ISSUES

WZLD-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

Childhood Obesity - Children that are not active tend to be overweight and in cooperation with the Ad Council, we aired a series of announcements urging parents and children to spend time together in outdoor activities.

Emergency Preparedness - Winter weather in Mississippi can become cold and severe at a moment's notice. We aired a series of announcements urging listeners to have an emergency plan in the event of severe weather.

February 10th, 2013 Tornadoes - Tragedy struck hundreds of families on Sunday, February 10th, 2013 when severe tornadoes ripped through Lamar and Forrest Counties in South Mississippi. We aired over 30 weather warnings via our EAS system warning listeners of the approaching storms. We then aired 8 hours of emergency information immediately following the E-4 tornadoes by implementing our local Emergency Plan. Local EOC officials and law enforcement were interviewed. Severe damage affected many local businesses, universities, churches and homes. A state of emergency was declared by local EOC officials and listeners were urged to remain off the roads and to stay clear of the damaged areas. We aired a series safety and clean-up announcements in the days following the severe weather.

Breast Cancer Awareness - Pink Ribbon Fund is a local organization that provides monetary support to local breast cancer patients that otherwise cannot pay for treatment. We aired a series of announcements promoting the Pink Ribbon Fund events that help support this organization with monetary donations.
