night would allow illegal immigrants to get a permit to work in

Utah. But they also include a requirement that police check the immigrant status of anyone stopped for a felony or serious misdemeanor. Supporters say the entire package balances economic needs and compassion, while opponents argue it will likely encourage more illegal immigration. Lawmakers initially balked at the enforcement measure, HB 497, because of what some viewed as a likely backlash. But sponsor Rep. Stephen Sandstrom, R-Orem, garnered enough support for passage after amending it to focus on more serious crimes.

A new survey says the average price of regular gasoline in the United States has jumped 33 cents per gallon in the last two weeks. The Lundberg Survey of fuel prices released Sunday says it's the second biggest price increase over a two-week span on record. Analyst Trilby Lundberg found in the survey completed Friday that the average national price of a gallon of regular is \$3.51. The average price for mid-grade is \$3.64, and premium was at \$3.75. IMMIGRATION PACKAGE IN UTAH

With the immigration package, passed in both chambers of the Republican-controlled Legislature late Friday, Utah made a sharp break with the hard-line trend in state immigration legislation that has been led by Arizona, which passed a strict enforcement law last April. Utah's package includes measures to tighten enforcement against illegal immigrants that echo Arizona's tough stance - like a requirement that the police check the immigration status of anyone arrested on a felony or a serious misdemeanor charge. But supporters said the hybrid package offered an alternative to states, including those controlled by Republicans, that are seeking to avoid the costly political polarization and legal challenges that followed Arizona's law and that also want to recognize the need of some businesses for immigrant labor in spite of high unemployment nationally. The guest worker bill came after intense lobbying by business and farm groups as

well as by some immigrant advocates, and it enjoyed the quiet but all-important endorsement of the Mormon Church. It is likely to raise many of the same constitutional questions as the Arizona law, including whether it intrudes on areas of immigration law reserved exclusively for the federal government. Central provisions of Arizona's law, known as S. B. 1070, were suspended by federal courts pending a lawsuit by the Obama administration.

Gas prices continued to rise Monday, driven higher for nearly two weeks straight by the turmoil in Libya, with analysts expecting prices to keep climbing. The national average price for a gallon of regular gasoline rose six tenths of a cent to \$3.509, according to a daily survey by motorist group AAA. Prices at the pump can vary widely among states, due in large part to vastly different levels of gasoline tax. Gas prices have increased for 13 days in a row, rising nearly 34 cents in that time. The highest gas prices in the nation are in California, where drivers pay an average of \$3.897 a gallon. Prices were also above \$3.80 in Hawaii and Alaska. Montana had the lowest gas prices at \$3.186 a gallon, on average. Wyoming was a close second with an average cost per gallon of \$3.189. Gas prices vary widely from state to state based largely on local tax rates. But prices have been trending higher nationwide following a rise in the price of crude oil, the main ingredient in gasoline.

Pipkin, R-Cecil, says the change was made to address a court case pending against Montgomery College for its long-standing policy of providing county tuition rates to all recent county public school graduates, regardless of immigration status.

Illinois abolished the death penalty today, more than a decade after the state imposed a moratorium on executions out of concern that innocent people could be put to death by a justice system that had wrongly condemned 13 men. Gov. Pat Quinn also commuted the sentences of all 15 inmates remaining on death row. They will now serve life in prison with no hope of parole. State lawmakers voted in January to abandon capital punishment, and Quinn spent two months reflecting on the issue, speaking with prosecutors, crime victims' families, death penalty opponents and religious leaders. He called it the "most difficult decision" he has made as governor.

The full Senate is to begin debating the bill Wednesday morning. The committee voted last week to require that illegal immigrants attend community college before they receive the in-state break at four-year universities, but questions of county residency forced them into the last-minute work session. Although the committee sent the measure to the Senate last week, supporters opted to do the rework in committee where it faces less opposition.

CANCER SURVIVORS

Nearly 12 million people in the United States are cancer survivors, almost four times as many as 40 years ago, reflecting big strides in cancer detection and treatment and the effect of an aging U.S. population, U.S. health officials said on Thursday. But many of the survivors face a lifetime of side effects caused by their treatments, according to figures released by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Cancer Institute. The researchers found there were 11.7 million cancer survivors in 2007, up from 9.8 million in 2001 and 3 million in 1971.

CALIFORNIA CHURCH ABUSE

Attorneys for hundreds of people who claim they were sexually molested by priests and religious brothers in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles are going before a judge to argue that confidential files on the priests should be made public. The plaintiff attorneys are asking a mediator judge at the hearing Thursday to recommend the release of files relating to the sexual abuse of children by priests. The release of the files has been in dispute since the archdiocese settled more than 550 cases for a record-breaking \$660 million in 2007. The plaintiffs argue that the settlement included a provision for the eventual release of the church's sealed files. But the church wants a more limited release and says disclosing the priests' confidential files violate their privacy rights and their religious freedom.

ARIZONA IMMIGRATION BILL

Bills given preliminary approval by the Arizona Senate would erect make it more difficult for illegal immigrants to find jobs and get public housing in Arizona. The Senate's action Monday represents a dry run of sorts for broader legislation targeting illegal immigration that could be considered later this week. The broader bill includes versions of both bills considered Monday. One of the bills would require public housing applicants to prove they are U.S citizens or legal residents. It also would require eviction of residents who let an illegal immigrant live with them in public housing. The second bill bars people who can't prove they are in the U.S. legally from getting a state fingerprint background check card. Those cards are needed for many work permits.

OBAMA ON EDUCATION

U.S. President Barack Obama called on Congress Monday to overhaul his Republican predecessor's signature "No Child Left Behind" education law before the next school year begins in September. Former President George W. Bush pushed for "No Child," enacted in 2002, to upgrade education by making schools accountable for students' performance and forcing reforms on schools that do not meet sets of standards. The law has been criticized as inflexible, forcing teachers to adhere to a narrow curriculum targeted mostly at ensuring that every student pass a series of standardized tests.

MARYLAND IMMIGRANT BILL

The Maryland Senate could vote during a rare night session Monday on a bill that

would allow illegal immigrants to pay in-state tuition rates at state colleges and universities. The bill modeled after the failed federal DREAM Act to require that affected students attend community college in the jurisdiction where they went to high school before qualifying for in-state tuition rates at a four-year college or university. Senators also amended the bill to require a student to spend three years in high school -- instead of two -- to be eligible for in-state tuition. Currently, 10 states allow undocumented students to pay in-state tuition.

MARYLAND IN STATE TUITION BILL

Maryland state senators on Monday signed off on legislation that would make undocumented immigrants eligible for in-state tuition benefits at the state's public colleges. After a lengthy and emotional debate, the Senate voted 27 to 20 to approve the measure, shifting one of the legislative session's most high-profile and controversial immigration bills to the House of Delegates. Sen. Victor R. Ramirez (D-Prince George's), the lead sponsor, spoke to dozens of students seated in the gallery who would benefit from the measure, and told his story of arriving legally in the United States from El Salvador at age 5. Republican opponents and some Democrats said the state should not be subsidizing the cost of higher education for illegal immigrants, and that their objections were a matter of fairness. The measure passed by the Senate is a scaled-back version of what proponents initially envisioned. It calls for Maryland high school graduates, regardless of immigration status, to initially qualify for tuition breaks only at the state's community colleges.

GOP DRAFTS LEGISLATIVE ASSAULT ON ILLEGAL IMMIGRATION

Congressional Republicans are drafting legislation that would require the federal government to develop a plan to add more fencing, sensors, agents and even drones to stop every illegal entry into the United States. The legislative effort offers another example of how a more conservative Congress has steered the immigration debate away from the Obama... administration's two-pronged push for reforms and improved border security, and toward strict enforcement of immigration laws. In December, a lame-duck House controlled by Democrats passed the Dream Act, a reform that would have created a path to citizenship for some young illegal immigrants in the U.S., but it was narrowly defeated in the Senate. The Democrats' Senate majority means the latest legislation is unlikely to pass, but the goal may be more political. Low levels of radiation have turned up in milk samples from two West Coast states. Traces of radioactive Iodine-131 were found in milk in California and Washington, according to federal and state authorities who are monitoring for contamination as the nuclear crisis unfolds in Japan. But the officials say the levels are still 5,000 times below levels of concern. The Environmental Protection Agency and the Food and Drug Administration said Wednesday that radiation was found in a March 25 milk sample from Spokane, Wash. The California Department of Public Health said on its website that a similar result was found March 28 in San Luis Obispo County.

HISPANIC LABOR FORCE INCREASE**VIVIANA AVILA - NEW YORK****PKG: 2:03**

Latinos earn less than whites or African Americans, the U.S. Labor Department says in a report released Thursday. "There are 50.5 million Latinos in the country," Labor Secretary Hilda Solis said in a conference call to present The Hispanic Labor Force in the Recovery, the first study of Latino workers at the national level. "At nearly 23 million, people of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity represented 15 percent of the United States labor force in 2010. By 2018, Hispanics are expected to comprise 18 percent of the labor force," the report says. The document said that while the recession officially ended in July 2009, overall unemployment peaked at 10.1 percent in October of that year, when joblessness among whites reached a high point of 9.4 percent. Black unemployment peaked in April 2010 at 16.5 percent, while the Hispanic jobless

rate topped out at 13.2 percent last November. Last year, 59 percent of Hispanics 16 and older had jobs, compared with 59.4 percent among whites and 52.3 percent of blacks. Black women, however, were more likely to be employed than their white or Latino counterparts. A big disparity was seen in the educational level of the employed, with 36.1 percent of whites older than 25 holding a university degree in 2010 compared to 26 percent of blacks and 16.9 percent of Hispanics.

It also includes a health program for responders sickened by the toxic debris and establishes a victims' compensation fund. Victims have five years to file claims. Thousands of firefighters, police and other rescue and cleanup workers contracted respiratory problems and other illnesses from working at the World Trade Center site in the aftermath of the attacks.

Continued job outsourcing by U.S. companies in order to cut costs and maximize profits may be keeping the U.S. unemployment rate at a high 9.8 percent. For the most part, U.S. firms are doing fine during the economic recovery. Just 4 percent of the top 500 U.S. corporations did not generate profits in 2010 while the stock market is nearing its highest level since the financial crisis began two years ago. President Barack Obama's administration plans to pull the plug on the troubled "virtual fence" project that was meant to better guard stretches of the U.S. border with Mexico, a senior lawmaker said Friday. The project, being run by Boeing

Co, has cost about \$1 billion so far and was meant to pull together video cameras, radar, sensors and other technologies to detect smugglers trying to cross the porous border. "The SBInet program has been a grave and expensive disappointment since its inception," Representative Bennie Thompson, the senior Democrat on the House of Representatives Homeland Security Committee, said in a statement which noted that the Department of Homeland Security was ending the project. Thompson said that nearly \$1 billion had been spent for only 53 miles of coverage in the project that started during the administration of former President George W. Bush. A DHS spokesman had no immediate comment and a Boeing representative was not immediately available for comment. The SBInet project has faced setbacks, missed deadlines and cost overruns. The future of the project has been in doubt for some time after bipartisan criticism by lawmakers and also from DHS Secretary Janet Napolitano.

Johnson & Johnson said Friday it is recalling nearly 47 million packages of Tylenol, Sudafed and other nonprescription drugs manufactured at a Pennsylvania facility that has already been subject to a series of massive recalls, battering the company's household brand. The latest recall affects certain lots of Tylenol, Benadryl and Sudafed products because of insufficient cleaning procedures, though the company does not believe that quality was impacted. The company also recalled certain lots of Roloids tablets because they do not include certain labeling information. The recalls are aimed at wholesalers in the U.S., the Caribbean and Brazil. Consumers do not have to take any action, the company

said. Consumers who have the products can continue using them. All of the products were made at the company's plant in Fort Washington, Pa., before it was shuttered in April following a Food and Drug Administration investigation. FDA inspectors found a slew of manufacturing problems at the plant, including equipment covered with thick layers of dust and others held together with duct tape.


