KKCY ISSUE RESPONSIVE PROGRAMMING SUMMARY 1st QUARTER 2017

During the months of January, February and March 2017, station KKCY broadcast numerous programs that gave significant treatment to issues of concern and interest in the communities within our coverage area. This quarter there was one overiding issue that trumped all others; Spillway damage at Lake Oroville. It began with rain and snowfall totals almost 200% above average on the heels of an historic 5 year drought. Controlled releases of 50,000 cubic feet per second though were keeping the lake level manageable. Then on February 7th, officials noticed cracks in the spillway structure and erosion beneath and around it beginning to occur in the natural landscape. As they shut off outflows to inspect the damage, inflow from rainfall increased to 190,000 cfs, causing the lake level to rise over 2 feet per day. Maximum level is 901 feet, at which point water would begin spilling over the auxilliary (or emergency) spillway, which had never happened in the life of the resevoir completed in 1968. These would be uncontrolled. February 9th, despite a gaping hole in the main spillway 180 feet wide and 30 feet deep, officials announced they had no choice but to open it up to 100,000 cfs with the lake at 89% of capacity and filling quickly. Their hope was that the hillside beneath and around the damage would erode down to bedrock ending further erosion. It was too little too late. Although releases through the main spillway did erode down to bedrock as hoped, the lake was filling at a remarkable rate, and by February 10th, for the first time ever, the capacity of the resevoir had been exceeded and water began pouring over the emergency spillway onto bare, unprotected hillside below. The next day, February 11th, uncontrolled releases had eroded that portion to the point where officials were concerned a "catastrophic failure of the hillside below the emergency spillway was imminent". Some estimates had uncrontrolled releases of up to 400,00 cfs, more than twice the capacity of the levee systems below the resevoir that would result in almost unfathomable destruction. injury and worse. Mandatory evacuations were issued for all communities along the Feather River below the lake from the city of Oroville south through Butte, Yuba, and Sutter Counties, a total of an estimated 188,000 residents. This mandatory evacuation remained in place until February 15th, during which time we broadcast 24 hours a day with contunious coverage and updates of the situation. As the

imminent danger subsided and lake levels dropped, we have continued with daily Lake Oroville updates in every newscast informing listeners of current lake levels and inflow and outflow numbers as well as plans for future actions by Department Of Water Resources officials and other key agencies. This will continue to be our primary issue and concern through the dry months and into next rainy season (November through March) as a construction project is scheduled to get underway beginning in May to build a completey new controlled spillway (approximately 300 feet wide and a mile long) an unrealistic proposition according to some, as well as figure out a way to prevent the catastophic erosion below the emergency spillway should it ever have to be utilized again.

-Locally produced newscasts, including weather and sports, are broadcast each Monday through Friday (except New Year's Day and President's day) at 5a, 5:30a, 6a, 6:30a, 7a, 7:30a, 8a, and 8:30a.

Other general issues and concerns and how we address them;

-Employment;

Weekly, a representative from The Sutter County One-Stop (a government-funded employment and career center) comes in to record a 60 second feature called "Job Hotline". This airs, at no charge to the One-Stop, throughout all day-parts Monday through Thursday for a total of 24 plays. (Audio available through the calendar year on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "Job Hotline".)

Local non-profit fundraiser and awareness events: These are covered in several formats;

- 1) Occasionally in news casts (particularly health events such as blood drives).
- 2) Public Service Announcements recorded by someone involved with the group or event in question. There are generally no fewer than 4 and no more then 10 of these 30 to 60 second free spots running in equal rotation throughout all dayparts for a total of 147 plays a week. (Audio of all PSA's is available through the calendar year on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "psa's").

3) Weekend Updates ("W's") are recorded by local announcers and air Thursday through Sunday, a total of 65 plays. (Audio is available through the week following their recording on the KKCY computer cartwall in #'s 26033-26036)

2) Special Broadcast events.

These take the form primarily of live remote broadcasts and in-studio guests during Dave & Briggs In The Morning. This quarter, we broadcast, as we have each year since 2008, from the Annual Tri-Counties Blue-Star Mom's Care Package Packing Party For The Troops on March 4th from 2p-4p. Weather: We receive our forecasts from the National Weather Service, and deliver it in summarized form with station announcers at least twice an hour, every day including holidays and weekends.

Traffic:

We provide in-house-produced updates prior to each newscast through reports from local law enforcement, and from listeners verified through local law enforcement.

Animal Welfare;

Weekly, a representative from Sutter Buttes Canine Rescue (a local non-profit, no-kill animal shelter) comes in to record a 60 second feature called "Pet of the Week". This airs, at no cost to the shelter,

throughout all day-parts Monday through Thursday for a total of 26 plays. (Audio available through the calendar year on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "Pet of the Week".)

Sports;

A local sports report follows each bottom of the hour newscast. Additionally, every other Monday, KKCY designates a local Team of the week culled from listener nominations. A recorded feature (60 seconds) airs honoring the team throughout the 2 week period for a total of 15 plays per week. (Audio available through the calendar year on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "teamsoweek".)

Community Involvement:

Every other Tuesday, KKCY designates a local Community Hero culled from listener nominations. A recorded feature (60 seconds) airs honoring the hero for a total of 23 plays per week. (Audio available through the calendar year on the KKCY newsroom computer desktop in the folder labeled, "Community Hero".)

General:

We broadcast 2, 30 minute programs from Media Tracks Communications of Des Plains, Illinois; "Viewpoints", which airs every Sunday Morning at 6, and "Radio Health Journal" which follows at 6:30.
