WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE AREA: A variety of community events and issues of what is going on in the area, such as health, social needs, armed forces, blood donations, month, ethnic issues, and education. Broadcast at the 38 minute position of every hour 6:00AM to 5:00PM seven days a week.

GET OVER IT: Monday 7:00pm to 8:00pm. Evening show host Steve Tatz hosts members of the Cumberland County community to discuss and promote their charitable and public service activities and initiatives.

BOB & STEVE SHOW: Saturdays 8:00am to 10:00am. Hosts present main topics each week to discuss and open the phones to callers who want to join the discussion.

THE COUNTRY STORE: Saturdays 12:00pm to 1:00pm. Various members of the station host to take calls from listeners in the broadcast coverage area with personal items to sell. The station does not charge for this and has several rules, per law, on what items cannot be offered for sale.

CLAYTON FREE PRESS: Saturdays 1:00pm to 2:00pm. Members of the Clayton Free Press host to discuss and promote charitable and public service activities and initiatives.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: A schedule of announced and dated Community-oriented events organized, hosted, and presented by local or national community organizations.
