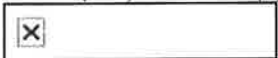

This is the fourth consecutive year of such hearings, the administrative law judge rule on the legality and technical accuracy of the notices on issues such as seniority, credentialing, among others.

Officials started reviewing the cases in the 1990s after reports that sloppy work by examiners at the FBI lab was producing unreliable forensic evidence in court trials. Instead of releasing those findings, they made them available only to the prosecutors in the affected cases, according to documents and interviews with dozens of officials. In addition, the Justice Department reviewed only a limited number of cases and focused on the work of one scientist at the FBI lab, despite warnings that problems were far more widespread and could affect potentially thousands of cases in federal, state and local courts. As a result, hundreds of defendants nationwide remain in prison or on parole for crimes that might merit exoneration, a retrial or a retesting of evidence using DNA because FBI hair and fiber experts may have misidentified them as suspects.

But Republicans never tried to block the measure. Instead they proposed removing specific references to protecting gays, lesbian and transgender people, and capping the number of visas for battered immigrants.

A federal judge declared Gov. Rick Scott's order requiring drug testing for some 85,000 state workers unconstitutional Thursday, saying the governor showed no evidence of a drug problem at the agencies to warrant testing without suspicion. The ruling marks the second blow to Scott's proposals regarding drug testing. The governor also suspended a state law he supported that required drug testing for welfare recipients last year after a lawsuit filed by the American Civil Liberties Union. A federal judge in Orlando has temporarily blocked that law. The ACLU and a government worker's union also filed a lawsuit last year challenging Scott's

order to drug test state employees, saying the testing violates the Fourth Amendment by subjecting state workers to an unreasonable search without adequate suspicion that they used drugs. Scott, who suspended drug testing for state employees in June, said he will appeal Thursday's ruling.

It should not be forgotten that, according to the American Civil Liberties Union, among those deported were 46,486 parents of U.S. citizen children expelled in the first half of 2011. This resulted in at least 5,100 of these children being placed in foster care. By comparison, the ACLU states, in the entire decade between 1998 and 2007, about 100,000 such parents were deported.

FEMALE FARMWORKERS SUFFER SEX ABUSE LUIS MEGID. SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA PKG 2:00

A new report says female immigrant farmworkers in the U.S. are commonly subject to sexual harassment and assault, in part because their immigration status makes them fearful of reporting an offender, particularly an employer. The report by Human Rights Watch included dozens of interviews with farmworkers, attorneys and advocates in seven states. The organization calls for laws to protect the workers, who "see these abuses as an unavoidable condition of agricultural work." An estimated 630,000 of the 3 million people who perform farm work are female. The study released Wednesday mirrors two previous reports that focused on California. A spokesman for the California Farm Bureau Federation says sexual harassment is a universal problem not confined to the agricultural industry, which is why laws were enacted to prohibit it.

LOS ANGELES ADOPTS 'RESPONSIBLE BANKING' ORDINANCE JAIME GARCIA. LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA PKG 1:50

Joining a growing number of municipalities, the Los Angeles City Council on Tuesday adopted a "responsible banking" ordinance that will require banks doing business with the city to disclose detailed data on loans and foreclosure activity by community. Much of the information is already reported under federal law but can be hard to find in voluminous federal banking reports, said Miguel Santana, city administrative officer. The new law would bring the information together on a city website that the public could search by census tract, he said. Banks that decline to provide the information will be deemed unqualified to bid for a piece of the city's \$6 billion in deposits and pension funds, Santana said. The law will enable the city and its residents to identify which banks are helping the community and which aren't, said Councilman Richard Alarcon, who wrote the legislation.

Kardashian, Burke and other celebrities endorsed the shoes in Skechers ads. Wednesday's settlement also involves the company's Resistance Runner, Toners, and Tone-ups shoes. Skechers made deceptive claims about those shoes, too, says the agency.

The governor had hoped to change two provisions of the law -- including one that would create a new public database of illegal immigrants who have appeared in court -- during a special session on redistricting that convened Thursday. "However, as we worked with legislators during the special session, it became clear that the Legislature did not have the appetite for addressing further revisions at this time," Bentley said in a statement. Bentley said he still had some concerns about the legislation, but said it made too many helpful changes for citizens and law-abiding businesses for him to cast it aside with a pocket veto.

Before Randy Wilson stepped in front of the camera at the DMV last Thursday, he was told to remove his glasses for his driver's license photo. Wilson, from Fargo, didn't think much of it. He figured it was probably because the camera's flash might cause a glare in the photo. As it turns out, though, it's a little bit more complicated than that. For the last two years, North Dakota has been using facial recognition software as a way to prevent driver's license fraud. Drivers like Wilson are asked to remove their glasses because the frames make it difficult for the software to identify a face. While the concept might seem like something out of a science fiction novel, it's actually pretty basic, said Glenn Jackson, director of the Driver's License Division of the Department of Transportation. The goal of the program, Jackson said, is to prevent a person from having more than one license. The software compares a new driver's license photo with old photos in the database to make sure that a driver isn't in the system under a different name.

Overall, food stamp fraud costs taxpayers about \$750 million a year, or 1 percent of the \$75 billion program that makes up the bulk of the department's total budget for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

The government's May jobs report is worse than economists had been expecting. The Labor Department says U.S. employers created 69,000 jobs in May, the fewest in a year.
