### **ISSUES**

WZLD-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

<u>Wounded Warrior Project / Fisher House</u> We aired a special 30 minute program and 30 second announcements urging listeners to donate to this Military Rehabilitation program designed for injured returning veterans' families. Fisher House provides lodging for family members of seriously injured veterans as they go through rehabilitation.

<u>Teen Issues - Bullying - Donorschoose.org</u> is an online charity to help students cope with in school bullying. We aired a series of 30 second announcements informing students of ways to report and cope with bullying.

<u>Cancer Research - City of Hope Reseach Center -</u> We aired a series of 60 second and 30 second announcements to bring attention to cancer research and ways local listeners can support this effort to find a cure.

<u>Underage Drinking - Underage Drinking Prevention</u> -Us of alcohol by underage children is an all time high. We aired a series of 60 second announcement suggesting ways parents can begin a conversation with their children about alcohol abuse.

<u>Housing - Habitat for Humanity -</u> Habitat for Humanity of South Mississippi continues their mission of providing home ownership for those in financial need. We aired a series of 30second announcements promoting the local chapter of Habitat for Humanity and helped them celebrate their latest home build.
