ADOLFO FRANCO –REPUBLICAN STRATEGIST- SAID THAT NOT JUST TEA PARTY MOVEMENT IS GOING TO THE RIGHT-WING ON POLITICS ALSO A LOT OF UNITED STATES PEOPLE ARE GOING THAT WAY BECAUSE THEY FEEL WORRIED ABOUT THE LACK OF JOBS AND THE FINANCIAL CRISIS.

SANTIAGO TAVARA –NOTIMEX CORRESPONDANT- CONCLUDED THIS SEGMENT SAYING THAT IDEOLOGICALLY HE IS NOT AGREE WITH THE TEA PARTY BUT ADMIRES HOW THEY HAVE BEEN DEVELOPED A WAY TO LOOK FOR NEW VOTERS AND POLITICIANS.

### **PREVIEW DEBATE CA GOVERNOR CANDIDATES LUIS MEGID / SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA PKG 2:24**

While many California voters were looking forward to the first debate between Jerry Brown and Meg Whitman today at UC Davis, Spanish-language media are anticipating another first -- the first-ever Spanish-language gubernatorial debate in California, to be held October 2 at CSU Fresno. The debate, hosted by KFTV Univision 21 Fresno, will be moderated by national Univision anchor María Elena Salinas. Univision reports that more than 21 percent of all California registered voters are Latino, and the numbers are growing: more than 46 percent of registered Latino voters in California have registered to vote in the past eight years. The latest Field Poll shows that Whitman has closed Jerry Brown's lead among Latinos to just 3 percentage points.

### **WHITMAN CONTROVERSY JAIME GARCIA / LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA PKG 2:16**

Republican Meg Whitman struggled to steady her campaign for California governor after disclosures about her former housekeeper -- an illegal immigrant - - threatened to cut into her support among Latinos just weeks before election day. The campaign that for months was dominated by talk of schools, the state's \$19 billion deficit and jobs has become a swirl of accusations pitting the word of Whitman, the billionaire former eBay chief executive, against a 39-year-old maid who worked in her home for nearly a decade.

### **CA DREAM ACT VETO VO :16**

Senator Gilbert Cedillo (D-Los Angeles) issues the following statement on Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger's veto of the California Dream Act (SB 1460): "On behalf of all the AB 504 students in California I am deeply disappointed in the Governor's veto of the California Dream Act, especially after all the time we have spent working to address his concerns. I introduced this bill five years ago and since that time we have created a coalition of supporters which includes the LA Chamber of Commerce, the University of California, the California State University and the California Community Colleges. It saddens me that the

governor has chosen to further limit access to higher education for these exceptional students who have worked so hard to achieve the dream of a college degree and a better life. This is why we must elect Jerry Brown as our next Governor, a person who understands the complexities of immigration and the residents of California."

## **WHITE HOUSE CHANGES**

### **LOURDES MELUZA/ WASHINGTON, DC**

#### **PKG 1:56**

Rahm Emanuel, President Barack Obama's high-profile chief of staff who helped push through major healthcare and financial regulatory reforms, stepped down on Friday to pursue a run for Chicago mayor. Obama praised Emanuel at a farewell ceremony at the White House. "It is fair to say we could not have accomplished what we accomplished without Rahm's leadership," he said. Pete Rouse, a long-time Obama adviser who helped orchestrate his presidential campaign, will step into the position temporarily.

## **BANK OF AMERICA FORECLOSURES**

#### **VO :22**

Bank of America says it is delaying foreclosures in 23 states as it examines whether it rushed the foreclosure process for thousands of homeowners without reading the documents. Bank of America is not yet able to estimate how many homeowners cases will be affected, a spokesman for the nation's largest bank says. A bank official acknowledged in a legal proceeding in February that she signed up to 8,000 foreclosure documents a month and typically didn't read them.

## **SCHWARZENEGGER SIGNS HEALTH BILL**

#### **VO :17**

The Governor was joined by Assembly Speaker John Pérez and Senator Elaine Alquist for the ceremonial bill signing of AB 1602 and SB 900, creating the California Health Benefit Exchange, an entity that will help California consumers and small businesses shop for and buy affordable health insurance.

## **SCHWARZENEGGER DECRIMINALIZES POT**

#### **VO :18**

Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger has signed legislation that will reduce the crime of possession of an ounce of marijuana from a misdemeanor to an infraction, handing a victory to marijuana advocates one month before November's state vote to legalize pot for recreational use. The governor's signature of Senate Bill 1449 by Sen. Mark Leno, D-San Francisco, will not reduce actual penalties for possession of small amounts of marijuana. Under California law, misdemeanor possession of less than an ounce was already punishable as infraction - with offenders facing fines of \$100. Marijuana advocates say the governor's decision

to sign the bill will significantly reduce the number of cases clogging California courts by removing the misdemeanor tag.

## **BMW RECALL**

**VO :22**

BMW of North America said Thursday it will recall nearly 200,000 luxury vehicles to fix leaks that could develop in the power braking system. The recall involves BMW 5 Series, 6 Series and 7 Series vehicles powered by V8 and V12 engines from the 2002-2010 model years and certain Rolls-Royce Motor Cars from the 2003-2010 model years.

## **NASA LAYOFFS**

**VO :23**

The company that makes rocket boosters for the soon-to-be-retired space shuttle said it laid off hundreds of employees because of uncertainty over the future of the U.S. space program. ATK Aerospace Systems dismissed 414 engineers, factory workers and other employees at three northern Utah locations, company spokesman George Torres told The Associated Press.

## **TOYOTA RECALL**

**VO :20**

Toyota says it has fixed about 3.7 million vehicles in the United States that have been part of the company's massive safety recalls. Toyota says in a progress update Monday that customer complaints about unintended acceleration made to its consumer hotline have fallen considerably since April. Toyota has been working to rebuild its reputation for safety in the wake of more than 10 million recalls worldwide. Company officials say they have completed 5 million fixes in the U.S. to recalled vehicles. About 1.3 million vehicles have received fixes for issues with sticking gas pedals and floor mat problems. Toyota says it is expanding the role of engineering teams created to investigate problems with unintended acceleration to include other problems as well.

## **TERRORISM ALERT**

**LOURDES DEL RIO- MIAMI, FLORIDA**

**PKG 2:16**

The FBI and Homeland Security Department say they have no indication that terrorists are targeting the U.S. or its citizens as part of a new threat against Europe but they warn law enforcement authorities to be on the lookout for suspicious activity, as it's more difficult to detect terror plots carried out by

individuals or small groups. On Sunday, the U.S. issued an alert to Americans living in or traveling to Europe to be vigilant because of the terror plots there.

**VERIZON PLANS \$50 MILLION REFUND TO CUSTOMERS**

**VO: 25**

Verizon Wireless admitted on Sunday it had erroneously charged customers for data services they didn't want and said it would refund more than \$50 million to those cellphone users. The announcement, among the largest customer refunds by a telecom service, comes amid complaints that users were unintentionally accessing the Web and using other data services, only to find those mistakes through extra charges on their monthly service bills. The Federal Communications Commission had been investigating the alleged practice and said Sunday it would continue its formal probe, which could lead to additional penalties on the nation's largest wireless firm. Verizon said that over several years, 15 million customers were charged from \$2 to \$6 for data services they didn't initiate. Overall foreclosure filings edged up to 930,437 in the third quarter, a 4% increase from the previous quarter. One in every 139 homeowners received a foreclosure filing during those three months. Bank repossessions, or REOs, also are on the rise. In September, a record 102,134 homes were taken back by banks. It's the first time repos have topped 100,000 in a single month. The uptick is not expected to last, RealtyTrac CEO James Saccacio said in a statement, because several major loan servicers have halted foreclosure sales pending a review of documents. Immigration officials, in an effort to deter fraud, will unveil today a new naturalization certificate for people who become U.S. citizens. The new certificates, used to obtain passports and other legal documents, come after U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) unveiled a new green card - the ID card for immigrants with permanent residency status - this year that had improved security features to prevent forgery and tampering. "They are going to be very significant" technical changes, says USCIS Director Alejandro Mayorkas, who is scheduled to present the new certificates at a naturalization ceremony in Baltimore. Mayorkas said his office doesn't track incidents of fraud for immigration documents, but the officials felt the improvements were necessary because the green cards hadn't been updated since 1998 and the last update of the naturalization certificates, in 2003, didn't add any security features. The old certificates were filled in manually and the person's photograph was just attached to it. The new computerized certificates will have all that information embedded in the document and also will have ink patterns that are harder to duplicate. The new green cards have more security features, including a personalized holographic image, a laser-engraved fingerprint of the person and improved identification technology.

### **SB1070 HEARING LUIS MEGID / SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA PKG 2:07**

A federal appeals court is hearing arguments over Arizona's request to enforce its controversial new immigration law. A three-judge panel of the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals began hearing arguments Monday from lawyers representing Arizona Gov. Jan Brewer. The Republican is appealing a lower-court ruling that put parts of the law on hold. The central theme Monday is what role local authorities can play in regulating immigration, an area largely left to the federal government to enforce. Brewer is attending the hearing in San Francisco. It started with her lawyers facing tough questions about a previous appellate ruling that rejected state regulation of immigration. When the law passed and Brewer signed it April 23, it touched off a national furor. Brewer is running for re-election Tuesday.

## **DON'T ASK DON'T TELL RULING**

A federal appeals court Monday ordered the U.S. military's ban on openly gay troops to remain in place while the Obama administration challenges a lower-court opinion declaring the "don't ask, don't tell" law unconstitutional. The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals effectively ruled that the ban should remain in effect

for the duration of a landmark legal battle that briefly forced the U.S. military to welcome openly gay recruits for the first time, then shut them out again. Monday's order extends a temporary stay the 9th Circuit issued on Oct. 20 lifting an injunction imposed the week before by U.S. District Judge Virginia Phillips when she ordered a halt to further enforcement of the law.

## **CONFUSION OVER PROGRAM TO SPOT ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS**

Several counties around the nation have voted to opt out of the program, called Secure Communities because of concerns that it could ensnare immigrants who have committed low-level offenses or chill crime-fighting cooperation between immigrants and the police. As recently as last week, the spokesman for New York State's criminal justice agency maintained that the program was optional for local governments. But federal officials now say that participation was never voluntary. The program, they say, will be up and running nationwide by 2013.

The FDA will accept comments on its proposed warnings until Jan. 9. In June, the agency will choose nine graphic images from the 36 it has proposed. More prominent warnings on cigarette packages, including larger text labels, were mandated in a June 2009 law putting the multibillion-dollar tobacco industry under the control of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

Senator Chuck Schumer is calling on the State Liquor Authority to immediately ban the sale of caffeinated alcoholic beverages such as "Four Loko." Schumer says two states, Michigan and Oklahoma have banned the drinks after several young people were hospitalized after consuming "Four Loko." Schumer says the drink, which is not FDA approved, is a toxic cocktail, containing as much caffeine as two to three cups of coffee and twice the amount of alcohol as a bottle of beer.

### **ARIZONA SMUGGLING RING BUST**

Arizona authorities say they've dismantled a major cell of a human smuggling

ring that may be responsible for the transportation of thousands of illegal immigrants from Mexico to Phoenix and other parts of the country. Fred Zumbo says the group displayed a "total disregard" for human life and that law enforcement has put a "huge dent in the human smuggling arena."

If Durham approves the resolution, city officials would accept it as a legal form of ID for business conducted with the city. Police officers would also accept it for identification purposes.

Bush. The parties agree on an extension of lower rates for individuals earning less than \$200,000 but disagree whether to extend those rates for the highest earners. Republicans say the economy cannot stomach higher taxes; Democrats say the nation cannot afford the cost of lower rates for the wealthiest taxpayers.

### **HISPANIC CAUCUS MEETING LOURDES MELUZA- WASHINGTON, DC PKG 1:49**

President Barack Obama has called on the Senate to pass legislation this year that would allow certain foreign-born young people who entered the United States as children without documents to become legal U.S. residents. Obama urged action during a meeting Tuesday with leaders of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus . The legislation, known as the DREAM Act, failed to pass the Senate in September. It would permit young people to become U.S. residents after spending two years in college or the military. It would apply to immigrants who were under 16 when they arrived in the U.S., have been in the country at least five years and have a diploma from a U.S. high school or the equivalent. Obama also called for Congress to act on comprehensive changes to immigration law "at the earliest opportunity."

### **BOEHNER NEW LEADER VO:21**

U.S. Republicans have elected John Boehner to serve as speaker of the House of Representatives when they take control in January, an aide said Wednesday. Republicans met behind closed doors to select leaders after winning control of the House from Democrats in the Nov. 2 elections.

### **PELOSI KEEPS JOB w/ DEMOC. VO:19**

House Democrats have re-elected Nancy Pelosi as their leader in the next Congress. The closed-door vote Wednesday will let the California congresswoman shift from House speaker to minority leader in January, despite concerns by some Democrats that the party needs new leadership after suffering huge midterm election losses. Pelosi has refused to take the blame and pinned party's losses on stubbornly high unemployment. Democrats also quelled a

power struggle between lieutenants Steny Hoyer of Maryland and James Clyburn of South Carolina, who vied to be Pelosi's second-in-command. Hoyer was poised to be the Democrats' vote-counting whip, and Clyburn will serve in a newly created position as the House's No. 3 Democrat.

## **WHITMAN SETTLEMENT**

### **VO:24**

Former California gubernatorial candidate Meg Whitman agreed Wednesday to provide her former housekeeper with \$5,500 in unpaid wages to settle a dispute that erupted after it was revealed the woman was an illegal immigrant. Whitman and her husband Dr. Griffith Harsh IV did not admit any wrongdoing while agreeing to the settlement at a two-hour closed meeting at the California Division of Labor Standards Enforcement. "The larger message is that if you're Meg Whitman or a small employer or anyone else -- if you hire someone, you need to pay them the wages for the hours that they worked. And there are no exceptions," said Gloria Allred, the celebrity attorney representing Nicky Diaz Santillan, Whitman's housekeeper for nine years.

## **HARRY REID DREAM ACT**

### **VO:22**

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid announced late Wednesday that the Senate will proceed with votes in the lame-duck session on two Democratic priority issues the ban on gays serving openly in the military, and legislation to allow a path to citizenship for young illegal immigrants. Reid's decision to pursue both items indicates Democrats are unwilling to cede their top issues despite overwhelming Republican gains in the midterm elections. Both issues face opposition from Republicans Reid said the vote on repealing "don't ask, don't tell" will be brought forward with the Defense authorization bill after Congress returns from the Thanksgiving

## **DREAM ACT PROTEST ARRESTS**

### **VO: 24**

Six illegal immigrants, including a Cal State San Bernardino student and a graduate of UC Riverside, staged a sit-in Wednesday at John McCain's Washington office to get the Arizona senator's commitment to a path-to-citizenship proposal he has supported in the past. Police arrested four of the protesters for refusing to leave after a brief conversation in which McCain did not acknowledge previously supporting the DREAM Act, which offers citizenship to certain youths who serve in the military or graduate from college. The foursome, which does not include the Cal State student, potentially face deportation. Similar protests have led to arrests but not deportation.

Some have called for his resignation while others have rallied to his defense.

US President Barack Obama celebrated on Thursday the return of a rejuvenated General Motors to the US stock market, saying it showed some of the "tough decisions that we made" during the financial crisis were beginning to pay off. Speaking in the White House briefing room, Obama said "American taxpayers are now positioned to recover more than my administration invested in GM, and that's a good thing." General Motors stock began trading on Wall Street again on Thursday, signalling the rebirth of an American corporate icon that collapsed into bankruptcy and was rescued with a 50 billion (b) US dollar infusion from taxpayers. The stock rose sharply at first, rising to nearly 36 US dollars per share from the 33 US dollar price GM set for the initial public offering, before pulling bck and closing at 34.19 US dollars. The trading - more than 400 million GM shares traded hands during its debut on the Big Board - helped reduce the federal government's stake in the company from 61 percent to about 36 percent. For the US to break even on its investment, it must sell its remaining stake for about 50 US dollars a share.

**RANGEL SENTENCING****VO: 24**

The House ethics committee is recommending that 20-term Rep. Charles Rangel of New York be censured and pay any unpaid taxes for financial and fundraising misconduct. The House will likely consider a censure motion after Thanksgiving. If it passes, Rangel would suffer the embarrassment of standing before his

colleagues and receiving an oral rebuke by the speaker. The five Democrats and five Republicans deliberated for several hours behind closed doors Thursday. Earlier, at a sanctions hearing, Rangel apologized for his misconduct but said he was not a crooked politician out for personal gain.

A new report shows the boycott of Arizona in the wake of a controversial immigration law has cost the state more than \$140 million. The analysis commissioned by the Center for American Progress says lost hotel revenue in the first four months after the bill signing was about \$45 million. The state also lost \$96 million that visitors would have spent during their stays. The study released on Thursday says meetings and conventions will probably continue to be lost for more than a year. That will multiply the impact of a boycott called by immigrant-rights groups after Republican Gov. Jan Brewer signed the state's new law in April. The study was paid for by the group, a liberal-leaning think tank, but conducted by the respected Scottsdale-based economic firm Elliott D. Pollack & Co. He will talk to businesses affected by it, analyst and will get reactions of people that are in favor of the law.

## **MARRIAGE POLL**

Marriage is increasingly optional and could be on its way to obsolescence, according to a survey of more than 2,600 Americans that examines changing attitudes about relationships today. Among the 2,691 adults surveyed by the Pew Research Center last month, 39% say marriage is becoming obsolete, up from 28% who responded to the same question posed by *Time* magazine in 1978. "If four in 10 are saying it's becoming obsolete, they're registering an awareness of a very important social change," says Paul Taylor of Pew. "It doesn't necessarily mean marriage is about to disappear or has disappeared." Census data reflect a declining percentage of married adults: 54% in 2010, down from 57% in 2000 and 72% in 1960. At the same time, the median age at first marriage increased in 2010 to its highest ever - 28.2 for men and 26.1

for women, according to Census. That's up from 26.8 and 25.1 in 2000.

Controversial new pat-downs and full-body scanners will be tested as Americans flock to airports for holiday travel. For some travelers, thanksgiving will be their first taste of this - new measures some call intrusive, others ineffective. But, TSA officials say it's working. Body scanners have already captured passengers trying to smuggle marijuana, whiskey, even knives. The head of the Transportation Security Administration says the close-quarter body inspections causing a furor among some passengers and pilots are unavoidable in a time of terrorist threats. John Pistole says he understands public distaste for more intense security procedures, particularly hand pat-downs. He called it a "challenge" for federal authorities and airport screeners. But Pistole said the attempted bombing of a U.S. bound plane last Christmas and the effort to ship packages with bombs to this country on cargo planes more recently makes tougher security necessary.

## **TOYOTA LITIGATION**

A federal judge tentatively ruled Friday he would leave intact the bulk of a consumer class-action case against Toyota seeking damages for economic losses stemming from complaints about cars that raced out of control. In a key setback for the automaker, the judge held that Toyota car owners stand to recover any compensation awarded under the lawsuit for lost resale value regardless of whether they personally experienced sudden unintended acceleration. That ruling, if finalized in a written order expected next week from U.S. District Judge James Selna in Santa Ana, California, would leave the size of

the prospective consumer class at roughly 40 million individuals, plaintiffs' lawyers said.

The new fee schedule increases application and petition fees by an average of about 10 percent but does not increase the naturalization application fee.

Half of Americans say the enhanced passenger security patdowns at U.S. airports go too far, according to a poll published Tuesday just before the busy holiday travel season. But nearly two-thirds of those surveyed in the Washington Post-ABC News poll support the new full-body security-screening machines at the airports, as most say they put higher priority on preventing terrorism than protecting personal privacy. The poll found that 50 percent said the new patdown searches were unjustified, while 48 percent supported them and 2 percent had no opinion. The recently adopted screening methods that have drawn complaints from passengers and lawmakers in Congress rely on highly revealing full-body imaging scanners and physical patdowns for travelers who choose to opt out of the scans. Airlines expect 24 million people to travel over the Thanksgiving holiday period. Airlines say they have passed along passenger concerns to the Transportation Security Administration, the agency responsible for the new procedures.

The Mexican government is telling migrants driving home for the holidays that they should form convoys for their own safety while traveling through Mexico. Mexico is experiencing unprecedented levels of drug cartel violence in some border areas, making it dangerous to travel on some highways, particularly those in the Gulf coast state of Tamaulipas and some leading to the northern city of Monterrey. In the past, those routes have been heavily used by migrants returning to their hometowns. Migrants have also been targeted in the past by common criminals for robberies or extortion because they often bring new vehicles, cash or appliances with them.

Truvada, reduced HIV infections by an average of 44% among gay and bisexual men who took the drug, compared with those taking a placebo. Men who reported being the most diligent about taking their pill each day reaped an even bigger benefit, reducing their risk by 73%.

**OEA IMMIGRATION REPORT**

The fact that U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) granted you authorization to work legally in the U.S. while your adjustment of status (AOS) application is pending does **not** mean that it is safe for you to travel abroad just yet. You did not specify your status before you married a U.S. citizen, but we assume, since you have not been home in a while, that you currently are undocumented. If you have been unlawfully present in the U.S. for 180 days to a year and you travel abroad (including even a day trip to Canada or Mexico) before you are granted legal permanent resident status, you face a three-year bar from reentering the U.S. Unlawful presence for a year or more triggers a ten-year bar. These bars would apply to you despite your marriage to a U.S. citizen and pending AOS application. Likewise, the fact that you may have U.S. citizen children who were born here does not alter the situation. Therefore, it is crucial that you remain in the U.S. until you are granted legal permanent resident status at or after your green card interview in the USCIS offices here. Then you will be able to travel abroad for periods of up to six months and return to the U.S. with no problem and no need to apply for permission. Note: a green card holder who travels abroad for more than six months is in a different situation and should obtain legal advice before such a trip.

**ORGAN DONOR**

Organ donation is the process of giving an organ or a part of an organ for the purpose of transplantation into another person. In order for a person to become an organ donor, blood and oxygen must flow through the organs until the time of recovery to ensure viability. This requires that a person die under circumstances that have resulted in an irreparable neurological injury, usually from massive trauma to the brain such as aneurysm, stroke or automobile accident. Only after



all efforts to save the patient's life have been exhausted, tests are performed to confirm the absence of brain or brain stem activity, and brain death has been declared, is donation a possibility. The state donor registry is searched to determine if the patient has personally authorized donation. If the potential donor is not found on the registry, his or her legally authorized representative (usually a spouse, relative or close friend) is offered the opportunity to authorize the donation. Once the donation decision is established, the family is asked to provide a medical and social history. Donation professionals determine which organs can be transplanted and to which patients on the national transplant waiting list the organs are to be allocated.

### **IMMIGRANTS JOB LOSSES**

New data compiled by the Census Bureau reports that 13.1 million immigrants, both legal and illegal, arrived in the United States in the past decade. During that period, there was an overall net decline of 1 million jobs in the nation. According to the report *Immigration and Economic Stagnation: An Examination of Trends 2000 to 2010*, approximately 2.4 million new immigrants settled in the U.S. in 2008 and 2009, while 8.2 million jobs were lost during that same period. The Census Bureau concluded that - without a change in immigration policy - the level of immigration can remain high even in the face of massive job losses. The agency reports that 12.1 million immigrants came to the United States during the 1990s, but net job growth was around 21 million during that decade. According to *FOX News*, proponents of tougher immigration laws are attempting to rally support for ballot initiatives in California and Iowa. Many individuals in those states would like to see a law similar to Arizona's, which allows authorities to check the immigration status of anyone they suspect may be in the country illegally.

The White House is condemning the new leak of hundreds of thousands of secret documents. Wikileaks published the first 219 of 251,587 diplomatic cables between the State Department and more than 270 American diplomatic outposts around the world. Some of the most interesting documents are about Iran, depicting Arab leaders practically begging the U.S. to prevent the Iranian government from getting nuclear weapons. The foreign minister of the United Arab Emirates says "Ahmadinejad is Hitler" and tells a top state department official that "the threat from Al-Qaida would be minor if Iran has nukes." The U.S. government is taking steps to make sure such a massive leak of classified information does not happen again.

**OBAMA PAY FREEZE****LUIS MEGID/ SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA****PKG**

President Barack Obama announced a pay freeze for 2 million federal employees Monday and warned the American public that the move is the first of many difficult decisions that must be made to slash the nation's mounting deficits. "The hard truth is that getting this deficit under control is going to require some broad sacrifice, and that sacrifice must be shared by the employees of the federal government," Obama said. The two-year freeze would apply to all civilian federal employees, including those working at the Department of Defense, but would not affect military personnel. The freeze, which requires congressional approval, is expected to save more than \$5 billion in savings over two years, \$28 billion over five years and more than \$60 billion over 10 years, White House officials said. Congress is not covered by Obama's order, but lawmakers voted last April to freeze their pay, with the House and Senate opting to forgo an automatic \$1,600 annual cost-of-living increase. House members and senators now are paid \$174,000 a year. Their last pay increase was \$4,700 a year at beginning of 2009.

It's the most wonderful time of the year, at least when it comes to shopping deals. Cyber Monday is no exception, yet there are countless deals waiting to be found throughout this holiday period online. U.S. retailers from Amazon.com Inc to Target Corp offered steep online discounts to shoppers on Cyber Monday, aiming to win additional sales after a strong start to the holiday shopping season over the weekend. Shares of Amazon rose as much as 2.6 percent to an all-time high of \$181.84, while smaller rival Overstock.com surged 8.1 percent and Web jeweler Blue Nile gained 5.3 percent on indications of strong traffic to retail

sites. The Monday after the U.S. Thanksgiving holiday was dubbed Cyber Monday five years ago to get consumers to focus on online shopping. But retailers have been increasingly offering online deals on Thanksgiving Day and over the holiday weekend as well. "I would expect Cyber Monday to be as strong as sales were this weekend," said Maggie Taylor, a senior credit officer with Moody's Investors Service. ### **TAX CUTE VOTE LOURDES MELUZA- WASHINGTON, DC PKG: 2:00**

House Democratic leaders had planned to hold a final vote on the tax package for this evening, but it's looking like that could slip amid a dispute over terms of the debate. Some Democrats want to make changes to the package President Barack Obama negotiated with Republicans, and vote is expected on imposing a higher estate tax. Such a change could derail the bill, but Democratic leaders are leaving the arm-twisting to the White House. Obama is urging the House to pass the bill as is, so he can sign it into law before a sweeping series of tax cuts expires at the end of the year. New York Democrat Louise Slaughter, who chairs the House Rules Committee, says it's "a vote people are making for their consciences." And California Democrat Xavier Becerra (hahv-YEHR' beh-SEH'-rah) says Obama "has been working it hard." Still many Democrats, even critics of the bill, are resigned to it ultimately passing with the lower estate tax. The Senate passed it yesterday by a 81-19 vote.

### **DREAM ACT VOTE VO: 26**

Faced with the prospects of having to literally read the full 1924 pages of an omnibus spending bill, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-Nev.) chose on Thursday night to pull the measure in favor of a continuing resolution to keep government funding. Republicans, presented with the news, could barely hide their glee. "Did we just win?" asked newly elected Sen. Mark Kirk (R-Ill.), a rhetorical question that seemed to engender sharp rebukes from Democrats. Kirk was directing his remarks to Sen. John McCain (R-Ariz.), who had chastised the spending bill as a pork-filled "monstrosity" before relating his sadness at no longer being able to make examples out of the earmarks in the measure. That, of course, was a rather one-sided if not unfair description of the bill. And what McCain left out of his remarks was the fact that Republican Senators had inserted their own earmarks into the legislation. Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-Ky.), who said his preference was for a one-page "clean" substitute, had more than \$100 million dollars worth in spending earmarks in the measure. The Minority Leader had also rather than a continuing resolution before

the November election.

## **DREAM ACT STUDENTS GRADUATION VICTOR HUGO RODRIGUEZ-PHOENIX, AZ**

Janet Murguía, President and CEO of NCLR (National Council of La Raza), the largest national Latino civil rights and advocacy organization in the United States, today joined a cross-section of distinguished Latino leaders from across the political spectrum, as well as in business, government, public service, entertainment, and sports, in sending a letter to the leadership of the U.S. Senate urging them to pass the "Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors (DREAM) Act." This legislation would allow undocumented youth who have grown up in this country the opportunity to achieve conditional legal status and eventually earn the ability to apply for citizenship if they attend college or serve in the military. "America cannot afford to lose another generation of young people who stand to contribute to its economic and social prosperity," read the letter addressed to Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid and Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell.

## **AFGHANISTAN EVALUATION LOURDES DEL RÍO-MIAMI, FL**

President Barack Obama's expansion of the war in Afghanistan has eroded the power of the al-Qaida terrorists who attacked America in 2001 and the resurgent Taliban militants who gave them cover, according to his own government's review. The findings ensure that Obama will stay the course, with U.S. forces to remain at war through 2014. U.S. troops will begin to leave Afghanistan in July, according to the report, the same timeline that Obama promised one year ago and has consistently upheld in recent weeks. But the scope and pace of that withdrawal remain unclear, and both are expected to be modest, given the enormity of the security and governance challenges in Afghanistan. All the findings will be tested in the months and years to come. They form the basis not just of Obama's war strategy but also his credibility with the American people on how this long, costly war is going and when it will end. The United States and its NATO allies hope to turn control of the Afghanistan conflict to that nation's own forces by the end of 2014, a timeline endorsed in the new review. Even then, Obama envisions an enduring U.S. role in Afghanistan. The White House on Wednesday evening released a five-page summary of the newly finished, classified evaluation of the war strategy for Afghanistan and Pakistan that Obama unveiled to much fanfare in December 2009.

## **AL QAEDA CHRISTMAS THREATS VO: 20**

Al Qaeda is planning attacks in the United States, Britain and Europe around Christmas, one year after a failed attempt to bomb a U.S.- bound passenger plane, a senior Iraqi official said Thursday. Major General Dhiya Hussein, the interior ministry's counter-terrorism chief, said a captured militant from the Iraqi wing of al Qaeda revealed the plot during interrogations. The insurgent was among a group of 39 men arrested in a widespread swoop on top militants last month, he said. Authorities say last month's raids, which led to the arrest of one of al Qaeda's top officers in Iraq as well as its leadership in the western province of Anbar, dealt a blow to the group's local affiliate, the Islamic State of Iraq. "One of the (men) confessed that ISI will execute attacks inside the United States, Britain, and Europe," Hussein said. "They were making preparations for this goal." He said Iraq had informed the affected countries, and said U.S. interrogators had already spoken to the insurgent.

President Barack Obama signed into law a huge, holiday-season tax bill extending cuts for all Americans on Friday, saluting a new spirit of political compromise as Republicans applauded and liberals seethed. The most significant tax legislation in nearly a decade will avert big increases that would have hit millions of people starting in two weeks on New Year's Day. It also offers 13 months of extended benefits to the unemployed and attempts to stimulate the economy with a Social Security payroll tax cut for all workers.

The U.S. Senate is expected to cast a crucial vote Saturday on the DREAM Act, which would pave the way for possibly hundreds of thousands of undocumented immigrants to legalize their status. And both opponents and supporters of the DREAM Act cranked up their arguments Friday, with Republican congressional leaders sending out a long list of reasons why the measure would be harmful for the country, and Democrats countering that not passing it would be detrimental. Even Department of Homeland Security officials, including the heads of the main

immigration agencies, joined the down-to-the-wire blitz, urging the passage of the DREAM Act. Thursday night, Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, D-Nev., scheduled the vote on the highly controversial measure, which would make undocumented immigrants younger than 30 years of age eligible for conditional legal status if they meet a strict set of criteria. The so-called cloture vote would not be on the bill itself, but on whether to move toward a debate and then vote on the bill. UK tourists stranded in New York were facing the prospect of Christmas away from home, as snow and freezing temperatures grounded flights across northern Europe on Monday (December 20). Only one of two runways at London's Heathrow airport -- the world's busiest international airport -- was operating after a weekend snowstorm, forcing thousands to camp out in terminals. At the British Airways Terminal at New York's JFK Airport, frustrated passengers said they were running out of patience - and not to mention, cash. Karina and Jennifer Flack from Cambridge, England, said they couldn't afford to stay in a hotel while their flights were delayed, and came to the airport to see if they could catch an earlier flight. "We were supposed to get home on Sunday night, but our flight got cancelled. We've managed to get a flight for Wednesday but we can't afford to stay in a hotel, so we've come to hopefully get some answers. Because we can't get through on the phones, or even on the Internet now," Karina said. The siblings said they hoped the weather conditions would ease soon.

## **POLITICAL REDISTRICTING DUE TO CENSUS RESULTS**

The 2010 census report coming out Tuesday will include a boatload of good political news for Republicans and grim data for Democrats hoping to re-elect President Barack Obama and rebound from last month's devastating elections. The population continues to shift from Democratic-leaning Rust Belt states to Republican-leaning Sun Belt states, a trend the Census Bureau will detail in its once-a-decade report to the president. Political clout shifts, too, because the nation must reapportion the 435 House districts to make them roughly equal in population, based on the latest census figures. The biggest gainer will be Texas, a GOP-dominated state expected to gain up to four new House seats, for a total of 36. The chief losers New York and Ohio, each projected by nongovernment analysts to lose two seats were carried by Obama in 2008 and are typical of



states in the Northeast and Midwest that are declining in political influence. Democrats' problems don't end there. November's elections put Republicans in control of dozens of state legislatures and governorships, just as states prepare to redraw their congressional and legislative district maps. It's often a brutally partisan process, and Republicans' control in those states will enable them to create new districts to their liking.

## **GAYS IN MILITARY**

The White House says President Barack Obama will sign the repeal of the military's ban on openly gay service members on Wednesday morning at a Department of Interior auditorium. With a stroke of his pen, the president will end the Pentagon's 17-year, "don't-ask, don't tell" policy. In repealing the ban, Obama will fulfill a 2008 presidential campaign promise. Press secretary Robert Gibbs would not say how long it would take for the administration to implement the repeal. But he said he didn't expect it to be "overly burdensome." In letters to the troops over the Weekend, the four military service chiefs warned that the ban is still in place, and will be for some time To come.

## **TOYOTA RECALL**

Toyota Motor Corp. has agreed to pay the government a record \$32.4 million in additional fines to settle an investigation into its handling of two recalls at the heart of its safety crisis. The Transportation Department said late Monday the civil penalties will settle investigations into how Toyota dealt with recalls over accelerator pedals that could get trapped in floor mats, and tearing relay rods that could break and lead to drivers losing control. The latest settlement, on top of a \$16.4 million fine Toyota paid earlier in a related investigation, brings the total penalties levied on the company to \$48.8 million. It caps a difficult year for the world's No. 1 automaker, which recalled more than 11 million vehicles globally since the fall of 2009 as it scrambled to protect its reputation for safety and reliability. Toyota's board of directors agreed to pay the fines on Tuesday at the company's board meeting in Japan, according to an official familiar with the case, and the company said it agreed to the penalties without admitting to any violations of U.S. laws.

## **HOLIDAY HEART SYNDROME LUIS MEGID- SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA PKG 1:40**

The term "holiday heart syndrome" was coined in 1978 when researchers

detected heart rhythm abnormalities in 24 study participants, none of whom had a history of heart disease. What they all did have was too much to drink, too fast. Since then, several studies have confirmed alcohol's heart rhythm-disturbing effects. The most common abnormal heart rhythm, atrial fibrillation, occurs when the upper heart chambers quiver instead of contracting regularly. Although it's often asymptomatic, it can lead to congestive heart failure or stroke. As the moniker suggests, holiday heart syndrome peaks on weekends and at holidays. Although alcohol alone can derail normal heart rhythms, its effects are exaggerated when mixed with caffeine. Rimmerman warned against the popular practice of mixing alcohol with energy drinks, calling it a "very bad combination."

The Transportation Security Administration "is carefully monitoring information related to terrorist tactics" in coordination with other nations, TSA spokeswoman Sterling Payne said in a statement Thursday. "The possible tactics terrorists might use include the concealment of explosives inside insulated beverage containers, so in the coming days, passengers flying within and to the U.S. may notice additional security measures related to insulated beverage containers."

**ONLINE HOLIDAY SHOPPING JUMPS 15 PERCENT TO \$36.4B****VO: 20**

Online spending rose 15 percent during the holidays, new data shows, as more Americans responded to online sales and free shipping offers and shifted more of their dollars online. Total online sales between Oct. 31 and Thursday rose 15.4 percent to a record \$36.4 billion, compared with \$31.5 billion a year ago, according to figures released Thursday from MasterCard Advisors' SpendingPulse, which tracks spending across all transactions including cash. Several categories, including clothing and electronics, gained share of overall category sales as well. "Americans are really changing way that they shop and the way they spend," said Michael McNamara, vice president of research and analysis for SpendingPulse.

The wireless company planned to release the video today, before New Year's Eve. The timing is aimed, the company said, at showing that texting and driving deserves to be considered as dangerous as drunk driving. The documentary includes intense, sometimes disturbing, images, including that of Ms. West, as she spent her last minutes alive on a breathing tube. Research from the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute shows that motorists who text face a 23 times greater risk of crash or near crash. Other wireless carriers, like Verizon Wireless,

## **MORE JOBS FOR 2011**

A new CareerBuilder survey finds that more employers plan to add full-time workers in 2011 compared to 2010. The survey found that new hiring is more likely "in technology and revenue-producing fields." "More than half of employers reported they are in a better financial position today than they were one year ago," Matt Ferguson, CEO of CareerBuilder, said in the survey statement. "2011 will usher in a healthier employment picture as business leaders grow more confident in the economy. ## **FLU CASES UP**

Flu season appears to be picking up. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says five states had widespread reports of flu last week, up from zero

two weeks earlier. ACDC report released Thursday says four of the states were in the South -- Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia and Virginia. The other was New York. The report also says that tests of about 120 virus samples show the circulating flu strains seem to be well-matched to this season's flu vaccine. Health officials say an estimated 23,600 flu-related deaths occur each year.

## **UNEMPLOYMENT FIGURES**

New U.S. claims for unemployment benefits dropped more than expected last week to their lowest level in more than two years, suggesting the labor market recovery was gaining strength. Initial claims for state unemployment benefits fell 34,000 to a seasonally adjusted 388,000, the lowest reading since early July 2008, the Labor department said Thursday. That was well below economists' expectations for 415,000. The prior week's claims figure was revised modestly up to 422,000 from the previously reported 420,000. A Labor Department official said there was nothing unusual in the state-level data and described the report as clean. The four-week average of new jobless claims, considered a better measure of underlying labor market trends, fell 12,500 to 414,000, the lowest level since the week ending July 26, 2008.

## **DEPORTATION NUMBERS**

### **VO:24**

A record number of immigrants were deported from the United States in 2010 and the year also has been marked by the expansion of the Secure Communities program of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, which identifies imprisoned undocumented foreigners. During Fiscal Year 2010, ICE deported 392,862 undocumented foreigners, of whom more than 195,000 were convicted criminals, an increase of more than 23,000 deportations - including 81,000 people with criminal records - compared with 2008. In 2009, deportations totaled 389,834 and the goal for 2011 is 404,000. ICE broadened the Secure Communities program, a biometric technology effort that compares the fingerprints of people being held in local jails with those in ICE and FBI databases. Up through November 2009, the one-year anniversary of the implementation of the measure, which operated at that time in 95 detention centers in 11 states, John Morton, the Homeland Security assistant secretary for ICE, announced that Secure Communities had detected 11,000 undocumented foreigners accused of major crimes such as murder, rape and kidnapping. Currently, the program is operating at 891 incarceration centers in 35 states.

### **DREAM ACT, WHAT'S GOING ON LOURDES MELUZA/ WASHINGTON, DC PKG 2:30**

Late last night, Majority Leader Reid (D-NV) filed a new version of the DREAM Act with the aim of attracting broader support for DREAM to get the requisite 60 votes to pass the Senate. With the filing of this new bill, the anticipated date for bringing DREAM to a vote will be delayed. The earliest Reid could file a cloture motion on the new bill would be this coming Thursday. After waiting out the requisite 30 hours post-cloture, it could "ripen" over the weekend, and effectively come up for a vote on Monday at the earliest. The new version addresses many of the concerns raised by Republicans and tightens the restrictions on eligibility in several respects. Shoppers might have just been lured by discounts, pulling forward sales from December.

The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals heard nearly three hours of arguments Monday during a televised hearing that reached a nationwide audience anxious for a final decision on whether voter-approved Proposition 8 and similar same-sex marriage bans

violate the U.S. Constitution. The judges appeared troubled over whether they could recognize marriage as a civil right for all same-sex couples or only those in states that already grant gays the rights of marriage without the title.

Toyota Motor Corp said Monday it would recall about 110,000 of the 2011 Sienna minivans due to a risk that drivers could damage the brake system as they use the parking brake. The Sienna is an all-new model. Toyota said it was not aware of any accidents or injuries related to this issue, and that it would notify owners in January of the problem. But the fix will be delayed until replacement parts are available in February, Toyota said, when it will ask owners to bring the minivans to dealers for installation of new parts. Toyota said that in some cases drivers had damaged a bracket connected to the brake lights by pressing on the parking brake. That could cause the brake lights to stay on, or in some cases cause the vehicle's regular brake to be partially engaged at all times, causing noise and vibration.

President Barack Obama's tax plan got a boost on Tuesday when a top Democrat in the House, where the plan faces its stiffest resistance, said there were "compelling reasons" to back it. The bullish comments from Democratic Majority Leader Steny Hoyer signaled opposition is dissipating among Democrats who believe that Obama's \$858 billion tax deal, brokered with the opposition Republicans, is too generous to the wealthy. The Senate cleared a key procedural hurdle on Monday, with a bipartisan group of 83 of the 100 members voting in favor of moving the bill forward. A vote in the Senate was expected late on Tuesday or shortly after midnight on Wednesday, with the House taking up the measure during the day Wednesday. Bush only on household income of up to \$250,000. But Democrats lost control of the House and saw their margins shrink in the Senate in the Nov. 2 elections, pushing Obama to strike the deal before the bolstered Republicans take more power in January.

The Senate Wednesday overwhelmingly passed a sweeping tax package that would save millions of Americans thousands of dollars in higher taxes while also reducing their Social Security taxes and extending jobless benefits. President Barack Obama swiftly urged the House to pass the \$858 billion bill without changes, a slap at Democratic liberals eager to toughen a part of the measure that permits up to \$10 million to pass to heirs estate tax-free. The House has voted to repeal the "don't ask, don't tell" policy that has stifled the service of gays in the military. The strong House vote to end the policy that since 1993 has barred openly gay people from military service shifts the debate to the Senate. President Barack Obama and others trying to repeal the policy are anxious to get a vote this year. Their concern is that Republicans, who take over the House and gain strength in the Senate next year, will move the issue to the legislative back burner.

LULAC sued over training materials distributed to Arizona law enforcement meant to guide the law's implementation, claiming the materials promoted racial and ethnic profiling. Bolton says LULAC lacked standing and failed to establish any real and immediate threat of harm. Gov. Jan Brewer says of the eight federal lawsuits against the state, six have been dismissed. Portions of the remaining two suits also been dismissed. The federal government's lawsuit against Arizona on portions of Senate Bill 1070 remains at the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco.

**YOUNG VOTERS SAY THEY FEEL ABANDONED**

They are practicing a lucrative and thriving specialty, becoming the linchpins of a billion-dollar industry. And yet they do not have to report to whom they recommend the drug to, how many referrals they give or for what ailments.

## **E-CIGARETTE SELLER ACCEPTS CALIFORNIA MARKETING LIMITS**

### **VO: 25**

A distributor of electronic cigarettes has agreed not to target its sales and advertisements to minors or to claim its products are safe alternatives to tobacco, under a consent judgment reached with California. The settlement, announced on Friday by state Attorney General Jerry Brown, comes weeks after the U.S. Food and Drug Administration said it intended to regulate e-cigarettes, battery-powered devices made to look and feel like conventional cigarettes.

## **ALCOHOL MORE HARMFUL THAN HEROIN, CRACK COCAINE: STUDY**

### **VO:20**

Alcohol is a more dangerous drug than both crack and heroin when the combined harms to the user and to others are assessed, British scientists said on Monday. Presenting a new scale of drug harm that rates the damage to users themselves and to wider society, the scientists rated alcohol the most harmful overall and almost three times as harmful as cocaine or tobacco. According to the scale, devised by a group of scientists including Britain's Independent Scientific Committee on Drugs (ISCD) and an expert adviser to the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA), heroin and crack cocaine rank as the second and third most harmful drugs. Ecstasy is only an eighth as harmful as alcohol, according to the scientists' analysis.

## **STRESS MAY HAVE ONLY SMALL IMPACT ON WEIGHT**

Despite the common belief that stress causes people to pack on the pounds, a new research review finds that, on average, stress has little long-term effect on weight. The results are surprising, researchers say, given the widespread notion that stress - by causing people to reach for junk food or skimp on exercise, for example is an important factor in weight gain.

### **LOURDES MELUZA. WASHINGTON, DC**

Mid-term elections tipped the Congressional balance of power toward the GOP, as Republicans swept up the majority of seats in U.S. House of Representatives. Democrats held on to a tenuous lead in the U.S. Senate, with Harry Reid (D-Nevada) maintaining his position as Majority Leader after a bruising battle and close call against Tea Party opponent, Sharon Angle. As of 6:30 a.m. with most precincts reporting, Republicans increased their presence to 239 seats, while Democrats fell to 183. Thirteen seats have yet to be called. Nancy Pelosi (D-California) will step aside as the first woman Speaker of the House, most likely for John Boehner (R-Ohio). The GOP now will have committee control as well as subpoena power over special investigations-a practice that has bogged down and distracted government away from pressing issues (e.g. the rash of terrorist attacks in the 1990s that were precursors to 9/11).

## **ARIZONA VOTE IMPACT**

Tuesday, Jan Brewer was able to ride Arizona's controversial immigration law all the way to victory and defeat Democratic Opponent Terry Goddard by a significant margin, but Arizona has bigger and more immediate problems than immigration despite what her campaign had voters believing. With all the coverage and excitement over Senate Bill 1070, it should come as no surprise that Brewer won the election, but if you take a look at her dismal campaign as recently as March, you'd see a completely different race. Before signing SB 1070, Brewer's election was unlikely. Kennedy, LaGuardia and Newark airports in 2008 are too generous and are based on good weather conditions, resulting in a glut of flights when the weather turns ugly, according to the report by the U.S. Department of Transportation's Office of the Inspector General. To maintain safety, air traffic controllers must hold flights on the ground or add spacing between planes.

National Democrats poured manpower and money into turning Texans out on Election Day with the hope of reaching millions of first-time voters who cast ballots for President Barack Obama in 2008. It didn't pay off. Amid a national Republican wave that also washed through conservative Texas, Gov. Rick Perry won re-election, the GOP again swept all statewide offices and Republicans amassed an even larger majority in the Texas House - where the Democratic National Committee's arm Organizing For America had especially hoped its voter turnout efforts would produce gains before crucial congressional redistricting next year. The outcome surpassed the Democrats' worst-case scenario and many Republicans' best-case predictions for Tuesday's election. "Last night's Texas Republican wins were the result of a national GOP tide and should not in any way be considered an endorsement of their record in Texas," state Democratic Party chairman Boyd Richie said in a statement Wednesday.

California voters "just say no" to legalizing recreational marijuana. Supporters of Prop 19 argued that legalizing pot would cut law enforcement costs and bring in tax revenue. Opponents said even if it passed, federal law would still prohibit individuals from possessing and using marijuana.

### **RETINAL IMPLANT TRIAL HELPS BLIND PEOPLE SEE SHAPES**

Scientists have developed an eye implant that allowed three blind patients to see shapes and objects within days of treatment in a trial and say the device could become routine for some kinds of blindness in five years. Experts described the study results as phenomenal and said the device, developed by German researchers, could eventually change the lives of up to 200,000 people worldwide who suffer from blindness due to a degenerative eye disease called retinitis pigmentosa.

### **NEW RULES FOR TRUCK DRIVERS RETURNING AFTER STROKE (file)**

Commercial truck and bus drivers who suffer a stroke should wait at least a year and be able to pass a driving test and a series of health assessments before getting in front of a wheel again, according to a U.S. expert panel. The panel, appointed by the Department of Transportation, also recommends annual check-ups on health and driving records as a requirement for continued driving.

### **NO LINK SEEN BETWEEN HIGH-CARB DIET, COLON CANCER**

Chinese women who eat a traditional diet rich in white rice and other starchy foods that spur a surge in blood sugar do not seem to have an elevated risk of colon cancer, a new study suggests. The findings, reported in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition, add to the conflicting body of evidence as to whether foods with a high "glycemic index" are related to an increased risk of colon cancer.

### **NEW STUDY WARNS AGAINST EATING PEANUTS DURING PREGNANCY**

Boiled peanuts are a Southern tradition and beloved in Huntsville. They're delicious and a great source of antioxidants. Unfortunately, you may want to avoid this delicacy when you're pregnant. A new study warns pregnant women against eating peanuts during pregnancy. Eating peanuts during pregnancy may increase your baby's risk of developing a peanut allergy later in life. Researchers looked at blood samples of 503 infants, between 3 months and 15 months old, with suspected egg or milk allergies. None of the babies had a peanut allergy, but researchers theorized that these infants were more likely to develop allergic

reactions to peanuts.

A new study finds that young, low-income women often gain too much weight during pregnancy, raising concerns about the potential long-term impact on their obesity risk. It could also serve as a reminder to newly elected members of Congress of the economic challenges they face in January. ## **CHEESE SOLD AT COSTCO IN 5 STATES LINKED TO E. COLI**

Federal health officials are warning consumers to avoid a cheese sold in five states over an E. coli outbreak that has left 25 people sick. The Gouda cheese was sold at Costco stores in Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico and Nevada. Costco offered the Bravo Farms Dutch Style Raw Milk Gouda Cheese for sale and in-store tasting between October 5 and November 1. Twenty-five people have been sickened by E. coli in the five states, the Food and Drug Administration said. No deaths have been reported.

## **CANCER-LUNG/SCREENING**

A major study shows giving heavy smokers special CT scans can detect lung cancer early enough to modestly lower their risk of death -- the first clear evidence that a screening test may help fight the nation's top cancer killer. Now the hurdle is deciding who should get these spiral CT scans and how often, because the tests carry their own risks, including repeated radiation exposure and a lot of false alarms that trigger unnecessary repeat testing and even



surgery.

**DRUG-TAINTED CHOCOLATE SICKENS 8 LA STUDENTS**

Authorities say eight students have been taken to a hospital after eating drug-tainted chocolate at a Los Angeles junior high school. Fire Department spokesman Erik Scott says paramedics were called to George Washington Carver Junior High School on Thursday morning after youngsters reported feeling sick. He says the children were taken to a hospital in good to fair condition.

**DIABETES CASES UP IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY**

Diabetes and obesity have increased across Los Angeles County in recent years, according to a report released Thursday by the county's department of public health and the American Diabetes Assn. of Los Angeles. The age-adjusted adult diabetes rate increased from 6.6% to 9.1% between 1997 and 2007, according to the new report, Trends in Diabetes: A Reversible Public Health Crisis. Of the 650,000 people with diabetes in 2007, the most recent year available, about 90% of those with diabetes in 2007 had Type 2, primarily caused by obesity, according to the report. The report draws on data from the Los Angeles County health survey, an annual telephone poll.

## **PANEL TO HEAR RESULTS OF ITS PROBE INTO GULF SPILL**

Representatives of the three companies most involved in the April incident will be on hand as well. The seven-member commission has a Jan. 11 deadline to report their findings to President Barack Obama, outlining what caused the disaster and what needs to be done to prevent another one. The president's commission is the first independent body to weigh in on the spill that dumped 200 million gallons of crude oil into the Gulf of Mexico

A new survey finds the average price of regular gasoline is remaining steady in the United States, with regular grade retailing at an average of \$2.83. The Lundberg Survey of fuel prices released Sunday says the price of a gallon of regular has fluctuated less than half a cent over the last two weeks. Analyst Trilby Lundberg says the average price for a gallon of mid-grade was \$2.97, and premium was at \$3.08. Memphis, Tenn., had the lowest average price among cities surveyed, at \$2.58 a gallon for regular. San Francisco was highest among surveyed cities at \$3.16. Diesel remained steady at \$3.13.

## **IMMIGRATION RAIDS AND HEARTACHE AT THE CENTER OF A MISSOURI SUPREME COURT CASE**

### **VO: 27**

The Missouri Supreme Court is set to hear arguments in the case of a Guatemalan woman who says she never consented to the adoption of her son by a Missouri couple, while incarcerated for violating immigration law. Encarnacion M. Bail Romero was arrested in May 2007 for immigration violations during a sweep at the poultry plant where she worked. In 2008, while the mother was still incarcerated, Carthage, Missouri parents Seth and Melinda Moser adopted her son, though Romero says she never agreed to the adoption. The Moser's countered that they stepped in to take care of the infant when no provisions were made for him when the mother was put into immigration detention. Now having served her sentence, Romero is seeking custody.

## **MAIL BOMBS**

### **VO: 31**

EU interior ministers met Monday to consider a plan to tighten air cargo security that would include blacklisting high-risk airports that are deemed to have inadequate security measures. German Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere says his five-point plan also calls for "special controls" on suspect parcels "like technical material from Yemen destined for a Jewish organization in Europe or the United States." The ministers are expected to set up a panel Monday to review the proposed measures. Last month, authorities intercepted two package bombs in Britain and Dubai that had been sent from Yemen. The addresses on the packages were outdated locations for two Chicago synagogues. The terror group al-Qaida in the Arabian peninsula has claimed responsibility.

## **BUSH CHENEY**

### **VO: 26**

Former President George W. Bush says Vice President Dick Cheney angrily confronted him over Bush's decision not to pardon a former vice presidential aide

over his role in the case of the leaked identity of CIA operative Valerie Plame. Bush, in an interview aired Monday on NBC's "Today" show, said Cheney was angry that Bush only commuted the sentence of I. Lewis Scooter" Libby, convicted of lying during the leak investigation. Bush's appearance came as he begins promoting his memoir, "Decision Points." In the book, Bush recounts that a furious Cheney told him: "I can't believe you're going to leave a soldier on the battlefield."

## **IMMIGRATION BILL**

VO: 27

State Rep. Debbie Riddle camped out and endured "creepy" noises inside the cold, empty Capitol to be first in line Monday morning to file legislation targeting illegal immigration and ballot security. The Tomball Republican said she remained outside the House chamber for two days because of the importance of getting priority bill numbers assigned to the two hot-button issues. House Bill 16 would require voters to present photo identification or two forms of non-photo identification before they are allowed to cast ballots. House Bill 17 is similar to Arizona's controversial immigration law. It would allow law enforcement officers to charge an immigrant who lacks proper documentation and already is detained on another charge with criminal trespass a Class B misdemeanor that carries a fine of up to \$2,000 and maximum jail time of six months.

## **BELL SALARIES**

VO:30

Bell is a working-class city of 40,000 where nine city officials and council members are charged with misappropriating \$5.5 million in public funds. At a hearing held in a school auditorium, state auditors explained what happened. Bell officials collected \$6.8 million over the past three years by doing such things as illegally raising property taxes, sewer assessment fees and business license fees. The auditors said much of the money earmarked for street repairs and

affordable housing was used to pay council members their huge salaries. The ousted city manager had an annual compensation package of \$1.5 million.

## **AGING DRIVERS**

### **VO:30**

Baby boomers begin turning 65 in January, and experts say keeping those drivers safe and mobile is a challenge with profound implications. The National Transportation Safety Board says more than one in five licensed drivers will soon be 65 or older. Many are likely to have medical conditions that can affect their driving. Smarter cars and better roads may help them stay behind the wheel longer. But eventually most people will outlive their driving ability. And since fewer Americans relocate when they retire, many of them will continue to live in suburban homes.

## **CHINA-VOLCKER**

### **VO:22**

One of President Barack Obama's top economic advisers says he sees no short-term way to reduce America's high unemployment, and he expects slow growth for the near future. Paul Volcker, who is chairman of Obama's Economic Recovery Advisory Board and a former Fed chairman, says he suspects unemployment "will gradually decline." He says the economic outlook is for "continuing but limited increases in economic activity for the next year or more."

## **BORDER PATROL ISSUES WANTED POSTERS IN ARIZONA**

### **VO: 24**

Patrol agents in southern Arizona are handing out wanted posters to crack down on drug and human smugglers in the most heavily trafficked corridor along the U.S.-Mexico border. The Border Patrol's Tucson sector covers 262 miles of the international border with Mexico and accounts for almost half of illegal immigrant arrests and marijuana seizures there. Agents began handing out fliers at checkpoints in late October carrying mug shots of dozens of smugglers at large, with a telephone number for the public to call in and provide anonymous tips.

## **TEENS TEXTING**

### **VO:25**

There's a provocative new study that suggests that teens who text 120 times a day or more, are more likely to have had sex or used alcohol and drugs than kids who don't send as many messages. The study's authors say they're not suggesting that "hyper-texting" leads to risky behavior, but say it's startling to see the apparent link. Dr. Scott Frank, the study's lead author, says that instead, the study concludes that a significant number of teens are very susceptible to peer pressure and also have permissive or absent parents.

## **US IRAQ**

**VO: 27**

U.S. Defense Secretary Robert Gates says the United States is open to the idea of keeping troops in Iraq past a deadline to leave next year -- if the Iraqi government asks for it. Gates says the U.S. will "stand by" for such a request once the country ends an eight-month political deadlock and forms a new government. He says the U.S. is "ready to have that discussion." Gates is urging Iraq's squabbling political blocs to form an inclusive government. But he says he has not weighed in with any of the leaders directly.

## **TERROR ARREST / VA. METRO STING**

**VO: 26**

A Pakistani-born U.S. citizen accused of attempting to help al-Qaida bomb the Washington Metro transit system is scheduled to make an appearance in federal court. Thirty-four-year-old Farooque Ahmed was arrested last month after being targeted in a federal sting operation. Authorities say he plotted with people he thought were al-Qaida members to conduct bombings at D.C. Metrorail stations. In fact, the people he allegedly believed were al-Qaida members were actually undercover law enforcement.

## **US UN US HUMAN RIGHTS**

**VO:30**

The United States has dismissed international calls to abolish the death penalty. U.S. State Department legal adviser Harold Koh told the Geneva-based U.N. Human Rights Council on Tuesday that capital punishment is permitted under international law. Dozens of countries have urged the U.S. to halt or abolish the death penalty during the first comprehensive review of Washington's human rights record before the 47-nation body. Koh also described some recommendations by countries like Iran and Cuba as "political provocations." But he said the U.S. was committed to rooting out injustices such as racial profiling and would seriously consider signing a U.N. declaration on the rights of indigenous people

## **RESPIRATORY DISEASE**

**VO:28**

Respiratory infections such as influenza and other causes of pneumonia kill 4.25 million people every year, many of them young children, according to a report released Tuesday. These infections account for 6 percent of all deaths globally, the World Lung Foundation said in releasing its Acute Respiratory Infections Atlas. "We know that at least 4 million people die from acute respiratory infections, yet the global health community does not even recognize them as a distinct disease group," said Peter Baldini, chief executive officer of the World Lung Foundation.

## **WOMEN PREFER SILICONE TO SALINE AFTER MASTECTOMY**

**VO: 38**

Women who have breast reconstruction after cancer surgery tend to be happier with the cosmetic results of silicone implants than with saline-filled ones, a study published Monday suggests. Silicone breast implants have had a troubled history. In 1992, the U.S. put limits on their use, over concerns that the devices could leak and potentially contribute to cancer or autoimmune disorders such as lupus and rheumatoid arthritis. But studies since then, including a report from the Institute of Medicine, an advisory panel to the U.S. government, have concluded that there is no clear link between silicone implants and those diseases.

## **CANCER PATIENTS PICK ANTIDEPRESSANT FOR HOT FLASHES**

Breast cancer survivors who struggle with hot flashes may find respite in an antidepressant, according to a new study that suggests the medication should be the go-to drug when the overheating is severe. Most women get hot flashes when their estrogen levels start to plummet in menopause, but the symptoms may be especially taxing for breast cancer patients who've received chemotherapy or estrogen-blocking drugs.

In 2008, the Bush administration announced an ambitious new program to help federal officials detain and deport illegal immigrants held on criminal charges by using fingerprints collected by local police departments. But two years later, as the program is being put into effect state by state, confusion abounds in New York and elsewhere, among officials and immigrant advocates alike, about how it works and whether local participation is required. Several counties around the nation have voted to opt out of the program, called Secure Communities because of concerns that it could ensnare immigrants who have committed low-level
