**INSIGHT PUBLIC AFFAIRS SHOWS 2024 1ST QUARTER

1. January 7 2024—This week's show is all about The Better Business Bureau. Jana Keihl and Tyler Williams are our guests.

This show was about BBB.org their new website. The new website is more user friendly, with tips for everyone, consumers, businesses, and more. They also talked about Resolutions the BBB has made this year in order to help consumers even more. Jana talked about stores building trust with customers, and how to generate new customers. He talked about the experiment on the consciousness of water. Good words frozen into water made beautiful designs, bad words frozen into water made ugly horrible designs. He says we're the same way...what we say to ourselves, affects what we become. Our words shape our world. Tell yourself positive things...and you'll get good out. You set things into motion in our lives...with our words. Bad and positive. It affects your inner peace. Responsibility is your ability to respond to your words. We all have a destiny, whether we want to face it or not. And we should

all learn to embrace that. Trust the process. Sometimes we have to walk through the fire...but it will make us a better person and turn us into the “sword,” we should be...not a clump of steel. You can take the pressure if you learn to trust the process.

1. January 28th. This week on Insight it's Cole Stanley, the Mayor of Amarillo. The subject of Amarillo talking about Amarillo as a sanctuary city was brought up. Texas is a sanctuary city and discussion on Amarillo becoming a sanctuary city will be addressed. Mayor Stanley also talked about Amarillo's infrastructure, and how that will help communities and people here in the area. He said he was amazed at how outdated technology was for City Police Dept. And that had to be updated even while the city is paying it out...in order to help operations. He addressed the new Sr. Center for “seasoned citizens,” and how that will benefit the city in years to come. 1. February 4th—Rory Sheppard From Action Coach is the guest. Rory talks about good habits in business to help your business thrive and build momentum. Start with smaller goals you can achieve and see fast positive results to create a rewarding quick momentum. A little growth everyday is an important first step for businesses. Life doesn't always give you a huge impact every time. And if it does you can't keep that up day in and day out. Set doable goals...and raise the bar. Be intentional about your purpose.

1. February 11th. —Rerun from last week

1. February 18th.---This week Dr. Walter Wendler Pres. at WTAMU is the special guest on Insight. Dr. Wendler talked about Forbes Magazine's article...ranking WTAMU as being one of the top Universities in the State, for online learning. “The Typical Student,”

1. March 3rd 2024—On this week's show...Rory Sheppard from Action Coach is in. Action Coach is about giving your business great instruction to grow on. Culture is paramount to make an organization successful. The level of customer service you give your customers...should never exceed the level of service you give each other in your organization. Respect for co-workers is very important. Some virtues of leadership include respect, kindness, community, generosity and empowerment service. Respect is important to have, it's hard to gain and very easy to lose. Retaining top talent is currently an issue as well. How to keep people. What is the top talent? It's the person with the right heart, who is there for the mission and the person, they are there on time, they do good work etc. Senator Ted Cruz was also a guest on the show talking about our Panhandle Wildfires. One of the largest wildfires ever has been taking place not far from here. Senator Cruz will let us know what is being done to help people here in The High Plains. Senator Cruz encourages everyone to listen to local officials and be ready to evacuate when told to. Resources and tools have been allocated very

quickly to help those up here trying to keep people safe, and bring the fires under control.

1. March 10th. 2024—This week, in light of recent wild fires...Jana Kiehl and Tyler Williams talk about how not to be scammed from our desire to come to the aid of recent victims. Unfortunately when Natural Disasters strike, there are always people who swoop in and try to take advantage of our human nature to come to the aid of those less fortunate. Also The BBB Torch awards for Excellence are coming up, and Tyler and Jana talk about those nominees.

1. March 18, 2024 was a rerun of February 18th. Show With Doctor Walter Wendler.

1. March 25th. This month is Colorectal Cancer awareness month. Dr. Obara from Texas Tech Health Science is here to enlighten people about the importance of testing, catching early and what people can expect if they have the disease. Dr. Obara also talks about lifestyles that can increase your risk of Colorectal Cancer. Also on the show today Jermal Mashburn, former Mavericks player. Jermal is also talking about surviving Colorectal Cancer. Box out Colon Cancer now encourages people 45 and over to be screened for Colon Cancer. Jamal's family history lead him to be tested.

13. March 31st. This Week we get better with Jody Holland. This week the topic of discussion is continuing to learn in a work environment. There are many ways of mastering information. If you look at research it typically takes 11 months for a person to master a job. Most of what is done in business is passive learning. Watching video, reading etc. Demonstration also helps. The trick is to get people into active learning. Micro learning is helpful. Small increments of learning...then discuss what they've been exposed to. Imply it...then you get employee to teach you back...that ups retention to 100%. Using this method...it helps people shave that 11 months down to 90 Days. Also choosing the top 10 things a person needs to know to perform their job...and teaching that...helps people learn

quicker. Younger generations ask the question...why do I do a job this way? That is motivational to young people. Be ready to answer questions for employees if they ask why something is done in a certain way.
