Wednesday, April 1, 2015

We begin tonight's news broadcast in Vermont, where House lawmakers today gave preliminary approval to a bill to rein in school spending. House Bill 361 includes plans to review the number of supervisory unions, or districts, throughout the state. A follow up to a story we reported yesterday, regarding a driver hitting a Vermont State trooper's cruiser and fleeing the scene.

Turning to New Hampshire, a state business development group is encouraging businesses large and small to consider making the federal government a client. It takes time and patience but the payoff may be worth it.

Thursday, April 2, 2015

Regarding Mount Sunapee Resort expansion, a decision will be made public April 16. New Hampshire Department of Resources and Economic Development Commissioner Jeff Rose announced this today.

It's officially known as the Cheshire Bridge, that's the 500 foot span, from end to end, that connects Route 12 in Charlestown, New Hampshire, to Route 11 in Springfield, Vermont. Now, it's in line for some repairs, set to happen later this summer, or possibly, next year depending on how project bids go.

The battle for students to help bring money into school districts continues. Claremont's Stevens High School is the latest among regional school districts to reduce tuition to out-of-district students, that according to the Valley News.

Friday, April 3, 2015

It will be the year 2045 before former Charlestown, New Hampshire, resident James Robarge is eligible for parole. Robarge learned today how many years he will serve in prison from Sullivan County Judge Brian Tucker. In another court case we've reported on, a former business executive and Sunapee resident will serve a minimum of nine years in prison for a car crash that killed a Wilder, Vermont couple and their unborn baby in December 2013. Well you can officially consider the 2015 Pumpkin Fest squashed. The Keene City Council denied organizing firm Let It Shine, Inc, a license to hold the event by a 13-1 vote last night, after violent riots at nearby Keene State College during last year's event put a major damper on the annual festival.

Monday, April 6, 2015

Newport, N.H., voters will meet tomorrow night for the first part of the annual Town Meeting.

New London, N.H., voters will review articles on the town warrant this week as well during town meeting, including whether the date should be moved to March. Windsor, Vt., is getting a financial boost to help with a transportation project.

Tuesday, April 7, 2015

There's a new retail business in Sullivan County. Claremont, New Hampshire is home to the first Running's store in New England. Claremont is one of three stores the Minnesota-based home and farm goods store is opening in the Northeast.

And then there were two. Republican Senator from Kentucky Rand Paul officially declared today his intent to run for president in 2016.

In Vermont news tonight, members of the Bellows Fall Fire Department are keeping their jobs as salaried firefighters, at least for now.

Wednesday, April 8, 2015

In New Hampshire, municipal airports can put a town or city on the map, in many senses of the word. From Lebanon to Claremont to Concord, all play a role in bringing aviation services and money into the local economy. Including Newport.

Also underway in Newport, construction of a new two-story retail store continues in its downtown. When complete, the first floor will house a Dunkin Donuts with parking in the back. The second floor will be built to specification by a company.

Turning to the Upper Valley, a restaurant fire in West Lebanon near 4 p.m. yesterday was caused by a smoldering cigarette in the mulch bed near the eatery.

Thursday, April 9, 2015

The winter of 2015 refuses to let up, even though spring began about three weeks ago. Those sounds of the season....the splash back and whoosh of tires on slushy roads and the crunch of boots on ice crystal paths...were all heard today. In New Hampshire news, the top federal prosecutor for the state is resigning after nearly six years on the job. John Kacavas will step down on April 17.

In Vermont news tonight, the Green Mountain State works hard to maintain its natural environment. To that end, Governor Peter Shumlin today appointed two new members to the state's Natural Resources Board. Saint Albans City Manager Dominic Cloud and Environmental advocate Elizabeth Courtney will serve as a member and alternate member, respectively.

Friday, April 10, 2015

For local residents and visitors, a shortcut that makes it easier to get from Newport to Sunapee is back in business. Trask Brook Bridge is open again, making the time to drive on Bradford Road between these two towns shorter. The bridge was closed for all travel on March 20, per the state Department of Transportation. Vermont now has what many other states have: a Latin motto. Governor Peter Shumlin today signed into law Senate Bill 2 and with that, the motto, "Stella quarta decima fulgeat." The Latin motto means "May the fourteenth star shine bright." The 14th star is a reference to Vermont's status as the 14th state to join the United States. The motto joins Vermont's English motto, "Freedom and Unity."

It's not every day someone loses a brass cannon. So the man who reported its theft to Vermont State Police also is offering a \$500 reward for its return. The cannon, along with a Honda dirt bike was reported missing to police last Saturday around 4 p.m., from its home on South Reading Road in Cavendish, Vermont. That's when owner Patrick Durkin of Greenwich, Connecticut, realized the Cavendish home had been broken into.

Monday, April 13, 2015

INTRO: October is 6 months away yet planning for a pumpkin-themed party in Claremont is moving forward. YCN's Lisa Connell has that story.

[VO: Plans to host a pumpkin festival in Claremont next fall continue to gain momentum.

Led by Michael Charest, a founder of the civic group Concerned Citizens of Claremont, about 15 people met Saturday morning to talk all things pumpkin. And speaking of politics, candidates seeking the nation's highest elected office continue to come forward. Yesterday, former U.S. Secretary of State Hillary Rodham Clinton announced she is running for president in 2016.

In other Vermont news, state officials may roll out a campaign to recruit more emergency medical responders, reports Vermont Public Radio. Dialing 911 remains the way most people get help in an emergency. A survey shows that many of the EMS staffs across Vermont are not fully staffed.

Tuesday, April 14, 2015

In southern Vermont this afternoon, a brush fire at 1036 Black Mountain Road in Dummerston crept into a nearby house, causing a fire in that home's walls, that according to the Brattleboro Reformer.

Wednesday, April 15, 2015

A fire in Putney, Vermont went to two alarms and took firefighters several hours to bring under control. The fire at 47 Fred Houghton Road spread to both floors of the 2-story wood frame home. Putney Fire Chief Tom Goddard says the fire is of suspicious origin, that according to the Brattleboro Reformer. It was 150 years ago, on April 15, 1865, that President Lincoln succumbed to his injuries. In other regional news, New Hampshire Governor Maggie Hassan and Vermont Governor Peter Shumlin joined with governors from both sides of the political aisle today. The governors signed a letter addressed to Congress, urging the U.S. House and Senate to reauthorize the U.S. Export-Import Bank.

Thursday, April 16, 2015

A decision is in regarding Mount Sunapee Resort's proposed West Bowl ski expansion: it can happen in exchange for the resort swapping 260 acres of resort land for a state park. New London Police Chief Edward Andersen said the New Hampshire Medical Examiner ruled the death of 74-year-old Robert Schaffer of New London as an accidental drowning. More people than not spoke in support of keeping Stevens High School in downtown Claremont an open campus, including the high school's principal. A home in Bradford, Vermont, needs \$200,000 in repairs and a state fire examiner says it's because three unsupervised children playing with matches accidentally set the home on fire.

Wednesday, June 24, 2015

The New Hampshire state budget has officially been passed by House and Republican lawmakers today. A problem with the 11-point-three billion dollar budget is that Governor Maggie Hassan is likely to veto it. Turning to the Governor of Vermont, Peter Shumlin has just signed into law House Bill 105, also known as the revenge porn bill. Revenge porn is the act of posting sexually explicit images of someone online without their consent.

Thursday, June 25, 2015

New Hampshire Governor Maggie Hassan vetoed the fiscal year 2016-to 2018 budget this morning. Hassan says in a statement that the two-year spending plan is unbalanced and gives tax breaks to some out-of-state companies at the expense of economic priorities to help all residents. In other news affecting our region and the nation, the U.S. Supreme Court upheld the tax subsidies that reduce out-of-pocket costs for people who bought medical insurance under the Affordable Care Act. With its 6 to 3 decision, the court ruling means states including New Hampshire who set up the insurance enrollment plan using a

federal application will continue to qualify for cost subsidies. Turning to Vermont news, a new state police barracks in Westminster will be built, now that its five-point-six million dollar tab and better weather conditions have cleared hurdles. The new building has been on hold since the destructive flooding left by Tropical Storm Irene in late summer of 2011.

Friday, June 26, 2015

Members of the New Hampshire congressional delegation say in separate statements today they support the U.S. Supreme Court's decision regarding same sex marriage. The nation's highest court ruled 5 to 4 today that it is legal for all 50 states to issue same-sex marriage licenses. In a related story, U.S Senator and former New Hampshire Governor Jeanne Shaheen is calling on the Veterans Administration to immediately extend benefits to same-sex military veterans. Top statewide news from Vermont today is that U.S. Representative Peter Welch will not run for governor of the Green Mountain State.

Monday, June 29, 2015

Holiday travel this week and weekend is expected to be at its greatest in 8 years, Triple A reports, with 41-point-9 million drivers on the road. Gas prices are averaging under 3 dollars a gallon, with 2-79 a gallon making it a lot easier to fill up the tank. A year ago, the average gallon of regular gas cost 3-66. Meanwhile, for the first time in nearly three weeks, residents of upstate New York and bordering northern Vermont and Canada may feel much safer. Both convicts who escaped from the Dannemora prison in upstate New York have met their fate. As July 1st approaches, a new law for all Vermonters takes effect,
