CALIFORNIA DEPORTATION OPERATIVES INCREASE

The plan was launched when the number of deportations slumped after several years of growth, partly due to the drop in illegal immigration along the Southwest border. But critics, including some inside ICE, denounced the effort as politically inspired to help President Obama's reelection campaign. The move, which began without public notice on May 14, calls for increasing the number of fugitive operations teams to 129 from 104. Each team has been given a goal of arresting 50 suspects per month, according to documents obtained by The Times, although ICE officials insisted Friday that no quotas were set for the teams. An early draft of the plan says ICE is "experiencing a shortfall in criminal removals for the fiscal year," and called for using 300 Border Patrol agents, dressed in ICE uniforms, to close the gap. The plan was scaled back to 150 ICE officers after objections were raised by union organizers for the Border Patrol.

Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg, Deputy Mayor for Health and Human Services Linda I. Gibbs and Health Commissioner Dr. Thomas A. Farley today visited Montefiore Medical Center to highlight the impacts of obesity, which kills an estimated 5,800 New Yorkers per year and is one of the leading causes of preventable death in the United States, second only to smoking. As the result of obesity, one in three adult New Yorkers now has diabetes or pre-diabetes and obesity increases the risk of some cancers, heart disease, arthritis and depression. Obesity is the only major public health crisis in America that is getting worse and nearly 60 percent of New York City residents are currently overweight or obese.

DC SECURE COMMUNITIES

The Washington, DC Council was praised by a wide coalition of community, faith, and labor organizations for

passing the Immigration Detainer Compliance Emergency Amendment Act in response to today's federally imposed activation of Immigration and Customs Enforcement's controversial "Secure Communities" deportation program. The act, which was introduced by Councilmember Mendelson, will limit Immigration and Customs Enforcement's use of District facilities and equipment and also narrows S-Comm's deportation dragnet by only responding to immigration detention requests for individuals who are over 18 and have been convicted of a dangerous crime.

EQUAL PAY FOR WOMEN

Senate Republicans on Tuesday blocked a Democratic bill calling for equal pay in the workplace. But President Barack Obama and his congressional allies aren't finished appealing to women on the No. 1 concern for all voters: the cash in their wallets on the heels of recession. As expected, the pay equity bill failed along party lines, 52-47, short of the required 60-vote threshold. But for majority Democrats, passage wasn't the only point. The debate itself was aimed at putting Republicans on the defensive on yet another women's issue, this one overtly economic after a government report showing slower-than-expected job growth.

DISNEY MICHEL OBAMA OBESITY

Today The Walt Disney Company - parent company of ABC News - announced it will be the first major media company to stop running junk food ads on its TV and radio networks and websites aimed at children. FACEBOOK SETTLEMENT

Nasdaq OMX Group Inc said it will offer cash and rebates totaling \$40 million (USD) to compensate clients affected by the problems with Facebook Inc's initial public offering (IPO). After approval by regulators, Nasdaq said on Wednesday (June 6), \$13.7 million (USD) would be paid to its affected member firms and the balance would be credited to members to reduce trading costs, with all benefits expected to be awarded within six months. The top four market makers in the Facebook IPO - UBS, Citigroup, Knight Capital, and Citadel Securities - together lost upward of \$115 million (USD) due to technical problems that prevented them from knowing for about two hours if their orders had gone through after Facebook began trading. Fordham Law School adjunct professor Annemarie (pronounced Anna-marie) McAvoy, said the move is an attempt by NASDAQ to correct the situation and retain business on the exchange.

TAX CREDITS FOR CHILDREN

Illegally \$4.200 million in tax credits for children. Congress first approved in 1997, the child tax credit with the overwhelming support of the republican majority as part of the Tax Relief Act child tax credit that is intended to benefit the children and to help prevent these from falling into poverty. The right to request the credit is linked to the son and not the father. The son by the claiming the credit must be less than 17 years, be legal dependent of the taxpayer, have lived with the taxpayer for more than half of the year and be a US citizen, having been born in the USA or be a resident alien. The fiscal code explicitly required documentation of citizenship or residence of the child, but not the claimant.

Federal authorities opened the latest front in their war on California's massive medical marijuana industry this week, filing property forfeiture lawsuits in a bid to shut down three dispensaries and sending warning letters to 34 people. The moves by the U.S. Attorney's Office in Los Angeles are the latest in an ongoing crackdown on what federal prosecutors say is a flourishing network of illegal cannabis suppliers operating across California under the cover of the state's medical marijuana law. Authorities have now targeted more than 220 dispensaries -- deemed "marijuana stores" by prosecutors -- or indoor cultivation houses in the seven-county Central District of California alone.

Florida on Wednesday disputed a Justice Department claim that its controversial voter purge efforts may be illegal and said it was the federal government that appeared to have run afoul of the law. Supporters of Florida's voter purge, which has been vigorously pursued under Republican Governor Rick Scott, say it is aimed at clearing voter rolls of non-citizens. But critics call it part of long-running Republican effort to deter minorities and the poor, who tend to vote Democratic, from casting ballots. Florida is expected to be a key state in the November 6 presidential election.

Vendors must conduct at least half of their business in neighborhoods underserved by grocery stores. Applicants could be licensed by week's end for locations on private property, according to the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection.

CHAGAS DISEASE INCREASE

Chagas disease , a parasitic infection spread to humans by insects, is not the new HIV/AIDS of the Americas, according to infectious disease experts who called the comparison "unrealistic" and "unfortunate." Responding to an editorial posted Monday in PLoS Neglected Tropical Diseases and the media attention that followed, Rick Tarleton, president of the Chagas Disease Foundation said the diseases have little in common beyond disproportionately affecting poor people. "I think it's an unfortunate comparison," said Tarleton, a distinguished research professor at the University of Georgia studying Chagas disease. "There are stigmas attached to HIV/AIDS that themselves are inappropriate, but it would be even more inappropriate to apply them to something like Chagas disease." About 300,000 people in the U.S. have Chagas disease an infection transmitted to humans by blood-sucking insects. But almost all of them became infected before coming to the U.S. from Mexico, Central America and South America , where roughly 10 million people have the disease.

NEW CANCER TREATMENT**MARIANA ATENCIO. MIAMI, FLORIDA****PKG 2:00**

In a significant step forward for the development of a potential new cancer treatment, scientists have found how a common cold virus can kill tumors and trigger an immune response, like a vaccine, when injected into the blood stream. Researchers from Britain's Leeds University and the Institute of Cancer Research (ICR) said by hitching a ride on blood cells, the virus was protected from antibodies in the blood stream that might otherwise neutralize its cancer-fighting abilities. The findings suggest viral therapies like this, called reovirus, could be injected into the blood stream at routine outpatient appointments - like standard chemotherapy - making them potentially suitable for treating a range of cancers. The study, part-funded by the charity Cancer Research UK and conducted on 10 patients with advanced bowel cancer, confirmed that reovirus attacks on two fronts - killing cancer cells directly and triggering an immune response that helps eliminate leftover cancer cells.

Monday is the beginning of the final three weeks of the Supreme Court's 2012 term, a period when the court will be releasing decisions, generally on Mondays, on cases they've heard this year. The two big cases awaiting decisions, which can be handed down between now and June 28, are the constitutionality of President Obama's health care plan and the Arizona immigration case, both of which have received national attention. Below is a primer on those cases, along with one other involving broadcast indecency. The president's health care law, officially titled the Affordable Care Act (ACA), was argued before the Supreme Court over three days in March. Twenty-six states, individuals, the National Federation of Individual Businesses and others challenged the government on the law's constitutionality. Squeezed by state budget cutbacks, the Los Angeles County court system is launching massive layoffs, pay cuts and transfers Friday. Cutbacks will affect 431 court employees and 56 courtrooms

throughout the nation's largest superior court system. Presiding Judge Lee Smalley Edmon says longtime employees are being laid off in the quest to save \$30 million. She notes earlier reductions already saved \$70 million, but more cuts in state support for trial courts are scheduled for the next fiscal year.

OBAMA POLICY TO SPARE MANY YOUTHS FROM DEPORTATION REAX

President Barack Obama is easing enforcement of immigration laws, effective immediately. The new policy offers a chance for hundreds of thousands of younger illegal immigrants to stay in the U.S. and work. The change was immediately embraced by Hispanics, but criticized by congressional Republicans. The policy change will affect as many as 800,000 immigrants who have lived in fear of deportation. It bypasses Congress and partially achieves the goals of the "DREAM Act." Under the administration plan, illegal immigrants will be immune from deportation if they were brought to the United States before they turned 16 and are younger than 30, have been in the country for at least five continuous years, have no criminal history, graduated from a U.S. high school or earned a GED or served in the

military.

ARIZONA SB1070

Police agencies that would enforce the most controversial part of Arizona's 2010 immigration law are expected to get squeezed by legal challenges from opposite sides if the U.S. Supreme Court upholds the law in the coming days. Opponents of the Arizona law, known as SB1070, are likely to sue police departments on claims that officers racially profile people as they enforce the provision of the law that requires police to check the immigration status of people they stop for other reasons. But legal challenges also are expected from the other side: from supporters who could claim that a police agency has broken the law if it restricts the enforcement of SB1070. A little-known section of the law lets anyone sue an agency that has a policy that restricts the enforcement of immigration law. The provision was aimed at holding cities accountable for "sanctuary policies" that discourage or prohibit officers from inquiring about a person's immigration status. Agencies that are found by a court to have sanctuary policies face fines of \$500 to \$5,000 for each day such a violation remains in effect after the filing of the lawsuit.

"TODOS SOMOS ARIZONA"

Nearly two-dozen media outlets serving Arizona's Latino community will interrupt their regular programming to jointly air a special on the state's immigration law ahead of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling on the controversial measure. Television and radio stations in Phoenix, Tucson and Yuma will broadcast the 30-minute feature at 5:00 p.m. Wednesday as part of the "Hoy Somos Arizona" (Today We Are Arizona) initiative. The effort aims to address the fears and concerns of Hispanics as they await the high court's decision on Arizona law SB 1070, which aims to criminalize the presence of undocumented immigrants in the state. The Supreme Court will rule by the end of this month on the U.S. Justice Department's challenge to SB 1070.

AMERICANS MORE POSITIVE ABOUT IMMIGRATION

President Barack Obama's decision not to deport young people who came to the U.S. illegally as children comes at a time when Americans' views toward immigration are much more positive than they have been in recent years. Currently, 66% say immigration is a "good thing" for the U.S. today, up from 59% last year and one percentage point off the high of 67% in 2006. The findings reflect a June 7-10 Gallup poll, conducted just days before the Obama administration put U.S. immigration back into the headlines by announcing that it would bypass Congress and stop deporting undocumented immigrants who came to the U.S. illegally as children -- a change that would affect hundreds of thousands of people. An update to one of Gallup's longest-standing questions on immigration finds more Americans in favor of keeping levels the same (42%) than in favor of decreasing them (35%). For most of the past 40 years, the opposite has been true, with more calling for decreased immigration than keeping the status quo.

More than 1,000 critics of Maricopa County Sheriff Joe Arpaio are expected to gather Saturday night for a rally to call for the closure of the sheriff's complex of canvas jail tents. Organizers say conditions in Arpaio's "Tent City"

complex are inhumane. The sheriff has said he doesn't see any problems with housing inmates in tents and often points out that some members of the U.S. military live in tents. Arpaio will be at the protest to defend his policies and has offered to give tours of Tent City to a few protesters. The county's jails will be closed to visitors on Saturday in anticipation of the rally. The rally is being held by the immigrant rights group Puente Arizona and the Unitarian Universalist Association, which is holding its annual convention in Phoenix this weekend.

GAS PRICES COULD HIT \$3

Those issues appear to be over, at least for now. Thursday, benchmark crude oil fell 4% to \$78.20 a barrel, the lowest price since early October and off 20% year-to-date. Coupled with slumping wholesale gasoline contracts for fall delivery, "the market is suggesting gas below \$3 by Halloween, and certainly by Thanksgiving," says Tom Kloza of the Oil Price Information Service. With production up, oil inventories at 21-year highs and tepid consumer demand, gas prices have fallen for 11 weeks. They're expected to drop more sharply after the peak summer driving season. "Demand just isn't there," says Brian Milne of energy tracker Televent DTN, noting an Energy Department report that demand for fuel over the past four weeks has fallen 5% below year-ago levels. "It's been dreadful." Barring supply disruptions heading into hurricane season - which helped drive pump prices to an all-time \$4.11 high in July 2008 - consumers could soon be filling up at prices not seen since December 2010. The expected slump in gas prices could have far-ranging impact, from consumer spending to the presidential elections, where debate over the swift price run-up early this year dominated much of the debate over which political party and energy policy could keep a lid on prices. Now, economists say plunging prices could provide a bit of a floor on the sputtering economy.

Thousands of residents whose homes were in danger of being threatened by a Utah wildfire have had to find shelter elsewhere as strong winds fueled a blaze that officials believe was started by target shooters. Residents of at least 2,300 homes in northern Utah were evacuated Friday, a day after the more than 6-square-mile fire started near the Saratoga Springs landfill, about 40 miles south of Salt Lake City. High winds then helped fan the flames onto tinder-dry grasslands. Authorities were initially worried as flames moved toward property owned by an explosives company, but the focus turned to saving homes as winds kicked up and the fire moved toward Saratoga Springs. Forecasters expect strong winds to persist through the weekend. On Friday, fire officials were calling in additional aircraft and extra ground crews. Utah County Sheriff Jim Tracy said he feared the fire could take down the area's power grid, shutting off electricity to up to 7,000 homes.

MOST AMERICANS OPPOSE HEALTH LAW

Most Americans oppose President Barack Obama's healthcare reform even though they strongly support most of its provisions, Reuters/Ipsos poll showed on Sunday, with the Supreme Court set to rule within days on whether the law should stand. Fifty-six percent of people are against the healthcare overhaul and 44 percent favor it, according to the online poll conducted from Tuesday through Saturday. The survey results suggest that Republicans are convincing voters to reject Obama's reform even when they like much of what is in it, such as allowing children to stay on their parents' insurance until age 26. Strong majorities favor most of what is in the law. A glaring exception to the popular provisions is the "individual mandate," which forces all U.S. residents to own health insurance. Sixty-one percent of Americans are against the mandate, the issue at the center of the Republicans' contention that the law is unconstitutional, while 39 percent favor it.

The House has passed a bill aimed at salvaging 2.8 million jobs and forestalling a sharp increase in interest rates on college loans. The bill would spend more than \$100 billion on highway and transit programs over two years. And it would also prevent a doubling of interest rates on new student loans, which is scheduled to go into effect Sunday. A deal clearing the way for passage of the bill was reached after Republicans gave up their demands that the bill require approval of the contentious Keystone XL pipeline and Democrats gave way on environment protections.

ABOUT THIS WEEK'S TOPIC:

We'll discuss the importance of the Hispanic women's vote for this year's presidential election. On the one hand, women's vote is fundamental for the Democratic party, as they expect that this vote will guarantee their victory and subsequent control of the Congressional Senate. On the other hand there is presidential candidate Mitt Romney and the Republican party, target of criticism among Latinas and women in general, particularly because of their traditional position against reproductive rights and immigrant families.

The analysis will start with two of the main spokespersons from both political parties. Joining us via satellite will be Gabriela Domenzain, from president Obama's campaign headquarters in Chicago, IL; and in our set, her counterpart from the Republican National Committee, Alejandra Franceschi.

This week we'll discuss two topics. First, we receive two President Barack Obama's Staff members, who lead the Hispanic Action Community Summits -an initiative that has already brought together Latino community leaders in 14 states in the past two years. Adolfo Arrijoa Vizcaino and Gonzalo Aguilar Zinser, son dos de los abogados que representan a los poderosos empresarios mexicanos, y quienes nos acompañana para dilucidar estra controversia.

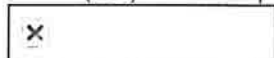

Economists surveyed by FactSet are predicting another good month in hiring in March. Economists expect that U.S. employers added 210,000 jobs last month but they also predict the unemployment rate remained at 8.3 percent for the third straight month.

The Labor Department will release the March employment report this morning. If the forecast proves correct, the economy would have added an average of 236,000 jobs per month since December. That's the most for a four-month period in almost six years. It would also mark the first time the economy has created at least 200,000 jobs in four straight months since early 2000.

ALABAMA IMMIGRATION LAW LATEST

While a proposal to amend Alabama's far-reaching immigration law is being touted as a sensible update of last year's bill, a leading immigrant rights group said Tuesday the revised bill needs to be defeated. Leaders of the Alabama Coalition for Immigrant Justice, said the measure - House Bill 658 - won't undo the effects of last year's House Bill 56 and it contains some even harsher measures. Bernard Simelton, president of the NAACP Alabama State Conference, said the conference is dismayed by legislators "efforts to fix something that can't be fixed. "HB 56 can't be fixed by another mean-spirited bill," Simelton said. But legislative leaders and aides to Gov. Robert Bentley argue the new bill strengthens the existing law and makes it more workable. Todd Stacy, spokesman for Alabama House Speaker Mike Hubbard said reasonable and legitimate concerns have been addressed in the new version.

RACIAL DISPARITIES AMONG CA SCHOOL DISTRICT SUSPENSIONS

Alameda public schools suspended African American students at roughly three times the rate of students from any other sizable racial group during the 2009-2010 school year, a new report shows. The report released Tuesday by the Los Angeles-based Center for Civil Rights Remedies at the Civil Rights Project, Suspended Education in estimates that more than 400,000 students were suspended and removed from classrooms at least one time during the 2009-10 school year in California - enough to fill every seat in all the professional baseball and football stadiums in the state. The California Department of Education reports over 750,000 total suspensions for the same year. These two estimates are consistent because many students were suspended two, three or even more times that year. Suspended Education in California's Public Schools analyzes recently released data from the U.S. Department

of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR). The report focuses solely on the number of students suspended at least once, and provides statewide estimates of student discipline data for nearly 500 districts across California. The analysis also illustrates the risk for out-of-school suspension faced by students from each racial group and by those with disabilities.

DEATH PENALTY REPEAL

Lawmakers in Connecticut's House of Representatives voted Wednesday night to repeal the state's death penalty. The measure now goes to the desk of Democratic Governor Dannel Malloy who has pledged to sign it into law. That will make Connecticut the fifth state in five years to abandon capital punishment. Opponents of the repeal argue that capital punishment serves as a criminal deterrent and offers justice for victims and their families.

COOK COUNTY REFUSES TO DEPORT UNDOCUMENTED INMATES

Once again, Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle has rejected attempts by the Obama administration to turn arrested undocumented immigrants over to federal immigration authorities. At first, Preckwinkle said the county's financial problems were behind their decision to allow undocumented arrestees who post bond to go free, saying that they shouldn't have to pick up the tab for a federal U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) mandate. When ICE offered to pay for the jail time, she changed her tune. In a letter obtained by the *Chicago Tribune* to ICE Director John Morton this week, the board "The more I've gotten into it, the more offensive and unjust it seems to me to make distinctions between people based on their documentation," Preckwinkle told the *Tribune*. "Equal justice before the law is more important to me than the budgetary considerations."

SUPREME COURT URGED TO TOSS ARIZ. IMMIGRATION LAW

The nation's unions have joined the Obama administration in urging the U.S. Supreme Court to toss out Arizona's anti-immigrant law, SB1070. In "friend of the court" briefs filed with the justices before the April 25 oral argument on Arizona's statute, the AFL-CIO, in one brief, and the Change To Win unions, in the other, both say the law intrudes on a federal area of law, immigration. Not only that, but the CTW unions point out that Arizona directly contradicts the 1986 federal immigration law's "fine balance of sanctions" - aimed at employers who hire undocumented workers - by Arizona's outright ban on employment of undocumented workers. SB1070 even bans the workers from seeking jobs, CTW says. The case is important because SB1070, signed by GOP Gov. Jan Brewer after passage by the overwhelmingly Republican legislature, is aimed not just at undocumented workers; unions and their allies declare it

discriminates against Hispanics, because it orders police to stop anyone they suspect of being undocumented and demand immediate proof of legal residence. In practical terms, that's anyone who "looks different." Lack of proof leads to arrest, detention, and deportation.

HOUSING BAILOUT

VO: 28

A government watchdog says the Treasury Department fumbled a program aimed at staving off foreclosure for people who are unemployed or owe more than their homes are worth. The Special Inspector General for the financial bailouts says in a report Thursday that homeowners have received only three percent of the money set aside for Treasury's Hardest Hit Fund. Money from the fund is distributed to state housing agencies, which run a variety of aid programs for homeowners. Special IG Christy Romero says the program has reached only 7 percent of the homeowners that states said they expect to help over the life of the program. It expires in 2017. The Treasury Department says the IG's criticisms are misguided and the program will work in the long run.

MANY PARENTS INSTALL CAR SEATS IMPROPERLY

The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety is releasing a new study on Thursday that measures the difficulties many parents have correctly installing child restraints. The study was conducted jointly with the University of Michigan. The main finding is that vehicle seat designs are working against parents with belt buckles and other seat hardware blocking child restraint anchors, and anchors that are so buried in the seat that they're difficult to access. Only 21 of 98 popular vehicles surveyed have child restraint attachment hardware that meet the criteria researchers identified as making it easier to correctly install restraints. Several committees are meeting Wednesday to vote on the cuts, which would be bundled together for a vote by the entire House next month as a follow-up to the more sweeping GOP budget plan approved last month. That measure is nonbinding but instructed six

House committees to come up with spending reductions as an alternative to across-the-board cuts scheduled to slam both the Pentagon and domestic agencies in January. Those cuts were required after the budget "supercommittee" failed to agree on a deficit-reduction plan last year.

USA-COLLEGE/ONLINE

Five prestigious U.S. universities will create free online courses for students worldwide through a new, interactive education platform dubbed Coursera, the founders announced Wednesday. The two founders, both professors of computer science at Stanford University, also announced that they had received \$16 million in financing from two Silicon Valley venture capital firms. Coursera will offer more than three dozen college courses in the coming year through its website at coursera.org, on subjects ranging from Greek mythology to neurology, from calculus to contemporary American poetry. The classes are designed and taught by professors at Stanford, Princeton, the University of California at Berkeley, the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Michigan. Coursera joins a raft of ambitious online projects aimed at making higher education more accessible and affordable. Many of these ventures, however, simply post entire lectures on the web, with no interactive component. Others strive to create brand-new universities from scratch.

DANGERS OF THE 'CHOKING GAME'

Approximately 5 to 11 percent of children and adolescents have participated in an activity commonly referred to as the "choking game," in which blood and oxygen to the brain is cut off with a belt, rope or other item in order to get high or achieve a euphoric feeling once pressure is released. Not only is this activity dangerous, it can also be associated with additional risky behaviors, according to a study in the May 2012 issue of Pediatrics, "Health Risks of Eighth-Grade Participants in the 'Choking Game': Results From an Oregon Population-Based Survey" (published online April 16). Researchers examined data from the 2009 Healthy Teens survey, which questioned 5,348 eighth-graders on choking game awareness, lifetime prevalence and participation. Among Oregon youth, 6.1 percent have participated in the choking game. Participation was closely linked to increased sexual activity and substance use among both genders, along with poor nutrition and gambling among females, and increased violence among

males. Black males were more likely to participate than white males, and Pacific Islanders had significantly higher participation rates (both males and females).

JOSE GODINEZ SAMPERIO MAY NOT BE ABLE TO PRACTICE INTERVIEW - WASHINGTON, DC

Jose Godinez-Samperio, 25, graduated at the top of his class at Florida State University's College of Law But the aspiring lawyer may not get to practice what he worked so hard to achieve. Godinez-Sampeiro is an undocumented immigrant and based on his legal status the Florida Board of Bar Examiners denied him entry into the state Bar. Godinez-Samperio, originally from Mexico, entered the U.S. legally with his parents when he was 9 years-old on a tourist visa but the family overstayed their allowed period of visitation. Since his time in the U.S. Godinez-Samperio became the valedictorian of his high school class in 2004, an Eagle Scout which is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouting program of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) and graduated from Florida State University College of Law. His case is now being reviewed by the Supreme Court to determine whether the Florida Board of Bar Examiners can accept someone who is not in the country legally, the Orlando Sentinel reports.

STUDY-TESTOSTERONE MAY HELP HEART PATIENTS

Patients suffering from heart failure may benefit from testosterone treatment, according to a new study.

Researchers found that people who took testosterone supplements could exercise longer than those who didn't. About five-million Americans have heart failure and it's a leading cause of hospitalization for people over the age of 65 in the U-S. Testosterone occurs naturally in both men and women but levels go down with age. The study appears in the journal Circulation.

WANT TO LOWER ALZHEIMER'S RISK? GET MOVING

The research published in the journal Neurology and reported on by USA Today showed study participants who scored in the bottom 10 percent of physical activity were more than twice as likely to develop Alzheimer's. Researchers say "physical activity" encompasses more than just exercise - it includes chores, cooking and even gardening. They say

OPTIMISM HELPS HEART HEALTH

When it comes to heart-health-- it pays to be happy. New research out of

Harvard finds optimists less likely to have heart attacks, heart disease or strokes. Scientists reviewed more than 200 studies and found that factors such as optimism and life satisfaction could offer protection against cardiovascular disease. And it held true regardless of a person's age, education, weight, or family history of heart disease. Those who were the most optimistic had about a 50% reduced risk of having a heart attack or stroke compared to those who were less satisfied with their lives. Scientists don't know all of the reasons why optimists have healthier hearts but they suggest that part of it has to do with better handling of stress. People with a positive outlook were also more likely to live a healthier lifestyle: To exercise, eat a healthy diet and to get the proper amount of sleep. Scientists know that depression, and using negative emotions such as hostility, anger and anxiety to deal with issues or suffering can be harmful to the heart.

When one in five Oregonians is enrolled in the program formerly known as food stamps, it's big news when a congressional committee suggests sweeping cuts to the program. It happened this week in the U.S. House of Representatives. Fifth District Rep. Kurt Schrader, D-Oregon, sits on the House Agriculture Committee, which voted this week to recommend cutting the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) by \$36 billion in the next 10 years. That's in line with the GOP budget mandates to reduce spending, although the committee cut even deeper than the \$33 billion goal. The panel also chose to cut only SNAP rather than trimming smaller amounts from other ag-related programs. FEDERAL RESERVE

The Federal Reserve will have plenty to say about the economy Wednesday, when its two-day policy meeting ends with a statement, updated forecasts and Chairman Ben Bernanke's latest news conference. Whether all that information will signal any shift in its outlook or the prospect of further steps to boost the economy is far from clear. The Fed will likely repeat its plan to keep short-term interest rates at record lows through 2014. It may also signal that it won't likely launch any new program to lower longer-term rates unless the economy weakens. That would be a switch from three months ago, when Bernanke and his colleagues ended their January meeting with hints that they were edging closer to a third round of bond buying. The Fed's bond purchases have been intended to drive down long-term rates to encourage borrowing and spending. But since then, signs have suggested that the U.S. economy has strengthened. And

the European debt crisis looks less dire than when the year began, though France's presidential race has muddied the outlook. Those developments make a further round of Fed bond buying less likely, many economists say. "This will be a wait-and-watch meeting," said David Jones, chief economist at DMJ Advisors. "Despite all the theatrics with a Bernanke press conference and new economic forecasts, I think we will get a very predictable outcome -- no change in policy."

**ICE DEPORTATION REVIEW

Immigration officials have offered to shelve 7.5 percent of deportation cases under a massive review of the backlogged U.S. system aimed at focusing on deporting more criminals, authorities said Tuesday. Immigration and Customs Enforcement has offered to temporarily suspend the deportation cases of roughly 16,500 people after reviewing more than 70 percent of the immigration cases pending as of mid-April, according to statistics released by the agency. ICE officials said 2,700 cases have been shelved. The rest still require paperwork and background checks. It was not immediately clear how many immigrants had been told of the offer or how many had accepted it. The Obama administration announced in August that roughly 300,000 deportation cases would be reviewed and non-criminals and those illegal immigrants who posed no public safety or national security threat would likely have their cases put on hold indefinitely.

**POSTAL PROBLEMS
VO: 20**

The Senate offered a lifeline to the nearly bankrupt U.S. Postal Service on Wednesday, voting to give the struggling agency an \$11 billion cash infusion while delaying controversial decisions on closing post offices and ending Saturday delivery. By a 62-37 vote, senators approved a measure which had divided mostly along rural-urban lines. Over the past several weeks, the bill was modified more than a dozen times, adding new restrictions on closings and cuts to service that rural-state senators said would hurt their communities the most. The issue now goes to the House, which has yet to consider a separate version of the bill. "The Postal Service is an iconic American institution that still delivers 500 million pieces of mail a day and sustains 8 million jobs," said Sen. Joe Lieberman, I-Conn., a bill co-sponsor. "This legislation will change the USPS so it can stay alive throughout the 21st century." The mail agency, however, criticized the measure, saying it fell far short in stemming financial losses. Postmaster General Patrick Donahoe said if the bill became law, he would have to return to

Congress in a few years to get emergency help.

MORE UNIVERSITIES CHARGING MORE TUITION FOR HARDER MAJORS VO: 21

A growing number of public universities are charging higher tuition for math, science and business programs, which they argue cost more to teach - and can earn grads higher-paying jobs. More than 140 public universities now use "differential tuition" plans, up 19% since 2006, according to research from Cornell's Higher Education Research Institute. That number is increasing as states cut higher-education spending and schools try to pay for expensive technical programs. "It's been a lifesaver," said Donde Plowman, which charges business and engineering majors \$50 more a credit. "We can be excited for the future." The money at Nebraska paid to create a career center, renovate a student lounge and hire an additional academic adviser. The college is also hiring new faculty.

BOTOX INGREDIENT HAS LIMITED EFFECT ON HEADACHES VO: 29

Patients who started out having headaches almost daily reported two fewer headaches per month when they were given injections of botulinum toxin A. They also had more side effects, including weak muscles and a stiff neck. The medication is marketed under multiple brands, but Allergan's Botox is the best known. Botox is used to treat a range of conditions, including migraines and excessive sweating. "The effect these appear to be having on migraine headaches is small -- it only reduces headaches by a couple of days a month," said Dr. Jeffrey Jackson, the study's lead researcher, from the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee. That's "really, really modest," he told Reuters Health. Still, it's possible that some chronic migraine patients will benefit from injections much more than others, he said.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG ABUSE ABETTED BY FAMILY, FRIENDS: STUDY VO: 22

More than 70 percent of people who abuse prescription pain relievers obtain the drugs from friends or relatives, usually with permission and for free, according to a government study released on Wednesday. The study, based on an ongoing national survey of nearly 70,000 Americans aged 12 and over, offers a snapshot of a growing health and safety problem that is already responsible for more fatal overdoses than cocaine and heroin, combined, and has begun to spawn other crimes including gang violence. "This is one of the greatest drug threats we have ever faced," Michele Leonhart, who heads the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration, told reporters as the study was released. An estimated 7 million Americans abuse pharmaceutical drugs. Prescription drugs account for about 75 percent of all drug-related U.S. overdose deaths, according to the U.S. Centers

for Disease Control and Prevention. And three of every four deaths from pills involve opioid pain relievers including oxycodone.

BAKERSFIELD THE COUNTRY'S MOST POLLUTED CITY

Four Valley cities are named in the American Lung Association's latest list of the most polluted in the country. In the agency's state of the air report, Bakersfield is listed as the most polluted city because of its high pollution and ozone levels. Hanford is number two on the list, in the year-round particle pollution category. Visalia took the fourth spot, while Fresno was ranked fifth. Los Angeles was also included in the list. The good news is, the report shows the US has made significant progress in cleaning the air. Ozone levels dropped 13 percent and particle pollution decreased between 2001 and 2010.

STUDENT LOAN RATES

A nearly \$6 billion dollar GOP proposal that would prevent interest rates on federal students loans from doubling will be up for a House vote on Friday. The bill is a response to Democrats daily calls to prevent the current 3.4 interest rates on subsidized Stafford student loans from automatically increasing to 6.8 percent on July 1. Republicans want to offset the cost by cutting funds from the president's health care overhaul.

POSTAL PROBLEMS

VO: 26

The Senate has passed overhaul legislation that would allow the financially strapped U.S. Postal Service to avert immediate bankruptcy, giving it a cash infusion while delaying decisions on closing post offices and ending Saturday delivery. The bill passed on a 62-37 vote. Under the measure, the postal service would get an \$11 billion refund of overpayments made to a federal fund to pay down debt and finance buyouts to 100,000 postal employees. At the same, it would halt the closing of more than 100 mail processing centers, bar any shutdowns before the November elections and protect rural post offices for one year.

Gaby Pacheco, a vocal immigrant activist, accepted a tantalizing invitation last week from an unlikely source: Republican Sen. Marco Rubio wanted her to help

craft a bill that could legalize the children of some illegal immigrants. Two hours later, Pacheco and other activists got a different pitch from their more familiar White House allies. Be wary of Rubio and his plan, two of President Obama's top advisers told them in a meeting. It wouldn't go far enough and wasn't likely to succeed. The group was polite but noncommittal. "We're not married to the Democratic or Republican parties," said Pacheco, 27. "We're going to push what's best for the community."

BULLYING AGES CHILDREN PREMATURELY

Violence can prematurely age children, by as much as seven to 10 years. That's according to a study published in *Molecular Psychiatry* and written about in *U-S-A Today*. The study looked at children's D-N-A sequences and found they shortened faster than normal in kids exposed to violence. Researchers say that may make children more likely to get diseases associated with aging -- like heart attacks -- seven to 10 years before their peers. The study looked at children who faced three types of violence: domestic violence against their mother, bullying and being the target of mistreatment from an adult.

DC:SENATE PASSES VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT

The U.S Senate renewed the Violence Against Women Act with a 68 to 31 vote Thursday. The measure is designed to crack down on stalking, rape and domestic violence against women This new version of the law gives protection to gays, lesbians and undocumented immigrants. Senate Republicans were initially against expanding the bill to include the groups, but 15 Republicans voted in favor of the reauthorization. House Republicans are expected to press for changes to the legislation when negotiators from the House and Senate meet to merge their competing bills.

WOMEN CANCER MEDICINE

Hormone therapy originally taken to ward off chronic diseases may be linked to an increased risk of breast cancer in older Chinese women, but it does not seem to raise their risk of heart attacks or heart-related deaths, a new study suggests. The findings expand upon the landmark Women's Health Initiative study of 2002, which found that a common estrogen-plus-progestin treatment increased a woman's risk for heart attacks, breast cancer and strokes. "In our study, we found the same increased risk of breast cancer, but we didn't find an increased risk of heart disease " said Dr. Irene Su, an assistant professor of reproductive medicine at the University of California, San Diego and the study's lead author.

CANCER, DIET, WORKING OUT

A cancer diagnosis often inspires people to exercise and eat healthier. Now the experts say there's strong evidence that both habits may help prevent the disease from coming back. New guidelines issued Thursday by the American Cancer Society urge doctors to talk to their cancer patients about eating right, exercising and slimming down if they're too heavy. That's not something most doctors do, said Dr. Omer Kucuk, an Emory University oncologist who has researched the effect of nutrition on prostate cancer. They're focused on surgery, chemotherapy or other treatments for their patients, he added. "Usually the last thing on their mind is to talk about diet and exercise," Kucuk said. Cancer society officials have long encouraged healthy eating and exercise as a way to prevent certain cancers. They and others have tried to spread that gospel to cancer survivors as well. Indeed, the cancer society has a certification program for fitness professionals who work with cancer survivors. But until now, the group didn't think there was enough research to support a strong statement for cancer survivors

FRUITS AND HEALTH

People who get a range of fruits and vegetables in their diets may have a somewhat decreased risk of type 2 diabetes a new study suggests. The findings, reported in the journal Diabetes Care, do not prove that eating your fruits and veggies will ward off type 2 diabetes -- a disease closely associated with obesity and old age. But researchers say the findings should give people yet more incentive to eat the way our mothers always told us. The study of over 3,700 UK adults found that those who downed the most servings of fruit and vegetables in a week had a lower risk of developing type 2 diabetes over 11 years, versus people who ate the fewest.

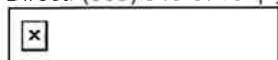

SMALL COMPANIES AND THEIR STARTUPS

According to an analysis of U.S. Census Bureau data, the rate of new business startups fell in 2010 to the lowest point on record. New companies as a percentage of all businesses dropped below 8 percent in 2010, the latest year for which numbers are available. Census Bureau data found that in 2010, 394,000 startup businesses created 2.3 million jobs at a time when the private sector lost 1.8 million jobs overall. The report, by two Census Bureau researchers and an economics professor at the University of Maryland, found that young firms those five years or younger now account for less than 35 percent of all businesses. That's down from nearly 50 percent in the early 1980s. And while they created more than 40 percent of new jobs in the 1980s, that has fallen to about 30 percent. Researchers found that the average size of new business was largely unchanged at fewer than 10 workers.

ECONOMY-UNEMPLOYMENT

The number of Americans who sought unemployment benefits last week fell more than expected, according to a report Thursday that could allay fears that the labor market recovery is stagnating. Initial claims for unemployment benefits fell by 27,000 to a seasonally adjusted 365,000, said The Department of Labor. This was the biggest drop since early May last year.
