The unemployment rate ticked down to 8.8% - a full percentage point lower than in November and the sharpest four-month drop in 28 years.

Wading into an increasingly thorny debate, Miss Napolitano said she cannot unilaterally ignore deportations laws for broad groups of illegal immigrants, but said students and young adults who would have been legalized had last year's "Dream Act" legislation passed Congress are not a chief target of federal authorities. "I will say, and can say, that you know what? They are not, that group, if they truly meet all those criteria, and we see very few of them actually in the immigration system, if they truly meet those, they're not the priority," the secretary said at an event sponsored by NDN, a progressive think tank and advocacy group, on the future of the nation's border policies.

At the start of the year, it appeared that Arizona's SB 1070 would spread the country like wildfire, with at least 24 state legislatures having introduced copycat "show me your papers" bills since the original passed in spring 2010. Now, with many state legislative sessions coming to a close, the fight against SB 1070 copycat legislation appears contained to just a few key battlegrounds. Converging forces have blocked the copycat bills' success. On the one hand, the bills have spurred broad opposition from immigrant and civil rights groups, as well as from business interests. On the other, a ticking clock killed several bills as legislative sessions end before lawmakers have had time to pass the controversial laws-particularly in a season in which most state political debates are dominated by budget battles.

The Indiana Republican and potential Republican presidential candidate says he hopes the law enforcement provision is removed, refusing to note whether that provision would cause him to veto the bill.

On the last day of Georgia's 2011 legislative session, the controversial immigration bill is the only major bill that still hasn't been resolved. State lawmakers have until midnight Thursday to come to an agreement on the bill, or else it will be dead for the session. Republican leaders in the House and Senate still have not come to an agreement on which version of the bill to pass. Both versions would allow law enforcement officers to check the immigration status of certain suspects. But the House version is tougher. It also requires companies with 10 or more employees to check the immigration status of new hires. House Bill 87 is now in the hands of the Senate.

GEORGIA ICE ARRESTS

Allegations of stolen identities and illegal aliens lead federal agents to local fast food restaurants. A federal grand jury indicted two McDonald's managers for selling stolen identities to workers. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents have been investigating this case for almost a year now. On Wednesday, federal officers swarmed restaurants and arrested suspected illegal aliens working at McDonald's with stolen identities. Nine illegal aliens are in custody, and five people have been indicted by a federal grand jury and are facing criminal charges. "The defendants are accused of providing stolen identities and facilitating documents to match those identities to allow illegal aliens to be employed at those locations," ICE agent Jason Gialanella said. Gialanella told The Coastal Source at

least nine identities have been confirmed to be real U.S. citizens, and that poses a huge risk to their personal information.

MARK DAYTON DROPS PAWLENTY DIRECTIVE ON IMMIGRATION ON CAMERA: 22

Minnesota Gov. Mark Dayton won't revive his Republican predecessor's directive requiring the state to participate in enforcement of federal immigration law. A spokeswoman told The Associated Press Thursday that Dayton decided against keeping or revamping the 2008 executive order from former Gov. Tim Pawlenty because it wasn't necessary. It had required state cooperation with federal authorities in areas such as customs enforcement and document fraud. Dayton spokeswoman Katie Tinucci says the order's expiration last week doesn't change anything state agents are already doing. She says Dayton considered keeping the directive, consulting with legal and public safety advisers as well as immigration advocates. Pawlenty made headlines when he announced the order and related immigration proposals as part of a get-tough approach toward illegal immigration.

**GEORGIA LAW UNDERSCORES URGENT NEED FOR

This misguided and likely unconstitutional legislation is the wrong way to approach the broken immigration system. HOW THE BUDGET CUTS AFFECT THE MEDICARE LOURDES MELUZA - WASHINGTON, DC

A bold but politically risky plan to cut billions of dollars from the federal budget is coming to a House vote, with insurgent Republicans rallying behind the idea of fundamentally reshaping the government's role in health care for the elderly and the poor. The GOP plan, expected to be voted on Friday, promises more than \$6 billion in spending cuts from the budget that President Barack Obama offered in February, relying on stiff cuts to domestic agency accounts, food stamps and the Medicaid health care program for the poor and disabled. But while leaving Social Security alone, the measure calls for transforming Medicare from a program in which the government directly pays medical bills into a voucher-like system that subsidizes purchases of private insurance plans. People 55 and over would remain in the current system, but younger workers would receive subsidies that would steadily lose value over time.

ARIZONA BIRTHING PROOF

The Arizona Legislature has become the first in the nation to pass a measure requiring presidential candidates to provide proof of citizenship in order to get on the state's ballot. House Bill 2177 got final approval Thursday night from the House. It will be transmitted to Gov. Jan Brewer, who will then have five days to sign it, veto it or do nothing and allow it to

become law. If Brewer chooses to veto the bill, Republican lawmakers could attempt an override vote. The bill would become law if two-thirds of legislators supported the override. Meat in the U.S. may be widely contaminated with strains of drug-resistant bacteria, researchers reported Friday after testing 136 samples of beef, chicken, pork and turkey purchased at grocery stores. Nearly half of the samples - 47% - contained strains of *Staphylococcus aureus*, the type of bacteria that most commonly causes staph infections. Of those bacteria, 52% were resistant to at least three classes of antibiotics, according to a study published in the journal *Clinical Infectious Diseases*. DNA testing suggested the animals were the source of contamination. Environmental health scientist Lance Price, the study's leader, said the animals most likely harbored these drug-resistant pathogens because antibiotics routinely are fed to livestock to promote growth and prevent disease in crowded pens on large farms.

Supervisors passed a law in 2009 that would have required the city to report only juveniles who have been convicted of felonies—not just arrested. Newsom refused to enforce it.



Hispanics now make up the majority of the population in 28 U.S. cities with more than 100,000 inhabitants, most of them located in California, Texas, Florida and New Jersey. That was revealed Tuesday by statisticians of the Census Bureau during a telephonic press conference that analyzed the latest demographic data for the Latino population, which in the last decade grew four times more than the country's population as a whole. They average is between 1 and 2 percent of each purchase and totaled \$16.9 billion in 2009, according to the Fed. The proposed regulations would reduce the fees by roughly 70 percent to a maximum of 12 cents a swipe. Credit cards, which can carry significantly higher interchange rates, are not covered by the law.

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-Nev.) reintroduced the bill in May. This time, backers are focusing on the potential economic benefits of a path to citizenship.

BY A 5-3 VOTE, THE HIGH COURT REJECTED ARGUMENTS BY BUSINESS AND CIVIL RIGHTS GROUPS AND BY THE OBAMA ADMINISTRATION THAT THE ARIZONA MEASURE MUST BE STRUCK DOWN FOR CONFLICTING WITH FEDERAL IMMIGRATION LAW. THE 2007 LAW UPHELD BY THE COURT IS SEPARATE FROM ONE ARIZONA ADOPTED LAST YEAR AND CRITICIZED BY PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA. THAT LAW REQUIRED THE POLICE TO CHECK THE IMMIGRATION STATUS OF ANYONE SUSPECTED OF BEING IN THE COUNTRY ILLEGALLY.

ENERGY DRINKS ARE NOT A GOOD CHOICE FOR CHILDREN BECAUSE THEY CONTAIN CAFFEINE AND OTHER STIMULANTS THAT CAN BE DANGEROUS. RESEARCHERS HAVE LINKED ENERGY DRINKS TO AN INCREASE IN HEART RATE AND HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE AS WELL AS SLEEP DISTURBANCES AND ANXIETY.

AN INTERNATIONAL PANEL OF EXPERTS SAYS CELLPHONES ARE POSSIBLY CARCINOGENIC TO HUMANS AFTER REVIEWING DETAILS FROM DOZENS OF PUBLISHED STUDIES. THE STATEMENT WAS ISSUED IN LYON, FRANCE, ON TUESDAY BY THE INTERNATIONAL AGENCY FOR RESEARCH ON CANCER AFTER A WEEKLONG MEETING OF EXPERTS. THEY REVIEWED POSSIBLE LINKS BETWEEN CANCER AND THE TYPE OF ELECTROMAGNETIC RADIATION FOUND IN CELLPHONES, MICROWAVES AND RADAR. THE AGENCY IS THE CANCER ARM OF THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION AND THE ASSESSMENT NOW GOES TO WHO AND NATIONAL HEALTH AGENCIES FOR POSSIBLE GUIDANCE ON CELLPHONE USE. THE GROUP CLASSIFIED CELLPHONES IN CATEGORY 2B, MEANING THEY ARE POSSIBLY CARCINOGENIC TO HUMANS. OTHER SUBSTANCES IN THAT CATEGORY INCLUDE THE PESTICIDE DDT AND GASOLINE ENGINE EXHAUST.

LAST YEAR, RESULTS OF A LARGE STUDY FOUND NO CLEAR LINK BETWEEN CELLPHONES AND CANCER. BUT SOME ADVOCACY GROUPS CONTEND THE STUDY RAISED SERIOUS CONCERNS BECAUSE IT SHOWED A HINT OF A POSSIBLE CONNECTION BETWEEN VERY HEAVY PHONE USE AND GLIOMA, A RARE BUT OFTEN DEADLY FORM OF BRAIN TUMOR. HOWEVER, THE NUMBERS IN THAT SUBGROUP WEREN'T SUFFICIENT TO MAKE THE CASE. THE STUDY WAS CONTROVERSIAL BECAUSE IT BEGAN WITH PEOPLE WHO ALREADY HAD CANCER AND ASKED THEM TO RECALL HOW OFTEN THEY USED THEIR CELLPHONES MORE THAN A DECADE AGO. IN ABOUT 30 OTHER STUDIES DONE IN EUROPE, NEW ZEALAND AND THE U.S., PATIENTS WITH BRAIN TUMORS HAVE NOT REPORTED USING THEIR CELLPHONES MORE OFTEN THAN UNAFFECTED PEOPLE. BECAUSE CELLPHONES ARE SO POPULAR, IT MAY BE IMPOSSIBLE FOR EXPERTS TO COMPARE CELLPHONE USERS WHO DEVELOP BRAIN TUMORS WITH PEOPLE WHO DON'T USE THE DEVICES. ACCORDING TO A SURVEY LAST YEAR, THE NUMBER OF CELLPHONE SUBSCRIBERS WORLDWIDE HAS HIT 5 BILLION, OR NEARLY THREE-QUARTERS OF THE GLOBAL POPULATION. SINCE MANY CANCEROUS TUMORS TAKE DECADES TO DEVELOP, EXPERTS SAY IT'S IMPOSSIBLE TO CONCLUDE CELLPHONES HAVE NO LONG-TERM HEALTH RISKS. THE STUDIES CONDUCTED SO FAR HAVEN'T TRACKED PEOPLE FOR LONGER THAN ABOUT A DECADE.

STUDY SENIOR AUTHOR MARINA PICCIOTTO OF YALE UNIVERSITY SAYS SMOKERS WHO DO HAVE THAT CONCERN SHOULD TRY NICOTINE-BASED SMOKING-CESSATION TREATMENTS.

THE PRODUCE TRADE ASSOCIATION CALLS THE LIST IRRESPONSIBLE, MISLEADING AND SENSATIONAL. THEY WORRY THE LIST "WILL DISCOURAGE PEOPLE FROM EATING FRESH PRODUCE- AND DIMINISH THE NUTRITION ... OF MANY AMERICANS."

THE ENVIRONMENTAL WORKING GROUP ALSO HAS A LIST OUT OF WHAT THEY SAY ARE THE SAFEST FRUITS AND VEGETABLES: ONIONS, CORN, PINEAPPLES, AVOCADO AND ASPARAGUS ROUND OUT THE TOP FIVE. THEY SUGGEST BUYING ORGANIC WHEN IT COMES TO 'DIRTY DOZEN' PRODUCE.

=====OLIVE OIL HELPS PREVENT STROKES (17 SEC)

RESEARCH HAS SHOWN THE BENEFITS OF THE MEDITERRANEAN DIET, CONSIDERED BY SOME TO BE ONE OF THE HEALTHIEST DIETS IN THE WORLD. NOW A STUDY OUT OF FRANCE SAYS THAT ONE KEY COMPONENT OF THAT DIET MAY HELP PROTECT AGAINST STROKE. AUTHORS OF THE STUDY WANTED TO DETERMINE IF THE AMOUNT OF OLIVE OIL CONSUMED IS LINKED TO STROKE. SO THEY REVIEWED DIETARY AND LIFESTYLE PATTERNS, AS WELL AS MEDICAL RECORDS, OF MORE THAN 76- HUNDRED FRENCH ADULTS OVER THE AGE OF 65. PARTICIPANTS WHO REPORTED INTENSIVE USE OF OLIVE OIL WERE AT A 41 PERCENT LOWER RISK OF HAVING A STROKE, COMPARED TO THOSE WHO DO NOT USE OLIVE OIL. THE AUTHORS CONCLUDED THAT OLIVE OIL MAY PROTECT AGAINST STROKE, THOUGH THEY STOPPED SHORT OF SAYING THAT AN OIL-RICH DIET LOWERS RISK.
